Game Notes: No. 6 Texas A&M 17, No. 2 Oklahoma 15

Postgame Notes...

The 31 total runs scored are the second-most scored in a Big 12 Championship game. The most was in the Oklahoma-Texas Tech matchup on May 18, 1997, when 36 runs were scored between the two teams.

Oklahoma (41-17, 1-1 in Pool Two)

- The Sooners now stand 22-21 in Big 12 Championship play.
- J.T. Wise set a Big 12 Championship record with three doubles, finishing the game 3-for-4 with four RBI.
- The 17 Aggie runs are the most runs allowed by the Sooner defense this season.
- Texas A&M's 19 hits are a season high allowed by Oklahoma.
- Starter Michael Rocha recorded his shortest outing of the season, as he surrendered four earned runs on one hit while walking three batters in one-third of an inning of work.
- The Sooner loss snaps a three-game winning streak over the Aggies.
- After tonight's loss, the Sooners must win their game against Missouri on Saturday, and have Texas Tech beat Texas A&M, in order to advance to Sunday's championship game.

Texas A&M (35-22, 1-1 in Pool Two)

- Texas A&M is now 17-19 in Big 12 Championship play and 15-13 in games played at AT&T Bricktown Ballpark.
- Kyle Colligan recorded his 17th multi-hit game of the season and the 67th of his career after finishing the day 3-for-4 at the plate.
- Brett Parsons smashed a career-high five RBI on a career-best three hits to lead the Aggie offense over the Sooners. The five RBI are also an Aggie record in Big 12 Championship play.
- Texas A&M's 17 runs are an Aggie record in Big 12 Championship play.
- The Aggies had a season-high 19 hits in the win over the Sooners, including a Big 12 Championship record and an Aggie record of seven doubles.
- Joe Patterson rebounded from his 0-for-3 performance against Missouri to put up four RBI while going 4-for-5 at the plate in the win.
