The Big 12 will once again host NCAA basketball action as first & second round games will be played at the American Airlines Center in Dallas on March 17 and 19. The league has hosted each year since 2001 in either Kansas City, Oklahoma City and Dallas.

Tickets for the games are on sale now through the American Airlines Center box office at or online at www.big12sports.com.

BIG 12 GOES INTERNATIONAL

The Big 12 will be well-represented at the FIBA U21 World Championships for Young Men, as three league standouts will compete in the event. The games will take place from August 5-14 in Mar del Plata, Argentina.

TOP COACHES MENTOR IN THE BIG 12

If you are looking for some of the top men's basketball coaches in the United States, look no further than the Big 12. The nation's two winningest coaches - Bob Knight and Eddie Sutton - both patrol the sidelines in the league. Knight ranks first all-time with 854 victories, while Sutton is second with 781 wins. Ten of the league's 12 head coaches boast more than 100 career victories.

BIG 12 SEES SUCCESS ON HARDWOOD AND GRIDIRON

The Big 12 is the only conference in America that has three teams that won postseason bowl games and had both their men's and women's basketball teams invited to the NCAA Championship. Iowa State, Texas and Texas Tech pulled off the unique trifecta. The other schools to accomplish the feat are Boston College, Connecticut, Louisville, Minnesota and Utah. A fourth Big 12 squad (Oklahoma) has both its teams in NCAA play, but dropped a decision in its bowl appearance this past season.

YOUNG SCORERS ARE BACK

Ten of the top 20 overall Big 12 scoring leaders will be back for 2005-06. All but one of the 10 players was a freshman or a sophomore last year.

JAYHAWKS LEAD LOADED FIELD IN MAUI

Kansas will travel to Maui from Nov. 21-23 to compete in the EA Sports Maui Invitational. The tournament will boast one of the best in-season fields of all-time, with six former national champions taking the court - Kansas, Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, Maryland and Michigan State. Gonzaga and host Chaminade round out the field. The Jayhawks will face Arizona in the opening round.

MISSOURI IS BIG 12 REPRESENTATIVE IN PRESEASON NIT

Missouri is slated to be the Big 12 squad competing in the annual Preseason NIT. The Tigers will host Sam Houston State in the opening round. A victory would advance MU to a second-round matchup with Drexel or Princeton at a site to be determined.

BIG 12 LEADS NATION IN RECENT FINAL FOURS

Over the last four years, the Big 12 has had five teams advance to the Final Four. The league is one of only five to have a school participate in the Final Four during that time. The five squads is more than any conference in the country.

BIG 12 HAS MULTIPLE REPRESENTATIVES IN REGIONAL SEMIFINALS (AGAIN)

For the fourth straight season, the Big 12 had at least two teams in NCAA Regional Semifinals. Oklahoma State played Arizona in the Chicago Regional in 2005, while Texas Tech faced West Virginia in the Albuquerque Regional. The league is one of only three (Big East, ACC) that can boast the feat over the last four seasons.

WE'RE USED TO THE POSTSEASON

Big 12 teams are used to seeing postseason play. Three squads - Kansas, Oklahoma State and Texas - rank among the top 12 in the nation in most consecutive NCAA appearances. In fact, the Big 12 is the only league in America with three teams on the list.

BIG 12 LED NATION WITH SIX IN '05 DANCE

The Big 12 had six teams earn bids to the NCAA Championship in 2005, tied with the Big East for the most entries of any conference in the country. It is the fifth time in Big 12 history (2000, '01, '02, '03) that the league has placed six squads in the "Big Dance."

SIXTEEN BIG 12 TEAMS EARN POSTSEASON BIDS

The success of the Big 12 wasn't limited to the men's side, as the conference also placed eight women's teams in postseason play. Six teams qualified for the NAACs (including National Champion Baylor), while Nebraska and Texas A&M were chosen for the WNIT. The 16 total bids is second among all conferences in the country.

