## Phillips 66 Weekly Awards

A Big 12 Player, Pitcher and Newcomer of the Week will be chosen each Monday, beginning February 20. Nominations are submitted by the school media relations offices and the winners are selected by a panel of radio members who cover the league's nine baseball teams on a regular basis.

## Big 12 Coaches' Teleconference

The Big 12 baseball coaches will participate in a media-only preseason teleconference at 10 a.m. CT on Tuesday, Feb. 14. The conference call can be heard live and will be archived on Big12Sports.com. Please contact the Big 12 communications staff for the call-in and replay phone numbers. The Big 12 baseball preseason poll will also be released on Feb. 14.

## Big 12 Weekly Shows

**The Big 12 Report** is a weekly show that is available exclusively at Big12Sports.com. Featuring analysis/commentary by Correspondent Wendell Barnhouse, the show is broadcast each Wednesday and focuses on the news and the stories going on in and around the Big 12 that week.

The Big 12 also boasts two over-the-air weekly magazine-style shows. Each program is a 30-minute promotion of the league, with features on student-athletes, coaches, teams and conference championships. **Big 12 Showcase** returns for its 16th season on FSN and has been produced by Keith Fletcher each of those years. Emily Jones handles hosting duties. **Big 12 This Week** is televised by ESPNU, with Chad McKee as the primary host. Segments of both programs are available online via the Big 12 website.

## Championship Credentials

Media credentials for the 2012 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship are authorized and issued by the Conference office. An online credential system, provided through an agreement with Sports Systems Services, Inc., is the only method to submit requests. The credential system will be made available during the month of April.

## The Internet - Big12Sports.com

The Big 12 Conference maintains its website at Big12Sports.com with complete information on the league and its member schools.

The site boasts original content from throughout the Conference along with several video broadcasts, including a weekly show (The Big 12 Report) and a daily update (Big 12 Minute). In baseball, full rebroadcasts and condensed game highlights of selected contests will be available via the Big 12 Digital Network, within 72 hours of a game's completion. **Many parts of Big12Sports.com - including video - are also available via an application on the various mobile platforms (iPhones, iPads, Android) for the first time this season.** Comprehensive live coverage of the 2012 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship in May is also available.

In baseball, scores throughout the league, standings and box scores are updated as games are final. Big 12 conference and team statistics are updated no later than the following morning, with weekly award winners posted each Monday. An archive of conference and team-by-team statistics for every season in league history is included as well.

Media can access Acrobat PDF files of the daily release, statistics, team-by-team statistics and the conference media guide on the website.

## Big 12 Release

The Big 12 will update a media release, including team notes, results and more throughout the season. Complete league statistics, in addition to team-by-team stats for all nine baseball squads will be updated via the conference website as well.

## Postseason Awards

The Big 12 presents the only official all-conference awards at the end of the regular season. Major award winners are chosen, along with the All-Big 12 teams. Each Big 12 head coach votes on the squads and is not permitted to vote for his own players. The awards will be announced in May prior to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship.

Academic All-Big 12 teams are also chosen in baseball and will be announced prior to the postseason.

### RICH FETCHIET

*Coordinator of Baseball Umpires*

Rich Fetchiet was named Big 12 Conference Coordinator of Baseball Umpires in August 2005. He has over 35 years of collegiate, national and international umpiring and umpire-related administrative experience.

Fetchiet is also currently the Coordinator for the Big East, Big Ten, Mid-American and Missouri Valley Conferences, as well as Conference-USA and the Horizon and Summit Leagues. He is a member of the NCAA National Umpire Program Advisory Committee in addition to the NCAA Baseball Rules Editorial Committee. Rich has served as the Baseball Secretary-Rules Editor for the NCAA and Chair of the ABCA Rules Committee. He is active in numerous officiating organizations and is a teacher and instructor at umpire camps and clinics across the country.

Fetchiet retired from active umpiring after the 2000 season. Prior to that he umpired numerous Division I conference tournaments and made three College World Series appearances, including serving as the plate umpire for the 1999 national championship game. Included among Rich's international tournaments are the Pan Am Games, World Cup Qualifier, Intercontinental Cup, World Championships and the Olympic Games. In 1997, the International Baseball Association named him Umpire of the Year.

