### **Baylor in the NCAA Tournament**

With Sunday's 86-76 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 victory over Green Bay, Baylor advanced to the Elite Eight for the second straight season and third time in program history. In NCAA Tournament play, BU is 2-0 in the Elite Eight, 1-1 in the semifinals and 1-0 in championship games. All-told, the Lady Bears are 22-8 (.733) in 10 NCAA trips, all of which have come under Kim Mulkey.

Baylor advanced behind **Brittney Griner's** 10th season double-double, with a career-high 40 points and 10 rebounds, against Green Bay. Also joining Griner in double-digit scoring was **Odyssey Sims** with 18. Baylor shot a season-high .589 (33-56) in the winning effort.

The Lady Bears, riding a 10-game win streak, take on eighth-ranked and second-seeded Texas A&M, a 79-38 winner over sixth-seeded Georgia.

Tuesday's Baylor/Texas A&M matchup marks the fourth meeting between the long-time rivals this season. The Lady Bears have won all three contests; 63-60 in College Station, 67-58 in Waco and 61-58 in the Big 12 Championship's title game in Kansas City, Mo. Baylor has won 22 of the last 25 contests, including eight straight victories. Overall, on neutral courts, the Lady Bears hold a 7-4 edge, including four straight neutral court wins.

When Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Kim Mulkey accepted the position of women's basketball head coach at Baylor University a decade ago, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious transformation the program was about to undergo. In just 11 years at Baylor, the former Olympic Gold medalist has guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, the 2005 NCAA national championship, 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, 11, 20-win seasons and two 30-win campaigns. In addition, over the past seven seasons, Mulkey has led the Lady Bears to two Final Four appearances (2005, '10) and five Big 12 Conference titles.

The 2005 national title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport and the first basketball national title, men's or women's, in the Big 12 Conference's 15-year history.

In winning the 2005 title, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to capture a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach and head coach. In addition,

she is the first individual ever to play for a women's team ranked No. 1 among AP voters while also later becoming coach of a team selected to No. 1.

En route to the NCAA championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and were the league's tournament champion, too. Baylor claimed another Big 12 title by winning the league's 2009 postseason tournament and swept both the 2011 regular-season and tournament titles.

Mulkey has produced amazing results since taking over the reins on April 4, 2000, averaging 27.1 wins a season. In her 11 years at the program's helm, she has posted an impressive 298-78 (.793) record which ranks her No. 4 nationally in winning percentage. In addition, the Lady Bear program ranks No. 6 among the NCAA Division I's winningest teams over that span.

Since taking over a squad that was just 7-20 the season prior to her arrival, Mulkey has guided the Lady Bears to 11 postseason appearances, including 10 NCAA Tournaments, two trips to the Women's Final Four and a trip to the 2003 WNIT finals. Her teams have also registered 11 of the program's 17, 20-win seasons and two of its six all-time 30-win campaigns.

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down," hit bookstores on Nov. 1, 2007, the paperback edition became available on Sept. 8. 2008.

Since coming into the league in 2000-01, Mulkey owns the top winning percentage and most victories among Big 12 coaches at 79.3 percent (298-78).

# Baylor Earns Record Number of Big 12 Awards...

Big 12 regular season champion Baylor became the first program in Conference history to collect five individual awards, including coach and player of the year, to highlight the 2010-11 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball awards released March 7. The official All-Big 12 awards are selected by the league's head coaches, who are not allowed to vote for their own players.

**Kim Mulkey** earned her second Big 12 Coach of the Year honor while sophomore **Brittney Griner** became the second Lady Bear to garner Big 12 Player of the Year in addition to picking up her second nod for Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year. Last season she shared the award with Nebraska's Yvonne Turner.

**Destiny Williams** was voted Big 12 Newcomer of the Year while **Odyssey Sims** was selected Big 12 Freshman of the Year. For the first time in program history, three Baylor players earned All-Big 12 first-team recognition when the 2010-11 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 Conference Women's Basketball awards were released. Griner, **Melissa Jones** and Sims were named to the league's first-team while Griner was an All-Defense selection and Sims was named to the All-Freshman team.

