# NO. 9 AGGIES LOOK TO DEFEND BIG 12 TOURNEY TITLE IN OKLAHOMA CITY

#### **TOURNAMENT PREVIEW**

Oklahoma City holds special memories for the ninth-ranked Texas A&M women's basketball team (23-6). A year ago, it was the setting for the program's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight where the Aggies proved to the nation that they had arrived and could play with the best including a Candace Parker-led Tennessee squad in the regional final and a milestone victory over Duke in the regional semifinal. A&M will look to make more memories at this week's Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball Championship to be held on March 12-15 at the Cox Convention Center. The Aggies enter postseason play as the defending tournament champions after defeating third-seeded Oklahoma State, 64-59, in the 2008 championship game in Kansas City. Last season, A&M became the first No. 4 seed in league history to win the postseason tournament title. The fourth-seeded Aggies will face either fifth-seeded Kansas State (23-6) or 12th-seeded Colorado (11-17) in the Big 12 Quarterfinals on Friday, March 13 at 1:30 p.m. (CT) with a spot in one of two semifinal matchups guaranteed to the winner on Saturday. The Aggies have won five out of their last six and punched their ticket as a top four tournament seed for the fourth-straight year. A&M is one of three league schools currently ranked among the top 10 teams in the country next to No. 3 Oklahoma and No. 7 Baylor, showing the strength and the depth of the Big 12 this season.

#### **HOW THEY GOT THERE**

The Aggies earned one of four top seeds along with Big 12 regular-season champion and top-seeded Oklahoma (27-3). second-seeded Baylor (24-5) and third-seeded Iowa State (23-7). A&M was the only league team to stop the Sooners' from their second perfect season in league play with a memorable 57-56 victory where fans stormed the court in celebration on Feb. 23 in College Station. The Aggies also won a string of games against ranked opponents in No. 21 Texas on Feb. 21 and Kansas State on March 1, but the Lady Bears would end their win streak with a 64-60 loss in both team's season finale on March 7 in Waco. A&M would go on to tie lowa State with an 11-5 record for third place in the final league standings. However, the Cyclones held the tiebreaker in head-to-head competition with the Aggies and earned the No. 3 seed. A&M and OU are the only two Big 12 South schools in the top half of the tournament bracket along with K-State, Colorado, eighth-seeded Kansas (17-12) and ninth-seeded Nebraska

## **SCOUTING KANSAS STATE**

Kansas State responded to a 71-45 loss to A&M on March 1 in Manhattan, by closing out Big 12 regular-season action on a high note with victories over No. 15 Texas (66-50) on March 4 and Colorado (71-61) on March 7 for a 10-6 campaign. Senior point guard Shalee Lehning has played in four games since her return to the lineup after a bout with mononucleosis. In her last outing, she registered her fifth career triple-double and Big 12-record third of the season with 16 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists against the Buffaloes. The All-Big 12 First Team selection currently ranks second in career assists (771) behind all-time leader Erin Grant of Texas Tech (844) in the league record books.

#### **COLORADO REPORT**

Colorado has lost its last five games since picking up its third conference win of the season against Kansas (69-62) on Feb. 18. The Buffaloes went 0-6 against the Big 12 South and 0-2 in head-to-head competition versus their Big 12 first-round opponent Kansas State that included a 71-61 set-back in both team's regular-season finale on March 7 in Boulder. CU has gone 1-1 in its first-round games over the last two years including a 71-67 victory over ninth-seeded Texas Tech as the No. 8 seed in the 2007 tournament held in Oklahoma City. The Buffs are led by Brittany Spears, a sophomore All-Big 12 Second Team guard who is averaging a team-leading 18.1 points and 7.9 rebounds a game as well as senior center Kara Richards who currently ranks 12th nationally in field goal percentage (56.9).

#### **SERIES HISTORY**

Kansas State and Colorado leads 11-5 and 10-7 respectively in the all-time series with Texas A&M. The Aggies have never faced K-State in postseason tournament play in addition to Kansas and Texas Tech. They last met the Buffaloes in a 62-45 victory for the top-seeded Aggies in the 2007 Big 12 Quarterfinals in Oklahoma City. It marked their first and only postseason meeting since the league's inception in 1996-97. A&M ended a two-game skid in the series with a 26-point rout of the Wildcats (71-45) in Manhattan on March 1. The Aggies have won the last six-straight games versus CU which is tied with Kansas for their largest win streak against a Big 12 opponent to date.

