There will be one call in December with a weekly call once conference play starts in January. There will also be a postseason call in March for all teams participating in postseason play (NCAA or NIT).

The teleconference begins at 10:00 a.m. Central Time each week. The call can also be heard live and on replay via the Big 12 web site at www.big12sports.com. A schedule and call-in/replay numbers will be published prior to the season.

IS THAT A NEW FACE ON THE BENCH?

The Big 12 will welcome five new head coaches to its sidelines this season, the most in conference history in one year. The changes are among the most in one season in recent college basketball memory, preceded recently by seven changes in the Atlantic 10 in 2001 and five by the Southeastern Conference in 1989.

The new coaches include Greg McDermott (Iowa State), Bob Huggins (Kansas State), Mike Anderson (Missouri), Jeff Capel (Oklahoma) and Sean Sutton (Oklahoma State). As a group, the five boast nearly 1,000 career victories.

PLAYERS LEAVE EARLY, BUT PLENTY RETURN

The Big 12 had eight players declare as early-entries for the 2006 NBA Draft, more than any conference in the country. However, several top stars return. Two of the early entries will be back in school - Richard Roby (Colorado) and Aleks Maric (Nebraska). Three of the five All-Big 12 First Team members are back, with a total of 14 players who were named to the All-Big 12 First, Second, Third or Honorable Mention squads returning in 2006-07.

STATS LEADERS ARE BACK AS WELL

The Big 12 leaders in eight of 13 overall statistical categories are eligible to play again in 2006-07. The list of returning athletes is below.

AUSTRALIANS RULE BASKETBALL?

The Big 12 will hold a unique place on the Australian Senior National Team in 2006. The squad, which competes in the FIBA World Championships in Japan in August, boasts two U.S. collegiate players. Both are from the Big 12. Juniors Aaron Bruce (Baylor) and Aleks Maric (Nebraska) will be part of the 12-man squad.

The duo has previously been teammates for the Under-21 National Team. Bruce is a two-time All-Big 12 honoree who set the conference scoring record for freshmen in 2004-05. Maric also earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention recognition last season.



BAYLOR IS BIG 12 ENTRY IN NIT SEASON TIPOFF

Baylor will be the Big 12 squad competing in the annual NIT Season Tipoff. The Bears will take part in the NIT's new format this year, facing Colorado State in West Region games in Spokane, Wash. BU will then face either Gonzaga or Rice in a second game, which will be played regardless of the result of the Bears' outing versus CSU. The teams with the best record in each region (East, Midwest, South, West) will advance to the semifinals at Madison Square Garden in New York.

ELITE COMPANY

Over the last four seasons, only six schools have reached the Elite Eight (regional final) of the NCAA Tournament in two different years. Kansas, Texas, Arizona, Connecticut, Kentucky and Michigan State can boast of the feat. *The Big 12 is the only conference with multiple schools in that group.*

BARNES COACHES THE TROOPS

Texas head coach Rick Barnes volunteered his services in Kuwait this summer, coaching a military basketball team in Operation Hardwood II from May 23-29. The United Service Organizations (USO) and Armed Forces Entertainment (AFE) sponsored the event for the second year in a row. In addition to Barnes, several other top coaches around the country took part, including Tubby Smith (Kentucky), Tom Izzo (Michigan State) and Gary Williams (Maryland).

MAN ON A MISSION

Oklahoma junior guard Kellen Sampson had a unique summer job this year, as he spent two weeks in May and June working with 11 others at an orphanage in the war-torn West African nation of Liberia.

Sampson was part of a construction group scheduled to erect a school building in Rainbow Town. He also spent much time with groups of local children - entertaining, playing games and trying to make the lives of the local youth more enjoyable.

"I had no concept of anything except trying to make 85 orphans' days a little better," Sampson said. "To be so completely un-self-centered really puts all the things that we do here in focus."

A UNIQUE PLACE IN THE TOP 5

Kansas mentor Bill Self and Texas head coach Rick Barnes are in a unique group of active coaches nationally. The duo are two of only six in the country who have led two different schools to top five rankings in the Associated Press top 25 poll. All-time, only 13 coaches have accomplished the feat.

RONALD LIKES THE BIG 12 NEWCOMERS

The Big 12 has many solid returning players in 2006-07, but also has several highly-touted newcomers. The league had a strong presence on the 2006 McDonald's All-America Game rosters, with five players being selected. The five Big 12 signees tied (Pac-10) for the second-most nationally.

