The site boasts original content from throughout the Conference along with several video broadcasts, including a weekly show (The Big 12 Report) and a daily update (Big 12 Minute). In men's basketball, full rebroadcasts and condensed game highlights of numerous contests will be available via the Big 12 Digital Network, within 72 hours of a game's completion. **Many parts of Big12Sports.com - including video - are also available via an application on the various mobile platforms (iPhones, iPads, Android) for the first time this season.** Comprehensive live coverage of media day in October and the 2012 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship in March is also available.

Big 12 Release

The Big 12 will update a media release, including team notes, results and more each morning after games are played during the season. Complete league statistics, in addition to team-by-team stats for all 10 league squads, will be updated via the conference website as well.

Phillips 66 Weekly Awards

A Big 12 Player and Rookie of the Week will be chosen each Monday, beginning November 14. Nominations are submitted by the school media relations offices and the winners are selected by a panel of media voters who cover the league on a regular basis. This year marks the 16th year for Phillips 66 as a sponsor of the Big 12 Conference.

The Big 12 Report is a weekly show that is available exclusively at Big12Sports.com. Featuring analysis/commentary by Correspondent Wendell Barnhouse, the show is broadcast each Wednesday and focuses on the news and the stories going on in and around the Big 12 that week.

The Big 12 also boasts two over-the-air weekly magazine-style shows. Each program is a 30-minute promotion of the league, with features on student-athletes, coaches, teams and conference championships. **Big 12 Showcase** returns for its 16th season on FSN and has been produced by Keith Fletcher each of those years. Emily Jones handles hosting duties. **Big 12ThisWeek** is televised by ESPNU, with Chad McKee as the primary host. Segments of both programs are available online via the Big 12 website.

Championship Credentials

Media credentials for the 2012 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship are authorized and issued by the Conference office. An online credential system, provided through an agreement with Sports Systems Services, Inc., is the only method to submit requests. The credential system will be made available during the month of January.

Postseason Awards

The Big 12 presents the only official all-conference awards at the end of the regular season. Major award winners are chosen, along with the All-Big 12 teams. Each Big 12 head coach votes on the squads and is not permitted to vote for his own players. The awards will be announced in March prior to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship.

Academic All-Big 12 teams are also chosen in men's basketball and will be announced prior to the postseason.

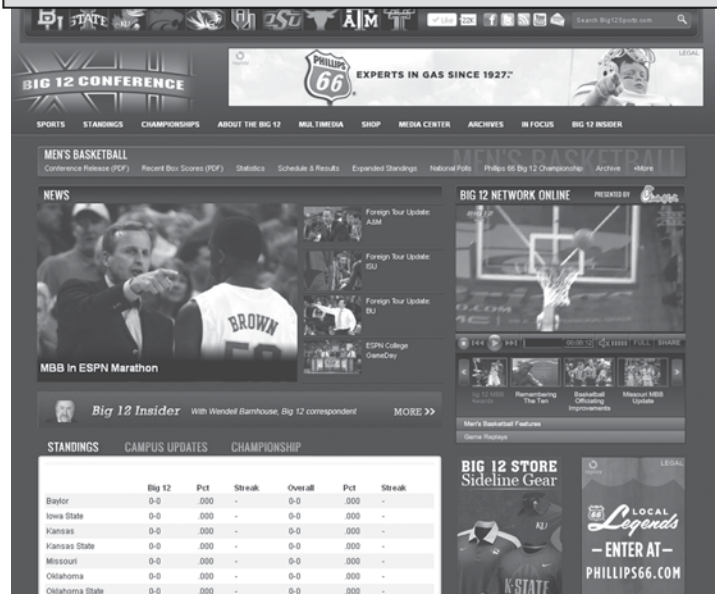

Big 12 To Play Full Round-Robin Slate in 2012

The Big 12 will be the only one of the six major conferences where every team plays everyone home and away. The Conference will employ an 18-game schedule in 2011-12, with every team playing every other squad twice.

Tidbits On 10 Teams

The Big 12 has earned 80 NCAA bids in its history. All but three of those bids were earned by the 10 members that will make up the Big 12 in 2011-12.

The Big 12 has 115 NCAA Tournament victories in its history. All but one of those wins was earned by the 10 teams that will make up the league in 2011-12.

