• **BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP SUCCESS UNDER BARNES ...** Texas has reached at least the semifinal round of the Big 12 Championship in nine of its first 11 trips under Rick Barnes. The Horns have advanced to the Big 12 Championship game in four of the last six years.

• **JOHNSON PROVIDES SPARK ...** Junior forward **Gary Johnson** posted a career-high 25 points (10-of-15 FG, 5-of-5 FT) and eight rebounds in 38 minutes off the bench during Saturday's loss at No. 21/22 Baylor. He is averaging 15.0 points and 6.6 rebounds while converting 26-of-45 (.578) field goals and 23-of-27 (.852) free throws in 29.8 minutes per game in his last five contests entering postseason play.

Texas in Conference Tournaments

Texas holds a 38-32 (.543) all-time record in league tournament games, including a 17-13 (.567) mark in its previous 13 trips to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. **In 11 appearances during the Rick Barnes era, UT has posted a 15-11 (.577) mark in the Big 12 Championship.** Texas has reached the finals of its conference tournament 10 times in the last 19 years, including five times in the Southwest Conference (1991, 1992, 1994, 1995 and 1996) and five times in the Big 12 (2001, 2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008). UT has claimed two league postseason tournament titles, both coming during its time in the SWC (1994 and 1995).

Success in the Big 12 Championship

The Horns have reached at least the semifinal round in 10 of their first 13 appearances in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship, including nine of their first 11 trips under Barnes. The Longhorns have advanced to the title game of the Big 12 Championship in four of the last six years (2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008). **Texas is the only school in the league to have won at least two games at the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship in each of the last four years entering the 2010 tourney.**

Unfamiliar Territory

For just the third time in Rick Barnes’ 12 years at Texas, the Horns did not receive a first-round bye in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. The two other times Texas failed to accomplish this feat came during the 2004-05 season (UT tied for fifth in the league at 9-7 and was the No. 6 seed in the Championship) and the 2008-09 season (UT tied for fourth in the league at 9-7 and was the No. 5 seed in the Championship).

A Check of the Polls

Texas is not ranked in the latest Associated Press poll (March 8) or in the latest ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll (March 8). **UT climbed to the top of both polls on Jan. 11, marking the first time in program history that the Horns had been the top-ranked team in the nation in either major poll.** Prior to the Jan. 11th poll, UT had been ranked No. 2 in the AP poll a total of 12 times in school history, including the previous six weeks of this year. Texas had been ranked No. 2 in the ESPN/USA Today poll a

Did You Know ?

Facts on the Texas Basketball program

- Texas is one of just five schools to have advanced to at least the “Sweet 16” of the NCAA Tournament in five of the last eight years, joining Connecticut, Duke, Kansas and Pittsburgh.
- Texas is one of just seven programs to have advanced to each of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments, joining Arizona, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan State and Wisconsin.
- Texas is the only school in the country that can claim two different National Player of the Year winners in the last seven years (T.J. Ford in 2003; Kevin Durant in 2007).
- Texas has produced three different consensus first-team All-Americans over the last seven seasons, the top total in the country during this stretch (Ford in 2003; Durant in 2007; D.J. Augustin in 2008).
- Texas has produced four Top 10 NBA Draft picks in the last seven years, tied for the top total in the nation during this stretch.

total of 10 times in school history, including the previous six weeks. During the Rick Barnes era, the Horns have spent 158 weeks in The AP Top 25, including 75 in the Top 10.

What’s the Difference?

Texas began the year with a 17-0 mark and moved to the No. 1 spot in both major national polls. The Horns then dropped five of their next seven games. UT won four of its next six contests before dropping its regular-season finale at No. 21/22 Baylor on Saturday.

Series vs. Iowa State

Wednesday’s contest marks the 20th meeting between Texas and Iowa State. UT owns an 11-8 advantage in the all-time series which dates back to the 1966-67 season. In that first meeting, the Cyclones posted a 101-87 win in Phoenix on Dec. 21, 1966. **Texas has won five straight and is 9-3 against the Cyclones during the Rick Barnes era.** Then-No. 1/1 UT posted a hard-fought 90-83 victory in Ames on Jan. 13 earlier this season. The two teams have never met in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship prior to Wednesday’s contest.

Texas-Baylor Game Notes

□ UT allowed opponent team season highs in points (92) and free throw percentage (.882, 15-of-17) and tied the season high for field goals allowed (36-of-66).

□ The Horns set a team season high in free throw percentage (.889, 16-of-18).

□ Texas recorded a 43-28 advantage in bench scoring.

