Game Notes: No. 3 Kansas State 10 vs. No. 7 Kansas 5

Postgame Notes...

Kansas State will take on No. 2 Oklahoma Saturday afternoon at 4 p.m. Kansas will face No. 6 Baylor at 7:30 p.m. Saturday night.

Kansas State (36-19, 1-1 in Pool Two)

- The Wildcats are now 8-8 in Big 12 Championship play.
- With the win, the Wildcats hopes of playing in Sunday's championship game will be kept alive pending an Oklahoma win tonight against Baylor.
- Senior Adam Muenster extended his lead on the all-time career record for stolen bases to 76 after recording two
 more in today's game. Muenster also now sits in a tie for second place in school history with 90 hits on the year.
 With his second hit of the game (a double, his 19th of the season), he now sits in a tie for sixth place in the record
 books with four other players, including current teammate, Daniel Dellasega, for most doubles in a season (19).
 Muenster finished the game 2-for-5 with one RBI.
- Sophomore Jake Brown moved into second place in the Wildcat record books for sacrifice bunts in a season as he laid down his 13th of the year. He finished the game 1-for-3 at the plate.
- Starting pitcher Kyle Hunter earned his ninth win of the year for his first since May 7 against Texas. He now is in second place with five other former Wildcats for most single-season wins in school history. The sophomore surrendered five earned runs on eight hits while striking out three batters in five innings of work.
- Closer James Allen picked up his eighth save of the season in relief today as he now ranks in a tie for fourth in school history for saves in a season. He finished the game only allowing two hits in two innings of shutout work.

Kansas (31-26-1, 0-2 in Pool Two)

- The loss eliminates Kansas from contention for Sunday's Championship game.
- Second baseman Robby Price is now in second place alone on KU's career runs scored list. Price scored his 203rd career run on a single to right in the first after belting his team leading fifth triple off the wall. Robby now trails his brother Ritchie, who played for the Jayhawks from 2003-2006, by only one run. He finished today's game going 2-for-5 with one RBI and one run scored.
- Price extended his hitting streak to six games, and has multiple hits in four straight games. Teammate Tony Thompson also extended his hitting streak to six games. Thompson has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games.
- Kansas has now lost five straight games, their longest losing streak of the season.
- Senior Cameron Selik suffered his fourth loss of the season as he surrendered seven runs while scattering 10 hits in 5 2/3 innings.