CLOSE CONTESTS THROUGHOUT THE BIG 12

Last season marked one of the most competitive, top-to-bottom, of any in Big 12 annals. Of the 96 conference games contested, nearly half (47) were decided by 10 points or less.

In addition, Oklahoma became the first team in Big 12 history to play four consecutive one-point games (conference or non-conference). The Sooners had seven one-point contests overall, a league record.

MORE STATS STUFFERS TO PLAY AGAIN

In addition to the league leaders, six of the 12 conference squads are able to bring back their leader in points, rebounds and assists when competition starts in October. Baylor, Colorado, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma State and Texas A&M all have their points, rebounds and assists leaders eligible to play again in 2006-07.

BEATING THE NATION'S BEST

The Big 12 posted the second-best winning percentage and second-most wins of any conference in the nation against Associated Press top 25 opponents in 2005-06. Conference squads won six of the last eight meetings, including a 5-2 mark during the 2006 calendar year. Big 12 teams have 16 wins over nationally-ranked squads during the past two years.

BIG 12 MADNESS IN OKC FOR THE FIRST TIME...

For the first time in conference history this season, the Phillips 66 Big 12 Basketball Championships will be played somewhere besides Kansas City or Dallas. In March, Oklahoma City will host the events for the first time. The men's championship will take place at the Ford Center from March 8-11. Most recently, the Big 12 hosted NCAA First/Second Round games at the arena in 2005.

...AND THEN WE GO BACK TO KANSAS CITY IN 2008

After playing this year's postseason games in Oklahoma, the Big 12 will return to Kansas City for the 2008 Phillips 66 Big 12 Basketball Championships. This time, however, the men's event will take place in a new arena - The Sprint Center - which will open in October 2007. It will mark the eighth time that Kansas City will host the basketball championships.

BAYLOR BEARS

BU NOTEBOOK

- Baylor returns 87.6 percent of its scoring, 84.7 percent of its rebounds and 93.5 percent of its assists from a year ago. Only two players have departed, with the two lost averaging just 6.6 and 2.1 points, respectively.
- The Bears have four of their five starters from 2005-06 available this coming season and 11 of 13 players from last season's roster.
- An underclassman (freshman or sophomore) has been BU's scoring leader in 39 of its last 44 games. In 27 of those contests, a freshman has been the leading point-producer.
- Junior guard Aaron Bruce, an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention choice in 2005-06, is back for his third campaign. While playing a full schedule two years ago, he was the nation's leading freshman scorer. He ranked No. 18 in the Big 12 last season with 13.1 points per game.
- For the first time under head coach Scott Drew, Baylor will be playing a full schedule with a full allotment of scholarships. The Bears played only conference games last year due to NCAA sanctions and have competed for three years with scholarship limits.
- In addition to the returnees, BU will boast three newcomers. All three of the players were rated in the top 100 nationally, including Parade and McDonald's All-America pick Demond "Tweety" Carter. The Bears have had three straight years of recruiting classes ranked in the top 20 nationally.

- Guard Richard Roby is the top scoring returnee among juniors in the Big 12. He needs 10 points to become the 24th player to score 1,000 points at Colorado.
- The Buffaloes bring back their scoring, rebounding and assist leaders from a year ago. Roby topped the squad with 17.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game in 2005-06. Senior guard Marcus Hall was first with 124 assists.
- Roby needs 10 points to break the 1,000-point plateau for his career. If he duplicates his scoring total from a year ago (510 points) he would rank seventh on the all-time Colorado scoring list.
- Head coach Ricardo Patton has led the Buffs to the postseason in six of his 10 years (2 NCAA, 4 NIT) as head coach. He has 177 career victories at CU, second on the all-time school coaching ledger.
- CU had its third 20-win season in the last 10 years in 2005-06. The Buffs have recorded three of the four 20-win ledgers in school history under Patton.
- Colorado is tied (Texas) for the largest class of incoming recruits in the Big 12. Among the newcomers expected to contribute immediately is Jermyl Jackson-Wilson, a transfer from Ohio State. He was rated as a top-50 recruit nationally out of high school.