□ UT fell to 11-1 against Baylor in games played in Waco and 24-3 overall against the Bears during the Rick Barnes era.

□ **Gary Johnson** (25 points, eight rebounds) topped the 20-point mark for the second time this year and third time in his career (85 games). He reached double figures in scoring for the 14th time this year and 35th time in his career. Johnson set career highs in points, field goals made (10-of-15) and minutes (38). He has grabbed at least eight boards in seven of the last 10 games.

□ **Damion James** (18 points) reached double figures in scoring for the 28th time this season and 97th time in his career (139 games). He tied the Big 12 record for most career games started (137).

□ **Jordan Hamilton** (18 points) reached double figures in scoring for the sixth time in the last seven games and 17th time this year. He tied his career high in blocks (two) and set a career high in minutes played (31).

□ **J'Covan Brown** (six assists, two turnovers) tied his career high in assists.

Trying to Duplicate These 15 Minutes

Texas trailed Oklahoma in the home season finale (March 1) by a 51-40 margin at the 15:36 mark of the second half following a pair of Tony Crocker free throws. **From that point on, the Horns outscored the Sooners by a 47-25 margin.** Texas hit 15-of-23 (.652) field goals and 16-of-19 (.842) free throws during this final 15:36. The Horns held Oklahoma to 7-of-19 (.368) FG shooting during the span. UT also posted a 20-4 advantage on the glass in the decisive stretch.

20 Wins ... Again

The 91-51 home victory against Nebraska (Feb. 13) gave Texas its 11th consecutive 20-win season. Texas has reached the 30-win plateau twice in the previous four years (31-7 record in 2007-08, 30-7 mark in 2005-06). UT's current streak of 11 straight 20-win campaigns is a school record. Prior to the current streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92). **The Horns have reached the 20-win plateau in all but one of Rick Barnes' seasons in Austin.** The Horns posted a 19-13 mark in 1998-99 and won the Big 12 Conference title.

Consistent Success in the Big 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of nine times in the 12 seasons under Rick Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10. The Horns have recorded at least nine wins in each of Barnes' first

12 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in five of Barnes' 12 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06 and 2007-08).

An "Elite" Program

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last four years and three times in the last seven seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

In "Sweet" Company

Texas has reached the NCAA "Sweet 16" five times in the last eight years. **The Longhorns are one of just five schools to accomplish this feat, joining Connecticut, Duke, Kansas and Pittsburgh.** Texas has made 10 trips to the "Sweet 16" since 1960. UT made "Sweet 16" appearances in 1960 (25-team tournament), 1963 (25-team tournament), 1972 (25-team tournament), 1997, 2002 and 2004. Texas also advanced to the "Elite Eight" in 1990, 2006 and 2008 and the Final Four in 2003.

LaceDarius Dunn posted a game-high 30 points, while Quincy Acy added 24 points off the bench to lead the Bears to a 15-point win before a Ferrell Center record crowd of 10,562 and an ESPN national television audience. The loss snapped an 11-game win streak by the Horns in Waco. Baylor converted 54.5% from the floor during the win and recorded a 22-10 advantage in points off turnovers. A back-and-forth first half featured nine ties and nine lead changes. Neither team led by more than two points through nearly the opening seven minutes of the contest. Baylor took a 16-13 advantage following a three-pointer from Dunn at the 13:08 mark. Trailing 18-15 following an Acy dunk with 12:33 left, the Longhorns used a pair of Gary Johnson free throws and a Johnson jumper to grab a 19-18 lead at the 11:51 mark. After a Tweety Carter jumper evened the score at 24-24 with 9:16 remaining, Texas used a Damion James three-point play to build a 27-24 cushion at the 8:34 mark. But that would mark the final lead of the game for the Horns. Baylor answered with an Acy dunk, a Carter layup and an Ekpe Udoh jumper to grab a 30-27 lead with 6:39 left. A Jordan Hamilton three tied the score at 30-30 on UT's next possession, but the Bears closed the half on a 12-4 run to take a 42-34 cushion into the break. Baylor posted a 10-0 advantage in second-chance points in the opening 20 minutes. Trailing 47-36 following an Anthony Jones jumper at the 18:58 mark, the Longhorns used a Dexter Pittman dunk and a James jumper to cut the margin to 47-40 with 16:26 remaining. After a Johnson jumper trimmed the deficit to 51-44 at the 14:14 mark, Baylor used back-to-back dunks from Acy and a Udoh jumper to build a 57-44 cushion with 12:28 left. Trailing 66-52 following another Udoh jumper at the 9:17 mark, Texas went on a 6-1 spurt over the next two minutes to trim the margin to 67-58 following a Hamilton three-pointer with 7:23 remaining. After a pair of James free throws made it 69-60 at the 5:46 mark, the Bears used an Acy layup, a pair of Dunn free throws and a Carter jumper to build a 75-60 cushion with 4:31 remaining. The Horns cut the lead to 10 points on two occasions later, but they could not get the margin to single digits the rest of the afternoon. The loss spoiled a solid effort by Johnson, who posted career highs in points (25), field goals made (10-of-15) and minutes played (38). Johnson was joined in double-figure scoring by James (18 points, eight rebounds) and Hamilton (18 points). Carter aided the Bears with 16 points and 10 assists against just one turnover. Baylor recorded 23 assists against just eight turnovers on the afternoon. The Horns set a team season high in free throw percentage (.889, 16-of-18), but they committed 18 turnovers which led to 22 Baylor points.

