

2010 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship SPRINT CENTER: March 10, 2010

Game Notes: No. 12 Nebraska 75 No. 5 Missouri 60

Nebraska improves to 6-13 all-time in the Big 12 Tournament and 4-9 in first round contests.

Nebraska becomes just the second 12-seed to defeat a 5-seed in the Big 12 Tournament history. The other was Colorado defeating Baylor in 2008.

Nebraska's only other victory as the lower seed (No. 6) was vs. No. 3 Oklahoma in 2006.

Missouri falls to 15-13 all-time in the Big 12 Tournament and 8-4 in first round contests.

Nebraska has defeated Missouri in each of their last three Big 12 Tournament meetings.

Nebraska is now 12-5 this season when leading at halftime.

Missouri is now 0-6 this season when trailing at halftime.

Nebraska's 75 points are the most that the team has ever scored in a Big 12 Tournament game.

Nebraska's 56% shooting percentage is the school's best ever in a Big 12 Tournament game. It is also the best shooting percentage by a Missouri opponent this season.

Nebraska is just the fourth opponent of Missouri's this season to shoot 50% or better from the field.

Nebraska's **Brandon Richardson** recorded a career-high 19 points and equaled a season-high in rebounds with seven.

Nebraska's **Lance Jeter's** six assists ties the most in a Big 12 Tournament game by a Nebraska player.

Nebraska's **Sek Henry** played in his 127th career game, tying him for third on Nebraska's all-time list.

Nebraska's **Ryan Anderson** made his 100th career start.

Nebraska's **Jorge Brian Diaz** recorded his 40th blocked shot of the year, the most of any Husker freshmen all-time.

Missouri's 22 total rebounds were the fewest this season and the fewest they have ever recorded in a Big 12 Tournament game.

Missouri's four turnovers were the fewest in a single game this season. It also ties Kansas State (2003 vs. Colorado) and Texas (2008 vs. Kansas) for the fewest number of turnovers committed in a Big 12 Tournament game.

Missouri recorded fewer than 10 assists for just the 6th time this season, the second time this year vs. Nebraska.

Missouri senior guard **J.T. Tiller** played in his 130th career game tying Derrick Chievous for 6th place all-time at Mizzou.
