Game Notes: No. 4 Texas A&M 9, No. 5 Texas Tech 2

Postgame Notes...

The Aggies will take on No. 8 Missouri on Thursday at 7:30 p.m. Texas Tech will take on No. 1 Texas tomorrow afternoon at 3 p.m.

Texas A&M (37-19-1, 1-0 in Pool One)

- The Aggies are now 19-19 all-time, and 4-3 vs. Texas Tech in Big 12 Championship play.
- Texas Tech's three hits are the fewest allowed by an Aggie defense in Big 12 Championship play.
- Designated hitter Matt Juengel had a career high 4 RBI's.
- With the win, A&M snapped a 4 game losing streak in Big 12 tournament openers, with their last win in 2003.
- Matt Juengel (8-game), Kevin Gonzalez (7-game), and Joe Patterson (5-game), all extended their hitting streaks.
- Caleb Shofner made his first start at third base since April 23 vs. Oklahoma.

Texas Tech (27-28, 0-1 in Pool One)

- The Red Raiders are now 13-21 in Big 12 Championship play.
- Tech has now lost three conference championship opening games dating back to the 2006 season. The last Red Raider opening win in the tournament came in 2005 against No. 1-seeded Nebraska, 5-3.
- Texas Tech is now riding a six-game losing streak after suffering a series sweep at Nebraska this weekend to close out the regular season.
- Sophomore designated hitter Scott LeJeune saw his 17-game hitting streak come to a halt today as he went 0-for-3 in today's loss.
- Freshman Ben Flora was charged with his third loss of the season today after surrendering four runs, three earned, on six hits while striking out a career-high six batters in a career-high five innings of work.
- Senior outfielder Bonham Hough led the Tech offense with two of the team's three hits as he finished the game 2-for-3 with one RBI and one run scored.