#### WHERE THEY STACK UP

Undoubtedly, senior All-America candidates Takia Starks and Danielle Gant are among the best of the best to ever don the Maroon & White uniform. A&M was one of three Big 12 member schools to boast two-or-more players on the All-Big 12 First Team next to Oklahoma and Kansas State. Starks, a three-time first team selection, is 24 points shy of 1,900 career points (1,876) and recently became the 21st player in school history to gain entrance into the 500-Rebound Club (504). She and Gant, a triple award winner with her second nod on the All-Big 12 First Team, are one of only four players in school history to record 1,500 career points and 500 career rebounds next to former players Lisa Langston (1982-86) and Prissy Sharpe (1996-2000). Gant, who was also tabbed Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year as well as to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team for the third-straight year, is the only player in program history to record 1,500 career points (1,533), 800 rebounds (881), 200 steals (261) and 100 blocked shots (108).

#### **AGGIE TOURNAMENT TIDBITS**

- Texas A&M is 6-11 all-time in Big 12 Championship games. The Aggies may be tied for the fewest tournament wins with Missouri (6), but are one of only two member schools with an under .500 record in postseason play to have added Big 12 hardware to their trophy case. A&M won it all in 2008, while Colorado (8) hoisted the inaugural trophy in 1997. Only one league school, Oklahoma (17), has turned 10-or-more overall tournament victories into more than two championship titles. Iowa State (20) and Texas (15) hold the most and third-most postseason tourney wins, but only combine for three titles with the Cyclones in 2000 and 2001 and the Longhorns in 2003.
- The Aggies earned a first-round bye for the fourth consecutive season under head coach Gary Blair and the veteran leadership of Starks, Gant and Micheaux. They are one of only two league schools and senior classes to earn one of four top seeds over the last four years next to Baylor. Also of note, A&M is the only Big 12 team to make consecutive semifinal appearances over the last three years, looking to make it a fourth in Oklahoma City.
- The Aggies have beaten the No. 3, No. 6, No. 7, No. 8 (twice) and No. 12 seeds all-time in the tournament. Of their six overall victories, two were against Big 12 South opponents in third-seeded Oklahoma State (2008) and seventh-seed Texas (1998) and the remaining four versus the Big 12 North in sixth-seeded Nebraska (2006), eighth-seeded Colorado (2007), 12th-seeded Missouri (2008) and eighth-seeded Iowa State (2008). A&M has faced eight of the 11 member schools in postseason play and have appeared once in the championship game since the league's formation.

### ON THE NATIONAL FRONT

The Aggies rank among the top 20 leaders in five NCAA statistical categories as of March 8 including third in turnover margin (7.0), fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense (25.8), 10th in steals per game (11.9), 16th in scoring defense (54.2) and 20th in scoring margin (13.5). They are seven shy of turning in the fifth-most steals in program history with 345 on the season. Meanwhile, Danielle Gant ranks among the top 50 players in the country in field-goal percentage with a 50.3 accuracy from the floor which is sixth-best in the Big 12 through all games played.

#### IN YOUR FACE D

The Texas A&M defense has forced four of its last five opponents to turn over the ball more than 20 times in a ballgame. Texas (29), Oklahoma (29) and Kansas State (23) each had season-highs in the turnover department against the Aggies for a combined 81. Oklahoma State was the newest addition to the mix with 22 miscues on March 5. A&M currently leads the league in turnover margin with opponents averaging 22.5 miscues per game.

#### THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

The Aggies have protected their home court well over the last four seasons with an unprecedented 57-5 (.919) overall success rate at Reed Arena. They compiled a 13-1 record at home this season including a season-high 49-point blowout of Texas State (94-45) on Dec. 13 and a league-high 43-rout of Nebraska (86-43) on Feb. 8.

#### **JUST THE 10 OF US**

The Aggies turned in their fourth-straight 10-win campaign and fourth overall since the league's inception. They posted an unprecedented four-year league record of 46-18 (.719). A&M is among a select few teams who have turned in four consecutive 10-win seasons since 2006 including Oklahoma (55-9) and Baylor (47-17). A&M seniors Takia Starks, Danielle Gant and La Toya Micheaux led their team to the third-most wins in the last four years against league foes, behind OU seniors Courtney Paris, Ashley Paris and Carolyn Winchester and BU seniors Rachel Allison, Jhasmin Player and Jessica Morrow.

#### MOVE TO THE HEAD OF THE CLASS

Since their arrival on campus, the 2009 Senior Class has led the Aggies to an impressive 100-30 (.769) overall record to date. The impact that Starks, Gant and Micheaux have made on the A&M women's basketball program has surpassed the 2008 Senior Class and their overall record of 93-39 (.705) during their four-year careers to move to the head of all senior classes in school history. That memorable class included current WNBA players Morenike Atunrase (San Antonio Silver Stars) and A'Quonesia Franklin (Sacramento Monarchs) as well as Patrice Reado, current athletic assistant Katy Pounds and LaToya Gulley.