11-in-a-Row

With their bid to the 2009 NCAA Tournament, the Horns extended their school-record streak of consecutive NCAA appearances to 11. Texas has advanced to the Big Dance in each of Rick Barnes' 11 seasons in Austin. Prior to the Barnes era, UT's previous mark for consecutive NCAA Tournament bids was four (set twice). **Texas is one of just seven schools to have advanced to each of the last 11 NCAA Tournaments (1999-2009).** Joining the Horns in this group are: Arizona, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan State and Wisconsin.

17 Straight to Start to the Season

Texas started this season with a 17-0 record prior to its 71-62 loss at No. 10/9 Kansas State (Jan. 18). The 17 victories to start the season marked the third-most wins to begin a year in UT history and most since the 1932-33 season. The 17-game win streak marked a tie for the fourth-longest win streak in school history.

Preseason Poll Notes

The No. 3 ranking in the preseason Associated Press poll was the second-highest spot in the preseason AP poll in school history, just behind the No. 2 spot held in the 2005-06 preseason poll. The No. 3 ranking in the ESPN/USA Today preseason poll tied for the highest spot in the preseason coaches' poll in school history, matching the No. 3 spot held in the 2005-06 preseason poll. This marks the ninth consecutive year that the Longhorns have been ranked in The AP preseason poll and the ninth straight year that the Horns have been ranked in the coaches' preseason poll.

Success Against the AP Top 25

During his 12 seasons in Austin, Rick Barnes has registered a school-record 50 career victories against AP Top 25 opponents (previous mark: 10-44 by Tom Penders, 1989-98). Barnes has guided the Horns to a 50-59 (.459) record against ranked teams. Barnes has posted 80 career victories against AP Top 25 foes.

Beating the Best

UT's home win against No. 2 Oklahoma last year (Feb. 21) marked the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Horns have defeated in a home game in school history. The victory also equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. **Five of UT's eight all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come in the Rick Barnes era.**

Back-to-Back Success Against the Top 10

Texas concluded an impressive four-day swing earlier this season with victories against No. 10/10 North Carolina (103-90 in Arlington on Dec. 19) and No. 9/9 Michigan State (79-68 in Austin on Dec. 22).

□ Texas recorded wins in consecutive games on the schedule against AP Top 10 teams for the first time since Jan. 12-16, 1982 (95-83 win at No. 10 Houston on Jan. 12; 87-73 home win against No. 9 Arkansas on Jan. 16).

□ UT posted back-to-back wins against AP Top 10 teams (non-consecutive games) for the first time since Nov. 24-Dec. 2, 2007 (97-78 win vs. No. 7 Tennessee in Newark; 63-61 win at No. 2 UCLA).

Deep and Productive Bench

One of the keys to Texas' success this season has been the play and production from its bench.

□ **The UT bench has outscored its opponent's bench in 27 of the first 31 games.**

□ The Horns posted a 40-2 advantage in bench scoring during the win at Oklahoma State (Feb. 1).

□ Texas recorded a 33-26 advantage in bench scoring at Missouri (Feb. 17). The Tigers entered the contest leading the nation in bench scoring.

□ The Horns posted a 41-3 advantage in bench scoring during the win against Oklahoma (March 1).

□ No UT player averages more than 29.7 minutes per game (Damion James).

Offensive Efficiency

UT is averaging 81.7 points per game while converting 47.2% from the floor on the year.

□ **Texas has shot better than 50% from the floor in 14 of its first 31 games.** By comparison, the Horns only reached the 50% FG mark in six of their 35 games last season.

□ In the 107-74 win against Long Beach State (Dec. 7), **UT had six players reach double figures in scoring** (Bradley, 17; James, 14; Johnson, 14; Hamilton, 13; Brown, 13; Pittman, 11). This marked the first time Texas had six players reach double figures in scoring since the Horns defeated Tennessee 95-70 on Nov. 24, 2004 in the third-place game at the EA Sports Maui Invitational.

