BIG 12 CONFERENCE - ONE TRUE CHAMPION



One. True. Champion. The Big 12 enters its 16th year in a unique position – as the only major conference in the nation to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field. Around here, it's every team against every team. We believe that's the way a true champion is made.



Determining our champion on the field is just one portion of how we play in the Big 12 Conference. The member schools of the Big 12 are neighbors, where road games don't require crossing time zones. We battle each other hard on Gameday and celebrate wins against outside competition. Our student-athletes, fans and alumni have each other's backs on other days – because that is what you do for your neighbor. A hard work ethic and Midwestern values are part of everyone associated with the Big 12 and its member schools.



This work ethic has translated to enormous success on the field of play in the first 15 years of the league. Since it began play in 1996-97, the Conference can boast of 42 team crowns and 477 individual NCAA Championships. The trophy case added more hardware last year as Oklahoma State (men's cross country) and Texas A&M (women's basketball) won national crowns. In the spring, the Aggies registered an unprecedented double three-peat by winning the men's and women's NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships for the third straight season.



Big 12 squads are highly-regarded on a national level in every sport. All but one sport the Conference sponsored this past season had at least one team ranked in the top five of the national polls, with eight sports boasting the nation's No. 1 team. In addition, most of those top five rankings (and all the No. 1 rankings) were by schools that will be part of the league in 2011-12 and beyond.



In addition to the NCAA crowns and top rankings, several other teams made strong national showings. Ten Big 12 volleyball teams have competed in the regional semifinals of the NCAA Championship over the past three years, including Texas for three straight campaigns. In 2010-11, six of the eight sports that hold NCAA Championships where the Big 12 sponsored full round-robin competition had a team competing among the final eight teams or beyond.



The spring season was especially successful. Softball was well-represented at the Women's College World Series as Big 12 teams made up half the eight-team field. Baylor was among the four national semifinalists in women's tennis while Oklahoma State qualified for the semifinals in men's golf. The Conference had multiple squads in the baseball College World Series field for the fourth time. In outdoor track and field, a total of 12 league squads placed among the top 25 finishers at the NCAA Championships, led by A&M's national crown.



The individual honors also continued, most recently with Texas pitcher Taylor Jungmann named the recipient of the Dick Howser Trophy, presented to college baseball's Player of the Year. The Conference had six athletes earn major individual awards in football and also had the national defensive player of the year for women's basketball. Overall, more than 1,200 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition in the past four years alone.



Through its first 15 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 16 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference is tied with a nation's-best seven appearances in the BCS National Championship Game and leads the country with 89 football consensus All-America selections. League squads have combined to lead the nation in women's basketball attendance each of the last 12 years and the Big 12 is the only conference to surpass the one-million mark in season attendance – doing so six times, including each of the last five seasons. In men's basketball, the league has sent six different teams to the Elite Eight the past four campaigns, the most of any conference.



The 10 current members have accounted for 34 of 39 bowl appearances over the last five years, including eight BCS berths. All 42 NCAA men's basketball bids in the last eight years and 77 of 80 in Big 12 history have been earned by the 10 schools.



During the last seven years a total of 21 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 14 consecutive seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

The academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. In 2010-11, four student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 88 Award. The honor recognizes individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers. In its short history, the Big 12 has also had over 500 Academic All-America recipients, averaging more than 30 each season.

Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Seven times in the past six years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport. The Big 12 had plenty of success overall in the classroom the last two years, as the Conference boasted 60 student-athletes earning Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition.

The Big 12 can boast of other stories that combine on and off the field success. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008, given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. She was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in 2007, but rebounded to win All-America honors at the 2008 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsperson of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 273 scholars have received over \$1.8 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 15 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports with the addition of equestrian and rowing for the 2011-12 campaign. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

The Conference is comprised of 10 institutions in the Central time zone that have shared many traditional rivalries throughout their histories. Member schools include - Baylor University, Iowa State University, University of Kansas, Kansas State University, University of Missouri, University of Oklahoma, Oklahoma State University, University of Texas, Texas A&M University and Texas Tech University.

The institutions created a league that encompasses five states and over 40 million people. More than 4,200 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition. The winner of the Big 12 football regular season championship earns the league's berth into the Bowl Championship Series.

This past summer, the Big 12 entered into a lucrative multi-year agreement with FOX Sports for selected football telecasts along with other sports. The Conference also has a multi-year agreement in place with ABC/ESPN, Inc. that began in 2008-09.

In its first 15 years, the Conference has distributed more than \$1.4 billion to its member institutions. The conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

BIG 12 HIGHLIGHTS

Football Notes...

- Is tied with a nation-leading seven appearances in the BCS National Championship Game.
- Has appeared in 18 BCS games during the 13-year history of the structure to rank third among conferences.
- Has advanced two teams to BCS games in the same season five times (2001, '03, '04, '07, '08).
- Leads the country with 89 football consensus All-America selections. The eight honorees in 2010 were a national-high.
- Has been home to four Heisman Trophy winners.
- Every team has played in a postseason bowl game.
- Will play six 2011 non-conference games against teams that finished last season in one of the Top 25 polls (TCU, Tulsa [twice], Florida State, Arkansas, Nevada).
- Will play half of its 2011 non-conference games (15-of-30) against teams that played in bowl games last season.
- Has 10 non-conference games in 2011 scheduled against teams from BCS automatic qualifying leagues.
- Has produced 81 national award winners in football.
- Is the only conference with bowl tie-ins that feature opponents from BCS automatic qualifying conferences in all of its post-season games.

- Has placed at least one Big team in the top four of the final BCS Standings in 10 of 13 years.
- Has ranked in the Top 8 nationally in scoring offense every season; with a team in the Top 4, 12 of 15 years.
- Defensively, has had a team finish among the Top 8 in the NCAA in scoring defense 12 of 15 seasons.

Conference Notes...

- Has claimed national championship team titles in 16 of the 23 sports it sponsors - including three in football.
- Can boast of 42 national team champions and 477 individual NCAA titles.
- Has awarded a total of \$88.36 million in grants-in-aid to its student-athletes.
- Has distributed annual revenue in excess of \$1.4 billion to its member institutions.
- Has produced 506 Academic All-America selections.
- Has named 13,253 student-athletes to the Academic All-Big 12 First Teams in their respective sports, 855 of which carried 4.0 grade point averages.
- Has awarded over \$1.8 million in post-graduate degree scholarships to 273 student-athletes.



FOOTBALL SCHEDULING & TIEBREAKER INFORMATION

Scheduling

All teams will play nine games as part of the Conference schedule – competing in a round robin format to establish a conference champion.

The Big 12 Conference Champion is the team that finishes the regular season with the highest winning percentage in conference games. If more than one team has the same winning percentage, the tied teams are declared co-champions.

Bowl Championship Series Representative Tiebreaker Procedure

The following procedure will determine the Big 12 Conference representative to the Bowl Championship Series in the event of a first-place tie:

- If two teams are tied, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
- If three or more teams are tied, steps 1 through 4 will be followed until a determination is made. Once a team has been eliminated from a multi-team comparison, it is dropped from further comparisons. If only two teams remain tied after any step, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
 - The records of the three teams will be compared against each other
 - The records of the three teams will be compared against the next highest placed teams in the conference
 - The highest ranked team in the first Bowl Championship Series Poll following the completion of Big 12 regular season conference play shall be the representative, unless the two highest ranked tied teams are ranked within one spot of the other in the BCS poll. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two highest ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the Bowl Championship Series.
 - The representative will be chosen by draw.