#### **20-20 VISION**

The Aggies turned in in their fourth consecutive 20-win season under head coach Gary Blair and ninth all-time in program history with a 76-65 win over Texas on Feb. 21. It marked the first time that A&M has turned in four-straight successful seasons over the 20-win benchmark. Last season, the Aggies put together the most victories in school history with a 29-8 record in 2007-08. Overall, Blair has guided 18 teams combined at Stephen F. Austin (7), Arkansas (7) and A&M (4) to 20-win campaigns. The Aggies finished 24-9 in the inaugural season in 1974-75, 26-18 in 1978-79, 23-8 in 1993-94, 21-9 in 1994-95, 20-12 in 1995-96, 23-9 in 2005-06 and 25-7 in 2006-07.

#### **MOVING UP THE CHARTS**

Three A&M seniors continue to move up the all-time career charts. Takia Starks ranks second all-time in career scoring with 1,876 points to date, while Danielle Gant is fourth with 1,533 points to date. Starks (747) and Gant (601) also rank first and third all-time in field goals made. Starks became the school's all-time leader in career three-pointers made (174) on Feb. 4.

#### **HOT-SHOOTING AGGIES**

Texas A&M shot a season-high 61.0 percent from the floor (36-of-59) and claimed their largest margin of victory (+43) against a Big 12 Conference opponent in school history with an 86-43 rout of Nebraska on Feb. 8. It marked the first time A&M shot better than 60 percent from the field since a 63.8 percent shooting performance against McNeese State on Nov. 21, 2006 in non-conference play. The Aggies have never shot 60 percent or better in a Big 12 game since the league's inception in 1996-97. Their previous high was 54.9 percent against Missouri on Jan. 31, 1998 in regular-season action as well as 57.6 percent versus seventh-seeded Texas in the first round of the Big 12 Tournament in Kansas City on March 3, 1998.

### **BIG BROTHER, LITTLE SISTER**

Texas A&M women's basketball freshman forward Adaora Elonu and her big brother, A&M men's basketball junior forward/center Chinemelu Elonu, became only the second known brother-sister combination to ever compete and start for the Aggies at the same time. The Houston natives were both highlyrecruited players out of Alief Elsik High School and hail from a family of five children with Nigerian roots. The most famous and memorable Aggie brother-sister combo was former NFL linebacker and second-round draft pick John Roper (1985-87) and All-Southwest Conference Decade Team member and third all-time leading scorer Donna Roper (1986-89) in the late 80's. Ironically, the Ropers were both from the Houston area and attended Jack Yates High School. The Elonus are one of just three current Aggie siblings who are competing for A&M this season. The list includes sisters Natalie and Cydne Currie in women's soccer and brothers Jamie and Terrence McCoy in football.

#### **A&M LANDS SOLID RECRUITING CLASS**

The Texas A&M women's basketball program landed one of the top recruiting classes in the nation with the signing of four top-rated high school players who will join the nationally-ranked Aggies for the 2009-10 season as announced by head coach Gary Blair on Nov. 12. A&M's heralded recruiting class is comprised of six-foot combination guard/forward Cierra Windham from Corona, Calif., 6-foot-3 post player Diamond Ashmore from Midwest City, Okla., 6-foot-1 wing player Kristi Bellock from River Ridge, La., and 5-foot-7 point guard Adrienne Pratcher from Memphis, Tenn. The early signing period ended on Nov. 19 with one additional scholarship available.

#### BAYLOR RECAP Baylor 64, Texas A&M 60

- For the 12th time this season, Texas A&M used the starting lineup of Sydney Colson, Takia Starks, Tanisha Smith, Danielle Gant and La Toya Micheaux (9-3).
- The 2009 Senior Class has now led A&M to a third-place finish or higher in all four years of their careers in Aggieland.
- Four of the last five meetings between A&M and Baylor have now been decided by five points or less in the all-time series.
- Danielle Gant recorded her 18th career double-double and sixth of the season with a team-high 16 points and season-high tying 13 rebounds against Baylor. She also turned in her seventh double-digit rebounding game of the season which marked the 23rd of her career. Gant had a career-high tying and season-high six steals in the ballgame.
- Tanisha Smith registered her 13th game this season in double figures with 14 against the Lady Bears. It marked the second time of her career to reach double-digits versus BU next to a team-and career-high 19 points on Jan. 21.

