• **BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP SUCCESS UNDER BARNES ...** Texas has reached at least the semifinal round of the Big 12 Championship in eight of its first 10 trips under Rick Barnes. The Horns have advanced to the Big 12 Championship game in three straight and four of the last five years.

• **THE BALBAY IMPACT ...** In his eight starts to end the regular season, **Dogus Balbay** has averaged 6.8 points per game with a 49-to-14 assist-to-turnover ratio.

• **PITTMAN'S PROGRESS ...** **Dexter Pittman** has averaged 16.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game while hitting 12-of-19 (.631) field goals over the last two contests.

Texas in Conference Tournaments

Texas holds a 36-31 (.537) all-time record in league tournament games, including a 15-12 (.556) mark in its previous 12 trips to the Big 12 Championship. In 10 appearances during the Rick Barnes era, Texas has posted a 13-10 (.565) mark in the Big 12 Championship. **The Horns have reached at least the semifinal round in nine of their first 12 appearances in the Big 12 Championship, including eight of their first 10 trips under Barnes.** Texas has reached the finals of its conference tournament 10 times in the last 18 years, including five times in the Southwest Conference (1991, 1992, 1994, 1995 and 1996) and five times in the Big 12 (2001, 2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008). **The Longhorns have advanced to the title game of the Big 12 Championship in three straight and four of the last five years (2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008).** UT has claimed two league postseason tournament titles, both coming during its time in the SWC (1994 and 1995).

Unfamiliar Territory

For just the second time in Rick Barnes' 11 years at Texas, the Horns did not receive a first-round bye in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. The only other time Texas failed to accomplish this feat came during the 2004-05 season, when the Horns tied for fifth in the league (No. 6 seed in the Championship) with a 9-7 conference record.

A Check of the Polls

Texas is not ranked in the latest Associated Press poll (March 2) or in the latest ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll (March 2). **In the polls released on Feb. 9, UT had its streak of consecutive weeks ranked in The AP Top 25 stopped at 37 straight (dating back to the poll on Feb. 19, 2007) and its streak of consecutive weeks ranked in the ESPN/USA Today poll stopped at 39 straight (Feb. 19, 2007).** During the Barnes era, the Horns have spent 141 weeks in The AP Top 25, including 60 in the Top 10.

Series vs. Colorado

Wednesday's contest marks the 21st meeting between Texas and Colorado. UT holds a 12-8 lead in the all-time series which dates back to a 90-75 Colorado win in Boulder on Dec. 11, 1967. The Horns have won four straight against the Buffaloes entering

Did You Know ?

Facts on the Texas Basketball program

- Texas is one of just three schools to have advanced to at least the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament in five of the last seven years, joining Duke (5) and Kansas (5).
- Texas is one of just eight programs to have advanced to each of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments, joining Arizona, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State and Wisconsin.
- Texas is the only school in the country that can claim two National Player of the Year winners in the last six years (T.J. Ford in 2003; Kevin Durant in 2007).
- Texas has produced three consensus first-team All-Americans over the last six seasons, the top total in the country during this stretch (Ford in 2003; Durant in 2007; Augustin in 2008).
- Texas is the only school in the nation to have a Top 10 pick in each of the last three NBA Drafts (LaMarcus Aldridge, No. 2 in 2006; Kevin Durant, No. 2 in 2007; D.J. Augustin, No. 9 in 2008).
- Texas has produced four Top 10 NBA Draft picks in the last six years, the top total in the nation during this stretch.

Wednesday's game, including an 85-76 overtime victory in Boulder earlier this year (Feb. 14). **Texas is 11-3 against Colorado during the Rick Barnes era entering Wednesday's contest.** The Horns are 2-1 all-time against Colorado in Big 12 Championship play.

Improving Offense with Balbay at the Point

Beginning with UT's home game against Oklahoma State on Feb. 10, **Dogus Balbay** was inserted into the starting lineup at the point guard spot. Since this change was made, Texas has been a much improved and more efficient team at the offensive end of the court. The Longhorns have a 5-3 record since inserting Balbay into the starting lineup.

Texas-Kansas Game Notes

- The Longhorns built a 14-point advantage (44-30) with 1:40 left in the first half.
- Texas hit 56.7% (17-of-30) from the floor in the opening 20 minutes, including a 3-of-5 (.600) mark from beyond the arc. The Horns were held to 27.6% (8-of-29) FG shooting in the second half, including an 0-of-7 mark from three-point range.

□ The Horns posted a 33-32 advantage on the glass. This marked the 25th time in 30 games this year Texas had outrebounded its opponent.

