Oklahoma State Remains Leader at Big 12 Women's Golf Championship

NORMAN, Okla. – Oklahoma State increased its lead to 10 strokes with a 13-over par 589 total as teams battled strong winds through the second round of the 2010 Big 12 Women's Golf Championship at the par 72, 6,327-yard Jimmie Austin OU Golf Club.

The Cowgirls' 589 set the Big 12 Championship record for lowest score after two rounds.

Texas improved from a tie for fourth to second place with a two-day total of 599. Texas A&M and Kansas State also climbed up the leader board to tie for third at 600, one stroke behind the Longhorns. The Aggies entered the second round in a tie for seventh before firing a 295 - the best round of the day. KSU moved from sixth place with a 297 in the second 18 holes.

Caroline Hedwall (Oklahoma State) took sole possession of first place after shooting the tournament's best round of 67 to go seven-under par with a two-day total of 137 - both marks tying Big 12 Championship records for one and two-round scores. She entered the day tied with teammate Victoria Park, who is now in second at three-under par 141. Hedwall and Park are the only two players currently under-par for the Championship.

Hedwall birdied six holes in the second round, including three straight on 10, 11 and 12. Morgan Moon (Kansas State) moved from sixth to third place with her two-round total of 146 (+2).

The final round gets underway Sunday at 8 a.m. with Kansas State, Iowa State and Colorado teeing off the first hole while Texas Tech, Missouri and Baylor swing off 10. The remaining six teams begin at 8:50 a.m. with leaders Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas A&M on hole 1 and Nebraska, Oklahoma and Kansas starting on hole 10. The awards ceremony will be held immediately following the conclusion of play.