#### **AGGIE NOTABLE QUOTABLES**

"Instead of looking at the Baylor tape, we looked at last year's Big 12 Tournament highlights of all three ballgames. I wanted our kids to realize that we are playing the best basketball we've played all year, even if we lost our last game at Baylor. Not many teams were going to win in that situation (Senior Day on the road). We gave it our best shot. I told our team, that we are more talented than last year's team throughout the lineup. We might not have the experience we had at the point guard position, but that's about it. I like our team. I think we have a chance to go as far or further than we did last year, if we can get hot, get a few breaks, be consistent and work on end-of-game situations better than we have this year. This team is playing very good basketball right now and is ready for the playoffs. This team wants to go to the Big 12 Tournament. We are trying to improve our seeding and we are trying to improve our basketball team. We are not trying to hold on, but go on." — Texas A&M head coach Gary Blair on last year's team going into the Big 12 Tournament without a loss to this year's team going in with a loss

"I take a little bit of pride in always finishing higher than what we were supposed to. The only year that we didn't was last year when we were picked first and we finished tied for third with the fourth seed." – Coach Blair on being picked fifth and finishing tied for third in the final league standings

"Whoever our next opponent is. We are good enough, but we are not dominant enough to look past anyone. Last year, a five lost to a 12 seed with Oklahoma and that was a pretty darn good five seed. We can't look past anyone. The only team who can be caught looking past is Oklahoma. They have the most to lose (with a one seed on the line). Everyone else No. 2 through No. 6 is pretty well set in the NCAA Tournament. It just depends on how well they play and if they can move up a little (in seeding)." – Coach Blair on who he thinks A&M's toughest competition will be at the Big 12 Tournament

"It's huge, because once every 15 years its going to happen where someone comes in and wins four-straight games in the Big 12 Tournament, men or women. It's happened once in the women's game with Oklahoma (in 2004). It's tough to do and particularly, if you go in and end up playing four great teams. People tend to forget the Big 12 Tournament is a championship which guarantees you a spot (in the NCAA Tournament). Last year, it moved us up from a third seed to a two seed." – Coach Blair on having a first-round bye at the Big 12 Tournament

"I'm always excited about the Big 12 Tournament. We are looking forward to it and catching some of the early first-round games. Having a first-round bye, takes away some of the pressure for us. We are playing well as a team right now and hopefully, we will keep it up in the tournament." – Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks on heading to the Big 12 Tournament



The Aggies went on a 26-5 run through the first 12 minutes of the contest as Mercer turned over the ball 19 times in the first half alone. A&M took advantage of a 41-15 lead at halftime. It marked the fourth-fewest points scored by an A&M opponent in a half.

Preseason Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year Tyra White registered a team-high 13 points as the Aggies cleared the bench with all but three players contributing to the final score. Senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant was the only other player to score in doubles figures with 12 to catapult her into the top 10 all-time in career scoring at A&M.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks and preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Tanisha Smith added nine apiece, while freshman Adaora Elonu was the team's leading rebounder with eight boards to go along with eight points in her official Aggie debut.

Mercer (0-1) made a comeback in the second half by improving their shooting from the floor to 34.8 percent which resulted in 30 of the team's final 45 points. The Bears were led by Oklahoma State senior transfer Natasha Doh who registered a game-high 15 points.

After a slow start by both teams, sophomore point guard Sydney Colson came off the bench to spark the Aggie offense scoring seven-straight points including a three to put A&M ahead, 21-20, with 1:24 to go in the first half. Colson, who is coming off surgery on a torn ACL in June, ended the night with 12 points, three assists and two steals in 22 minutes of play.

Pitt's top returning player Shavonte Zellous had two quick fouls in under two minutes of the ballgame, but scored 23 points to lead the Panthers (0-1). She went 3-for-16 from the floor, but was 14-for-16 from the free throw line.

Preseason Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year Tyra White led the Aggies in the scoring column for the second-straight game with a team-high 13 including back-to-back three-pointers with under eight minutes remaining that stretched A&M's lead out to as many as nine.

The Aggies outrebounded Pitt, 42-37, behind the board work of senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant who had a game-high 13 along with nine points which was just short of a double-double. The win also marked A&M's fourth all-time win over a nationally-ranked opponent in non-conference play.

TUCSON, Ariz. – Senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant turned in her first double-double of the season with a game-high 12 points and 10 rebounds as No. 5 Texas A&M held off Arizona, 54-44, at Lute and Bobbi Olson Court at the McKale Center.

Gant's double-double was the 13th of her career, while A&M set a program milestone with its first-ever road victory in the all-time series versus Arizona (3-2) in Tucson. The win also catapulted the Aggies to one of their best starts in school history with an unblemished 4-0 record which includes three consecutive victories on the road.

After a 9-4 run by Arizona in the opening minutes of the game, A&M stepped up its defensive pressure and took the Wildcats deep into the shot clock on their possessions. Freshman reserve Sydney Carter knocked down a three-pointer at the 9:05 minute mark to relinquish the lead, 13-11, and the Aggies never trailed again.

A&M held Arizona to a season-low 24.5 percent (12-of-49) shooting from the floor, but the Wildcats were able to stay in the ballgame by going nearly perfect from the free throw line making 20-of-23 charity attempts including 13 of their 23 first-half points with a 92.9 percent accuracy rate.