### Quick Hits...

- With Sunday's win over Green Bay, Baylor, at 34-2, set a Big 12 record for single-season wins. The Lady Bears held the previous mark of 33 which it set during the 2004-05 NCAA championship season.
- In Baylor's three 2011 NCAA Tournament games, the team is shooting an impressive .519 (83-160) from the field. Four players are shooting 50 percent or above; Brittney Griner (.630), Destiny Williams (.625), Brooklyn Pope (.565) and Kimetria Hayden (.500).
- Brittney Griner is the nation's leader in blocked shots this season, as she now has 168 rejections, passing St. Mary's Louella Tomlinson's 151 (Tomlinson's season is complete).
- **Griner's** career high 40 points vs. Green Bay were the most by a BU player since Danielle Crockrom scored 41 at Texas A&M on Jan. 20, 2001.
- Baylor won a program-record 15 Big 12 regular-season games. The Lady Bears became the seventh Big 12 champion to win at least 15 league games in the league's 15-year history.
- Baylor has now won at least 29 games in three of head coach Kim Mulkey's 11 seasons and has won 30 or more games twice; 33 in 2005 and a school-record 34 in 2011.
- BU has posted its sixth 30-win season ever, and second under Kim Mulkey. Four of BU's 30-win seasons came before
  women's basketball was recognized as an NCAA Championship sport.
- Baylor has won five Big 12 titles, two regular season (2005, 2011) and three postseason tournaments (2005, 2009, 2011).
- Baylor has held its opponents to a league-leading .322 field goal percentage this season while shooting .477.
- Baylor's Brittney Griner is a contender for National Player of the Year honors while point guard Odyssey Sims is a National Freshman of the Year candidate. The tandem joins Melissa Jones as All-America candidates as well.
- BU, 15-1 in league play, outscored its Big 12 opponents by 18.4 points per game and won 12 of its 16 conference games by 12 or more points. Baylor's three non-double-digit Big 12 wins were road victories at No. 6/5 Texas A&M (63-60), Jan. 30 and at No. 16/15 Oklahoma (82-81), Feb. 27 and a home victory over the fifth-ranked Aggies (67-58), Feb. 14.
- Baylor is 13-1 vs. ranked opponents this season, including four top 10 victories, and has won 13 straight vs. ranked foes.
   The Lady Bears have posted a +12.0 scoring margin over their 14 ranked opponents this season.
- Against ranked opponents, Odyssey Sims owns a higher scoring average than her season scoring mark. Sims averages 17.0 ppg vs. ranked foes vs. 13.4 ppg on the season.
- **Brittney Griner** hit just 19-of-32 free throws over the season's first four games, including 5-of-13 at No. 1 UConn, but has since hit 81.3 percent (208-of-256) to move her season mark from .594 to .789. Over the last 14 games, Griner is 101 of 119 (.849) from the free throw line, including 10-of-10 vs. Green Bay.
- Baylor leads the Big 12 Conference in 12 categories: scoring offense, scoring defense, scoring margin, field goal
  percentage, field goal percentage defense, 3-point FG percentage, 3-point FG percentage defense, rebounding offense,
  rebounding margin, blocked shots, assist/turnover ratio and defensive rebounds.
- Baylor drew 10,294 fans vs. Texas (Feb. 12) to eclipse the program's single-season attendance record of 122,550 which was set over 17 home games a year ago. After completing its undefeated 21-game home slate in 2010-11, a record 166,593 (7,933 per game) passed through the Ferrell Center doors. Baylor surpassed the all-time Ferrell Center (men's or women's) total home attendance mark of 134,256 set by BU's men's team over 19 games in 2008-09 as well as the overall per-game women's average record set in 2005-06 (7,717 per game).
- Baylor was a school-record 21-0 at home this season and has won 67 of its last 72 Ferrell Center games since the start of
  the 2007-08 season. Texas' 70-54 win a year ago marked BU's last homecourt loss.
- BU's 21-game win streak, which was snapped by Texas Tech on Feb. 19 in Lubbock, was its longest since a school-record 30-game string that encompassed the final 20 games of the 2004-05 season and the first 10 of the 2005-06 campaign. The 21-game run was BU's longest single-season run and second-longest overall streak in school history and marked the ninth time in the last 11 seasons it has registered at least one double-digit win streak.

- Coaches Association (WBCA) 2011 NCAA Division I State Farm Coaches' All-America team. The 40 finalists, who are voted upon by WBCA-member coaches in each of the eight WBCA regions, are now in the running for selection to the 10-member State Farm Coaches' All-America team.
- Griner, the 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, averages a team-leading and Big 12 leading 23.1 points per game and leads the nation in blocked shots with 168 on the season. Sims, the 2011 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, ranks second on the team with 13.4 points per game and leads the Big 12 in 3-point field goal percentage at .456. Both players were All-Big 12 first team selections.

