PAT KNIGHT

Head Coach

Pat Knight begins his second full season as the Texas Tech head coach and his ninth season on the Red Raider basketball court.

The 2008 - 2009 squad finished the season at 14-19. Among the highlights of Pat Knight's first season as head coach was the graduation of five seniors – Rogdrick Craig, Michael Prince, Esmir Rizvic, Damir Suljagic, Alan Voskuil. Trevor Cook also earned his undergraduate degree in Economics and still has a year of eligibility remaining.

The Red Raiders set numerous school, conference and NCAA marks with their 167-point scoring performance against East Central University in the opening round of the Legends Classic. Texas Tech topped Kansas at the United Spirit Arena in early-March, 84-65. Alan Voskuil's nine three-pointers set a new arena record. With their 88-83 win over Texas A&M in the opening round of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship, the Raiders eclipsed the record of a 20-point comeback after they were down 21 points in the second half.

In the A&M game, Mike Singletary scored 29 consecutive points with no other Red Raider scoring. His run of consecutive points without a teammate scoring is the second longest in NCAA history behind Bill Mlkvy's 54 points on March 3, 1951.

On the morning of February 4, 2008, Coach Bob Knight decided to step away from the court and, as had been in place for several seasons, announced that Pat would be taking over the top spot for the Red Raiders.

"There's a transition that's going to take place here from me to Pat, and I've dwelt on this all year long ... how it would be best for him and for the team and for what we can do in the long run to make this the best thing for Texas Tech," commented Bob Knight.

As the thirteenth head coach for Texas Tech men's basketball, Pat gained his first win as a collegiate head coach, his initial victory at home, and his first win over a nationally ranked team with Texas Tech's 84-75 win over #18 Kansas State on February 13. On March 1, his Red Raiders then topped nationally ranked Texas (#5) by three points, 83-80.

"It's kind of surreal right now," Pat Knight said. "But I didn't get into this business to be an assistant coach my whole life. It's always been a dream of mine, even as a kid. That's all I've been around is coaches."

Under the direction of their new head coach, the Red Raiders won three of their five remaining home games and gained a road win over Colorado to complete the 2008-2009 season at 16-15.

Prior to the 2005-2006 season, Pat was named head coach designate. He is certainly no stranger to the hardwoods of the basketball court. As the head coach, he is responsible for all aspects of the Red Raider program.

After his four year collegiate playing career at Indiana, Pat joined the staff of the NBA's Phoenix Suns where he served as an administrative assistant and scout. In 1997, he was an assistant coach to the CBA's Connecticut Pride.

In 1998, Coach Knight was named to his first head coaching position as the leader of the Wisconsin Blast of the International Basketball Association. After a 3-5 start, Pat led his team to a 16-10 record over the last 26 games for a 19-15 record, the fourth best mark in the league.

Coach Knight earned his playing experience at Indiana University from 1991-1995. A four-year letter winner with a red-shirt season, Pat graduated in 1995 with a degree in sports management. He played a career-high 424 minutes as a senior in 1995 and scored a career-high 45 points in 31 games. As a senior, Pat had a career best 60 assists and registered 137 in his career.

During his collegiate career, his team made five NCAA appearances and he played in the 1992-1993 Elite Eight. His team also won Big Ten titles in 1991 and 1993.

When Indiana University played Texas Tech in the inaugural United Spirit Arena game on November 19, 1999, Coach Pat Knight praised the state of the art facility for players and fans and then reflected upon what it might be like to someday coach at Texas Tech University and call the United Spirit Arena home.

After serving as an assistant at Indiana for two years and one as an assistant coach with the Zips of the University of Akron, Coach Pat Knight's reflection became reality at Texas Tech.

As a collegiate player and nearly nine seasons as an assistant coach, Pat was on the sidelines as a player or a coach for 308 of Bob Knight's 902 career wins.

Coach Pat Knight and the former Amanda Shaw were married on May 10, 2002.

