Postgame Notes...

Kansas State will play Texas A&M tomorrow at 12:30 p.m.

Kansas State (36-22, 2-1 in Division Two)

- The Wildcats are now 10-10 all-time and 2-2 against Oklahoma in Big 12 Championship play.
- This marks the first time since 1995 that Kansas State and Oklahoma have met five in a season.
- Kansas State's win secures the first four-game sweep of Oklahoma in a single season since 1993.
- Freshman Ross Kivett extended his hitting streak to 12 games, a career long, with a single in the first inning.
- Jason King extended his hitting streak to a career-best 15 games with a single in the first.
- Shane Conlon moved to 4-1 on the season throwing five-plus innings of work, his longest outing against a Big 12 opponent since pitching 6.2 innings against Texas Tech. Conlon allowed two runs, scattering four hits while striking out three.
- James Allen recorded his 17th save of the season and 31st of his career. Allen holds the school record in both single season and career saves and now ranks fourth in Big 12 history in career saves.

Oklahoma (41-17, 1-2 in Division Two)

- The Sooners are now 25-25 all-time and 2-2 against Kansas State in Big 12 Championship play.
- This is the second time the Sooners and the Wildcats have faced each other in 2011 Big 12 Championship with Oklahoma dropping both games.
- First baseman Cameron Seitzer extended his hitting streak to 17 games with an RBI single in the first inning.
- Seitzer also collected his team-leading 25th multi-hit game of the season.
- Catcher Tyler Ogle snapped a six-game hitting streak.
- Caleb Bushyhead extended his hitting streak to nine games on a single in the ninth inning.
- Dillon Overton was charged with the loss and is now 8-4 on the season after throwing 4.1 innings, allowing four runs, three earned, off of six hits. He walked three and struck out three.
- Tyson Seng tied a career high with four strikeouts while allowing two hits in 3.2 innings of work out of the bullpen.