### Texas A&M Aggies...

- Located in College Station, Texas, the Texas A&M Aggies are 30-5 on the season. Texas A&M's five losses came at fifth-ranked Duke (61-58), against No. 1 Baylor (63-60, 67-58, 61-58) and at Kansas State (71-67). The Aggies are riding a three-game win streak.
- The Aggies are led in scoring and rebounding by senior Danielle Adams' 22.7 point and 8.7 rebound averages, she is followed by junior forward Tyra White at 13.7 points and guard Sydney Carter's 10.2 an outing. Adora Elonu, a junior forward, ranks second on the team in rebounding with 5.7 a contest.
- The Aggies are coached by eighth-year head coach Gary Blair (Texas Tech, 1972). Blair is 185-79 (.701) in his eight seasons along the Texas A&M sideline and 593-242 (.710) in 26 seasons as a head coach.

# Series Records...

- Baylor leads the series 47-35 and has won 22 of the last 25 contests, including eight straight wins. Overall, on neutral
  courts, the Lady Bears hold a 7-4 edge, including four straight neutral court wins.
- Kim Mulkey is 22-4 overall vs. the Aggies and 4-0 on neutral courts (2003, '06, '09, '11).

# This Year in the NCAA Tournament...

- Attendance for Waco's first round games was 8,368, which was the highest among 2011 NCAA Women's Tournament first-round sites. Tennessee edged Baylor for first- and second-round total attendance honors with 16,955 to BU's 16,804. BU's 8,436 for its second-round win over West Virginia was the second-best crowd at the 16 NCAA sites (Tennessee had 9,007 for its game vs. Marquette in Knoxville).
- Prairie View A&M's 8 first-half points are the fewest in one half in NCAA Women's Tournament history.
- Prairie View A&M's 30 points are tied for the third-lowest point-total in an NCAA Women's Tournament game (regardless of round).
- Baylor's 51 rebounds vs. Prairie View A&M matched the 51 it hauled down against Florida on March 22, 2004
- Brittney Griner set a Baylor NCAA Tournament single-game record for points with 40 vs. Green Bay. Her 12 free throws
  made vs. West Virginia also ranks No. 1 among BU players in NCAA Tournament play.
- Baylor's .589 (33-56) shooting percentage vs. Green Bay was a team season high.

### Griner and Sims Honors Candidates...

- BG Brittney Griner 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year and National Player of the Year and All-America candidate. Griner ranks No. 1 nationally in blocks (4.7) and triple-doubles (1), No. 6 in scoring (23.1) and No. 27 in field goal percentage (.544). She leads the Big 12 in both blocks and scoring, is No. 2 in field goal percentage and No. 6 in rebounding.
- O Odyssey Sims 2011 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and National Freshman of the Year and All-America candidate. Sims ranks No. 1 in the Big 12 in 3-point field goal percentage (.456), No. 9 in field goal percentage (.483), No. 15 in assists (3.1) and No. 17 scoring (13.4). Sims poured in a career-high 37 points, including a school-record-tying nine treys, in BU's 82-81 win at No. 16 Oklahoma, Feb. 27.

### Young Squad...

- Despite being ranked No. 3 nationally and spending seven weeks at No. 1 in both polls, Baylor is still a very young team. Only five upperclassmen are listed on the 14-player roster; two seniors and three juniors. Of those five, senior Melissa Jones averaged 30.7 minutes per game in '09-10 (but was sidelined by injury for 15 games), junior Terran Condrey played 16.1 a contest, junior Ashley Field managed 13.2 an outing, while junior Lindsay Palmer and senior Whitney Zachariason played 8.1 and 5.6 minutes a game, respectively.
- Baylor's roster features seven sophomores and two freshmen. Sophomores Brittney Griner and Shanay Washington, both returning starters, played 33.5 and 21.2 minutes a game, respectively, while fellow classmates Kimetria Hayden and Jordan Madden averaged over 13.5 minutes a contest.
- Baylor's regular starting lineup consists of a freshman (Odyssey Sims), three sophomores (Brittney Griner, Jordan Madden, Destiny Williams) and a senior (Melissa Jones).

### Handling Adversity...

- After advancing to the 2010 NCAA Final Four and returning four starters, much was expected of the 2010-11 Lady Bears.
   Despite a couple of early setbacks, the loss of two returning starters, the Lady Bears have persevered.
- Starting point guard Kelli Griffin, a senior, quit the team after one exhibition contest and on Nov. 20 sophomore guard Shanay Washington suffered a season-ending injury, a torn ACL in practice. Griffin was a three-year starter and Washington had started 32 of 36 games last season and every game this season until her injury.
- Starting guard Melissa Jones received a head injury late in the Lady Bears' victory at Oklahoma, Feb. 27 and lost vision

in her right eye. She sat out the Missouri game (March 2) but was back in the starting lineup at Colorado (March 5), despite not regaining her sight in the right eye. As of March 28, she had not yet regained full vision in the eye.

