

2010 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship AT&T Bricktown Ballpark May 29, 2010

Game Notes: No. 4 Texas A&M 9, No. 1 Texas 3

Texas A&M (39-19-1, 3-0 in Pool One)

- Texas A&M finished 3-0 in pool play for the first time in school history. With the win the Aggies extend their
 winning streak to five games in a row, and now sport a five game Big 12 championship win streak, a school
 record.
- The last time the Aggies defeated a No.1-ranked team was April 14, 2009 at Rice, 7-3.
- The Aggies handed Big 12 Pitcher of the Year Cole Green his first loss of the year after he started 10-0.
- Designated hitter Matt Juengel went 3-for-4 at the plate with two home runs and three RBIs. It is Juengel's first career multi-homer game, and the first ever multi-homer game by an Aggie in the Big 12 tournament.
- Shortstop Brodie Greene and right fielder Tyler Naquin each had four hits on the day, both tying career highs. Naquin finished the day 4-for-5 with two doubles and a 3-run home run, while Greene was 4-for-5 with two RBIs. Naquin's three RBIs on the day is also a career high.
- A&M as a team homered three times on the day, tying their season high as well as the school record in Big 12 Championship play. The Aggies have now homered in eight straight games and 11 of their last 12.
- Eight of the Aggies' 14 hits were extra-base hits (five doubles, three homeruns), tying a season high.

Texas (46-11, 0-3 in Pool One)

- For the first time since the 2001 season, Texas has been swept in the Big 12 Championships after falling to Missouri (7-3), Texas Tech (4-2) and Texas A&M (9-3).
- With the loss, this marks the first time all season the Longhorns are riding a three-game losing streak.
- Starting pitcher Cole Green, Big 12 Pitcher of the Year, was charged with his first loss of the season as he gave up a season-high seven earned runs on nine hits while only striking out four batters. The last time Green faced the Longhorns (April 17) he was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week after allowing a mere one hit and no runs in a complete game effort.
- Catcher Cameron Rupp extended his current hitting streak to 10 games as he went 1-for-5 with one run scored in today's game.
- Outfielder Connor Rowe led the Texas offense as he went 3-for-4 at the plate, all three singles.
- Pitcher Brandon Workman made just his second relief appearance of the season today as he managed to give up two earned runs on four hits in 2 1/3 innings of work while striking out three batters as well as hitting two batters.