Fetchiet is a higher education administrator at the University of Michigan School of Dentistry. Rich and his wife, Kay, and two children currently reside in Ann Arbor, Michigan.



The Big 12 is in the midst of its 16th year as the only major conference in the nation to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field.

Determining our champion on the field is just one advantage of the Big 12. The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success on the field of play in the first 15 years of the league. Since it began play in 1996-97, the Conference can boast of 42 NCAA team titles and 492 individual national championships. The trophy case added more hardware last year as Oklahoma State (men's cross country) and Texas A&M (women's basketball) won national crowns. In the spring, the Aggies registered an unprecedented double three-peat by winning the men's and women's NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships for the third straight season.

Big 12 squads are highly-regarded on a national level in every sport. All but one sport the Conference sponsored last season had at least one team ranked in the top five of the national polls, with eight sports boasting the nation's No. 1 team. In addition, most of those top five rankings (and all the No. 1 rankings) were by schools that are part of the league in 2011-12.

In addition to the NCAA crowns and top rankings, several other teams made strong national showings. Thirteen Big 12 volleyball teams have competed in the regional semifinals of the NCAA Championship over the past four years, including Texas for four straight campaigns. In 2010-11, six of the eight sports that hold NCAA Championships where the Big 12 sponsored full round-robin competition had a school competing among the final eight teams or beyond.

The spring season was especially successful. Softball was well-represented at the Women's College World Series as Big 12 teams made up half the eight-team field. Baylor was among the four national semifinalists in women's tennis while Oklahoma State qualified for the semifinals in men's golf. The Conference had multiple squads in the baseball College World Series field for the fourth time. In outdoor track and field, a total of 12 league squads placed among the top 25 finishers at the NCAA Championships, led by A&M's national crown.

The individual honors also continued, most recently with Baylor quarterback Robert Griffin III winning the league's fifth Heisman Trophy. Texas pitcher Taylor Jungmann was named the recipient of the Dick Howser Trophy a season ago, presented to college baseball's Player of the Year. The Conference has had 10 athletes earn major individual awards in football in the past two campaigns and also had the national defensive player of the year for women's basketball in 2010-11. Overall, more than 1,200 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition in the past four years alone.

Through its first 15 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 16 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference tied for a nation's-best seven appearances in the BCS National Championship Game and leads the country with 89 football consensus All-America selections. League squads have combined to lead the nation in women's basketball attendance each of the last 12 years and the Big 12 is the only conference to surpass the one-million mark in season attendance – doing so six times, including each of the last five seasons. In men's basketball, the league has sent six different teams to the Elite Eight the past four campaigns, the most of any conference.

During the last seven years a total of 21 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 14 consecutive seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Most recently, Danielle Robinson (Oklahoma) and Sam Acho (Texas)

were selected to receive Today's Top VIII Awards – one of the NCAA's top honors. It recognizes student-athletes who completed their athletic eligibility during 2010-11 for success on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. In 2010-11, four student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 88 Award. That honor showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has also had over 500 Academic All-America recipients, averaging more than 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Eight times in the past seven years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport. The Big 12 had plenty of success overall in the classroom the last two-plus years, as the Conference boasted 67 student-athletes earning Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition through the fall.

The Big 12 can boast of other stories that combine on and off the field success. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008, given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. She was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in 2007, but rebounded to win All-America honors at the 2008 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsman of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 273 scholars have received over \$1.8 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 15 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports with the addition of equestrian and rowing for the 2011-12 campaign. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Beginning in 2012-13, the Conference will be comprised of 10 institutions, with many having shared traditional rivalries throughout their histories. Member universities will include – Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas, Texas Tech and West Virginia.

The institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 37 million people. More than 4,200 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts postseason championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition. The winner of the Big 12 football regular season championship earns the league's berth into the Bowl Championship Series.

This past summer, the Big 12 entered into a lucrative multi-year agreement with FOX Sports for selected football telecasts along with other sports. The Conference also has a multi-year agreement in place with ABC/ESPN, Inc. that began in 2008-09.