The Big 12 has 24 NCAA bids in the past four years and 42 since 2004 – all earned by squads that will compete in the Big 12 this coming season.

A total of 25 of the 26 consensus All-Americans in Big 12 history have come from schools that will compete in the Big 12 in 2011-12.

Every Big 12 men's basketball player that has won a major national award in league history hails from one of the 10 schools that will play in the Conference during the upcoming season.

Big 12 Stars Garner Early Preseason Love

Two of the top returning performers in the Big 12 have been recognized as part of the *Sporting News* Preseason All-America Teams. Baylor sophomore forward Perry Jones III was selected to the first team, while Kansas junior forward Thomas Robinson was part of the second team.

Protecting Home Courts Against The Outsiders

Big 12 teams combined for an amazing home record over the last two seasons, posting a 222-6 (.974) record versus non-conference foes in their home arenas. League squads have won 177 of their last 182 non-conference home matchups dating back to 2009-10.

Extra-Tough At Home In Recent Years

The Big 12 was 181-34 (.842) at home during the 2010-11 campaign, the most wins and best winning percentage in league history. Conference squads have won more than 80 percent of their home contests in each of the past four seasons, the best stretch in Big 12 history. The Big 12's combined annual record at home is included below.

GameDay Could Make Two Appearances Again

The upcoming year could mark the fourth time since 2005 that two Big 12 institutions will host ESPN's College Gameday driven by State Farm college basketball show in the same season. The popular weekly program will take its show to the University of Missouri for the first time in school history when the Tigers host Kansas on

February 4. The second appearance could take place in the final weekend of the regular season when ESPN will utilize a "flex pick" for the first time. One of two options that week will be Texas at Kansas from Allen Fieldhouse on March 3. KU has hosted on four previous occasions, while Missouri becomes the seventh school from the Big 12 (Baylor, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas) to host the event.

Rankings Regulars

Big 12 squads are mainstays among the national top 25 polls every season. Last year, at least four conference teams were ranked in the top 25 in all but one week, with five squads ranked on eight different occasions and six teams in the top 25 three times. Entering the 2011-12 campaign, at least one conference team has been ranked every week since the Big 12 began competition in 1996-97, a span of 286 consecutive weeks.

Overall, 1,904 rankings in the top 25 have been earned in Big 12 history, with 1,885 (99 percent) coming from the 10 current members.

Against Each Other

The Big 12 fared well among the six major conferences when playing each other, finishing as one of two leagues with a winning record in 2010-11. **The Big 12 has posted a better than .500 record versus this group in three of the last four years.**

RPI Ratings

Last season, the Big 12 had five squads among the top 37 of the Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) on Selection Sunday and was the only league with every team rated among the top 165. The Big 12 was ranked third as a conference, the fourth straight season the league has been among the top three nationally in RPI.



Eight Big 12 Squads Advanced To Postseason

The Big 12 had five teams selected for the NCAA Championship and three that participated in the NIT a year ago. It marked the fourth consecutive season that the Conference had at least eight postseason squads.

The Most Among The Elite

The Big 12 has had two teams in the regional finals in three of the past four seasons (2008, '09, '10). Nine times in the last 10 years at least one conference squad has advanced to the Elite Eight. Since 2002, the Big 12 has had the most teams in the regional finals and more than double the amount of some conferences.

In the last four years (2008-11), the Big 12 has sent six DIFFERENT teams to the Elite Eight - more than any conference in the country. Since the NCAA Championship field expanded to 64 teams in 1985, the Big 12 is the only conference that has accomplished the feat of sending six different teams in a three-year span (2008-10) to the regional finals.

Ready To Play In Early Rounds

The Big 12 has done well as a conference at the start of the NCAA Championship. The league is 14-4 (.778) in NCAA games prior to the Round of 32 over the past three seasons (2009-11). Since 2008, the Big 12 is 19-5 (.792) in its first NCAA contests. In the past five seasons, league squads are 22-6 (.787) in their first matchups.

Last Four Seasons, Big 12 Is Among The Best

Over the past four years, the Big 12 has posted a 37-23 (.617) record in NCAA play. The winning percentage is second nationally during that time.

Big 12 Basketball Is The Road To The NBA

The Big 12 has become the place to be for those who want to be selected in the NBA Draft. The Conference has produced more NBA first-round draft picks than any league in the nation each of the past two years. The Big 12 had six first-rounders in 2011 after having seven two years ago.