 Despite the adversity, the Lady Bears have been ranked no lower No. 3 this season and spent seven weeks as the nation's No. 1 team.

### Off to a Good Start...

- Prior to its loss at Texas Tech (Feb. 19), Baylor posted its best-ever start in the program's 37 seasons at 24-1. BU opened the 2007-08 season at 20-1.
- At 34-2, the Lady Bears have posted BU's best-ever 36-game record, the 1975-76 team opened at 31-5 start en route to a 31-6 final record.
- Sunday's win over Green Bay broke the school record for wins in a season (34) and ranks as the most wins ever posted by a Big 12 Conference team.

### Trio Named All-Region...

- The trio of sophomore Brittney Griner, senior Melissa Jones and freshman Odyssey Sims were named to the seven-member State Farm Coaches' All-Region 5 team. All three are candidates for the 2011 State Farm Coaches' All-America Basketball Team. Griner is one of just three sophomores to make all-region while Sims in the only freshman listed.
- Former Lady Bear Sophia Young became Baylor's first two-time WBCA All-American with selections in 2005 and `06. Suzie
  Snider Eppers was Baylor's first WBCA All-American in 1977 and Sheila Lambert was honored in 2002. Griner was an
  honorable mention pick as a freshman in 2010.

### 300 Wins in Sight...

Baylor head coach Kim Mulkey, with her 298-78 career record, needs just two more victories to join the 300 career wins
club. In order to reach the milestone this season, the Lady Bears will have to advance to the Women's Final Four
championship game. An NCAA Tournament semifinal win would give Mulkey 300 victories in just 378 games at Baylor.

### Lady Bear Seeds...

After earning the program's first-ever No. 1 seed, Baylor's top seed marks the ninth time in 10 trips to the NCAA Tournament that the Lady Bears have been a top five seed. Baylor was a No. 2 seed twice (2002, '05), a No. 3 seed three times (2006, '08, '09), a No. 4 seed twice (2004, '10) and a No. 5 in 2007.

# **Baylor Versus Postseason Teams...**

Baylor faced 16 opponents that are participating in 2011 postseason competition and it holds a 22-2 record versus those teams. Baylor posted a 14-2 record against its 10 former opponents playing in the NCAA Tournament: Connecticut (0-1), Kansas State (2-0), Iowa State (1-0), Michigan State (1-0), Oklahoma (2-0), Notre Dame (1-0), Tennessee (1-0), Texas (2-0), Texas A&M (3-0) and Texas Tech (1-1). The Lady Bears were 8-0 against their six opponents participating in the 2011 Women's WNIT: Colorado (1-0), Kansas (2-0), Liberty (1-0), Oklahoma State (2-0), Rice (1-0) and Syracuse (1-0).

#### Defense...

- Baylor hasn't allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent from the field in 173 straight games, dating back to March 25, 2006, an 82-63 Sweet 16 loss to eventual national champion Maryland.
- BU has held 14 of its 36 opponents this season to below a .300 field goal percentage. The Lady Bears held five of their
  conference foes under 30 percent six times; Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma State (twice), Texas and Texas A&M.
- The Lady Bears hold a +25.8 scoring margin over their opponents this season and are +10.5 in rebounding. Baylor outscored its Big 12 opponents by +18.4 per game, and won 12 of 16 league games by at least 12 points.
- In NCAA Division I statistics, through games of March 22, Baylor ranks No. 1 in blocks (7.1) and No. 2 in field-goal percentage defense (.320). The Lady Bears also lead the Big 12 Conference in 3-point field goal defense (.262).
- Baylor is 27-1 on the year when allowing 60 or fewer points.
- The Lady Bears are 29-0 in 2010-11 when out-rebounding their opponent.
- Baylor has out-shot its opponent from the field in 35 of 36 games this year.

