## Game Notes: No. 4 Kansas State 5, No. 5 Kansas 4

## Kansas State (40-15-1, 0-1 in Pool 1)

- Today's game marked Kansas State's third consecutive appearance in the Big 12 Championship. The Wildcats have a 6-6 record in conference championship play.
- With two stolen bases in the opening game, the Wildcats have tied the school record for stolen bases in a single season with 138.
- With two swipes for the day, Adam Muenster moved into a tie for fourth place in the Wildcat record books for career stolen bases with 49.
- Kansas State's 10 hits marks the 39th time this season the Wildcats have recorded double digits in hits.
- Muenster and Dane Yelovich extended their individual hitting streaks to 11 games each. Muenster was 2-for-4 with one RBI, while Yelovich was 1-for-3 on the day.

## Kansas Jayhawks (37-20, 1-0 in Pool 1)

- Kansas has four Big 12 Championship appearances in conference history.
- KU's No. 5 seed is its highest-ever tournament seed at the Big 12 Championship.
- The Jayhawks are now 4-5 in Big 12 Championship play, with three of the five losses by one run.
- Kansas' 15 hits are a Jayhawk Big 12 Championship record.
- Tony Thompson extended his current hitting streak to 14 games, going 4-for-5 at the plate.
- David Narodowski, the 2009 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, hit his fourth home run of the season to score the first run of the 2009 Big 12 Championship.
- Jason Brunansky continued his hitting streak to four games, all against Kansas State, with a 1-for-4 performance in the opening game of the tournament.
- Travis Blankenship extended his league-leading appearances record to 35 after one-third of an inning of relief against K-State in the opening game.
