QUOTES

Oklahoma Head Coach John Roddick

"That was huge, that doubles match. If we don't have that point, there's still a match out there that could go either way. Getting that point I thought was going to be critical for either team."

"It's hard. Winning the first (Big 12 Championship) was hard and winning the second one was harder. It's a challenge every year and to start being in the mix every time to win a championship is great. Our expectation from the players is starting to really show and the confidence from them has really risen. Our attitude got a lot better in the last week and a half and our competitive spirit came out."

Baylor Head Coach Matt Knoll

"We learned a lot today. We were put in a championship environment and I think it was a great opportunity and I think we will get a lot out of it. We will be better for it and now we have a couple weeks now to go back and get ready for what is ahead and we will make up for this."

"I think there are a lot of things that got us behind the 8-ball and some are things that have to do with Oklahoma being a really good team, and some have to do with things that we need to do better internally. You want to play good competition and we did. If you don't get pushed you don't learn things about yourself unless you are playing a good team like Oklahoma. Unfortunately sometimes when you learn some things about yourself it doesn't feel good. Today it didn't feel good."
