Big 12 Commissioner Dan Beebe:

On cost-containment and budget issues.....

"Cost-containment strategies are important in today's economy. Our Directors of Athletics voiced their support for national legislation in these areas."

"Cost-containment is important because we want to drive as much revenue as possible back to the schools. We need to be cognizant of returning revenue to our schools so they can support their programs. The Conference itself is going to be stable, but we are trying to help schools make up for any losses."

"Conference activities were also reviewed, such as trying to conduct as many meetings as possible via video conferences."

"We continued to review all of our bowl partners. We received great feedback from our Athletics Directors."

Missouri Director of Athletics Mike Alden:

On cost-containment and budget issues.....

"Some items that were targeted include support for elimination of non-traditional playing seasons, foreign travel, regional track & field championships and elimination of printed media guides. Those are the four principle areas our board feels strongly about."

"The non-traditional playing seasons would not allow them to have organized activities outside their traditional season, or if those activities did take place that they would count towards the number of allowable games played."

"There are a number of schools already doing some of these things. A lot of movement has already taken place - we just want to push for it at a higher level."

On the record Big 12 revenue distribution and the bowl partners

"It's a combination of things. The strength of our conference, the Big 12 brand, our great fans who travel extremely well and television ratings. With all of that an the job Dan has done, it will bear fruit for the entire league."

Note: Missouri serves as chair and spokesperson for the administrative and coaches' groups this season.
