#### **Game Notes: No. 8 Missouri 7, No. 1 Texas 3**

#### **Postgame Notes...**

Missouri will take on No. 4 Texas A&M (1-0) on Thursday at 7:30 p.m.

Texas will play No. 5 Texas Tech (0-1) tomorrow afternoon at 3 p.m.

#### **Missouri (28-25, 1-0 in Pool One)**

- Missouri has now won 6 of their last 7 Big 12 tournament openers.
- The Tigers are 17-20 all-time in the Big 12 Conference Championship and 3-1 vs. Texas in Big 12 Championship play.
- The Tigers snapped a 3 game losing streak, and 7 game slide against the Longhorns dating back to last year.
- Pitcher Nick Tepesch threw his 3<sup>rd</sup> complete game of his career, and 2<sup>nd</sup> in his last 3 outings.
- Senior Aaron Senne (4), freshman Dane Opel (6) and sophomore Conner Mach (6) extended their hitting streaks in today's win over the Longhorns.
- Senne, the co-Big 12 player of the year, tied his season-high for walks today with three. He finished the game 1-for-2 with two RBI and one run scored.

#### **Texas (46-9, 0-1 in Pool One)**

- The Longhorns are now 29-23 all-time against Missouri. The Tigers' win comes on the heels of a Longhorn regular-season series sweep last weekend at Mizzou.
- Today's 7-3 loss snapped a seven-game winning streak as the loss marks the first for Texas since May 7 when Kansas State defeated the Longhorns 2-1 in Manhattan.
- For the third consecutive year, Texas has dropped the opening game of the conference tournament. However, in 2008 and 2009, the Longhorns rallied back to win the Big 12 Championship title with three straight wins. The last opening win in the conference tournament for the Longhorns came in 2007 against K-State, 19-10.
- Starting pitcher Hoby Milner suffered his first loss of the season as he gave up four earned runs on six hits while striking out four batters in four innings of work. Today's game against Mizzou was just the freshman's third start of his career.
- Designated hitter Russell Moldenhauer extended his hitting streak to 13 games as he finished the day 1-for-4 at the plate.