... The Red Raiders enter their 85th season of playing men's basketball with the 2009 - 2010 campaign.

... The first team began with the 1925-1926 season and was coached by Grady Higgenbotham. The team was 6-8 that season. They played seven opponents with the season opener against Daniel Baker on January 25, 1926. The season finished on February 23 against Abilene Christian.

The 2008 - 2009 Team ...

... Texas Tech completed the 2008 - 2009 season at 14-19 and were 3-13 (11th) in Big 12 play.

... The season opened on November 14 against Saint Francis (PA) and closed on March 12 against Missouri in the conference championship.

... Five players graduated from the 2008 - 2009 squad -- Rogdrick Craig, Michael Prince, Esmir Rizvic, Damir Suljagic, and Alan Voskuil. (Trevor Cook also graduated and has a year of eligibility remaining)

Coach Pat Knight ...

... begins his second full season as the head coach of the Red Raiders.

... took over the top coaching spot with 10 conference games remaining on the schedule on February 4, 2008.

... completed the remainder of the 2007-2008 season with 4 wins and 7 losses -- including a first round loss in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.

... is the thirteenth men's basketball head coach in Texas Tech history.

... gained his first collegiate win as a head coach, his initial victory on his home court, and his first win over a ranked team with Texas Tech's 84 - 75 win over #18 Kansas State on February 13, 2008.

... his next win over a nationally ranked team was on March 1, 2008 against #5 Texas. (Texas Tech 83 Texas 80)

... coached the Red Raiders to an 84 - 65 upset win over #9 Kansas in their final home game of the 2008-2009 season on March 4, 2009. Senior Alan Voskuil led both teams with 38 points.

New Red Raiders

Coach Pat Knight has announced the signing of three new players for the 2010 - 2011 season...

Jamel Outler, a 6-foot-3, 175-pound guard from Bellaire High School in Bellaire, Texas, will enter Texas Tech next season as a freshman. He was Coach Knight's first commitment in the 2010 recruiting class. As a Cardinal junior, Jamel averaged over 14 points per game. Last season, Scout.com ranked him as a two-star recruit. Jamel commented, "Coach Knight knows what we go through as players and was honest and straightforward with me about playing for him."

Javarez Willis, originally committed to Texas Tech last spring but did not meet NCAA academic requirements in time to enroll in the 2009 freshman class. Instead, he elected to pursue a post-graduate year at Christian Life Center Academy. He will arrive on the Tech campus as a freshman with four years of eligibility. As a senior at Dallas Pinkston High School, Javarez averaged 14.4 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. After his visit to Lubbock, Javarez said, "I felt like Texas Tech was home."

Paul Cooper, a 6-foot-8, 280-pound forward from Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Florida is the third Red Raider signee. As a freshman, the Auburndale, Florida native played a reserve role and averaged 3.8 points and 3.5 rebounds per game while shooting nearly 58 percent from the field. This season, the Commodores are 4-0 and look to improve on their 24-9 record last season with Paul seeing much more time on the court. To be successful as a Red Raider, Paul commented, "I have to do what I always do, rebound, play physical, and block shots."

Series vs. South Dakota

Friday's contest marked the second meeting between Texas Tech and South Dakota. The Red Raiders won the initial meeting, 87-56. It was also the season opener for the Gerald Myers team on November 29, 1976. Texas Tech went on to post a 20-9 record that season.

Series vs. Texas A&M - Corpus Christi

Saturday's game was the second time the two teams had met. The initial meeting was on Nov. 24, 1999. Texas Tech had just opened the new United Spirit Arena on November 19, 1999 in a 68-60 loss to Bob Knight's IU team before defeating the Texas A&M - Corpus Christi Islanders in the first Red Raider road game of the season, 96-83. The Raiders posted a 12-16 record for 1999-2000.

Series vs. Oregon State

Sunday's game marked the first meeting between the two teams. Oregon State is the first of three Pac-10 teams the Red Raiders will host this season at the United Spirit Arena. Washington visits on December 3 and Stanford is in town on December 22.

