



**2011 Phillips 66 Big 12
Women's Basketball Championship
Municipal Auditorium: March 9, 2011**

Game Notes: No. 4 Kansas State 56, No. 5 Iowa State 53

The win was Kansas State head coach Deb Patterson's 300th career victory. She is now 300-173 at Kansas State.

Through six games of the 2011 Big 12 Championship the higher seed has won every contest.

Kansas State improved to 21-9 this season. The Wildcats are now 6-6 in Big 12 Championship quarterfinal contests and 14-14 in Big 12 tournament games.

With the loss, Iowa State drops to 22-10 overall. ISU fell to 8-6 in Big 12 Championship quarterfinal contests and 22-13 in overall Big 12 Championship games.

Attendance for the third session of the 2011 Big 12 Championship was 4,584. It brings the total attendance for the tournament to 12,256.

Kansas State holds a 46-29 lead in the all-time series with Iowa State. KSU is 5-2 in conference tournament contests against ISU, but this was the first KSU win (1-2) over Iowa State in Big 12 Championship games.

Iowa State head coach Bill Fennelly dropped to 520-212 in his career and 354-159 at ISU.

Iowa State extended its NCAA record streak of consecutive games with at least one three-pointer to 516. Kansas State also extended its streak of consecutive games with a 3-pointer to 138.

Brittany Chambers scored 20 points to move into fourth place on Kansas State's sophomore scoring list. She has 488 points this season. With two 3-pointers, Chambers also moved into a tie for fifth place on KSU's single-season 3-point chart.

Kelsey Bolte scored 10 points to move into sixth place on ISU's career scoring chart with 1,621 points, passing former teammate Alison Lacey. She also moved into a tie for fourth place on ISU's single-season scoring chart (along with Lindsey Wilson, 2003) with 539 points this season. She moved into a tie for second place on ISU's career games played list with 134.

With 18 points, Hallie Christofferson was in double figures for the 14th time this season. She tied her career high with three treys today.

Brittany Chambers finished in double figures for the 24th time this season (46th in her career) and scored 20+ for the 10th time this season. Jalana Childs also finished in double figures for the 21st time this season and the 35th time in her career.

Jalana Childs passed out a season-high three assists today.

Kansas State improved to 17-2 this season when leading at half.