□ **Damion James** (26 points) reached the 20-point mark for the fifth time this year and the 10th time in his career (103 games). He reached double digits in points for the 27th time this season and the 65th time in his career.

□ **Dexter Pittman** (16 points) reached double digits in points for the 12th time this year and the 15th time in his career (95 games). Pittman also tied his career high in blocks (three).

□ **A.J. Abrams** (10 points) reached double digits in points for the 22nd time this year and the 90th time in his career (139 games).

□ **Dogus Balbay** tied his career highs in minutes played (38), steals (three) and blocks (two).

□ **Justin Mason** tied his season high in minutes played (38).

20 Wins ... Again

With their victory against Baylor (March 2), the Longhorns reached the 20-win mark for the 10th consecutive season. Texas has reached the 30-win plateau in two of the last three years (31-7 in 2007-08 and 30-7 in 2005-06). UT's current streak of 10 straight 20-win campaigns is a school record. Prior to the current streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92).

In "Sweet" Company

Texas has reached the NCAA "Sweet 16" five times in the last seven years. **The Longhorns are one of just three schools to accomplish this feat, joining Duke (5) and Kansas (5).** Texas has made 10 trips to the "Sweet 16" since 1960. UT made "Sweet 16" appearances in 1960 (25-team tournament), 1963 (25-team tournament), 1972 (25-team tournament), 1997, 2002 and 2004. Texas also advanced to the "Elite Eight" in 1990, 2006 and 2008 and the Final Four in 2003.

An "Elite" Program

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last three years and three times in the last six seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

10-in-a-Row

With their bid to the 2008 NCAA Tournament, the Longhorns extended their school-record streak of consecutive NCAA appearances to 10. **Texas has advanced to the Big Dance in each of Rick Barnes' 10 previous seasons in Austin.** Prior to the Barnes era, UT's previous mark for consecutive NCAA Tournament bids was four (set twice).

Beating the Best

The Feb. 21 home win against No. 2 Oklahoma marked the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Horns have defeated in a home

game in school history. The victory also equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. **Five of UT's eight all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come in the Rick Barnes era.**

Sherron Collins posted a team-high 21 points and seven assists to pace the Jayhawks to a 10-point win before a sellout crowd at Allen Fieldhouse and a CBS national television audience. The contest proved to be a tale of two halves. Texas hit 56.7% (25-of-59) from the floor in the opening half and took a 44-37 advantage into half-time. In the final 20 minutes, Kansas outscored the Horns by a 46-29 margin by converting 14-of-26 (.538) field goals and limiting Texas to 27.8% (8-of-29) FG shooting. The first half featured eight lead changes and seven ties. Trailing 11-9 following a Damion James three-pointer at the 15:12 mark, the Jayhawks used back-to-back threes from Brady Morningstar to grab a 15-11 advantage with 14:09 remaining. Texas responded with back-to-back jumpers from James to tie the score at 15-15 at the 12:01 mark. The game featured five more ties over the next four minutes, the latest coming after a Markieff Morris layup knotted the contest at 26-26 with 7:59 left. The Horns then used a Connor Atchley layup, a pair of Dexter Pittman free throws and a Justin Mason jumper to build a 32-26 cushion at the 6:06 mark. Leading 36-30 following a Collins jumper with 4:36 left, Texas used a James jumper, a Pittman layup, two free throws from James and a Dogus Balbay layup to extend its advantage to 44-30 at the 1:40 mark. Kansas closed the half with a momentum-changing seven straight points to trim the gap to 44-37 at the break. James paced Texas with 20 of his game-high 26 points in the opening 20 minutes (8-of-10 FG). After a pair of James free throws gave the Horns a 46-39 advantage at the 18:35 mark, Kansas ran off six straight points to close the margin to 46-45 following a Mario Little jumper with 16:38 left. Texas responded with a Clint Chapman jumper and a Mason layup to take a 50-45 lead at the 15:57 mark. Trailing 56-52 following a Gary Johnson jumper with 13:01 remaining, Kansas used a Collins layup and a Tyshawn Taylor jumper to tie the score at 56-56 at the 11:37 mark. The Horns ran off five straight points to build a 61-56 cushion following a Pittman dunk with 10:46 left. Kansas responded with six straight points to take a 62-61 advantage after a Markieff Morris follow slam at the 9:10 mark. The contest saw two lead changes and two ties over the next two minutes, the latest coming after a pair of James free throws evened the count at 65-65 with 7:31 left. Four straight free throws by Cole Aldrich gave the Jayhawks a 69-65 cushion at the 6:19 mark. The Horns closed to within two points on three separate times over the next two minutes, the final time after a pair of A.J. Abrams free throws pulled Texas within 73-71 at the 4:08 mark. Kansas sealed the game's outcome with a Morningstar three, a Taylor dunk and two Collins free throws to build an 80-71 cushion with 1:21 left. The Horns were not able to convert a field goal in the final 4:49 of the contest. Joining James in double-figure scoring for Texas were Pittman (16) and Abrams (10). Aldrich (12 points, 10 boards) and Taylor (11) joined Collins in double-digit scoring for Kansas.