In its first 15 years, the Conference has distributed more than \$1.4 billion to its member institutions. The conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

Equestrian and rowing championships began in spring 2009 and became fully sponsored in 2011-12.

Big 12 titles for sports without round-robin conference play are determined by the postseason championship (Cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, rowing, swimming & diving, indoor/outdoor track & field). Wrestling was determined in this manner prior to 2011-12.

## GREAT EXPECTATIONS

Oklahoma, Texas and Texas A&M are all ranked in the four preseason baseball polls. The Longhorns' highest ranking is No. 5 by Collegiate Baseball and USA Today/ESPN. The Aggies sit in the top 10 in all four polls, including a No. 5 ranking by the NCBWA. Oklahoma also earns its highest ranking from the NCBWA - No. 14. Baylor is ranked in the top 30 by Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA, while Kansas State, Oklahoma State and Texas Tech are receiving votes in at least two of the polls. Future member TCU is ranked in the top 15 of all four lists.

Individually, five Big 12 student-athletes have been named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association preseason All-America teams. Tyler Naquin (Texas A&M), Ross Stripling (Texas A&M) and Corey Knebel (Texas) have been tabbed first team selections, while John Neely (Texas Tech) earned a second team spot. Erich Weiss (Texas) garnered third team recognition.

Knebel and Naquin, along with Sam Stafford (Texas) also earned Collegiate Baseball *Louisville Slugger* Preseason All-America first team nods. Second team selections included Stripling along with teammate Michael Wacha and Hoby Milner (Texas).

## LEADER OF THE PACK

Including the Longhorns' 49 victories in 2011, Texas' Augie Garrido has compiled 1,817 career wins in 43 years of coaching. He is the all-time winningest active mentor (by victories) in Division I. The Vallejo, Calif.-native moved into first-place when he claimed his 1,428th victory on June 9, 2003 against No. 1 Florida State. He currently sits at No. 2 among all coaches, trailing only Gordie Gillespie of Division III St. Francis [Ill.], who has 1,893 victories. Garrido is one of only two Division I coaches to win 500 or more games at two different schools and the only coach to win 600 or more contests at two different institutions. Garrido has amassed a 666-301-2 (.688) mark at UT over the last 15 seasons.

In addition, Garrido (10th) is joined by Kansas State's Brad Hill (6th), Oklahoma's Sunny Golloway (17th), Texas A&M's Rob Childress (25th) and Oklahoma State's Frank Anderson (36th) in the top 50 active coaches by winning percentage.

## 2011 SEASON REVIEW

The Texas Longhorns and Texas A&M Aggies finished the regular season with identical 19-8 records to share the Big 12 Conference's regular season baseball title. It marks the Longhorns' third-straight regular season crown and seventh overall (2002, '04, '06, '07, '09, '10, '11). The Aggies earned their fourth title (1998, '99, 2008, '11) and first since 2008. Co-champions had occurred on just one other occasion (Baylor and Nebraska, 2005).

Texas and Texas A&M represented the league in the eight-team NCAA Baseball College World Series. It marked the Longhorns' 34th appearance overall, sixth as a member of the Big 12 and first since 2009. The Aggies advanced for the fifth time overall, second as a Big 12 representative and first since 1999. It was the first time since 2005 the Conference had multiple members in the CWS. Big 12 schools have an all-time record of 22-26 at the CWS in 15 combined appearances.

Baylor, Kansas State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State earned NCAA Regional berths in addition to UT and TAMU, marking the sixth-straight year the Big 12 has had at least six teams make the 64-team field.

For the second-straight year, two Big 12 teams finished the season ranked in the top 10 of all four national polls. The Longhorns' highest ranking came at No. 6 in the *Baseball America* rankings while the Aggies also earned a No. 6 ranking in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll. Both UT and TAMU were ranked every week in 2011.

Four additional Big 12 squads earned rankings during the 2011 campaign. Baylor opened the year ranked for the first seven weeks, while Oklahoma was ranked all but one week of the season. Oklahoma State was ranked for seven-straight weeks from April 4-May 6. The highest ranking earned by a Big 12 school in 2011 was at No. 2 (OU - three times, UT - May 23).