In the second half of play, the Aggies pushed the lead out to as many as 13 points as Carter hit the front end of a one-and-one from the free throw line. A&M led most of the second half by double digits, but Arizona got within four with a jumper by Reiko Thomas with under two and a half minutes to go, 48-44. A&M remained composed as Gant and Carter combined for A&M's 6-0 scoring run in the final stretch to hold off the Wildcats' last second-attempt at an unset.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks was the only other A&M player in double figures with 10 points and a season-high seven rebounds, despite a sprained ankle in the first half.

Carter's three-pointer from downtown broke a 52-52 tie with 4:31 left in regulation and senior All-America candidate Takia Starks added another three to push the A&M lead out to 58-54. Starks, who was named the tournament MVP after averaging 18.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals in two games played including a 61-57 win over Penn State on Friday, had 17 for the Aggies. She was joined on the all-tournament team by Gant and Carter as well as Miranda Ayim who led Pepperdine with 14 points.

A&M led by as many as 16 with 2:26 left to go in the first and went into the locker room with a 33-25 lead. Carter scored 13 of her 17 in the first half alone. She turned in a flawless 7-of-7 performance from the line coupled with two threes in the Aggies' 14-4 run in the opening minutes of the contest.

The Waves cut the lead to under double digits as the Aggies committed 13 of their 28 turnovers of the game in the second half of play. Four consecutive free throw makes by Pepperdine's Skye Barnett put the Waves within four and a lay-in by Lauren Bell closed the gap to two, 52-50, with 6:17 remaining. Bell later tied it up at 52-all with a fast break layup in traffic.

Head coach Gary Blair, who coached the Ladyjacks from 1985-93, was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame at halftime with words from University President Dr. Baker Pattillo and several of his former SFA players in attendance for the special occasion.

Three A&M players reached double figures including a careerand game-high 17 points by freshman Adaora Elonu who also added six rebounds to the winning cause. Preseason Big 12 Conference Newcomer of the Year Tanisha Smith and preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year Tyra White each added 13.

The Aggies never trailed in the contest and led by as many as 43 points with 3:05 remaining in regulation. It marked A&M's largest margin of victory over an opponent and the fewest points scored by an opponent this season.

The A&M defense held the Ladyjacks to an opponent seasonlow 25.5 percent shooting from the floor (12-of-47) including 16 percent on 4-of-25 shooting in the first half of play. SFA committed

29 turnovers in the game which resulted in 29 of A&M's total points. Natashia Green led the Ladyjacks with 12.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – No. 4 Texas A&M rolled to its eighthstraight victory of the season with an 80-48 blowout of former Southwest Conference rival SMU before a season-high crowd of 3,563 at Reed Arena.

It marked the Aggies' eighth-straight win on their home court, having been tested on the road for six of its first seven games of the season to continue on their best-ever start in school history.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks scored 14 of her game-and season-high 21 points in the first half of play as the Aggies took a 43-18 advantage into halftime. Starks moved into third all-time in career scoring with 1,525 career points to date.

Two other Aggies joined Starks in the double-figure column with 13 from senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant who scored A&M's first five points of the ballgame and freshman Adaora Elonu who added a near double-double performance with 12 points and eight rebounds to the mix.

The Mustang offense had no chance against the A&M defense which has now held six of its eight opponents this season to under 32 percent shooting from the floor and 20 percent accuracy from beyond the three-point arc.

SMU (2-5) hit only 30.4 percent (17-of-56) of its field goals and 18.8 percent (3-of-16) of its three-point attempts for the game. Brittany Gilliam turned in a team-high 18 points and eight rebounds as the Mustangs remained without a road win in three tries this season.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – No. 3 Texas A&M remained undefeated on an already record-breaking season with a 64-50 victory over No. 24 TCU before 5,395 fans at Reed Arena.

The Aggies improved their school-record start to a perfect 10-0, while the Lady Frogs dropped their second-straight top 25 matchup to fall to 8-4 on the season. The win marked the first time in school history that A&M has beaten two top 25 non-conference opponents in regular-season action next to a 56-50 win over No. 23 Pittsburgh in the State Farm Tip-Off Classic on Nov. 16.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks knocked down a season-high tying 21 points including 18 in the first half which was three points less than TCU's overall team score at halftime, 35-21. The A&M defense caused havoc for the Lady Frogs from the get-go as they committed three quick turnovers in the opening minutes of the ballgame and 13 total in the first half alone which was more than the team's season average of 12.4 which ranked No. 6 nationally among NCAA statistical leaders.

TCU was able to close the gap to as few as six on two free throw makes by Micaela Younger with 13:33 remaining in regulation, 41-35, but it wasn't enough to hold off the Aggies who have now won 36 straight against non-conference opponents at home.

