# PAT KNIGHT

## Head Coach

Coach Pat Knight begins his first full season as the Texas Tech head coach and his eighth season on the Red Raider basketball court.

On the morning of February 4, 2008, Coach Bob Knight decided to step away from the court and, as had been in place for several seasons, announced that Pat would be taking over the top spot for the Red Raiders.

"There's a transition that's going to take place here from me to Pat, and I've dwelt on this all year long ... how it would be best for him and for the team and for what we can do in the long run to make this the best thing for Texas Tech," commented Bob Knight.

As the thirteenth head coach for Texas Tech men's basketball, Pat gained his first win as a collegiate head coach, his initial victory at home, and his first win over a nationally ranked team with Texas Tech's 84-75 win over #18 Kansas State on February 13. On March 1, his Red Raiders then topped nationally ranked Texas (#5) by three points, 83-80.

"It's kind of surreal right now," Pat Knight said. "But I didn't get into this business to be an assistant coach my whole life. It's always been a dream of mine, even as a kid. That's all I've been around is coaches."

Under the direction of their new head coach, the Red Raiders won three of their five remaining home games and gained a road win over Colorado to complete the 2008-2009 season at 16-15.

Prior to the 2005-2006 season, Pat was named head coach designate. He is certainly no stranger to the hardwoods of the basketball court. As the head coach, he is responsible for all aspects of the Red Raider program.

After his four year collegiate play-ing career at Indiana, Pat joined the staff of the NBA's Phoenix Suns where he served as an administrative assistant and scout. In 1997, he was an assistant coach to the CBA's Connecticut Pride.

In 1998, Coach Knight was named to his first head coaching position as the leader of the Wisconsin Blast of the International Basketball Association. After a 3-5 start, Pat led his team to a 16-10 record over the last 26 games for a 19-15 record, the fourth best mark in the league.

Coach Knight earned his playing experience at Indiana University from 1991-1995. A four-year letter winner with a red-shirt season, Pat graduated in 1995 with a degree in sports management. He played a career-high 424 minutes as a senior in 1995 and scored a career-high 45 points in 31 games. As a senior, Pat had a career best 60 assists and registered 137 in his career.

During his collegiate career, his team made five NCAA appearances and he played in the 1992-1993 Elite Eight. His team also won Big Ten titles in 1991 and 1993.

When Indiana University played Texas Tech in the inaugural United Spirit Arena game on November 19, 1999, Coach Pat Knight praised the state of the art facility for players and fans and then reflected upon what it might be like to someday coach at Texas Tech University and call the United Spirit Arena home.

After serving as an assistant at Indiana for two years and one as an assistant coach with the Zips of the University of Akron, Coach Pat Knight's reflection became reality at Texas Tech.

As a collegiate player and nearly nine seasons as an assistant coach, Pat was on the sidelines as a player or a coach for 308 of Bob Knight's 902 career wins.

Coach Pat Knight and the former Amanda Shaw were married on May 10, 2002.

### Red Raider Basketball Signs Four

The Texas Tech men's basketball program has signed four players to National Letters of Intent. The new Red Raiders hail from Florida, Mississippi, New Mexico, and Texas. Two will enter Texas Tech as freshmen and two will be Red Raider juniors for the 2009-2010 season.

**Jaye Crockett**, a 6-foot-5, 190-pound guard from Clovis High School in Clovis, New Mexico, will enter Texas Tech next season as a freshman. Jaye averaged 20.9 points and 10.4 rebounds per game as a junior. He helped the Clovis High Wildcats go 29-2 and finish as the Class 5A runner-up. Jaye was the only junior named to New Mexico's first team all-state squad last season. After his visit to Lubbock, Jaye commented, "I really liked the coaching staff and the campus atmosphere. They play similar to the way Coach Isler plays us."

**Mike Davis**, a 6-foot-3, 180-pound guard from Houston, Texas, plays for the Wildcats of Phillis Wheatley High School. The Wildcats were last season's Class 4A state semifinalists. The previous season he played at St. Pius X. The Panthers went to the TAPPS 6A Final Four last year. "I like Tech's playing style and my parents will get to see a lot of the games," Mike remarked.

**Theron Jenkins**, a 6-foot-6, 211-pound forward from Itawamba Community College in Fulton, Mississippi is the third signee for the Red Raiders. A role player behind five starting sophomores, Theron averaged 7 points and 4 rebounds per game as a freshman for the ICC Indians. After five games into the 2008-2009 season, Theron is averaging 16 points, 6 rebounds, and 3 assists for Coach Marty Cooper. "I just felt that Texas Tech was the place for me to go. I liked everything I saw at Texas Tech," Theron said.

**Brad Reese**, a 6-foot-7, 200-pound forward from Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Florida is the fourth Red Raider signee in the early signing period. He is a pre-season NJCAA first team All-America pick. Brad started all thirty games and averaged 30 minutes per game for the Commodores last season. He averaged 16.7 points and 4.1 rebounds in his freshman season. Coach Jay Powell commented, "Brad is tall and long but he can also shoot the three." Last season Brad made 63 of his 188 three-point attempts (.335) and 91 of 117 free throws (.778). After five games this season, he is averaging 16 points, 6 rebounds per game, and is shooting 40% from behind the arc. Brad declared, "Texas Tech is a really good fit for me. I've signed with good people who are also good coaches who can help me when I'm finished playing basketball."