Three Games in Three Days

The last time the Red Raiders played three games in three days was in the Great Alaska Shootout on November 22, 23, and 24 in the 2007-2008 season. Texas Tech defeated host Alaska - Anchorage (74-47) and Gonzaga (73-63) before falling to # 22 Butler (81-71). John Roberson, Mike Singletary, and D'walyn Roberts were freshmen. Trevor Cook was a sophomore.

John scored 22 points and was named the Player of the Game against Alaska - Anchorage. After the final game, Martin Zeno accepted the Runner-up award from Governor Sarah Palin.

A Three at the Right Time

Freshman Mike Davis from Phillis Wheatley HS (Houston, TX) was 0 -for-4 from 3-point territory until he sank a three-pointer with 00:01 on clock in the first half of the Texas Tech - Oregon State game. His basket gave the Red Raiders a six point lead going to the locker room...and they scored the first basket of the second half to push their lead to eight points -- the largest margin they would have in the second half.

The Red Raiders and the *Duel in the Desert*

• The Red Raider squad opened the season with three games in three days -- and three victories. Texas Tech claimed the ***Duel in the Desert*** Championship after defeating South Dakota (88-49), Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (66-59), and Pac-10 foe Oregon State (64-60).

• Junior **David Tairu** was voted the MVP of the tournament. He led the team in scoring in two of three contests, averaging 14.0 points for weekend. He started all three games, connecting on 14-of-27 (.519) shots from the field. He was 5-of-9 (.556) from the 3-point range and 9-of-11 (.818) from the free throw line. On Monday, he was named the Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week for his efforts.

• David's accolade marks just the sixth time in Big 12 history a Texas Tech player has won rookie honors.

• Curious about the other five???

Here they are ... **John Roberson** (twice in the 2007-2008 season), **Martin Zeno** (Dec. 2004), and **Rayford Young** (twice in Feb. 1997).

• Junior Mike Singletary was voted to the All-Tournament Team. He started each game and averaged 14.7 points per game for the series.

Summary of Texas Tech vs. Northwestern State

The Red Raiders played the fourth of their five-game homestand as they hosted the Demons of Northwestern State from Natchitoches, Louisiana.

- After giving up 44 points in the first half, the Red Raiders held the Demons to 31 points in the second half for their fourth win of the season, 94-75.
- Mike Singletary led all scorers with 25 points. He was 8-11 from the field and sank all nine FT attempts.
- D'wayn Roberts recorded his first double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds.
- The Demons held the lead by four points (32-28) with at the 6:40 mark in the first half. By halftime, Tech had pulled out to an eight point lead, 52-44. The Raiders stretched their lead to 24 points with 7:45 remaining, 81-57
- Five Tech players scored in double figures - Singletary (25), Roberts (11), Cohadarevic (11), Tairu (10), and Reese (10).
- Walk-on Wally Dunn played 4 minutes and was 1-for-1 from the field.

Summing up Texas Tech vs. Lamar

Texas Tech and Lamar met for the fourth time in the series which began on December 13, 1979. With their 77-54 win on Saturday, the Red Raiders have won each home game in the series. Last season, the Cardinals won in Beaumont on December 13, 85-79.

- The Red Raiders held the Cardinals to 54 points. It's the fourth game that the Tech defense has held their opponents to 60 points or less.
- The "starting five" has been the same through the first five games for the Raiders.
- Nick Okorie came off the bench to lead all scorers with 19 points. Nick also played 31 minutes -- the most the minutes of any player in the game.
- Nick's halfcourt+ shot with 00:01 on the clock gave the Red Raiders a ten-point lead at the half, 36-26.
- Tech turned Lamar's 21 turnovers into 29 points.
- Tech's largest lead was 25 points at the 01:27 mark of the second half. Lamar's largest lead was 3 points with 09:33 remaining in the first half.
- Tech's 3-point FG percentage of .455 (5-of-11) against Lamar is the top mark for the young season.