### With The Lead ...

- Baylor has led at some point in every game this season, and in 32 of its 36 games held a double-digit lead at some point
  in the contest. The Lady Bears' largest lead of the season was 66 points (105-39) with 2:39 left in the 2nd half vs.
   Southeastern Louisiana. In 24 games, BU held a lead of 20 or more points at some point in the game.
- In 20 of 21 home games this season, Baylor led by double-digits at some point in the game. The lone exception was the Lady Bears' 67-58 win over Texas A&M, when their biggest advantage was nine points (and their largest deficit was also nine points, which was the largest deficit they had on their homecourt in 2010-11). BU won its 21 home games by an average of +31.1 ppg, and held its opponents to 31.5 percent field goal shooting (including 26.4 percent from 3-point range) and 52.0 points per contest.
- The Lady Bears have recorded 18 wire-to-wire victories this season.
- Baylor has twice overcome double-digit deficits to win games this season, rallying from 11 points down in the first half (11:55, 8-19) to record an 87-72 win at Texas and from 12 down vs. Texas A&M (0-12, 15:14) in the Big 12 Championship game to post a 61-58 victory. The Lady Bears nearly had a third double-digit comeback win, as they overcame a 15-point second-half deficit at No. 1 UConn back in November to take an eight-point lead before falling, 65-64, at Hartford.
- The Lady Bears' largest deficit of the season has been 15 points, and ironically came in their only two losses, at No. 1 UConn (29-44, 16:02 in 2nd half) and at Texas Tech (37-52, 5:23 in 2nd half). Baylor also faced double-digit deficits at Texas and to Texas A&M in the Big 12 Championship title game, but came back to win both games. The Lady Bears also rallied from a 9-point deficit (38-47) with 10:13 left in the 2nd half to beat the Aggies in Waco, Feb. 14, 67-58.

# Lady Bears Love the 70s & 80s ...

While the Lady Bears are known for their gritty defense, they can also score the basketball, as evidenced by their 2010-11 scoring average of 78.0 points per game, which would rank as the program's highest since a school-record 89.9 average over 41 games in 1977-78. Baylor is 27-0 on the season when scoring 70 or more points and has won 77 straight such games since a 78-72 overtime loss at North Carolina State in the 2nd Round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament at Raleigh, N.C. The Lady Bears also have a string of 82 consecutive victories, including an 20-0 record in 2010-11, when putting 80 or more points on the scoreboard, since a 103-99 triple-overtime loss at Nebraska in 2004-05.

 All-told, Baylor is 219-13 (.944) under Kim Mulkey when scoring 70 or more points, including a 140-3 (.979) record when totaling 80 or more. The Lady Bears have averaged 70.4 or more points in 10 of Mulkey's 11 seasons along the BU sideline.

#### The Griner Effect...

With Brittney Griner's 6-8 presence in the paint and her ability to block shots, opponents have taken an increased number of 3-point shots since her arrival. In 2008-09, the year before Griner came to Baylor, BU opponents took 570 shots from beyond the arc, in 2009-10 foes took 740 treys and they have taken 733 so far this season.

### **Griner Climbing Career Block Charts...**

- Brittney Griner entered the season ranked No. 2 on Baylor's career block chart with 223 rejections. Just 41 games into her career (Nov. 23, 2010 vs. Texas Southern), Griner broke Danielle Wilson's BU record of 249, achieved in 92 games.
- Through 36 games as a sophomore, Griner has blocked 168 shots, including nine against both top-ranked UConn and No. 6 Tennessee, and her career total now stands at 391. Her 2010-11 block total stands No. 2 on both the BU single-season and Big 12 lists behind her NCAA record 223 rejections a year ago.
- Griner ranks No. 2 on the Big 12 career block list behind Oklahoma's Courtney Paris' Big 12 record of 446.

# Sims Simply Superb...

- Freshman point guard **Odyssey Sims** has scored in double digits in 25 of the last 32 games she's played in, including six 20+ point outings (24 vs. No. 6 Tennessee, 25 vs. No. 23 Syracuse, 23 at Texas; 21 at Kansas; 25 at No. 6 Texas A&M, 22 vs. No. 5 Texas A&M) and one 30+ point performance (37 at No. 16 Oklahoma).
- Sims ranks No. 1 in the Big 12 Conference in 3-point field goal percentage (.456) and No. 2 on the BU individual season best chart
- She has been named the Big 12's Freshman of the Week a league-best five times (Dec. 20, Dec. 27, Jan. 17, Jan. 31, Feb. 28)
- Sims' 107 assists and 469 points ranks No. 3 and No. 6, respectively, on BU's freshman top 10 list.

### Jones, So Versatile...

- Senior guard Melissa Jones is having quite the senior season. Although not appearing among the league's top 30 in scoring, she's listed among the Big 12 leaders in almost every other category: No. 1 assist/turnover ratio (3.0), No. 9 steals (1.9), No. 11 assists (3.9), No. 13 offensive rebounds (2.2) and No. 13 rebounding (6.9).
- In addition, Jones ranks No. 2 nationally in assist/turnover ratio (3.0).
- Jones, at 5-11, is the only player under 6-1 to rank among the league's top 12 in offensive rebounding (2.2 orpg). Jones
  on one of only two player under 6-1 listed among the Big 12's top 15 in rebounding (Chucky Jeffery, CU, 5-10).
- Jones, a guard, is the first non-point guard to lead the Lady Bears in assists (135) since Jessika Stratton was the team's assist leader in the 2002-03 season.
- Jones' 135 assists ranks No. 8 on BU's senior top 10 assist list.
- She needs just 32 points to become BU's 29th 1,000-point scorer, despite missing 16 games due to injury the past two seasons.