□ In the 103-90 win against No. 10/10 North Carolina, **the Horns had four players score at least 20 points** (James, 25; Pittman, 23; Brown, 21; Bradley, 20). This marked the first time Texas had four players record at least 20 points in a game since the Horns defeated No. 7 Tennessee 97-78 in the title game at the StubHub! Legends Classic in Newark, N.J. on Nov. 24, 2007.

Century Club Success

UT has reached the century mark four times this year. The Horns posted a 107-74 home win against Long Beach State (Dec. 7), a 104-42 home victory against Texas-Pan American (Dec. 15), a 103-90 win against No. 10/10 North Carolina (Dec. 22) at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington and a 103-86 home win against Colorado (Jan. 9) to open Big 12 Conference play.

□ Texas is 96-9 all-time when topping the 100-point mark, including a 62-1 mark in home games.

□ UT reached the century mark in a Big 12 game for the first time since Jan. 16, 2007 at Oklahoma State (105-103 3OT loss).

□ UT reached the century mark in a Big 12 non-overtime game for the first time since Jan. 6, 2007 at Colorado (102-78 win).

□ UT reached the century mark in a Big 12 home game for the first time since Feb. 11, 2002 vs. Kansas (110-103 OT loss).

□ UT reached the century mark in a Big 12 non-overtime home game for the first time since Feb. 9, 2002 vs. Colorado (104-95 win).

Defense Wins

Solid defense continues to be a Texas trademark under coach Rick Barnes. **In their first 31 contests, the Longhorns have held their opponents to an average of 69.0 points per game on a combined 39.8% FG shooting, including a 170-of-542 (.314) mark from three-point range.** UT has held its opponents to 30% or under FG shooting in 13 of 62 halves this year. Since Rick Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 195 of their 406 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 177-18 (.908) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat (11-1 record this year).**

□ UT held Western Carolina (Nov. 18) to 41 points on 26.2% FG shooting. WCU did not shoot better than 30% from the floor in either half.

□ Texas held USC (Dec. 3) to 30.4% FG shooting, including a 1-of-10 (.100) mark from beyond the arc.

□ The Horns forced 22 turnovers against No. 9/9 Michigan State (Dec. 22), including six by PG Kalin Lucas (two assists).

□ Texas limited Texas A&M (Jan. 16) to 37.9% FG shooting, including an 8-of-24 (.333) mark in the second half.

□ UT held No. 10/9 Kansas State (Jan. 18) to 38.5% FG shooting, including a 1-of-12 (.083) mark from three-point range. The Horns limited the Wildcats to 30.0% (9-of-30) FG shooting from the floor in the second half.

□ Texas limited Nebraska (Feb. 13) to 28.1% FG shooting, including a 2-of-18 (.111) mark from beyond the arc. The Horns held the Huskers to 51 points (second-lowest total all year and low in Big 12 play) and below the 30% FG mark in both halves.

Cleaning the Glass

Texas has been a solid rebounding team during its first 31 games. **The Horns sport a +6.6 rebound margin (42.1-35.5) entering Wednesday's contest.** UT has outrebounded its opponent in 22 of its first 31 contests (19-3 mark in those games), including 12 games by double-digit margins.

□ Texas posted a +33 rebound margin (64-31) against UT-Pan American (Dec. 15). This tied for the second-best single-game rebound margin in school history.

□ The Horns recorded a +19 rebound margin (60-41) against No. 10/10 North Carolina (Dec. 19). Texas registered a 29-12 advantage in offensive rebounds. **Dexter Pittman** had 12 offensive boards, equaling the total number by UNC as a team.

□ UT recorded a +16 rebound margin (39-23) against Colorado (Jan. 9), including an 18-6 advantage on the offensive glass.

□ The Horns posted a +19 rebound margin (46-27) against Texas Tech (Jan. 27). UT recorded a 25-7 advantage in second-chance points.

□ UT registered a +22 rebound margin (49-27) against Nebraska (Feb. 13).

□ The Horns posted a +17 rebound margin (38-21) against Oklahoma (March 1).

Improving at the Line

Texas has made major strides in its free throw shooting of late. **During their last three games entering Wednesday's contest, the Longhorns have converted 51-of-61 (.836) free throws.** Texas converted 12-of-15 (.800) from the stripe at No. 22/23 Texas A&M (Feb. 27). The Horns returned to hit 23-of-28 (.821) at the line during the win against Oklahoma (March 1). UT then converted a season-best 88.9% (16-of-18) from the stripe at No. 21/22 Baylor on Saturday.