- Iowa State will bring back eight players from last season, led by forward Rahshon Clark. The junior averaged 13.1 points with a team-high 5.5 rebounds per game.
- Clark led the team in rebounding last year with 5.5 boards per game. He was also first in blocks (30) and free-throw percentage (.767). He connected on 23 consecutive free throws at one point during the season.
- Junior forward Jiri Hubalek shot 51.5 percent from the field last season, the second-best percentage on the team. He connected on at least half his shots in 19 of 30 games in 2005-06.
- New head coach Greg McDermott has been to the postseason each of the last three seasons and five times during his career.
- McDermott has posted seven 20-win campaigns during his career and has an overall winning percentage of .635. He has nine winning records in 12 seasons as a head coach.

KU NOTEBOOK

- Kansas returns 85.2 percent of its scoring from last year, including all five starters. The Jayhawks are one of two teams in the Big 12 (Oklahoma State) bringing back all five starters.
- Sophomore Brandon Rush was the first player in Big 12 history to be named All-Big 12 First Team as a freshman when he garnered the honor a year ago. He scored 444 points, the second-best freshman campaign in KU history and seventh-best on the Big 12 freshman list.
- Sophomore guard Mario Chalmers set a Big 12 freshman record with 89 steals last season, including 53 thefts in league games. A repeat performance of the conference effort in 2006-07 would move Chalmers into third on the Big 12 career chart.
- KU led the nation in field goal percentage defense last year (.370). It marked the second time in the last six years the Jayhawks have topped the country in that category.
- Head coach Bill Self has finished either first or second in each of his last eight seasons as a head coach. The Jayhawk mentor has garnered six league championships during that time (Two each in the Big 12, Big Ten and WAC).
- In addition to its solid core of returnees, KU will welcome two McDonald's All-Americans to the team this year. Freshmen Darrell Arthur and Sherron Collins were both recognized last season.

KSU NOTEBOOK

- Kansas State has its top four scorers and three of its top four rebounders eligible to return in 2006-07. Overall, the Wildcats can bring back 81.5 percent of their points from last year.
- K-State head coach Bob Huggins ranks seventh nationally among active Division I head coaches in wins and eighth in winning percentage. He is 567-199 (.740) in his career and has participated in postseason play in 21 of 24 seasons. Huggins has 14 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- The Wildcats held opponents to 39.8 percent shooting a year ago. It tied for their second-best field goal percentage defense mark in Big 12 history, surpassed only by the 1998-99 squad (.384) and matching the '97-98 campaign.
- Junior David Hoskins scored in double-figures in 20 games last season during his first year at KSU. He surpassed 20 points four times, including a career-high tying 25 versus Texas Tech in the Big 12 Championship First Round.
- Senior forward Cartier Martin led the Big 12 in free throw percentage last year, connecting on 132-of-157 (.841) shots from the line. It was the first time in league history that a Wildcat player had led the conference in the category.
- Senior guard Lance Harris scored in double-figures 14 times last season. He shot 50.0 percent or better in nine contests.

- Junior guard Jason Horton ranked fifth in the league in assists with 4.48 per game. The ranking was the highest in Big 12 history for a Mizzou player as Horton dished out 121 overall in 27 games.
- Horton is the sixth player in MU history to record back-to-back seasons of 100 assists or more. He had 224 career dishes in his first two seasons.
- Junior forward Marshall Brown posted 14 double-digit scoring efforts last season. He also shot 45.6 percent from the floor (53.8 percent from inside the arc), tops among returning starters.
- Missouri mentor Mike Anderson has averaged 22.3 wins in four seasons as a head coach. Beginning with his days as an assistant at Tulsa and Arkansas, he has enjoyed 18 campaigns with 20-plus victories and a .700 overall winning percentage.

- Junior center Aleks Maric is a member of Australia's Senior National Team that will compete in the World Championships in Japan from Aug. 19 - Sept. 3. Maric helped the Australia Under-20 squad to the world title in Greece in 2003.
- Maric averaged 8.1 boards last season and is the top returning rebounder in the Big 12. He posted double-figure rebound totals 12 times a year ago, including eight of his last 14 outings. Maric also had 10 double-doubles (a league-high seven in Big 12 games), the most of any conference returnee.
- Nebraska reached the semifinals of the Big 12 Championship in 2006. It marked just the second time in league history (1998), the Huskers had accomplished the feat. The two tourney victories matched NU's total for the previous nine events.
- The Cornhuskers' 19 wins in 2005-06 were the most in head coach Barry Collier's six seasons at Nebraska. The school also earned its second NIT berth in the last three years.
- Sophomore guard Jamel White connected on 80.2 percent (69-of-86) of his free throws last season, tops among Cornhusker returning regulars.
- Senior guard Charles Richardson ranked fourth in the Big 12 in assist-to-turnover ratio with a 1.92 mark. He has 220 assists in his first three seasons at NU, with 117 turnovers.

