

2010 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship AT&T Bricktown Ballpark May 30, 2010

Game Notes: No. 4 Texas A&M 5 vs. No. 6 Baylor 3

Postgame Notes...

This was the first extra innings game of the 2010 Championships and the first extra innings title game since 2004 when Oklahoma State defeated Missouri, 10-9, in 13 innings.

Texas A&M (40-19-1, 0-3 in Pool Two)

- With the win, this is the second Big 12 Championship title for the Aggies. Coincidentally, both titles have come over Baylor with the last title coming in a 14-6 victory in the 2007 Big 12 Championship game.
- Texas A&M now stands at 2-2 in Big 12 Championship title games and 2-0 when advancing out of pool play.
- The Aggies are now riding a six-game winning streak and have also won six straight games in Big 12 Championship play, dating back to the opening game of the 2009 Big 12 Championship against Missouri.
- A&M extended their school record 16 wins for the month of May with today's 5-3 win over Baylor.
- Senior Brodie Greene's walkoff home run in the bottom of the 10th inning marks the first walkoff home run win of the year for the Aggies. Greene finished the day 4-for-5 with two RBIs and two runs scored. He was named the 2010 Big 12 Championship's Most Outstanding Player.
- With Greene's home run, the Aggies recorded a program-best seven bombs in this year's tournament. The previous most was six in 1997. Texas A&M has now safely homered in each of their past nine contests.
- Catcher Kevin Gonzalez extended his current hitting streak to nine games as he went 1-for-3 at the plate.

Baylor (34-22, 3-0 in Pool Two)

- For the sixth time in six appearances, Baylor was denied the title as Aggie senior blasted a two-run, bottom-of-the-10th home run to win Texas A&M's second Big 12 Championship title. This was the second time the Aggies defeated the Bears for the Big 12 Championship trophy. The last time was in 2007 by a score of 14-6.
- The 10-inning game was the sixth of the season and fourth in Big 12 Championship competition for the Bears. They now hold a 1-5 record in games beyond nine innings and 2-2 record in extra-inning Big 12 Championship games.
- Baylor now stands at 26-22 in Big 12 Championship play and 1-3 vs. the Aggies in Big 12 Championship competition.
- Prior to today's loss, the Bears were 27-1 when leading a game after eight innings. They now stand at 27-2 on the year.
- With the loss, Baylor's season-high, eight-game winning streak comes to a skid. Their last loss, prior to today's 5-3 defeat, came on May 15 at Texas Tech with the same result, 5-3.
- Senior Willie Kempf, who earned the Bears' first win of the tournament in relief on Wednesday against K-State, got the start in today's title game and entertained his longest outing since the 2008 season as he went 7 1/3 innings as he finished the game only allowing one run on five hits while fanning five Aggie batters to earn a no-decision.
- Sophomore Brooks Pinckard, who started the game at center field, came into the game in relief in the ninth inning and was
 charged with his second loss of the season as he surrendered two earned runs on three hits, including the game-winning tworun blast over the left field wall.
