

2011 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship Sprint Center: March 9, 2011

Game Notes: No. 9 Seed Oklahoma State 53, No. 8 Seed Nebraska 52

Big 12 Championship Notes

Oklahoma State improves to 20-12 all-time in the Big 12 Championship and remains perfect in first-round games at 9-0. The Cowboys are now 11-8 in Big 12 Championship games played in Kansas City.

Nebraska falls to 6-15 all-time in Big 12 Championship games and 4-10 in first-round contests.

This was just the second-ever meeting between Oklahoma State and Nebraska in the Big 12 Championship, with OSU moving to 2-0 against NU. OSU won the previous matchup, 54-39, in the 2007 Big 12 Championship.

Individual & Team Notes

Keiton Page scored in double figures for the 20th time this season and 52nd time in his career to lead Oklahoma State with 16 points. It is the ninth time this season Page has led the Cowboys in scoring, and the second time he has led OSU in a Big 12 Championship game (3-10-10 vs. Oklahoma).

Matt Pilgrim pulled down 12 rebounds for Oklahoma State, tied for the fifth-most ever by an OSU player at the Big 12 Championship. It is the fifth time this season and ninth time in his career that Pilgrim has reached double figures in rebounding.

Marshall Moses scored 10 points for Oklahoma State, an OSU-leading 25th time this season and 49th time in his career that he has scored 10 or more points.

Oklahoma State shot less than 50% from the field (.400) for the 25th time in 2010-11, improving to 13-12 in those games. With Nebraska finishing at .345 from the field, OSU is now 16-2 in games where its shooting percentage is the same as or better than its opponent.

Oklahoma State improved to 12-4 this season in games in which it led at halftime, and 50-10 in the Travis Ford era.

Nebraska's **Lance Jeter** scored 17 points to lead the Cornhuskers, the 21st time this season he has reached double figures in scoring and the 11th time this year he has led NU in scoring.

Toney McCray recorded 11 points for Nebraska, his 13th time in 2010-11 reaching double figures in scoring.

Brandon Ubel scored in double figures for just the seventh time this season, netting 11 points for Nebraska.
