



2009 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship **FORD CENTER: March 11, 2009**

Game Notes: No. 7 Oklahoma State 81, No. 10 Iowa State 67

Big 12 Championship Notes...

- * With tonight's 81-67 victory, Oklahoma State has defeated Iowa State three consecutive times in Big 12 Championship games. The Cowboys are 3-1 overall versus the Cyclones in Big 12 Championship history.
- * Overall, OSU holds a 59-52 all-time series lead but has won 10 of the last 12 and 21 of the last 26 contests versus Iowa State.
- * The Cowboys improved to 7-0 in first round games in the Big 12 Championship.
- * The Cowboys committed just five turnovers tonight, which tied their Big 12 Championship mark set 3/12/05 versus Kansas. It's just the seventh time this season that they have committed fewer than 10 turnovers in a contest.

Individual & Team Notes...

- * Oklahoma State improves to 21-10 overall, and Iowa State falls to 15-17 on the season. The Cowboys advance to the Big 12 Championship quarterfinals tomorrow night where they will face the No. 2 seed Oklahoma Sooners.
- * OSU ranks fifth nationally in three-point makes a game (9.5 3FGM/Game). Tonight it was 10-26 (38.5% 3FG).
- * The Cowboys shot 92.9% from line (13-14 FT), marking the second time this season they have shot above 90 percent from the charity stripe. For the season, OSU has shot 74.2% from the line.
- * Despite starting four guards, Oklahoma State outscored Iowa State 34-8 in the paint.
- * Oklahoma State forward Marshall Moses netted a team- and career-high tying 18 points.
- * Guard James Anderson finished with 14 points. Anderson has scored in double figures in 10 straight contests. He has scored 20 or more points six times during that span, including 30 or more points three times.
- * With 12 points tonight, Cowboys guard Terrel Harris passed Victor Williams (1,261 points) for 15th on the school's all-time scoring list.
- * Cyclone forward Craig Brackins recorded his 15th points/rebound double-double of the season with a game-high 23 points and 12 rebounds. In addition, he has led the Cyclones in scoring each of the last 14 games.
- * Brackins surpassed the 1,000-point mark in his career with 23 points against the Cowboys and now has scored 1,011 points his career. He becomes the fifth player in ISU history to record 1,000 points in the first two seasons as a Cyclone and just the third ISU sophomore to accomplish the feat.
- * In addition, Brackins became the third player in school history to record 600 points and 300 rebounds in one season. Jeff Grayer (811 pts./300 reb. – 1988) and Zaid Abdul-Aziz (619 points/334 reb. – 1967; 604 pts./365 reb. – 1968) are the other members of the 600-point/300-rebound club.
- * ISU's Diante Garrett dished out a team-high five assists. With the five assists, Garrett moved past Charles Harris for 19th on the all-time career assist leaders list. The sophomore now has 252 career assists.
