Colorado athletes in italics

Women's Hammer

Loren Groves (Kansas State) 64.73 meters [212-04] won the hammer throw, in addition setting a Potts Field mark breaking previous best 59.63 meters Kate Burton, Wyoming in 2006.

- Groves is the first K-State woman to win the event since Renetta Seiler won the event three years in a row (1997, 1998, 1999)

Laci Heller (Kansas State) finished in second place with a 60.19m [197-06]

Colorado's Kaity Kark finished with a season-best throw 42.37m [139-00]

Men's Decathlon

Nick Adcock (Missouri) set a Big 12 Championship Meet Record of 10:94 [w: 0.7] in the decathlon version of the 100-meter dash breaking the mark of 10.96 [w: 1.8] of Kendall Madden (Texas A&M) set in Columbia, Mo. (1998)

Rok Derzanic (Kansas State) set a decathlon long jump Big 12 Championship Meet Record of 7.68 meters [w:0.0] [25-2.50]. Previous best was Donovan Kilmartin (Texas) 7.41 [w: 0.2] set in Manhattan, Kan. (2005)

Lars Rise (Missouri) set a Big 12 Championship Meet Record in the decathlon shot put of 15.70m [51-6.25]. Previous best was Hans Uldal (Missouri) 14.85, Manhattan, Kan. (2005)

Colorado's Adam Salzmann personal-best 11.37 in the 100-meter dash

Women's Heptathlon

Colorado's Troi Smith set a personal best in the high jump 5-00.5 [1.54m] and 200-meters, 26.27

Men's Hammer

Kansas's Egor Agafonov set a Potts Field record in the men's hammer throw with a throw of 221-11 (67.65), breaking the previous record of 197-0 (60.04) set by Jace Rivera in 2006. Three others also finished with marks higher than the previous stadium record. Jason Morris of Missouri recorded 212-07 (64.80), Missouri's Tyler Dailey threw 201-02 (61.31), and Nebraska's Keith Lloyd recorded a mark of 200-09 (61.20).

Women's Javelin Throw

Nebraska's Kayla Wilkinson won the Big 12 Championship in the women's javelin throw for the third time with a throw of 182-10 (55.73).

Women's 10,000m Run

Lisa Kroll (Iowa State) became the second back-to-back conference champion in Big 12 history, finishing in first place with a time of 35:59.28.

Men's 10,000m Run

Colorado took the top five positions, with first place going to Kenyon Neuman with 30:40.78. Bradley Harkrader came in second with his time of 30:40.98. Matt Tebo finished third with 30:41.22. Chris Pannone's time of 30:41.25 put him in fourth place and Richard Medina finished fifth with his time of 30:44.47.