A True Senior "Class"

For the first time since the 2003-04 "Sweet 16" team that featured a quartet of veteran seniors who had played major minutes in Brian Boddicker, Royal Ivey, Brandon Mouton and James Thomas, the Longhorns have the benefit of a senior class. The trio of **Damion James, Justin Mason** and **Dexter Pittman** (can also add redshirt junior Matt Hill to this class as well) have all made significant contributions to UT's success in each of their four years in Austin. **Entering Wednesday's game, the James-Mason-Pittman trio have played in a combined 408 games (322 starts) and totaled 3,556 points and 2,276 rebounds in 9,411 minutes.** They have led UT to a NCAA "Elite Eight" appearance in 2007-08 and NCAA Second Round trips in 2006-07 and 2008-09.

James in Contention for Hardware

□ **Damion James is among the Top 30 midseason candidates for the 2009-10 John R. Wooden All-American team** (released on Jan. 4). UT is the only school to have two winners of the Wooden Award in the last seven years (T.J. Ford in 2003 and Kevin Durant in 2007). In addition, D.J. Augustin was one of five finalists for the award in 2008.

□ **James is one of the Top 30 midseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T** (released on Feb. 24). Texas is the only school to have two winners of the Naismith Trophy in the last seven years (Ford in 2003 and Durant in 2007).

□ **James also is one of 16 finalists for the Oscar Robertson Trophy** (released ON Feb. 16). The award, selected by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association, honors college basketball's national player of the year. Durant earned the Oscar Robertson Trophy in 2007.

James Named Finalist for Lowe's CLASS Award

Damion James was named one of 10 finalists for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in the sport of men's basketball (Feb. 3). This is the second straight year that UT has had a finalist in men's basketball for this award, as A.J. Abrams was a finalist last season. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as a NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: classroom, character, community and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Ballots will be cast from a national poll of media, coaches and fans. Lowe's will announce the award for men's basketball at the 2010 NCAA Final Four in Indianapolis. This marks the ninth year for the basketball division of the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

James Getting Better by the Year

Senior guard/forward **Damion James** is a four-year starter who has played in all 139 games (137 starts). **James was recently named to the All-Big 12 First Team and was one of just two players to earn a unanimous selection to the squad** (joining Oklahoma State's James Anderson). He leads the team in scoring (17.7 ppg) and rebounding (10.2 rpg) while converting 192-of-375 (.512) field goals, including 30-of-76 (.395) from three-point range. He has recorded a team-best 15 double-doubles in the first 31 games. James also ranks second on the team in blocks (36) and leads the squad in steals (49).

James Earns Weekly Accolades

Damion James was tabbed the **Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week** by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association on **Jan. 19**. James also was named the **Phillips 66 Big 12 Conference Player of the Week** (Jan. 18). This marked the second Big 12 weekly honor this season and third career accolade for James. He previously earned the award on Nov. 30, 2009 and during his sophomore season (Dec. 3, 2007). James averaged 25.5 points, 13.0 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game while leading UT to wins at Iowa State (Jan. 13) and against Texas A&M (Jan. 16).

James Shines Against the Best

Damion James played at an extremely high level during UT's back-to-back victories against Top 10 foes North Carolina and Michigan State earlier this year. **In the two wins during a stretch of four days, James averaged 24.0 points, 14.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game.** He posted a game-high 25 points and 15 rebounds (five offensive) and set a career high in steals (four) during the win against No. 10/10 North Carolina (Dec. 19). James returned to record a game-high 23 points and 13 rebounds (four offensive) in the home win against No. 9/9 Michigan State (Dec. 22). **He also added 24 points (8-of-13 FG, 4-of-4 threes), 10 rebounds and five blocks in the loss to No. 1/1 Kansas (Feb. 8).**

□ **Avery Bradley** may claim Tacoma, Washington as his hometown, but he actually became a Texas fan when his family lived in Arlington, Texas from 2001-04.

□ **J'Covan Brown** is the cousin of former Texas Basketball stand-out B.J. Tyler (1992-94). Tyler earned third-team All-America honors from The Associated Press, Basketball Weekly and UPI as a senior in 1994 and was the MVP of the 1994 Southwest Conference Postseason Tournament. Tyler also was the No. 20 pick in the 1994 NBA Draft by the Philadelphia 76ers.

□ **Clint Chapman's** father, Kenny Chapman, is a senior firefighting pilot for Erickson Air-Crane. Kenny has been deployed throughout the U.S. and the world to fight forest fires. The Chapman family lived in Australia twice for three-month stretches during the winter when Clint was nine and 10 years old.