# 1,000 Points...

- In just 51 games, Brittney Griner recorded 1,000 career points, thus becoming the 28th Lady Bear to achieve the 1,000-point milestone, she now has 1,476 points to rank ninth on BU's career chart.
- It took former Lady Bear standout Sophia Young, a two-time All-American, 67 games to reach the 1,000-point mark.
- 10 of the 28 players on BU's 1,000-point list have played under head coach Kim Mulkey.
- Please see page 8 for a complete listing of BU's 1,000-point scorers.

### Improvement From Beyond the Arc...

- Last season the Lady Bears finished No. 12 in the Big 12 Conference and 329th nationally with 2.3 made 3's per game, while shooting just 27.6 percent (86-312) from beyond the arc.
- As of March 27, BU ranks No. 1 in the league and No. 5 nationally with a .389 (183-471) mark and is averaging 5.1 made treys per game. It took the Lady Bears just 32 games to double their 37-game 2009-10 season total (86).
- With 183 treys in 36 games, the Lady Bears have set a record for made 3-point baskets in a season, the 2004-05 national championship squad's previous record was 163 treys in 36 games.
- Freshman **Odyssey Sims**' 67 triples ranks No. 4 on BU's single-season list. She needs just nine more treys to take over the top spot from Emily Niemann's 75 makes in 2004-05.

# Sharing the Rock...

2007-present

- With the departure of senior point guard Kelli Griffin, many wondered who would pick up the slack in the assist column for the Lady Bears, and the answer has been many players.
- The Lady Bears rank No. 2 in the Big 12 Conference and No. 16 nationally (through games of March 27) in assists with 16.6 per game. Six players have dished out 40 or more assists: **Melissa Jones**, 135, **Odyssey Sims**, 107, **Kimetria Hayden**, 80, **Jordan Madden**, 61, **Brittney Griner**, 52 and **Terran Condrey** 48.
- Jones, a guard, is the first non-point guard to lead the Lady Bears in assists (135) since Jessika Stratton was the team's
  assist leader in the 2002-03 season.

# Mulkey vs. Ranked Opponents...

■ In head coach **Kim Mulkey's** 11 seasons, Baylor is 74-56 against ranked opponents. Since a 69-55 loss to No. 15 Texas during the 2004-05 season, Baylor is 56-31 versus ranked opponents, including 13-1 in 2010-11.

### Climbing the Charts...

- Brittney Griner currently ranks No. 2 on Baylor's career field goal percentage chart (.529) behind former Lady Bear standouts Sophia Young (.546) and ahead of Danielle Crockrom's (.523). Griner also ranks No. 3 on BU's career free throw made chart with 419 makes, she needs 10 to catch Angela Tisdale.
- Griner's 239 free throws made this season rank her No. 1 on the team's individual season best chart, passing Lynnell Pyron's (1974-75) record of 237 makes. In addition. her 823 points ranks No. 5 and her 23.1 ppg is No. 4.
- Griner's 832 points ranks No. 2 on the Big 12 Conference's single-season list behind Andrea Riley's 909 in 2009-10. Griner's 40 points vs. Green Bay enabled her to become the second player in Big 12 history to register an 800-point season and to break Riley's Big 12 sophomore scoring record.
- Griner's 832 points is the most-ever by a BU player in NCAA competition and the most since Debbie Polk's 899 in 1980-81. Her total ranks fifth on BU single-season list.