BY THE NUMBERS

- 1 - Opponents that shot more than 48 percent from the field against Texas A&M last season. The Aggies finished tied for second in the Big 12 in field goal percentage defense, holding foes to 39.4 percent - a mark that was 17th nationally.
- 4 - Consecutive 20-win seasons for Texas Tech under head coach Bob Knight. Prior to the current streak, the Red Raiders had posted eight 20-win campaigns in 76 years.
- 5 - Categories in which Aaron Bruce of Baylor placed among the top 11 league statistical leaders. He was second in the Big 12 in scoring (18.2 ppg), third in free throw percentage (82.8) and field goals made (2.46), seventh in field goal percentage (47.1) and 11th in assists (3.75).
- 5 - Wins by Iowa State over nationally-ranked opponents last season. The total was more than any other Big 12 squad.
- 5 - Nebraska players who were named to the Academic All-Big 12 First Team a year ago, more than any team in the conference. Three of those players - Jason Dourisseau, Bronsen Schliep and Tony Wilbrand - are on the roster again in 2005-06.
- 6 - The number of 20 win teams in the Big 12 last season, the sixth time in nine seasons the conference has had at least six 20-win squads. The most in one year is seven, posted during the 2002-03 season.
- 6 - Games won by Oklahoma State at the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship over the past two seasons. Prior to the current winning streak, the Cowboys had won six total games in the event over the first seven years of the conference.
- 9 - Years in which Kansas has led the Big 12 in home attendance. The Jayhawks have ranked first in the league in the category every season since the conference was formed in 1996-97.
- 12 - Double-doubles by Oklahoma's Taj Gray last season. The total was tied for second in the conference and is the most among returning players.
- 21 - Rebounds by Brad Buckman of Texas at Colorado last season. The total was the most in the Big 12 in 2004-05. He also had 27 points, the seventh player in league history to post 20 or more points and rebounds in the same contest.
- 60 - Number of games it took Iowa State's Curtis Stinson to reach 1,000 career points. The junior guard was the third-fastest player in Cyclone history to reach the mark when he did so last season.
- 100 - Percent of scoring that Colorado returns from last season. The Buffaloes are the only team in the Big 12 that returns all five starters.
- 116 - Assists by Kansas State's Clint Stewart last season, a KSU freshman record. He finished with 4.00 per game, the best average by a Big 12 freshman and a mark that ranked eighth in the league overall.

BU NOTEBOOK

- The Bears return 93 percent of their scoring and 90 percent of their rebounding from last season.
- Sophomore guard **Aaron Bruce** was the nation's top-scoring freshman a year ago. He finished 18.2 points per game. Bruce also led the Bears in minutes (34.8 mpg), assists (3.8), 3-pointers (69) and free throws (96).
- Junior **Tim Bush** and **Bruce** are the top two returning free throw shooters in the Big 12. Bush ranked second overall, hitting at 83.3 percent from the stripe. Bruce was third at 82.8 percent.
- BU boasts four returning starters this season, its most since 1996-97. Leading the way is senior **Tommy Swanson**, the second Bear player (Matt Sayman) in the last six years to enter his senior season with more than 60 career games played. Swanson has played in 73 games in three seasons.
- Baylor's incoming newcomers were rated in the top 20 nationally by two different recruiting services and boast three national top 100 players.
- Due to NCAA sanctions, Baylor will not play any regular-season non-conference games in 2005-06. The Bears will begin practice on October 14 as usual, but will not suit up for a game until their Big 12 opener in January.

- The Cornhuskers bring back three of their top four scorers in 2005-06, with 62.7 percent of their scoring returning overall.
- NU's defense has been solid in recent years, as the Huskers have held opponents under 64 points per game each of the past two seasons. A year ago, the squad finished third in the Big 12 in scoring defense (63.9).
- Sophomore guard **Joe McCray** scored 433 points last season, second on the Nebraska all-time list and eighth in Big 12 annals for freshman points. He set a Big 12 and NU freshman record for 3-point field goals with 80.

- Oklahoma State has the best record in the Big 12 over the last two seasons. The Cowboys are 57-11 overall and 24-8 in league play, both first in the conference.
- Sophomore **JamesOn Curry** scored in double-figures seven straight contests to end the 2004-05 season. Overall he posted 10 points or more 16 times. He is OSU's top returning scorer (9.4 ppg) from last season.
- Curry** scored 79 points in six postseason (Big 12 & NCAA) games last season. He averaged 13.2 points with 26 rebounds and 30 assists.
- The Cowboys ranked in the top six nationally in all three major shooting categories last season. OSU was first in 3-point field goal percentage (.426), second in free throw percentage (.780) and sixth in field goal percentage (.497).
- Oklahoma State's 57 wins over the past two seasons are the third-most of any team in the nation. Only Illinois (63) and Duke (58) can boast more wins during that span.