□ **Jordan Hamilton** has four brothers, Zelle (30), Gary (24), Isaac (14) and Daniel (13) and one sister, Miya (26). Gary played basketball at the University of Miami (Fla.) from 2003-06 and currently plays professionally in Israel.

□ **Gary Johnson** wears jersey No. 1 to pay tribute to both T.J. Ford (11) and Daniel Gibson (1), former UT stars from the Houston area who had the No. 1 in their respective jerseys.

□ **Jai Lucas** is the son of John Lucas II. His father was a 15-year NBA veteran (1976-90), who played for the Houston Rockets, San Antonio Spurs, Washington Bullets, Seattle Super Sonics and Golden State Warriors. John II was also a former NBA head coach (San Antonio Spurs, Philadelphia 76ers and Cleveland Cavaliers) and is currently an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Clippers. Jai's older brother, John III, played college basketball at Baylor and Oklahoma State, leading OSU to the Final Four in 2004.

□ **Dean Melchionni** is the son of Gary Melchionni. His father was an All-ACC performer at Duke (1970-73) and a second-round pick of the Phoenix Suns in the 1973 NBA Draft. Dean's brother, Lee, was a four-year letterwinner at Duke (2003-06). Dean's uncle, Bill Melchionni, played college basketball at Villanova and starred in the NBA with the Philadelphia 76ers and New Jersey Nets. Bill's jersey number was retired by both Villanova and the Nets.

□ **Dexter Pittman** is the son of Johnny Pittman, who played basketball at Oklahoma State (1989-91).

□ **Alexis Wangmene's** legal guardians are R.C. and Beth Buford. R.C., who is the general manager of the San Antonio Spurs, discovered Wangmene in 2004 during the NBA's Basketball without Borders trip to South Africa, when Wangmene was 15. Wangmene's native tongue is French, the language spoken in Cameroon. He learned English in six months during his sophomore year at San Antonio Central Catholic High School. Wangmene attended the same prep school (Blair Academy in Blairstown, N.J.) as former Texas player Royal Ivey. Wangmene wears jersey No. 20 to honor his father (Teophile Mang-Ikri), who wore the same number when he played in Cameroon.

□ **Varez Ward's** full name is Kyievarez Ward. He was given the nickname "Varez" by his mother (Sharon) at birth. Ward began wearing jersey No. 50 in the seventh grade, after he saw former Auburn guard Doc Robinson wearing the number.

□ **Shawn Williams** wears jersey No. 2 because his full name is Shawn Williams II. His father (Shawn Sr.) and mother (Ton'Nea) both played basketball at Central Oklahoma, and Ton'Nea is a member of the school's Hall of Fame. Ton'Nea is currently an assistant principal at A. Maceo Smith High School in Dallas.

Pittman's Block Party

Dexter Pittman set a career high with seven blocked shots against USC (Dec. 3). **Pittman fell just one block shy of the UT single-game mark** (8, by Chris Owens vs. California on Nov. 15, 2000; 8, by Chris Mihm at Massachusetts on Feb. 5, 2000). His five blocks in the first half were just one shy of the UT single-half mark (6, by Chris Mihm in the first half at Massachusetts on Feb. 5, 2000). He also posted six blocks (five in the first half) against Texas A&M (Jan. 16). **Pittman leads the team with 60 blocks in the first 31 contests (1.9 bpg).**

The Glue Guy

If you're looking for the individual who does all the dirty work and holds the team together, look no further than senior combo guard **Justin Mason**. He has played in 138 of a possible 139 games (129 starts) during his time in Austin. **Mason had his streak of consecutive games played snapped at 132 when he was unable to play (left foot injury) in the home game against Nebraska (Feb. 13).** He has earned or shared the team's Most Outstanding Defensive Player honor in each of his first three seasons. Mason is a two-time Big 12 All-Defensive Team selection, earning the award in both his sophomore and junior seasons.

Mason Takes Pride in 'D'

Justin Mason scored just one point in 35 minutes during the home win against Oklahoma State (Feb. 24), but he may have been the most valuable player on the floor for the Longhorns. Mason had primary responsibility on James Anderson, the Big 12 Player of the Year. Anderson entered the game averaging 22.8 ppg on the year and 24.3 ppg in Big 12 play. The Horns limited Anderson to just 14 points on 5-of-13 FG (1-of-5 threes).