### BU Drops out of No. 1...

- After spending seven weeks at No. 1 in both polls, Baylor dropped to No. 3 after its 56-45 loss at Texas Tech (Feb. 19).
- On January 3, 2011, for the first time in program history, Baylor's women's basketball team ascended to the top spot in The Associated Press poll. Baylor had been ranked No. 2 every week since the beginning of the 2010-11 season but moved to the top spot after then-top-ranked Connecticut lost at then-No. 9 Stanford, 71-59.
- Prior to losing at Texas Tech, Baylor's lone loss was a one-point decision at UConn, 65-64, on Nov. 16. The Lady Bears reeled off 21 straight victories, including wins over nine ranked opponents, including three top 10 victories - No. 25 Michigan State (78-52), No. 16 Notre Dame (76-65), No. 6 Tennessee (65-54), No. 23 Syracuse (77-43), No. 17 lowa State (70-58), No. 25 Texas Tech (64-51), No. 6 Texas A&M (63-60), No. 13 Oklahoma (92-70) and No. 5 Texas A&M (67-58). Baylor has posted a +12.2 scoring margin against its 12 ranked opponents this season.
- The Lady Bears are Baylor's first team to ever achieve a No. 1 listing in an AP Poll. Men's basketball's highest ranking came on Dec. 6 and Dec. 13, 2010, when it checked in at No. 9 and football's highest ranking was No. 3 for two consecutive weeks during the 1953 season.
- Baylor also topped the chart in the Jan. 4 USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll, moving past UConn. It marks Baylor's second No.
   1 ranking in that poll, as it was listed in the top spot in the final poll of 2005.

### Marking a Million...

- The Lady Bears surpassed the 1,000,000 fan mark since Kim Mulkey's arrival on the Baylor campus when they drew 6,015 fans against Southeastern Louisiana, Nov. 28. Throughout Mulkey's 11 seasons at the program's helm, 1,111,088 fans have attended Lady Bear games in the Ferrell Center.
- Last season Baylor finished No. 8 in NCAA Division I home attendance with an average attendance of 7,209 per game. In
  addition, Baylor set a then-all-time single-season attendance record with 122,550 fans attending 17 home games.
- Through 21 home games this season, the Lady Bears drew a Ferrell Center record-breaking 166,593 fans, averaging a record 7,933 a game to rank sixth nationally.
- Against Texas (Feb. 12) Baylor eclipsed the program's single-season attendance record of 122,550.
- BU surpassed the 100,000-mark in home attendance for the sixth straight year when it drew a sellout crowd of 10,379 vs.
   Texas Tech, Jan. 22.
- Against Tennessee on Dec. 14, Baylor set a then-Ferrell Center attendance record, including both men's and women's games, when 10,569 fans attended the contest.
- The Lady Bears drew four of the top six crowds in Ferrell Center history this season with a record crowd of 10,569 vs. Tennessee, 10,379 vs. Texas Tech which stands third, the 10,299 vs. Texas A&M which ranks fifth and the 10,294 vs. Texas is No. 6.
- Baylor recorded a program-record four sellouts in 2010-11 (Tennessee, Texas Tech, Texas, Texas A&M) and its first back-to-back sellouts (Texas & Texas A&M) ever.
- Eight of the program's Top 25 Ferrell Center crowds were registered in 2010-11.

### Big 12 Attendance...

- Through games of March 22, the Lady Bears rank No. 1 among Big 12 teams in total attendance, averaging 6,852 a game.
- In **home** attendance average, Baylor is No. 2 with 7,933 per contest, behind lowa State's 9,370 a game. Texas Tech is No. 3 at 7,043, Texas A&M follows at 6,104 and Oklahoma averages 5,490.

# NCAA Division I Home Attendance...

Through games of March 22, Baylor ranks No. 6 in NCAA Division I home attendance with 7,933 fans per contest. Tennessee tops the charts with 12,069 followed by Louisville (10,859), Iowa State (9,370), Connecticut (9,075), Notre Dame (8,553) and Baylor.

- Since taking over a squad that was just 7-20 the season prior to her arrival, Kim Mulkey has averaged 27.1 wins a season.

### Home, Sweet Home...

- In **Kim Mulkey**'s 11 seasons along the Ferrell Center sideline, her teams have posted some impressive numbers on their home court. The Lady Bears have maintained a 165-19 (.897) Ferrell Center record during that time span. Mulkey's first four seasons produced a 56-10 (.849) Ferrell Center mark while over the past seven years the Lady Bears are 109-9 (.924).
- The Lady Bears have won 109 of their last 117 home games, including 67 of their last 72.
- Since a 16-3 homecourt record in 2006-07, the Lady Bears have registered Ferrell Center records of 17-1 (07-08), 14-2 (08-09), 15-2 (09-10) and this year's record-breaking 21-0 mark.
- Baylor last posted an undefeated Ferrell Center record in 2004-05 with a 14-0 mark.