Strength of Schedule

To say the Longhorns have played a difficult schedule this season would be a gross understatement. UT has posted a 3-4 mark this year against the AP Top 25. **During its non-league schedule, Texas faced two opponents each from the Big East Conference, the Big Ten Conference and the Pac-10 Conference and one from the Southeastern Conference.** In addition, the Horns scrimmaged No. 20/20 Davidson and No. 10/11 Gonzaga in the preseason.

Defense Wins

Solid defense continues to be a Texas trademark under coach Rick Barnes. In its first 30 games this year, Texas has held its opponents to an average of 65.7 points per contest and a combined 41.0% FG shooting. **UT has limited 15 of its first 30 opponents to under 40% FG shooting, including two to under 30% FG shooting.** Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 180 of their 370 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 163-17 (.906) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat (12-3 record this year).**

More Defensive Details

□ Texas held Stetson (Nov. 14) to 38 points on 26.0% FG shooting (13-of-50). This marked a tie for the fifth-lowest shooting percentage by a UT opponent since the 1960-61 season. The Horns limited Stetson to just one field goal over the first 11:16 of the game.

□ Texas held Tulane (Nov. 18) to 51 points on 31.0% FG shooting (18-of-58).

□ The Horns limited Saint Joseph's (Nov. 24) to 29.3% FG shooting (17-of-58).

□ Texas held Oregon (Nov. 26) without a field goal for a span of 12:29 in the first half (from 15:49 to 3:20).

□ UT limited Rice (Nov. 30) to 25.9% FG shooting (7-of-27) in the second half.

□ The Horns held No. 15/12 Villanova (Dec. 9) to 38.0% FG shooting (19-of-50), including a 4-of-18 (.222) mark from beyond the arc.

□ Texas limited Appalachian State (Jan. 2) to 43 points on 30.2% FG shooting (16-of-53), including a 3-of-18 (.167) mark from three-point range.

□ The Horns held Iowa State (Jan. 10) to 38.8% FG shooting (26-of-67), including a 9-of-28 (.321) mark in the first half.

□ Texas limited Texas Tech (Jan. 17) to 34.0% FG shooting (18-of-53). The Longhorns held the Red Raiders scoreless for a span of 6:47 in the first half (from 17:14 to 10:27).

□ UT held Baylor (Jan. 27) to 37.5% FG shooting (24-of-64), including a 9-of-31 (.290) mark in the first half.

□ The Horns limited Colorado to 1-of-8 FG shooting (.125) in the decisive overtime session (Feb. 14), including an 0-of-4 mark from beyond the arc.

□ Texas held Baylor (March 2) to season lows in points (57) and FG percentage (31.6). The Longhorns held the Bears to 7-of-25 FG shooting (.280) in the first half.

Cleaning the Glass

Texas has outrebounded its opponent in 25 of its first 30 games. The Longhorns recorded a 41-29 edge on the glass during the home win against Baylor (March 2). UT posted a 41-29 rebound margin during the home win against Texas A&M (Jan. 24). He was a successful pitcher during his high school days. Balbay's Near Triple-Double

Sophomore guard **Dogus Balbay** had one of his finest all-around performances during the home win against No. 2/2 Oklahoma (Feb. 21). **Balbay nearly recorded just the second triple-double in school history, as he posted 10 points (5-of-9 FG), nine assists against just two turnovers and eight rebounds in 34 minutes.** Reggie Freeman registered the lone triple-double in UT history with 22 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists at TCU on Feb. 11, 1996.

Balbay Impressive in Starting Role

Dogus Balbay has made the most of his first eight career starts. **In these last eight games, Balbay has averaged 6.8 points per contest while recording 49 assists against just 14 turnovers.** During the home win against Oklahoma State (Feb. 10), he posted 10 points (5-of-9 FG), seven assists against just one turnover and two steals in 33 minutes. In his first collegiate season, **Dogus Balbay** has been much more productive and efficient since the start of Big 12 Conference play. **During UT's 16 regular-season league contests, Balbay posted 69 assists against just 20 turnovers (a 3.5-to-1 ratio).** He also has averaged 5.0 ppg and 3.2 rpg while hitting 35-of-67 (.522) field goals in 25.9 minutes per contest.

