Game Notes: No. 2 Oklahoma 5, No. 7 Texas Tech 2

Postgame Notes...

Oklahoma and Texas Tech met for the eighth time in Big 12 Championship play tonight with the Sooners now owning a 4-3 advantage over the Red Raiders.

Oklahoma (41-16, 1-0 in Pool Two)

- Tonight marked Oklahoma's 13th appearance in the Big 12 Championship. OU and Baylor are the only Big 12 teams to have appeared in every conference tournament.
- The Sooners now stand at 22-20 in the Big 12 Championship.
- Oklahoma leads the overall series with Texas Tech at 31-24-1.
- The Sooners' win marked the 20th come-from-behind win for the team this season.
- With the victory, Oklahoma extended its midweek game record to 13-3 for the season.
- Ross Hubbard tied a career-high with four RBIs in the Sooners' opening win over Tech. He finished the night 2-for-4.
- Andrew Doyle pitched eight innings for the fourth time this season, allowing two runs and scattering four hits while fanning four batters.
- Ryan Duke recorded his 15th save of the season to tie an Oklahoma single-season high for saves by striking out two of the three batters faced.

Texas Tech (24-31, 0-1 in Pool Two)

- Texas Tech has made nine Big 12 Championship appearances.
- The Red Raiders are now 12-19 in Big 12 tournament play.
- Chris Richburg extended his team-best hitting streak to nine games, as he went 1-for-4 with one RBI for the night.
- Jeremy Mayo has caught 23 baserunners stealing in a single season. He finished second in the Big 12 in this category for the season.
- Willie Rueda had his career-high 11 game hitting streak snapped, as he finished 0-for-4 at the plate.
- A.J. Ramos was charged with his fifth loss of the season, surrendering five earned runs on eight hits in 5.2 innings of work.