The 2011 draft marked the second consecutive season and third time overall that at least five conference standouts were taken in the first round. It was also the sixth straight draft that at least one Big 12 athlete has been picked among

the top six.

The 2011 draft was the first time in Big 12 history the Conference has had four selections among the first 14 choices. It was also the second consecutive year that the NBA Draft boasted three straight first-round picks from the Big 12.

A total of 78 players from the Conference have been selected since the first season in 1996-97. The Big 12 has had at least four players drafted in each of the last eight years. In addition, there has been at least one league athlete among the top 10 overall selections in 11 of 15 seasons.

Since the first season of conference competition, the Big 12 has always guaranteed its teams extensive national television coverage. This year, the Big 12 Conference continues its long-standing relationship with the ESPN family of networks, including ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN3.com.

In addition, Conference games are provided to CBS through the partnership with ESPN. The Big 12 and ESPN, Inc. are entering the fourth year of a long-term contract that runs through the 2015-16 season. **The Big 12 was the first conference to be guaranteed three weekly telecast windows on ESPN or ESPN2.** In addition, 95 games will air annually with more than 60 contests broadcast by ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU. Selected games will also be available on ESPN3.com and ESPN Full Court, the network's outer-market pay subscription service. The telecasts listed below were known at press time.

The Big 12 Conference maintains long-term television agreements to ensure the greatest exposure for its men's basketball programs. Included below is a breakdown of these rights and how they affect which games are televised, and when they are shown.

ESPN has purchased the rights to 95 games, plus all games of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship. Of those 95 contests:

- Forty-three will be televised on either ESPN or ESPN2, with a maximum of 20 of those games sublicensed to a national over-the-air network (ABC/CBS)
- In addition to the 43 games above, a maximum of 20 games may be televised on ESPNU and 32 games may be televised in syndication on the Big 12 Network
- ESPNU may move up to six games per season for telecast exclusively on ESPN3.com (Internet)

Appearance Requirements

There are no appearance requirements (minimums or maximums) for games on ESPN, ESPN2, syndication or the sublicense to a national over-the-air network. However, ESPNU and ESPN3.com shall be subject to the following restrictions:

- No same single match-up game in consecutive seasons
- No more than four appearances on ESPNU or ESPN3.com in a season, except two schools may have five appearances
- No more than one appearance per season on ESPN3.com

Game Times/Exclusive Windows

The times for selected games will be (Central Time):

- The late window (generally 8 p.m.) for Big Monday telecasts
- No earlier than 11 a.m., for weekend games distributed on ESPN, ESPN2 or an over-the-air network
- No earlier than Noon, for all other weekend games
- No earlier than 6 p.m., nor later than 8:30 p.m., for all Wednesday games
- No earlier than 6 p.m., nor later than 8 p.m., for all other games

Member institutions which carry local or third-tier packages are precluded from televising games in exclusive windows as established by the contract. These windows generally allow for a slight overlap of games of up to 30 minutes, except as noted below:

- Monday evening games, two-hour protected window
- Wednesday evening games, 90-minute protected window
- Syndication games on Saturday afternoons, two-hour protected window
- Syndicated games in primetime (weekend and weekday) and Sundays, 90-minute protected window
- Tuesday, Wednesday and/or Friday games (except syndication), no protected window



Distribution of Institutional (Local) Package Games

ESPN controls the national/regional distribution of games and the contract limits the geographical reach of institutional (third-tier or local) package games to the state(s) of the participating team(s). The guidelines for the distribution of these games include:

