



## 2009 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship AT&T Bricktown Ballpark: May 23, 2009

### Game Notes: No. 6 Texas A&M 11, No. 7 Texas Tech 4

#### Postgame Notes...

With the A&M win, Missouri solidifies its spot in tomorrow's Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship game versus Texas. The game will take place at 1 p.m. CT, and will decide the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

#### **Texas A&M (36-22, 2-1 in Pool Two)**

- The Aggies are 18-19 all-time in Big 12 Championship play.
- Texas A&M's bagel on the scoreboard in the fifth inning snapped a streak of eight straight innings in which the Aggies had scored. A&M had scored in all but one inning on Friday night's 17-15 win over Oklahoma, including the ninth inning of Wednesday's game against Missouri, the Aggies had scored in 12-of-13 at-bats.
- 2009 marked the first time in school history that the Aggies have scored double-figure runs in consecutive Big 12 tournament games. A&M put up 17 against Oklahoma on Friday and 11 against Texas Tech on Saturday night; in fact, the Aggies have scored 10 or more runs in two tourney games just once before (1997).
- Luke Anders became the sixth player in school history to reach the 40-home run plateau with a solo shot in the first inning. Anders ranks sixth all-time and is one behind his teammate, Kyle Colligan (41).

#### **Texas Tech (25-32, 1-2 in Pool Two)**

- The Red Raiders are 13-20 in Big 12 Championship play.
- Texas Tech is eliminated from 2009 Big 12 Championship play following the loss to the Aggies.
- Chris Richburg hit his 14<sup>th</sup> homer of the season. He finished the day 1-for-4 with one RBI.
- Brian Cloud pitched 2.2 innings of shutout relief while fanning three batters, one short of his season high, in his final appearance as a Red Raider.
- Garrett Totten smashed the first triple of his career as he finished the day 2-for-4 at the plate while scoring two of Tech's four runs.
- Jeremy Mayo drove in two runs and finished the night 2-for-4 at the plate to lead the Tech offense in the loss to Texas A&M.
