Texas Head Coach Michael Center

"It was the first time we played singles first, so I wasn't quite sure what to expect. We came out and got some early breaks, and Oklahoma State started to come back. The guys that got the first sets I thought did a good job. They got their matches and got points on the board. Then we had to fight back a little bit and get that fourth point. It was a good effort and I'm excited about tomorrow."

"They've [Oklahoma] been beating us the last couple years, so we don't have much to lose. We have to go out there and throw the kitchen sink at them and see what we can come up with. They're a good team and I know the guys will be excited about playing tomorrow."

Oklahoma State Head Coach Jay Udwadia

"I thought it was a really close match. I was on Courts 1, 3, and 5. I wasn't quite sure what was going on in the other bank. It was definitely a match that could've gone either way. I wasn't sure who was going to win Court 2 or if we were going to go into doubles. I'm proud of the way the guys fought today. Texas is a really good team. They beat us pretty handily the first time around. For us to come back and get in the position of doing some better things against them, I'm proud of the way we competed and fought."

"There's only one team in the country that wins their last match of the year. I'm proud of the way they fought today. It bodes well for the future of the program. It's a strong conference. We know what we're up against and we know what level what level we have to compete and win against. Obviously you're never happy losing, but at least you're happy the guys can compete and play at this level. Hopefully we'll continue and try to push through and win some of these in the future."
