Postgame Notes...

Texas will play the loser of Game 7 tomorrow at 3:15 p.m.

Texas (41-14, 1-1 in Division One)

- The Longhorns are now 27-20 all-time and 3-4 against Baylor in Big 12 Championship play.
- Junior Taylor Jungmann moves to 13-0 on the season tallying his fifth complete game of the season and seventh of his career.
- The one-hit complete-game shutout was the second for Jungmann this season (also on April 21 at Kansas).
- Jungmann is now on a 15-game winning streak dating back to the 2010 Big 12 Championship where he dropped a decision to Texas Tech, 4-2.
- Jungmann allowed only one hit, the fewest allowed in a Big 12 Championship game since Nebraska's Chad Wiles held Oklahoma State to one hit, shutting the Cowboys out, 5-0, in the 1999 Championship.
- Jungmann also retired 16 consecutive batters spanning from the second to the seventh inning.
- Jungmann has now thrown the 30th complete game in a Big 12 Championship.
- Shortstop Brandon Loy extended his hitting streak to 11 games with a 2-RBI double in the fourth inning.

Baylor (29-26, 0-2 in Division One)

- The Bears are now 26-24 all-time and 4-3 against Texas in Big 12 Championship play.
- Baylor had three errors in the loss against Texas.
- Junior Brooks Pinckard stole his 32nd base of the season, which leads the Big 12 Conference.
- Pinckard is now tied for fourth place on Baylor's single-season stolen base list.
 - Sophomore Josh Turley was charged with the loss and is now 3-5 on the season. He threw 5.2 innings, giving up four runs, one earned, on six hits, while striking out four batters.
- Sophomore Max Muncy collected the only hit for the Bears while driving in the only run in the loss to the Longhorns.