Freshman Adaora Elonu was the only other Aggie player to reach double figures with 10 points, while senior center La Toya Micheaux added a career-high tying 14 rebounds and sophomore point guard Sydney Colson dished out eight assists in the winning

cause. Meanwhile, TCU was paced by TK LaFleur, a junior transfer from Nebraska, who turned in a game-high 22 points.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – Senior All-America candidates Takia Starks and Danielle Gant combined for the entire opponent team total in No. 3 Texas A&M's 83-51 blowout of No. 25 New Mexico before 5,543 at Reed Arena.

It marked the Aggies' third win over a top 25 opponent this season and the largest margin of victory (+32) over a ranked opponent in school history. A&M, off to its best start in 35 seasons of Aggie Basketball, remained undefeated on the season at 11-0, while New Mexico dropped to 11-2.

Gant recorded a game-and season-high 27 points which was one point shy of her career best, while Starks added 24. Both returning All-Big 12 Conference First Team performers led the Aggies to a 22-7 run in the first half behind solid shooting performances. Gant was flawless in the first 12 minutes of regulation scoring 12 points on 5-for-5 shooting from the floor and 2-for-2 from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, Starks connected on a season-best trio of threepointers and moved into first all-time in career field goals made (631) surpassing former A&M standout Lisa Langston who made 627 from 1982-86.

A&M was up by as many as 17 points in the first half, but the Lobos cut the lead to three on a layup by Valerie Kast with 1:56 to go, 31-28. The Aggies went into the lockerroom with a 36-30 advantage.

The second half started off much like the first as A&M jumped out to a 32-8 run and never looked back. They committed a season-low eight turnovers in the game, while the Aggie defense forced the Lobos to cause 26 miscues on the floor. UNM was paced by a 19-point effort from leading scorer Amy Beggin.

**COLLEGE STATION, Texas** – No. 3 Texas A&M extended its schoolrecord start to an undefeated 12-0 and avenged two previous losses to George Washington with a 78-59 win over the Colonials before a season-high crowd of 6,892 at Reed Arena.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks registered a gamehigh 22 points knocking four three-pointers from downtown coupled with a career-high six steals as the Aggies matched their longest win streak in school history. They have won 28 in their last 30-game stretch dating back to a 58-51 win at Kansas in Big 12 Conference play on Jan. 26, 2008.

Senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant turned in her second double-double performance of the season and 14th of her career with 17 points and 10 rebounds to lead A&M to its first-ever victory over GW in three tries. The Colonials (7-6) halted A&M's run in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2007 and beat the Aggies in overtime last December on the road.

Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Tanisha Smith rounded out the Aggies' double-figure scorers with a career-high 16 after opening up the game with back-to-back threes which contributed to 12 first-half points for the junior transfer from Arkansas-Fort Smith.

Starks and Smith combined to score 25 points in the decisive first half, when the Aggies opened a 40-23 lead by the break. Erica Rivera led the Colonials with 13 points in their second consecutive loss to a top 25 opponent.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) – Despite a valiant second-half effort, No. 6 Texas A&M fell to No. 3 Oklahoma, 71-59, at the Lloyd Noble Center.

The Aggies (14-2, 2-1) had been off to their best start in Big 12 Conference play and won three of their last four meetings with the Sooners. Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks scored all of her team-high 19 points in the second half, while senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant added 18 including 10 on 5-of-7 shooting in a low-scoring first half for the Aggies.

Danielle Robinson led the way for the Sooners (13-2, 3-0) with 19 points and 10 assists and was one of three OU players to turn in double-doubles. Whitney Hand had a career-high five three-pointers in six attempts and scored 17 points for OU.

OU's Courtney Paris had 11 points and 14 rebounds to extend her NCAA-record streak of consecutive double-doubles to 108 games, but did not reach double digits in points until 1:01 remained. Her twin sister, Ashley Paris, had 16 points and 10 rebounds for her 12th double-double of the season.

The Aggies cut a 19-point deficit early in the second half to 12 points at 41-29 on a three-point play by Starks with 15:58 left. Hand started a 14-0 Oklahoma run with a put-back, followed by a three-pointer, and another three-pointer by Carlee Roethlisberger gave the Sooners a 55-29 lead with 11:54 left.

Texas A&M, whose only previous loss had come to Florida State on Jan. 5, rallied within 60-51 on another three-point play by Starks with 3:23 left, but after that, Robinson went 4-of-4 from the free-throw line and assisted on two baskets by Courtney Paris to keep the Sooners comfortably ahead.

OU committed 13 first-half turnovers but still led 35-22 at halftime, thanks in part to 4-of-4 three-point shooting by Hand and a 23-11 rebounding advantage.

Starks ended the night with 18 points and four rebounds in 36 minutes of action versus the Lady Bears.