Seven of the league's 10 squads finished in the top 50 of the NCAA RPI, including Texas A&M (10), Texas (12), Oklahoma (22), Baylor (28), Oklahoma State (36), Kansas State (41) and Texas Tech (47).

## LOOKING AHEAD TO THE FUTURE ...

Beginning with the 2012-13 campaign, the Big 12 Conference will welcome two new teams to the Conference - TCU and West Virginia.

- *Baseball America* has ranked the 2012 recruiting class as the 10th-best in the nation. TCU has landed in the top 10 of *Baseball America's* recruiting class rankings in three of the last five years.

- Produced Jedd Gyorko, the second round pick of the San Diego Padres and 2010 Brooks Wallace Award Winner at shortstop. Gyorko was also named the Padres Minor League Player of the Year and the California League Player of the Year.
- Since 2003, WVU's team batting average has been at least .300. Thirty players in the past four years have batted above .300 with athletes above .400 on five different occasions.
- Coach Greg Van Zant earned his 500th career win last season and currently has 505 career victories, ranking second in West Virginia baseball history and becoming only the fourth coach of any sport at WVU to surpass 500 wins.
- Since 2008, WVU has produced six draft picks and has had six players sign free agent contracts.

The Big 12 has had five or more teams ranked in the RPI top 50 in all but one season and has had six or more ranked in the top 50 nine of the past 10 seasons. As a whole, the league finished 2011 ranked third. The Conference has earned a top three finish in nine of the past 10 seasons.

For the second-straight season and third time overall, TAMU captured the Big 12 Championship crown, defeating Missouri in 10 innings. The Aggies won the 2011 and 2010 titles with walk-off home runs in extra innings. Only three other schools have won the championship in back-to-back years.

## HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

Texas and Texas A&M headlined the Big 12's six teams listed in the top 50 of the NCAA attendance rankings. UT and TAMU finished 2011 ranked fifth and 11th, respectively, in average home attendance. The Big 12 has had four or more teams place in the national top 25 every season since 1999.

UT recorded 280,011 fans during the 2011 campaign, averaging 6,512 spectators. The Aggies had 155,772 enter the turnstiles last season, drawing an average of 3,994 for their 39 home games.

Texas and Texas A&M are three of eight schools in the nation that have averaged at least 2,700 fans each season since 2000.

## 2011 NCAA STAT LEADERS

For the third-straight year, Texas led the league in team earned run average, setting the Big 12 record for lowest ERA in a season. The Longhorns posted a 2.35 mark, second-best in the nation for the second time in the past three years (2009).

The Sooners finished the season ranked 14th nationally with a .313 batting average. The No. 14 ranking was the highest finish for a Big 12 team in that category since 2001.

Big 12 Player of the Year Tyler Naquin (Texas A&M) led the nation in hits (104), while Ross Stripling (Texas A&M) tied for the national lead in wins (14). Both are returning for the 2012 season.

## BIG 12 RECORDS SET IN 2011

In addition to posting the lowest earned run average in Big 12 history in 2011, the Longhorns also set a record for most saves in a season with 23. Corey Knebel accounted for 19 of those, one shy of the Big 12 single-season record of 20 set in 1999. UT's 13 shutouts were also a record.

Kansas State tied a Big 12 season-high for stolen bases in a game, racking up 12 against Long Island on March 11.

In the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship, Jacob House (Texas A&M) became the third player to record five or more hits in a championship contest when he went 5-for-5 against Texas Tech on May 25.

## TOP RETURNERS FOR '12

Seven of the league's 11 All-America selections from 2011 will return this season, including first team picks Corey Knebel (Texas) and Ross Stripling (Texas A&M).

In 2011, four freshmen were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, the most freshmen selections in history. A freshman had not earned a first team distinction since 2006. Knebel and Erich Weiss (Texas) earned the honor along with Krey Bratsen (Texas A&M) and David Paiz (Texas Tech). Just under half of the 2012 All-Big 12 First Team members are returning for the 2012 season - eight.

