TEAM NOTEBOOK

- BU advanced to a regional final for the first time in the modern era last season and set a school record for overall wins. The Bears have earned two NCAA bids the last three years after previously having just four in their history.
- Baylor finished the 2009-10 regular season with 10 conference wins for the first time in Big 12 history. It also marked the first year the Bears have received a bye in the Big 12 Championship.
- Senior guard LaceDarius Dunn needs 518 points to set the career scoring record for the Big 12 Conference and 451 to reach his school mark. He has 1,739 career points, fourth on the school list. He finished with a school-record 704 a year ago.
- The Bears have posted three consecutive 20-win campaigns and earned three consecutive postseason appearances for the first time in school history.
- Baylor was the only school in the nation last season with no loss of more than seven points. The eight defeats suffered were the fewest since 1971.

TEAM NOTEBOOK

- Colorado returns 82.6 percent of its scoring, 82.5 percent of its rebounding and 83.3 percent of its assists from last season. The team will bring back five starters and nine letterwinners from a year ago.
- Senior guard Cory Higgins is ninth on the school career scoring list with 1,391 points. He has led the Buffaloes in scoring in each of the past two seasons.
- Higgins finished with 587 points in 2009-10, the highest total for a CU player since Shaun Vandiver (699) and Stevie Wise (655) surpassed the mark in 1990-91.
- Sophomore guard Alec Burks set a Colorado freshman scoring record last season with 512 points. The total was the fifth-best by a freshman in Big 12 history.
- CU shot 76.6 percent from the free throw line a year ago, first in the Big 12. The mark ranked third in the nation, as the Buffs led the category for the first time in league history.

TEAM NOTEBOOK

- Junior forward Marcus Morris led the Big 12 in field goal percentage for conference games, connecting at a .561 clip. He is the third Jayhawk in league history to lead the Big 12 in the category.
- KU has posted 15 conference victories four times since the Big 12 began play (1996-97). The Jayhawks have won or shared 10 regular-season Big 12 titles and have captured the league postseason crown seven times.
- Senior guard Tyrel Reed has connected on 104-of-243 (.428) shots from 3-point range in his career. The percentage ranks fifth on the all-time Kansas list.
- Kansas became the third program in college basketball history to reach the 2,000-win plateau with a victory over Texas Tech at the 2010 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. KU has an all-time record of 2,003-796 (.716).
- KU has finished first or second (outright or tied) in all but one season since the Big 12 began play. The Jayhawks have 10 regular season crowns in that time and have won 53 league titles overall in their history.

TEAM NOTEBOOK

- K-State advanced to an NCAA regional final last season for the first time since 1988. The Wildcats earned their second NCAA bid in the past three seasons after not having one in the prior 10 years.
- Kansas State recorded a school-record 29 victories in 2009-10. The 'Cats have won at least 21 games in four consecutive years for the first time in school history.
- Senior guard Jacob Pullen scored 91 points in four NCAA games in 2010. He has scored in double digits in 37 consecutive games - the second-longest streak (Mitch Richmond, 50) in school history.
- The Wildcats led the Big 12 in free throws made (734), a conference single-season record. The total also established a school record, topping the team mark from the 1958-59 campaign.
- KSU has been ranked in the top 25 for 15 consecutive weeks, its longest stretch since 1972-73. The squad has been in the top 10 for 10 straight weeks, the longest string since a 14-week stay in 1961-62.

- Missouri has a 22-10 record in Big 12 games over the last two years, the second-highest win total in the league during that span. The Tigers have had back-to-back 10-win campaigns for the first time since 1999-2000.
- The Tigers led the nation with 10.9 steals per game a year ago and have 759 thefts the last two seasons, a Big 12 two-year record. Mizzou also forced a nation-best 19.4 turnovers per contest.
- Ten of the 13 athletes on the MU roster played at least 10.1 minutes per game in 2009-10, with only two averaging more than 24.1 minutes. Ten different players led the team in scoring.
- Junior guard Kim English was named to the All-Big 12 Third Team last season, one of only three underclassmen in MU history to be named to the top three squads during the Big 12 era.
- Junior forward Laurence Bowers had 48 blocks a year ago to lead Missouri. The total was sixth on the Tigers' single-season rejections list and his 61 career blocks is just eight short of the school's all-time top 10.