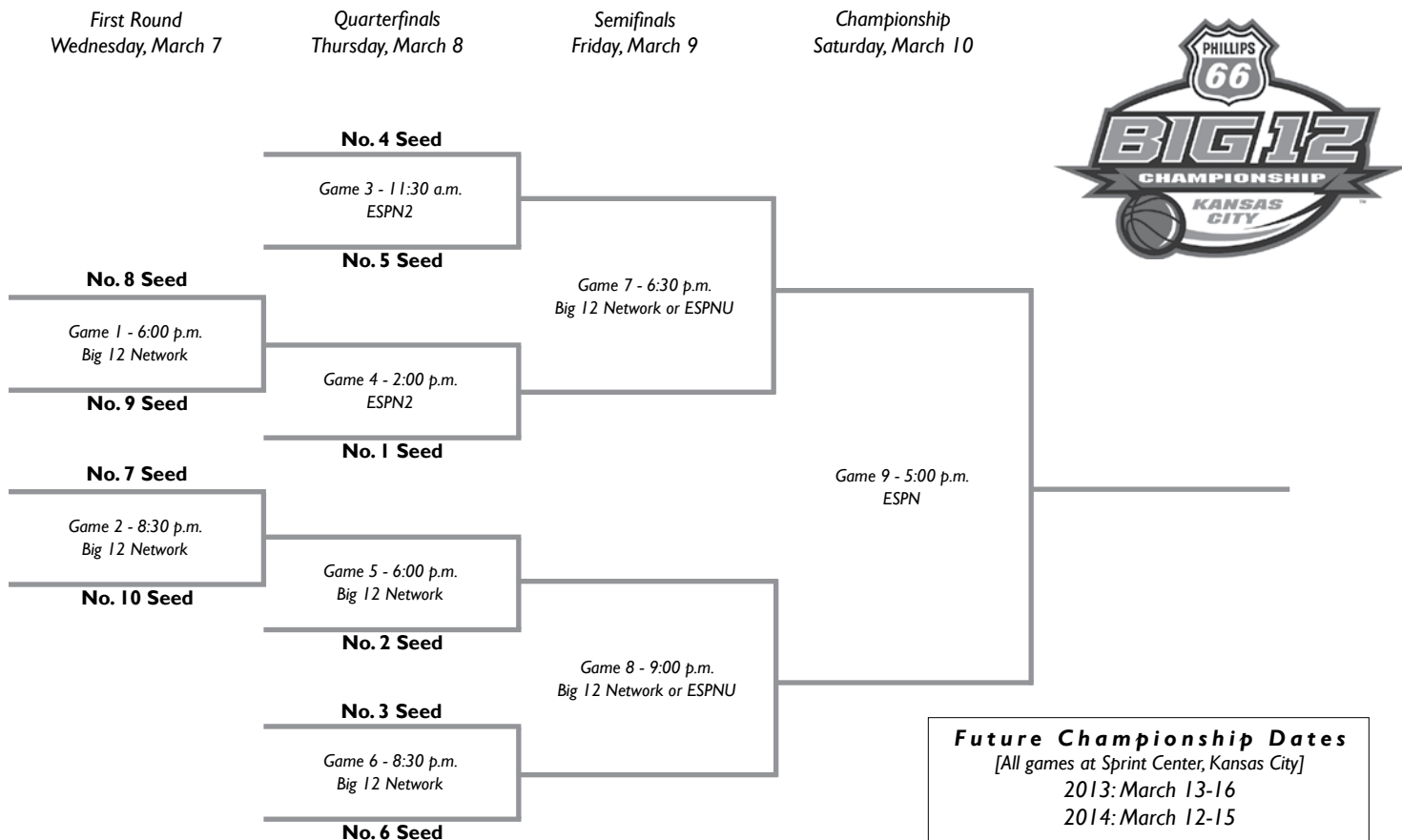
- Telecasts may be distributed only within the states (and overlapping DMAs) of the two participating teams
- At its option, institutions may present the telecasts to ESPN for placement on ESPN Full Court
- Unselected games produced as part of the local package may be distributed by Big 12 websites within the state(s) of the participating teams
- If an unselected game is offered to ESPN for out-of-market distribution (ESPN Full Court) and ESPN declines, Big 12 websites may distribute such games on a free, sponsored, pay-per-view or other basis

Revenue Distribution Process

Basketball television revenue is divided equally among all member institutions. However, each institution is awarded a flat amount annually for non-conference home games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU and for non-conference road games on an over-the-air network (e.g. CBS, ABC).



The Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship will continue in Kansas City in 2012, with Sprint Center hosting the league championship for the fourth time. All 10 institutions will participate with seeding based on regular season finish. The top six squads in the conference standings earn first-round byes. The Big 12 Champion earns the league's automatic bid to the 68-team NCAA Championship field. The entire Big 12 Championship will be televised on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN Full Court, ESPN3 or the Big 12 Network.

CHAMPIONSHIP TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

Seeding for the Championship will be based upon regular-season competition. The winner of the postseason basketball championship shall be declared the Big 12 automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championship. A team ineligible under NCAA or Big 12 rules for postseason competition shall not compete in the championship.