## NOTABLE INCOMING CLASSES

*Baseball America* tabbed Texas' incoming 2012 class as the second-best in the nation, while Oklahoma came in at No. 13. Future conference member TCU ranked 10th.

In addition, Collegiate Baseball tabbed Oklahoma's newcomers as the fourth best in the nation. Texas' ranked 12th, Texas A&M's 38th and Kansas 40th. TCU landed at No. 29.

## STREAK OF 40 WINS

At least three league squads have totaled 40 or more wins each of the past 14 years. Texas, Texas A&M and Oklahoma reached the mark in 2011. The Big 12 has also had at least six teams finish with 30 or more wins in each season since the Conference was established. Over the past 10 years, a Big 12 team has finished under .500 only 14 times.

## CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION/HISTORY

The Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship returns to Oklahoma City's RedHawks Field on May 23-27.

RedHawks Field, which opened on April 2, 1998 and seats 13,066 fans, serves as the home facility for the Triple A Oklahoma City RedHawks, an affiliate of the Houston Astros. It has hosted 14 baseball championships in the league's 16-year tenure, including this season's event. Overall, three venues have sponsored the championship: All-Sports Stadium, Oklahoma City (1997); RedHawks Field (1998-2001, '03, '05-11) and The Ballpark in Arlington (2002, '04).

## CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The eight teams with the best conference records (based on winning percentage) in regular season competition will qualify for the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship -- a two-division, double-elimination format.

In the event of a tie or ties in the standings, the following tie-breaking system will be implemented.

- If two teams are tied, head-to-head competition will be used to break a tie.
- If two teams remain tied, the winner of the first game of the Conference series between the two tied teams will be used.
- If two teams remain tied, there will be a comparison of the records of the tied teams against the highest place team(s) in descending order from top to bottom until the tie is broken; or,
- If two teams remain tied, there will be a drawing to determine the seed or qualification for the tournament;
- If three or more teams are tied, there will be a comparison of head-to-head records in a 'mini round-robin' of tied teams, followed by steps (a), (b), (c), and (d). Once a team has been eliminated from a multi-team comparison, it is dropped from further comparisons.

The Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship winner earns the Big 12's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship field. If the championship is terminated before completion, then the league's regular season champion (No. 1-seeded team for the championship), will serve as the Conference's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Tournament.

