Game Notes: No. 6 Baylor 6, No. 7 Kansas 3

Postgame Notes...

Baylor and Texas A&M will face off in tomorrow's 2010 Big 12 Championship title game for the second time in four years. The Aggies will be the home team.

Baylor (34-21, 3-0 in Pool Two)

- For just the fifth time in Big 12 Championship history, Baylor has swept pool play along with tomorrow's title game opponent, Texas A&M. Out of the five times this feat has been accomplished, Baylor has done it twice. The last time the Bears swept their pool was in 2007 where they went on to fall in the title game to Texas A&M, 14-6.
- Baylor now stands at 26-21 in Big 12 Championship play.
- In tonight's game, the Bears turned four double plays to tie the Big 12 Championship record. The last time a team did so was Missouri against Oklahoma State on May 24, 2006.
- With the win, Baylor is now riding a season-high, eight-game winning streak.
- Junior Landis Ware drove in four runs tonight for the second time this tournament. This record has only been done seven other times by a Baylor Bear in program history. He finished the game 2-for-3 with four RBIs and one run scored.
- In only his fifth appearance of the year, sophomore Joey Hainsfurther earned his first save of the season after scattering only three hits while fanning one Jayhawk batter in 2 2/3 innings of shutout work.

Kansas (37-20-1, 0-3 in Pool Two)

- Kansas dropped their sixth game in a row, extending their season-high losing streak. The Jayhawks finished 0-3 in pool play for the second year in a row. Kansas has not won a game in Big 12 Championship play since winning the tournament in 2006.
- Second baseman Robby Price extended his hitting streak to seven games in the loss, going 2-for-4 at the plate.
 With his two hits, Price tallied his 20th multi-hit game of the season and fifth straight for the Jayhawks. Robby scored his 204th career run in the 6th inning, tying his brother Ritchie for KU's all-time leader in runs scored.
- Tony Thompson (7), Casey Lytle (4), and Brett Lisher (5) all extended their current hitting streaks.
- Jimmy Waters had the lone RBI for the Jayhawks, adding to his team-leading total of 63.
