Game Notes: No. 2 Oklahoma 13, No. 3 Kansas State 2

Postgame Notes...

Oklahoma (44-15, 2-1 in Pool One)

- Oklahoma improves to 24-23 all-time in Big 12 Championship play and 8-7 under its current format.
- The Sooners capitalized on their 24th "big" inning of the year scoring six runs in the fourth en route to scoring 13 runs on the night. With the win OU is now 20-1 on the season when scoring 10 or more runs.
- Oklahoma homered three times during the game; they have now homered in 16 of their last 17 games (multiple times in eight of those 16 games).
- Third baseman Garrett Buechele extended his current hitting streak to eight games, while going 3-for-3 at the plate tonight. Buechele homered twice in the game, his second multi-homer game of the season. With his two homers tonight he passed teammates Cameron Seitzer and Max White for the team lead in home runs (15).
- Anthony Collazo appeared in the fourth straight game for the Sooners, while only facing one batter, a strikeout, he extended his streak to seven straight scoreless appearances.

Kansas State (36-20, 1-2 in Pool Two)

- The Wildcats are now 8-9 in Big 12 Championship play.
- For the first time since 2007, K-State finished the Big 12 Championships with less than two wins (1-2).
- Carter Jurica did not start in today's game for the first time since the 2008 Big 12 Championship title game. This broke a streak of 117 straight starts for the junior.
- Senior Ryan Daniel made his first start since April 30 (at Oklahoma) today. His three innings pitched was his longest outing since four innings against Baylor on April 16. He finished the game allowing three earned runs while scattering five hits and striking out four Sooners. The four strikeouts are the most for Daniel since he fanned seven batters against Milwaukee on March 19.
- Senior Adam Muenster picked up his third stolen base of the Big 12 Championship today, extending his career record to 77. He finished the game going 1-for-3 at the plate.