Johnson Continues to Spark Frontcourt

In the first 31 games this season, junior forward **Gary Johnson** is averaging 9.4 points (sixth on the team) and 5.5 rebounds (third on the team) while converting 105-of-190 (.553) field goals in 23.1 minutes per game. He has reached double figures in scoring in 14 games this year. **In Big 12 play, Johnson upped his production to 11.1 points (third on team) and 6.6 rebounds (second on team) in 27.2 minutes per contest.** He is one of six players to earn a spot on the Big 12 All-Reserve team, selected by league media.

Johnson's Career Day at Baylor

Gary Johnson had one of the finest offensive efforts in his career during Saturday's loss at No. 21/22 Baylor. **Johnson posted a team-high 25 points (10-of-15 FG, 5-of-5 FT) to go along with eight rebounds in 38 minutes off the bench.** He set career highs in points, field goals made and minutes played.

Johnson on a Roll at the Right Time

Gary Johnson is playing the best basketball of his career entering postseason play. **In the last five games, Johnson is averaging 15.0 points and 6.6 rebounds per game while converting 26-of-45 (.578) field goals and 23-of-27 (.852) free throws in 29.8 minutes per contest.** In addition to his 25-point effort at Baylor, Johnson also tallied 22 points (7-of-11 FG, 8-of-10 FT) and eight boards in 25 minutes at Texas Tech (Feb. 20) and added 14 points (5-of-9 FG, 4-of-4 FT) and eight rebounds in 28 minutes against Oklahoma (March 1).

Johnson Better on the Boards

Gary Johnson has been a much improved rebounder in the last few weeks. **In his last 10 games, Johnson has averaged 7.5 rebounds per contest.** He grabbed 10 boards at Oklahoma State (Feb. 1) and at Oklahoma (Feb. 6). Johnson also posted eight rebounds against No. 1/1 Kansas (Feb. 8), nine against Nebraska (Feb. 13), eight against Oklahoma (March 1) and eight at No. 21/22 Baylor on Saturday.

Johnson Steps Up Against Michigan State

Gary Johnson had seven points, three steals (tied his career high) and two boards in 19 minutes during the win against No. 9/9 Michigan State (Dec. 22). Leading 68-63 with 4:25 left against the Spartans, Johnson hit a jump shot, came up with a steal and an assist on a Dogus Balbay dunk, then added another steal and a dunk in a 38-second span to give the Horns a 74-63 advantage and seal the victory.

Hamilton Gaining Experience

Freshman swingman **Jordan Hamilton** has reached double digits in scoring in 17 of the first 31 games. He ranks fourth on the team in scoring (10.0 ppg) and fourth in rebounding (3.7 rpg) in 19.4 minutes per contest.

Hamilton Finds the Range

Jordan Hamilton has reached double figures in scoring in four straight and six of the last seven games entering Saturday's contest. **During the seven-game stretch, Hamilton has averaged**

13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds game while converting 36-of-71 (.507) field goals, including a 15-of-37 (.405) mark from three-point range, in 25.1 minutes per game off the bench. Hamilton had 16 points, five rebounds, three assists and two blocks in 21 minutes against Nebraska (Feb. 13). He returned to record a game-high 24 points (10-of-16 FG), five boards and two assists in 25 minutes at Missouri (Feb. 17). Hamilton added 13 points, five boards and a career-high three steals against Oklahoma State (Feb. 24). He recorded 10 points and four rebounds at No. 22/23 Texas A&M (Feb. 27) and added 18 points (7-of-13 FG), three assists and two blocks in a career-high 31 minutes at No. 21/22 Baylor on Saturday.

Hamilton Sees Double Against the Sooners

Jordan Hamilton recorded his first collegiate double-double with his 12 points (5-of-7 FG, 2-of-3 threes) and 11 rebounds in 28 minutes of work during the home win against Oklahoma (March 1). All 11 boards came at the defensive end of the court. His previous career high in rebounds was seven (three times) entering the contest against the Sooners.

Hamilton Provides Spark at Oklahoma State

Jordan Hamilton had his best complete effort in a Texas uniform during the win at Oklahoma State (Feb. 1). **Hamilton tallied 27 points while hitting 11-of-16 FG (5-of-8 threes) and added four rebounds, one assist without a turnover and one block in just 19 minutes off the bench.** He had 18 of his 27 points in the decisive second half. Hamilton set career highs in points, field goals made and three-point field goals made in Stillwater.

Lucas Finding His Place

Junior point guard **Jai Lucas** (first name is pronounced Jay) has averaged 3.0 points in 10.3 minutes per contest during his first 20 games. **Lucas has hit 12-of-26 (.462) from three-point range and has recorded 28 assists against 16 turnovers.** He posted 15 points (5-of-7 threes) and two assists in just 15 minutes off the bench against Gardner-Webb (Dec. 29). Lucas added nine points (2-of-3 threes) and two assists in 18 minutes against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (Jan. 2). He saw his first action in a Texas uniform during the win against No. 10/10 North Carolina (Dec. 19).