Background on Balbay

Dogus Balbay missed UT's season opener against Stetson due to a violation of the NCAA's amateurism rules which occurred prior to his enrollment at Texas. The NCAA determined that Balbay participated in a total of 11 games for a professional team in Turkey during the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons. The NCAA penalized Balbay on a 1-for-1 basis, meaning that each game Balbay played professionally in Turkey equaled one game that he

would be withheld from competition at UT. Balbay injured his right knee on Oct. 4 and had surgery on Oct. 30 last year. He was medically cleared to play prior to UT's game at Texas Tech on March 1. Since Balbay did not participate in UT's final 10 games of the 2007-08 season (beginning with the game at Texas Tech), he served 10 of his 11-game suspension last year. He made his collegiate debut against Tulane (Nov. 18).

Balbay's International Experience

After fully recovering from his right knee injury and going through spring individual workouts, **Dogus Balbay returned home to Turkey to play for his country this summer.** Balbay led Turkey to a fourth-place finish at the Under-20 European Championships (Riga, Latvia) on August 1-10. He ranked fourth on the team in scoring (8.3 ppg), led the squad in assists (4.9 apg) and minutes played (29.0 mpg) and ranked second in steals (10) and third in rebounding (4.1 rpg) during the eight-game tourney.

Pittman Producing

Junior center **Dexter Pittman** ranks fourth on the team in scoring (9.2 ppg) and third in rebounding (4.6 rpg) in just 14.7 minutes per contest. He has converted a team-best 61.0% (100-of-164) field goals and 77-of-104 (.740) free throws. **Pittman has reached double figures in scoring 12 times in the first 30 games after achieving the feat just three times in his first two seasons (65 games).** He posted his third double-double this year with 13 points and 10 rebounds in 20 minutes at Texas A&M (Feb. 16).

Pittman on a Roll

Dexter Pittman enters the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship playing the best basketball of his career. **Over the last two games, Pittman is averaging 16.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per contest while converting 12-of-19 (.631) field goals.** He posted a game-high 16 points (7-of-8 FG, 2-of-4 free throws) and seven rebounds (four offensive) in 23 minutes against Baylor (March 2). Pittman then registered 16 points (5-of-11 FG, 6-of-6 FT), three boards and three blocked shots in 22 minutes at No. 9/9 Kansas.

Dex-a-Trim

Dexter Pittman has dropped nearly 70 pounds since reporting to campus as a freshman at 366 pounds. After a solid showing in spring individual workouts, he attended the prestigious Pete Newell's Big Man Camp in Las Vegas this past summer.

Chapman Looking for More Consistency

Sophomore forward/center **Clint Chapman** returns to the front-court rotation. He played in 35 of 38 games (one start) and averaged 1.3 ppg and 1.4 rpg in 6.6 mpg last year. Chapman has played in 27 of the first 30 games (started the season opener against Stetson) and is averaging 1.9 ppg and 1.6 rpg in 8.4 mpg this year. He tied his career high with six rebounds (three offensive) during the win against No. 15/12 Villanova (Dec. 9) at the Jimmy V Classic. **Chapman tied his career high with seven points and added three boards, two steals and one block in a career-best 22 minutes off the bench in the home win against Texas Tech (Feb. 25).**

Hill Climbs Back into the Rotation

Matt Hill returns for his redshirt sophomore year after missing the entire 2007-08 season with a left heel injury. Last year, he had surgery on his left heel (Dec. 21) and was granted a medical redshirt year. **Hill has played in 20 of UT's first 30 games this season.** During the win at Texas Tech (Jan. 17), he posted six points (3-of-5 FG), five rebounds and one block in a career-high 27 minutes. **The six points marked a season high and the most since he had six against Nicholls State on Nov. 21, 2006.** His five rebounds also marked a season high and the most since he had six against Texas State on Dec. 16, 2006. As a true freshman in 2006-07, he played in 23 games. Hill saw action in all 18 games to start his career prior to a left foot injury that sidelined him on Jan 23. He missed 11 consecutive Big 12 games before returning to play in five of the last six contests that year.

Smith Looking to Expand Backcourt Rotation

Junior guard **Harrison Smith** dropped nearly 20 pounds (went from 213 to 195) during the offseason strength and conditioning program. Smith has seen action in 10 games this season. He played 14 minutes and grabbed three rebounds during the game at No. 6/5 Oklahoma (Jan. 12). He played in 12 games as a sophomore after seeing game action in eight contests as a freshman.