Road Win at Stephen F. Austin

The Red Raiders played their first road game of the season on November 24 in Nacogdoches, Texas, against the Lumberjacks of Stephen F. Austin.

Series Record

Texas Tech and SFA met for the eleventh time since the series began on December 28, 1937. The Raiders now lead the series 6-5. With Tech's 63-61 victory, the Red Raiders have now won the last five meetings. All of the other Raider wins have been at home. Last season, Texas Tech won at home on New Year's Day, 69-55.

Texas Tech on the Road

The game at SFA was the first road game for the Red Raiders this season. The last Texas Tech win on the road had been at Colorado (87-69) on February 20, 2008.

The last true non-conference win on the road was at Louisiana Tech (66-59) on December 6, 2006. Jarrius Jackson and Martin Zeno combined for 39 points in the 66-59 Red Raider win in Ruston, LA. (Texas Tech did defeat host Alaska-Anchorage 74-47, in the opening of the Great Alaska Shootout in the 2007-2008 season.)

- Corbin Ray's five minutes of playing time marks the first time he has played this season after being injured in a scrimmage earlier in November.
- Last season, D'walyn Roberts reached double figures in seven games for the season. After the first six games this season, he has reached double figures in three games.
- Junior John Roberson has 338 career assists. He currently stands in the 8th spot in Red Raider history -- having just passed Bryant Moore's 335 mark and is just below Tony Benford's 1982-1986 total of 341 assists. Stan Bonewitz holds down the top spot with 435 career assists.

- Darko Cohadarevic led the team in scoring at SFA with 18 points.
- John Roberson followed with 14 points, 5 rebounds, and 4 steals.

Texas Tech 74 Samford 53

On November 28, the teams met for the first time since January 4, 1978. On that day, Texas Tech, coached by Gerald Myers, won the game in Lubbock, 88-58.

- After spotting Samford seven points in the opening two minutes, the Red Raiders closed out the Bulldogs to earn their seventh win of the 2009-2010 season, 74-53.
- Texas Tech's seven-game win streak is the best start the Red Raiders have had since becoming members of the Big 12 Conference in the 1996-1997 season.
- The 1995-1996 squad opened with seven wins in their final season in the Southwest Conference.
- John Roberson led Texas Tech in scoring with 16 points. David Tairu dropped in 15 points with Nick Okorie adding 14 points in his first start of the season. Mike Singletary added 11 points.

- 25 years ago (and on the same day) Bubba Jennings, now a Red Raider assistant coach, led all scorers with 23 points in the double overtime loss to Washington, 59-57.
- No. 10/12 Washington was the first ranked non-conference opponent Texas Tech has hosted in the United Spirit Arena.
- Mike Singletary's 16 points and 12 rebounds against the Huskies was his first double-double of the season and the fourth in his Texas Tech career.
- John Roberson's 25 points against Washington is his best scoring performance of the season and the fourth time in his Red Raider career of scoring at least 25 points.
- Mike Singletary's 42 minutes and John Roberson's 43 minutes in the overtime win against Washington are the most minutes either player has played in a single game.
- Texas Tech's win over No. 10/12 Washington was their first win over a nationally ranked opponent since defeating No. 9 Kansas at home on March 4, 2009, 84-65.

- The Horned Frogs held a 14-point lead with 2:06 remaining in the first half. The Red Raiders scored the next nine points to cut the deficit to five points at halftime.

Texas Tech traveled to Lawrence, Kansas, for the Saturday afternoon match-up with the No. 3 Kansas Jayhawks with television coverage on the Big 12 Network.

The Red Raiders and the Jayhawks met for the 22nd time since the series began on December 7, 1959. With their 89-63 win, Kansas now holds the overall lead, 18-4.

Over the last seven games, each team has won on their home-court. Tech won last year in Lubbock, 84-65, while Kansas won the previous season in Lawrence, 109-51.

The Jayhawks staked themselves to a 42-18 lead at the half behind a .452 shooting effort from the field while the Red Raiders shot .208 for the half.