Tiebreakers - The first criteria in the breaking of ties in the standings shall be head-to-head competition of tied teams. The following procedure will be used to establish the postseason championship seeds when ties exist.

Ties Involving Two Teams

- Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season.
- Each team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular-season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.  - Institutions involved in the drawing have the right to have a local representative in attendance at the drawing.
 - A single slip of paper for each institution (with name or logo) will be placed into a container and will be drawn in order of seeding from highest to lowest.

Ties Involving More than Two Teams

- Results of collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams (mini round-robin).
- If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record.
- If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record vs. the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standing until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- If at any point the multiple-team tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie-breaking procedures above will be applied.
- Once a team is eliminated from a multi-team comparison, it is dropped from further comparisons.

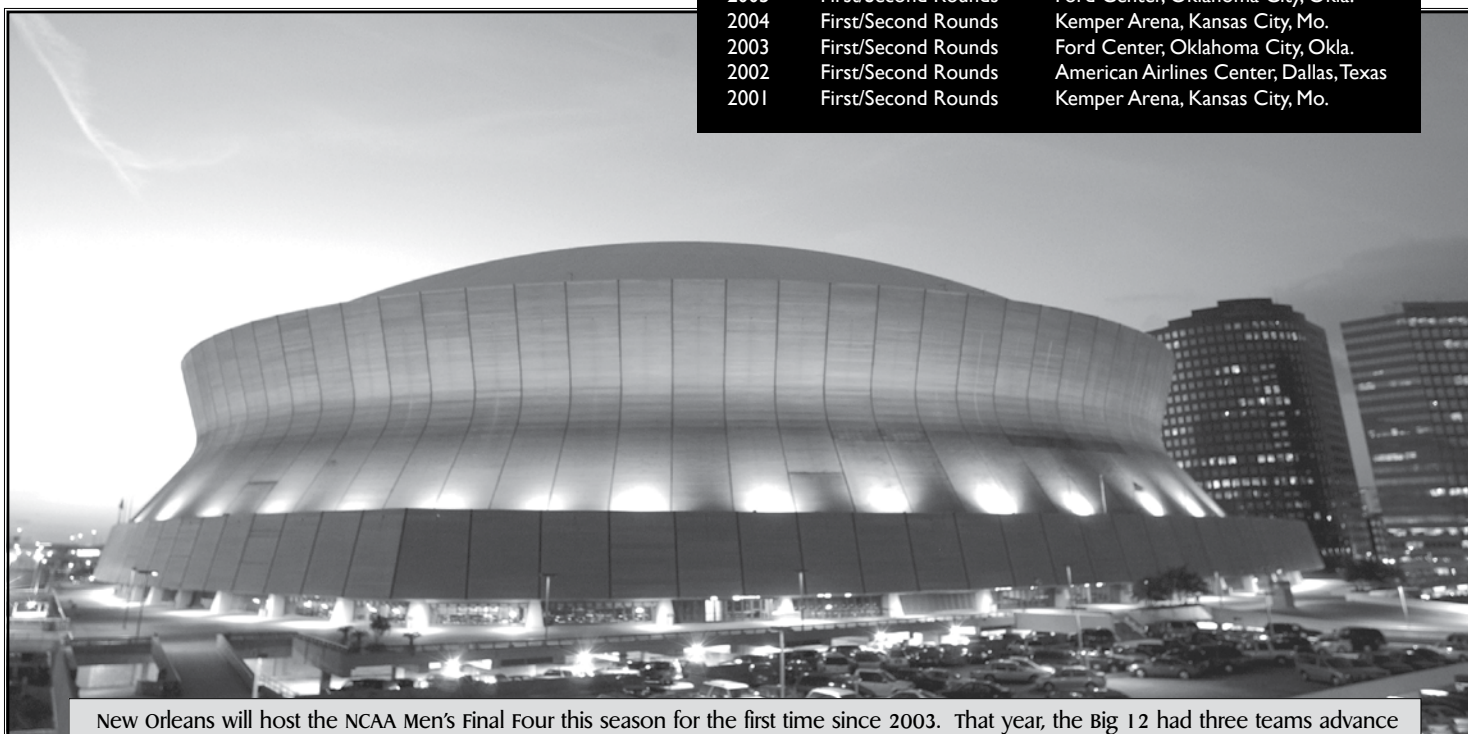