- Senior forward Mario Boggan posted double-digit scoring efforts in his last nine games of 2005-06, averaging 17.7 points during the span. He scored 10 points or more in 29 of 33 games last year, including surpassing the 20-point plateau five times.
- Boggan led the Big 12 in both field goal and free throw percentage in conference play, the first player in league history to accomplish the feat. He shot 55.2 percent from the floor and hit at a .846 (55-of-65) clip from the line.
- Head coach Sean Sutton will take the reins at OSU for the first time this season. He had served as an assistant coach for his father, Eddie, since the 1993-94 season.
- In its last 10 games, Oklahoma State allowed more than 68 points just three times. The Cowboy defense surrendered just 63.9 points per game over its final 10 contests.
- The Cowboys have earned postseason bids in each of the last 10 seasons, the third-longest string in the Big 12.

UT NOTEBOOK

- Last year, Texas set a school record for the most victories in a season (30). The Longhorns have been ranked in the top 10 of the final coaches' poll three times in the last four years.
- Texas finished with 13 victories in Big 12 play in 2005-06, tying for the most in school history. The Longhorns have double-digit conference wins in all but one season under head coach Rick Barnes.
- Sophomore guard A.J. Abrams had 36 assists with just 15 turnovers in his last nine games, all during the month of March. He dished five assists or more four times and also had four outings with one turnover or less.
- Abrams set a UT freshman record for games played a year ago, appearing in 37 contests. He is the Longhorns' top returning scorer (6.4 ppg) and also placed second on the team last year in 3-point field goal percentage (.390).
- Barnes' teams at Texas have averaged 23.9 victories in his eight seasons in Austin. The Longhorns have won at least 20 games in all but one campaign under Barnes - his first year in 1998-99 (19-13).
- UT is one of just three schools (Connecticut, Duke) to reach the regional semifinals (Sweet 16) of the NCAA Tournament in four of the last five seasons.

A&M NOTEBOOK

- Texas A&M will bring back its top six scorers from last season's team and a total of 89.6 percent of its scoring from a year ago.
- The Aggies were 16-2 at home in 2005-06 and have won 33 of 38 games in College Station under head coach Billy Gillispie. The victory total is the most home wins in the country during that span.
- Texas A&M held opponents to 41.1 percent shooting from the field last season. The mark is the sixth-best in school history. Two of the top six shooting defense performances have come under Gillispie.
- A&M's overall victory total (22) a year ago was it's highest since posting a 26-8 mark in 1980. The Aggies also have 18 conference wins over the last two years after posting only 25 in the first eight Big 12 seasons.
- Last season, the Aggies earned their first NCAA bid since 1987 and the sixth in program history. TAMU's first-round victory was its first in the NCAA play since a 2-1 record in the 1980 postseason.
- Texas A&M opponents scored just 60.3 points per game. The average allowed was the second-best in school history, behind the 1979-80 squad (59.8). The Aggies allowed 60 points or less 19 times, including eight of the last nine outings.

TECH NOTEBOOK

- Head coach Bob Knight needs 11 victories to break the all-time record for Division I wins held by North Carolina's Dean Smith. Knight is 869-350 (.713) in 40 seasons of head coaching.
- The Red Raiders' finish last season marked only the second time a Knight-coached team has posted a losing record. In 1970-71, he coached Army to an 11-13 mark, but rebounded with a 17-8 tally at Indiana the following campaign.
- Senior guard Jarrius Jackson was the leading scorer in the Big 12 last season. He topped the conference overall with 20.5 points per game and was also first in league contests, averaging 21.7 points.
- Jackson finished the year averaging 26.0 points over the last seven games. Overall, he surpassed the 20-point plateau 18 times in 2005-06.
- Tech held 26 of 32 opponents to 40.0 percent or lower from 3-point range in 2005-06, with 29 of 32 foes being held to single-digit field goals from beyond the arc.
- Texas Tech brings back four starters and four of its top six scorers. The Red Raiders will also welcome several newcomers, including Rogdrick Craig. The son of former San Francisco 49ers standout running back Roger Craig, Rogdrick averaged 21.2 points last season.