Wangmene a Factor Again in Frontcourt

Sophomore forward/center **Alexis Wangmene** returned to the rotation after being sidelined (medical redshirt) with a right knee injury last year. **Wangmene is averaging 2.1 points and 1.9 rebounds in 8.1 minutes per game off the bench while playing in 28 of the first 31 contests.** He had a season-high eight points (4-of-6 FG), four rebounds and two steals in 12 minutes against Long Beach State (Dec. 7). Wangmene added seven points, six boards and two blocks in 16 minutes against UT-Pan American (Dec. 15).

Chapman, Hill Compete for Playing Time

Junior forward/center **Clint Chapman** and redshirt junior forward/center **Matt Hill** are factors in the frontcourt rotation for the Horns this year. **Hill**, who has played in 64 career games, has fully recovered from a left heel injury that sidelined him for the entire 2007-08 season. **Chapman** has seen action in 83 career games. Chapman had four points and a career-high nine rebounds in 15

minutes off the bench against UT-Pan American (Dec. 15). He posted a season-high six points (3-of-4 FG) and two rebounds in seven minutes at No. 10/9 Kansas State (Jan. 18).

Balbay Out for Season with Injury

Junior **Dogus Balbay** suffered a torn ACL in his left knee during the first half of the win at Texas Tech (Feb. 20). He will miss the remainder of the season. Balbay had played in all 27 games (making 22 starts at the point guard spot) prior to the injury. He averaged a team-high 3.9 assists along with 3.8 points and 3.2 rebounds in 21.5 minutes per game. Balbay had recorded a 106-to-43 (2.5-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio and ranked third on the team in steals (35) at the time of the injury.

Ward Out for Season with Injury

Sophomore combo guard **Varez Ward** ruptured his right quadriceps tendon during pre-game warmups prior to the game against Pittsburgh (Nov. 24) in Kansas City. He underwent successful surgery on Dec. 1 in Birmingham, Ala. and will miss the remainder of the season. **Ward had started each of UT's first three games** and averaged 6.7 points and 3.0 rebounds in 23.0 minutes per contest. He also led the team in steals (seven) at the time of the injury.

Williams Out for Season with Injury

Freshman forward **Shawn Williams** suffered a left ankle injury against Texas State (Dec. 12). He underwent successful surgery on Jan. 20 in Austin and will miss the remainder of the season. Williams saw action in seven of UT's first eight games, averaging 5.6 minutes per contest off the bench.

Success in the Classroom

Five UT players earned a spot on the 2010 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team, released on March 3. **Damion James, Dogus Balbay** and **Gary Johnson** were each named to the First Team, while **Justin Mason** and sophomore **Alexis Wangmene** were selected to the Second Team. **UT's five selections marked the most of any school in the league.** James earned his third career honor, as he was a second-team pick in 2007-08 and a first-team choice in 2008-09. Mason also claimed his third career honor, as he was a second-team choice in both his sophomore and junior. Balbay and Johnson each earned their second career mention on the academic all-league first team.

Three-Point Streak

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter Wednesday's game having hit at least one 3-pointer in 649 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 777 of 784 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

Year 12 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in Texas Basketball history, **Rick Barnes** is in his 12th season at Texas and sports a **293-113 (.722)** mark with the Horns. He has compiled a **495-247 (.667)** record in 23 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson

and Texas. Along the way, he has guided his teams to a total of 17 NCAA (current streak of 14 consecutive) and three NIT trips.

Horns Ink Thompson in Fall Signing Period

Tristan Thompson (Brampton, Ontario, Canada) signed a National Letter of Intent during the fall signing period to play basketball next season at Texas. Thompson (6-9, 240), a forward from Findlay College Prep (Henderson, Nev.) who plays under coach Michael Peck, is ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the nation by Scout.com, No. 7 by The Sporting News, No. 11 by ESPNU and No. 17 by Rivals.com. **Thompson was recently named to the West squad roster for the 2010 McDonald's All-American Game** (scheduled for March 31 in Columbus, Ohio). He transferred to Findlay from St. Benedict's Academy (N.J.) during his junior season. At Findlay, he played in five games and averaged 11.4 ppg and 6.6 rpg while playing alongside current UT freshman Avery Bradley. The duo helped lead Findlay to a 33-0 mark and the mythical high school national championship. In 21 games at St. Benedict's last year, Thompson averaged 19.1 ppg and 9.6 rpg.