# **Dunks Anyone???**

- 6-8 freshman post Brittney Griner, who dunked the ball 52 times in 32 games as a senior at Houston's Nimitz High School, recorded her first collegiate dunk on Nov. 24, 2009, versus Jacksonville State.
- In doing so, Griner became the seventh woman to record a dunk in an NCAA game.
- **Griner** threw down two more in Baylor's victory over Texas State (Jan. 2, 2010) becoming just the second female to dunk twice in a game, joining former Tennessee standout Candace Parker who dunked twice against Army, March 19, 2005.
- Griner added her fourth dunk, her first on the road and first-ever in Big 12 history, at Kansas State.
- She recorded her first dunk of the 2010-11 season and fifth career against Texas Tech on Feb. 19.
- Only Tennessee Lady Vol standout Candace Parker has more career dunks (seven) in the women's game than Griner's five.

Griner recorded an 'unofficial' dunk on Saturday, Nov. 7, 2009, when the Lady Bears downed Incarnate Word, 81-52, in an
exhibition contest. She tallied 25 points, 11 rebounds and five blocked shots in the contest.

### Set to Graduate...

- Senior Melissa Jones and junior Lindsay Palmer will both graduate in May 2011 ceremonies. Jones, a health, human performance and recreation major, will have completed her degree requirements in four years while Palmer, a psychology major, will graduate in just three years.
- Palmer earned the 2010 NCAA Elite 88 (top GPA among Final Four teams) at the Women's Final Four in San Antonio.

### Did You Know Kim Mulkey is...

- The ONLY women's basketball coach, and one of only three in men's and women's basketball (joining Bob Knight and Dean Smith), who have won a national championship as both a player and coach.
- The **ONLY** basketball coach to win a national championship as a head coach, assistant coach and player.
- The first individual ever to play for a women's team ranked No. 1 among AP voters while also later becoming coach of a team selected to No. 1.

### Co-Captains...

After serving as the team's lone captain last season, Melissa Jones has some assistance this year. Sophomore Brittney
 Griner joins Jones as a team captain.

### BU in the Polls...

- After spending seven weeks at the nation's No. 1 team, Baylor dropped to No. 3 after losing at Texas Tech on Feb. 19.
- Baylor moved into the top spot on Jan. 3, 2011, and stayed there until Feb. 21, 2011.
- The Lady Bears entered the season ranked No. 2 in the AP Top 25 preseason poll. The No. 2 ranking marked the program's highest-ever preseason AP ranking, besting the No. 6 rating to begin the 2005-06 season. It also marked BU's fourth top 10 preseason AP debut, as the Lady Bears were No. 7 on 2009-10, No. 6 in 2006-07 and No. 8 in 2004-05.
- BU began the 2010-11 season ranked No. 2 (tied with Stanford) in the USA Today ESPN Division I Top 25 Coaches' preseason poll. The Lady Bears debuted in the Coaches' poll top 10 for the fourth time in program history and their No. 2 ranking is their highest initial ranking.
- The Lady Bears have 174 AP Top 25 poll appearances in the 2000s, all of which have come under head coach Kim Mulkey, to rank No. 9 on the wire service's all-time list.
- BU has been ranked in a school-record 148 straight AP polls dating back to week nine of the 2003-04 listing when it broke
  in at No. 24.
- All told, the Lady Bears have appeared in the Associated Press Top 25 poll 185 times which ranks No. 29.

Head coach Kim Mulkey is one of four coaches in NCAA Division I that is coaching her daughter this season and the duo is
one of two mother/daughter combinations. Mulkey's daughter, Makenzie Robertson, is a freshman on this season's

- With Kim Mulkey and Leon Barmore on the Lady Bear coaching staff, Baylor is one of just two women's programs with
  at least two Women's Basketball Hall of Fame members on its 2010-11 staff.
- Head coach Kim Mulkey was enshrined in 2000, while Barmore entered the Hall in 2003. In addition, Barmore was a 2003
  inductee into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

### Injury Update...

Sophomore guard Shanay Washington tore her ACL (left knee) in practice on Saturday, Nov. 20. She will miss the rest of
the season and Baylor will apply for a medical hardship waiver. Washington underwent surgery on Dec. 1 and is currently
undergoing rehabilitation.

### Triple-Doubles...

- Brittney Griner etched her name in the Baylor record books when she produced the program's first triple-double on Dec.
   16, 2009, against Oral Roberts. The 6-8 post poured in a career-high 34 points, blocked a career-high 11 shots and hauled down 13 rebounds in Baylor's 101-76 victory.
- In that same game, Melissa Jones narrowly missed a triple-double, ending with 15 points, nine rebounds and nine steals.
- Griner added back-to-back triple-doubles when she tallied 24 points, 11 blocks and 10 rebounds against Colorado on Feb. 6, 2010, and 17 points, 11 blocks and 10 rebounds at Oklahoma on Feb. 10, 2010.
