Game Notes: No. 4 Texas A&M 7, No. 8 Missouri 2

Postgame Notes...

Texas A&M will take on No. 1 Texas (0-2) on Saturday at 12:30 p.m.

Missouri will play No. 5 Texas Tech (1-1) Saturday morning at 9 a.m.

Texas A&M has clinched a spot in Sunday's Big 12 Championship game with tonight's win over Missouri.

Texas A&M (38-19-1, 2-0 in Pool One)

- Texas A&M will advance to its fourth Big 12 Championship game, with the last coming in 2007 when the Aggies brought home the trophy.
- With the win, A&M extends its current winning streak to four games on the season, and now holds a four game winning streak in Big 12 Championship play, a school record.
- The Aggie pitching staff has now moved into second place on the schools season strikeout list. They added nine strikeouts in the win leaving them with 538 on the season. The record holder, last year's staff, threw 568 strikeouts.
- Joe Patterson broke for home on a suicide squeeze attempt in the sixth inning, and scored when the pitch got by the catcher – it's scored as a stolen base, and thus is the Aggies' first swipe of home plate since May 12, 2009 (Caleb Shofner vs Texas State).
- Pitcher Barret Loux became the first 10-game winner for the Aggies since 2007, when Kyle Nicholson and David Newmann each won 11 games.

Missouri (28-26, 1-1 in Pool One)

- The Tigers are now 17-21 all-time in Big 12 Championship play and 1-2 vs. Texas A&M in Big 12 Championship competition.
- With the loss, Missouri is out of contention for Sunday's championship game.
- Starting pitcher Kelly Fick was charged with second loss of the season as he surrendered two runs on four hits in just 2 1/3 innings of work. In just his third start of the season, this was his shortest outing.
- Outfielder Russell LaFleur was the only Tiger to record multiple hits as he went 2-for-4 at the plate. This was his fifth multi-hit game of the season with his last coming on April 17 against Oklahoma State when he went 2-for-5 with two RBIs.