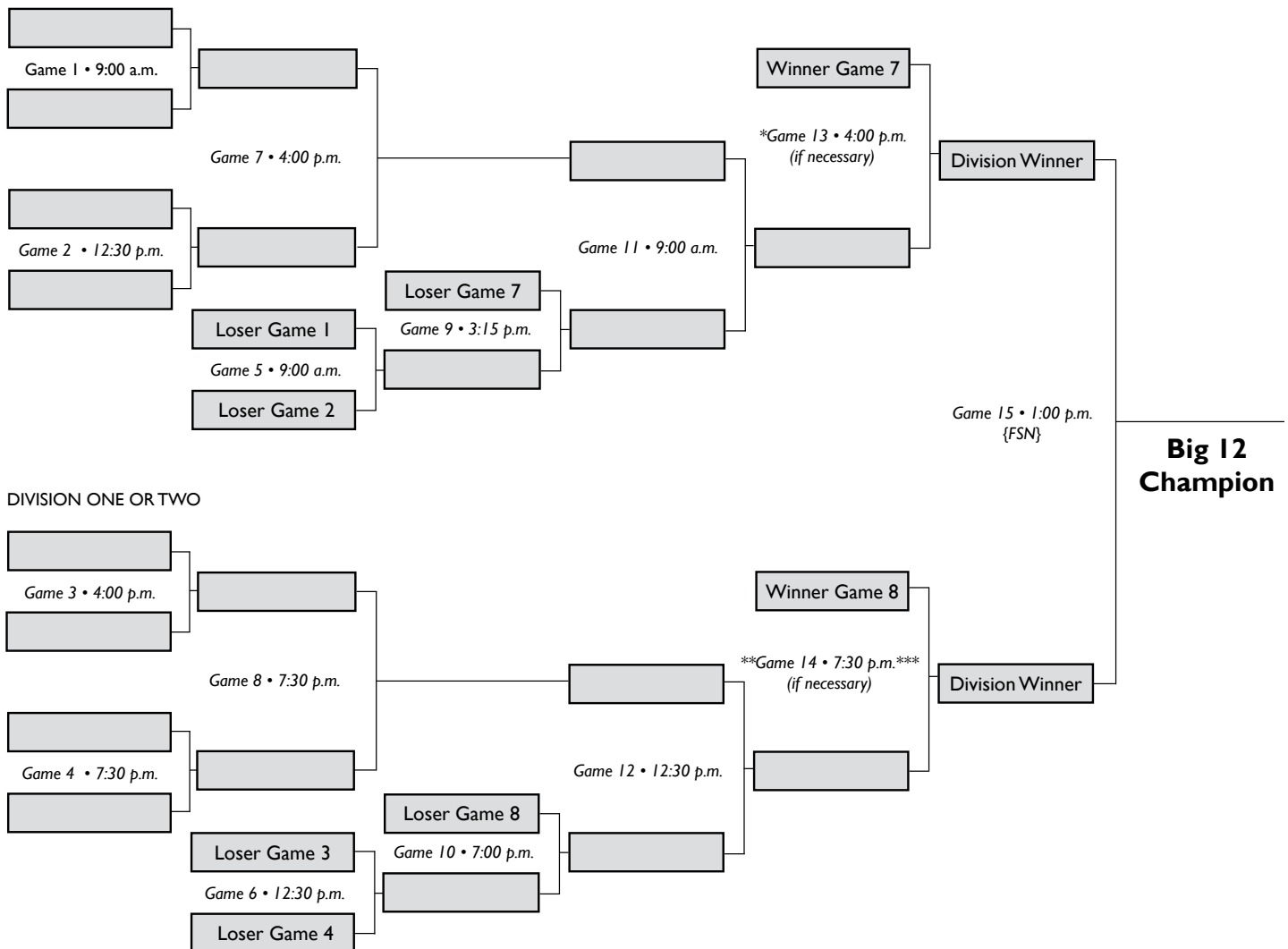

### THE VENUE

After 61 years in Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium, another era in college baseball opened last season at the new home of the College World Series, TD Ameritrade Park in downtown Omaha. The 24,000-seat stadium, which also is home to Creighton's baseball program, will play host to the CWS for at least the next 25 seasons.

### THE ROAD TO OMAHA

The 64-team bracket provides for 16 four-team double elimination Regionals; and eight two-team, best-of-three Super Regionals, with the eight winners advancing to Omaha for the NCAA Men's College World Series.

The champions of all 29 NCAA Division I conferences automatically qualify for the championship. The remaining 35 teams will be selected at-large. The Division I Baseball Committee will also consider regular season conference standings and/or conference postseason competition.

### THE BIG 12 IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Big 12 has sent a total of 15 teams to the Men's College World Series, including four squads in the past three seasons. Texas and Texas A&M represented the league in 2011, the fourth time the Big 12 has sent multiple members.

Six different league squads have qualified for the event in the Big 12's 15 seasons, including the Longhorns' 2002 and '05 national title runs. Baylor (2005), Nebraska (2001-'02, '05), Oklahoma State (1999), Texas (2000, '02-'05, '09, '11) and Texas A&M (1999, '11) have represented the Conference at the event. The Big 12 had an all-time high three teams in the '05 MCWS field.

The Big 12 has made 83 total appearances in the NCAA postseason with an overall record of 222-182 (.550). All of the league's current nine squads have made at least one appearance as a representative of the Big 12. Last season, the Big 12 sent six teams to postseason play, marking the sixth-straight year the Conference has had six or more squads in the 64-team field.

League teams have combined to make 25 Super Regional trips, producing a winning mark of 34-31, and hosting the Super Regional round on 11 occasions. The Big 12's nine baseball teams for 2012 have made 207 total appearances in the NCAA postseason with 78 MCWS visits.