There were 19 lead changes in the ballgame and 17 ties. Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Tanisha Smith came up big for the Aggies (14-3, 2-2) all night with a career-and game-high 19 points and six rebounds including six of the team's first eight points of the game where A&M capitalized on Baylor's early mistakes on the court. The Aggie defense forced the Lady Bears into a season-high tying 20 turnovers for the game.

Both teams shot close to 50 percent in a fast-paced first half, but BU took a 37-34 advantage into halftime on a three-pointer by Jessica Morrow who ended the night with 15 points. Morghan Medlock led the Lady Bears (16-1, 4-0) with 17 points. Wilson, who had the game-winning play, recorded a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds, while Jhasmin Player added 12.

**AMES, Iowa** – No. 4 Texas A&M had a season-low scoring effort which contributed to a 67-50 loss at No. 21 lowa State, 67-50, before a crowd of 10,278 at Hilton Coliseum.

The Cyclones (17-4, 5-2) snapped a three-game winning streak by the Aggies (17-4, 5-3) who remained winless in Ames in seven tries.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks was the only A&M player to score in double figures with a team-high 18 points on 8-of-15 shooting from the floor. The Aggies led only once in the ballgame on a layup by junior Tanisha Smith at the 15:39 minute mark of the first half.

Three Iowa State players reached double digits including a game-high 25 points by Heather Ezell who connected on 7-of-13 three-pointers from downtown including four-straight threes to open up the second half of play which would hamper any comeback made by A&M. The Cyclones would go on to win the battle of the boards with an opponent season-high 43 which matched No. 2 Oklahoma's board count on Jan. 18 in Norman.

Kelsey Bolte had 13 of the Cyclones' 33 first-half points and ended the night with 17, while Amanda Nisleit added 10. With less than six seconds on the game clock, Alison Lacey pushed the ball up the court and heaved a last-second three to send ISU into the lockerroom with a 33-21 lead.

Though the Cyclones shot just 37.5 percent from the field in the first half, they beat the Aggies 11-0 on the offensive glass and scored 12 second-chance points. A&M had a short run courtesy of Starks, senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant and sophomore Sydney Colson after the break, but could not erase its 12-point halftime deficit to any fewer than 10 in the second half. Colson and Gant contributed six points in the road loss.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - No. 4 Texas A&M used a balanced scoring attack in an 86-43 rout of Nebraska at Reed Arena

Ten players contributed to the scoring column in A&M's largest margin of victory (+43) against a Big 12 Conference opponent in school history. It also marked Nebraska's lowest-scoring production of the season and its fewest points ever scored in the series.

Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks and sophomore back-up point guard Sydney Carter each knocked down a teamhigh 13 points, while junior Tanisha Smith added 11.

The Aggies (18-4, 6-3) sought revenge after committing an un-characteristic 30 turnovers in a 73-60 loss in Lincoln a year ago on Jan. 23, 2008. This time around, the A&M defense forced the Cornhuskers (10-12, 1-8) to a season-high 28 turnovers, behind 13 steals in the game courtesy of a career-high five from sophomore point guard Sydney Colson within 12 minutes of play in the first half.

Nebraska opened up the game on a quick 4-0 run, but A&M countered by scoring the next 14-of-18 combined points by both teams. The Aggies took their first lead of the game as senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant converted the fast break layup off of a turnover by Cory Montgomery with 13:53 left in the half, 8-6. A&M never looked back.

The Aggies shot a season-high 61.0 percent knocking down 36-of-59 attempts from the floor and held the Huskers to a season-low 28.3 percent (13-46). Gant and Colson each had nine in

the winning cause, while A&M's bench was responsible for 47 of the team's second-largest offensive output of the season with 86 for the game.

Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Tanisha Smith recorded her first career double-double with a team-high 15 points and 10 rebounds for the Aggies (19-5, 7-4) who bounced back in Big 12 Conference play after a road loss at Texas Tech, A&M picked up its 10th win of the season at Reed Arena.

A&M never trailed in the ballgame and led by as many as 32 points with 35 seconds remaining in regulation. The Aggies mounted a 20-4 run on the Buffaloes in the first 10 minutes of play and held them to two buckets and nine percent shooting from the floor in that span.

Senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant was perfect in that first half going 5-for-5 from the field and 2-for-2 from the charity stripe for all of her 12 points for the game. Meanwhile, preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year Tyra White came off the bench and contributed 12 points and six rebounds to the cause. Senior All-America candidate Takia Starks rounded out the double-figure scorers with 11.