Smith Provides Spark

Harrison Smith has emerged as a valuable part of the backcourt rotation in two of the last three games. He had a career-high 12 points (5-of-9 FG, 2-of-5 threes) and five rebounds in 17 minutes at Oklahoma State (Feb. 28). Smith followed with six points and a career-best six boards in a career-high 21 minutes during the win against Baylor (March 2). **Putting things in perspective, Smith has recorded 18 of his 46 career points and 11 of his 33 career rebounds in two of the last three contests.**

The Lone Freshman

Combo guard **Varez Ward** is the only freshman on the 2008-09 Texas Basketball team. After a solid preseason, he has played in 28 of the first 30 games and is averaging 3.4 points and 2.2 rebounds in 14.4 minutes per game (seventh on the team). He made his first collegiate start during the game at Arkansas (Jan. 6). During the win at Baylor (Jan. 27), Ward tallied eight points (6-of-6 FT), four rebounds and two assists in 16 minutes. He followed with nine points (5-of-7 FT) and four rebounds in 24 minutes against Kansas State (Jan. 31). Ward tallied nine points (5-of-5 FT) in 12 minutes against Oklahoma State (Feb. 10) and recorded eight points and three boards in 28 minutes at Colorado (Feb. 14).

Wangmene Out for Remainder of Season

Sophomore forward/center **Alexis Wangmene** had surgery on his right knee on Dec. 17, and he will miss the remainder of the year. He played in four of the first five games and averaged 3.0 ppg and 3.0 rpg in 6.3 mpg. In the win against Saint Joseph's (Nov. 24), Wangmene had eight points (tied his career high), seven rebounds (one shy of his career high), one block and one steal in just nine minutes off the bench.

Three-Point Streak

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter Wednesday's game having hit at least one 3-pointer in 613 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 741 of 748 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

Horns and the NBA Draft

When D.J. Augustin was taken with the ninth overall selection in the 2008 NBA Draft, it completed quite a three-year run for Texas at the Draft. **UT is the only school in the nation to have a Top 10 pick in each of the last three NBA Drafts.** In fact, Texas is just the fourth school since 1985 (when the current draft lottery system was implemented) to produce a lottery pick in three consecutive years. Georgia Tech (1989-91), Duke (1992-95) and Connecticut (1994-96) previously accomplished the feat. UT has produced four Top 10 picks in the last six years, the top total in the nation during this stretch.

Jai Lucas Transfers to Texas

Former University of Florida guard **Jai Lucas** (first name is pronounced: Jay) has transferred to The University of Texas. Lucas has enrolled in classes for the spring semester at Texas. Per NCAA transfer rules, Lucas is permitted to practice with the Longhorns, but he will not be able to participate in games or travel with the team. Lucas spent his freshman season (2007-08) at Florida and earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team while starting all 36 games for the Gators. He averaged 8.5 ppg and converted a team-best 43.5 percent of his three-point field goal attempts (37-of-85) while helping Florida post a 24-12 record (8-8 SEC, 4th East) and advance to the MasterCard Postseason NIT semifinals. Lucas earned McDonald's All-America and Parade All-America honors during his senior year at Bellaire High School in Houston, as he averaged 26.3 points and 7.5 assists per contest.

Texas Inks Trio in Fall Signing Period

Three high school hoop standouts signed National Letters of Intent during the fall signing period to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. **Avery Bradley (Tacoma, Wash.)**, **Jordan Hamilton (Los Angeles, Calif.)** and **Shawn Williams (Duncanville, Texas)** will join the Horns for the 2009-10 season.

□ Bradley (6-3, 175), a guard from Findlay College Prep (Henderson, Nev.) who plays under coach Michael Peck, is ranked as the No. 8 high school prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and the No. 10 prospect by Scout.com. Bradley played his first three years of high school at Bellarmine Prep in Tacoma. He averaged 25.7 points per game as a junior.

□ Hamilton (6-7, 215), a swingman from Dominguez High School, is ranked as the No. 5 high school prospect in the country by Rivals.com and the No. 13 prospect by Scout.com. Hamilton averaged 27.6 points and 11.1 rebounds per game as a junior.

□ Williams (6-7, 215), a swingman from Duncanville High School who plays under coach Phil McNeely, is ranked as the top player in the state of Texas by TexasHoops.com. He also is ranked as the No. 44 high school prospect in the nation by Scout.com and the No. 64 prospect by Rivals.com. He averaged 17 points and 9.5 rebounds per game as a junior.

Year 11 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in Texas Basketball history, **Rick Barnes** is in his 11th season at Texas and sports a **267-103 (.722)** mark with the Horns. He has compiled a **469-237 (.664)** record in 22 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. Along the way, he has guided his teams to a total of 16 NCAA (current streak of 13 consecutive) and three NIT trips.
