No. 2 Texas A&M 4, No. 6 Kansas State 1

Postgame Notes...

Texas A&M will play the winner of Game 10 on Saturday at 7 p.m.
Kansas State will play Oklahoma tomorrow at 7 p.m.

Texas A&M (-21, 2-0 in Division Two)

- The Aggies are now 24-19 all-time and 2-0 against Kansas State in Big 12 Championship play.
- Sophomore Michael Wacha moved to 7-3 on the season throwing 8.0 innings, giving up one run, while scattering five hits.
- This marks Wacha's longest outing since throwing a complete game against Kansas this season.
- Wacha struck out seven while not allowing a walk. The last time Wacha did not walk an opposing batter was in a complete game performance against Oklahoma this season.
- The one run the Aggie pitching staff allowed ties the fewest allowed in a Big 12 Championship game. A&M held Oklahoma to one run in the 2001 Championship.
- Second baseman Andrew Collazo extended his hitting streak to five games with a single in the eighth inning.

Kansas State (40-16, 1-1 in Division Two)

- The Wildcats are now 9-10 all-time and 0-2 against Texas A&M in Big 12 Championship play.
- Freshman Ross Kivett tied his career-long hitting streak at 11 games with a single in the first inning.
- Junior third baseman Jason King extended his hitting streak to a career-long 14 games by going 3-for-4 with one RBI driving in the Wildcats only run. He holds the longest hitting streak by a Wildcat since Carter Jurica.
- King's double in the first inning gave him 48 in his career, tying Brian Culp (1990-93) for fifth in school history.
- The loss was charged to Matt Applegate who is now 5-4 on the season, he gave up three runs, on five hits, three earned, and struck out three batters.
- Junior Justin Lindsey came out of the bullpen and pitched 5.2 innings, allowing four hits, no runs, and striking out four. He threw a season-high 85 pitches, the most by a relief pitcher this season.