Colorado (10-12, 2-8) suffered its third-straight loss in league play and goes to 0-6 after its final stop against the Big 12 South. The Buffaloes were paced by a 25-point and 10-rebound doubledouble by top player Brittany Spears. CU opened up the second half with nine-straight points to get within 17, but it wasn't enough to overcome its deficit against the Aggies.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas — No. 11 Texas A&M claimed its fifthstraight victory over No. 12 Texas, 76-65, to earn another half-point toward the State Farm Lone Star Showdown standings between the two in-state rivals at Reed Arena.

The Aggies (20-5, 8-4) also turned in their fourth-straight 20-win campaign under Texas A&M head coach Gary Blair and swept the Longhorns (19-7, 7-5) for only the fourth time in program history and third time since the league's inception in 1996-97.

Takia Starks kept her double-digit scoring streak intact against

Takia Starks kept her double-digit scoring streak intact against all Big 12 opponents pouring in 16 of her game-high 18 points in the second half of play. She was one of five A&M players to reach double figures including 12 points and 11 rebounds by Danielle Gant who collided with Texas' Ashleigh Fontenette for a loose ball at the 13:41 minute mark of the second half and did not return to the game. It marked Gant's fifth double-double of the season and 17th of her career in only 26 minutes of action versus the Longhorns.

Texas led for most of the first half and by as many as seven. Gant scored eight-straight points in a span of three and a half minutes to get A&M within one of the Longhorns, 19-18, with under four minutes to go in the half. Sydney Carter hit a three-pointer with 2:34 to go to the tie the game up at 21-all. The Aggies would later make three free throws from Starks and Tanisha Smith to take a 31-27 lead

A&M would continue to wear Texas down in the second half with its pressure defense and forced the Longhorns to a season-high 29 turnovers in the ballgame. Adaora Elonu came off the bench in the second half of play in relief of Gant and turned in back-to-back layups to give the Aggies their biggest lead of the contest and they never looked back. Elonu finished with a league career-high 10

points followed by Smith with 11 and Sydney Colson with 10.

The victory kept the Aggies (22-5, 10-4) in third place in the Big 12 Conference standings with two more games remaining in the regular season. They turned in their fourth-straight 10-win campaign under Texas A&M head coach Gary Blair.

For the second-straight game, the Aggies got scoring production from its bench which included a career-high tying 17 points from freshman Sydney Carter, a career-high eight points from freshman Kelsey Assarian and six points from redshirt freshman Tyra White. A&M's bench accounted for 33 of the team's 71 overall points of the contest against the nation's second-best scoring defense in Kansas State (21-6, 8-6).

Eight players contributed to the scoring column for the Aggies including senior All-America candidate Takia Starks with 15 followed by nine from sophomore Sydney Colson, eight from junior Tanisha Smith and six from senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant.

In the first half, A&M built a 10-point lead on a three-pointer by Carter and a turnaround jumper by Gant to go up 17-7 with 11:20 left on the clock. The Aggie defense forced the Wildcats to seven of its season-high 23 turnovers in the first nine minutes of the ballgame.

Back-to-back threes by K-State's Kari Kincaid cut the lead to nine, 22-13, with under eight minutes to go in the half. A&M would go no to lead by as many as 17 on a Carter fastbreak layup, 30-13, at 4:28. The Aggies took a 38-21 lead into halftime, but the Wildcats would open up the second half with six-straight points and a 12-4 run to cut A&M's lead into single digits. **WACO, Texas** – A valiant second-half rally by No. 8 Texas A&M fell short as No. 5 Baylor held on for a 64-60 victory before a sellout crowd of 10,118 at the Ferrell Center.

The Aggies finished the regular season with a 23-6 overall record and an 11-5 mark in Big 12 Conference play. A&M tied for third place with lowa State (23-7, 11-5) in the final league standings and will enter next week's Phillips 66 Big 12 Women's Basketball Championship on March 12-15 in Oklahoma City as the No. 4 seed. The Aggies will face the winner of either fifth-seeded Kansas State (23-6, 10-6) or 12th-seeded Colorado (11-17, 3-13) in the Big 12 quarterfinals on Friday, March 13 at 1:30 p.m. (CT).

A&M trailed by double digits at halftime, 34-24, but a furious second-half comeback led by junior Tanisha Smith and senior All-America candidate Danielle Gant tied the game at 44-44 with 11:23 remaining in regulation.

For the final 11 minutes of the game, neither team led by more than five points, but Baylor's Jessica Morrow hit three field goals, including a pair of threes and was a perfect 4-for-4 at the free throw line over the final 3:15 to hold off the Aggies. Morrow led the Lady Bears (24-5, 12-4) with a season-high 23 points followed by 13 from fellow senior Jhasmin Player.

Gant scored 11 points in the second half and finished with a team-high 16 points. She also had a career-and game-high six steals and pulled down 13 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the season and the 18th of her career. Smith scored 12 in the second half, including 10 in the first seven minutes, and finished with 14 points, seven rebounds and a team-best six assists with one turnover.


