The Big 12 Conference maintains its website at Big12Sports.com. Complete information on the league and the member schools is available.

The site boasts original content from throughout the Conference including regular video updates, a weekly podcast and written content. In men's basketball, condensed game highlights of numerous contests will be available via the Big 12 Digital Network, within 72 hours of a game's completion. Many parts of the Big 12 Digital Network - including video - are also available via an application on various mobile platforms (iPhone, iPad, Android). Comprehensive live coverage of media day in October and the 2016 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship in March is also available.

In men's basketball, scores throughout the league, standings and box scores are updated as games are final. Big 12 conference and team statistics are updated no later than the following morning, with weekly award winners posted each Monday. An archive of conference and team-by-team statistics for every season in league history is included as well.

Media can access Acrobat PDF files of the daily release, statistics, team-by-team statistics and the conference media guide on the website.

Big 12 Release

The Big 12 will update a media release in Acrobat PDF format, including team notes, results and more each morning after games are played during the season. Complete league statistics, in addition to team-by-team stats for all 10 league squads, will be updated via the conference website as well.

Phillips 66 Weekly Awards

A Big 12 Player and Newcomer of the Week will be chosen each Monday, beginning November 16. Nominations are submitted by the school communications offices and winners are selected by a panel of media voters who cover the league on a regular basis. This year marks the 20th year for Phillips 66 as a sponsor of the Big 12 Conference.

Big 12 Weekly Shows

The Big 12 boasts two over-the-air weekly magazine-style shows. Each program is a 30-minute promotion of the league, with features on student-athletes, coaches, teams and conference championships. Big 12 Showcase returns for its 20th season on FOX Sports regional affiliates and has been produced by Keith Fletcher each of those years. Erin Hartigan handles hosting duties, with Wendell Barnhouse as a weekly contributor. Big 12 This Week presented by Dr Pepper will be back for its seventh season and is televised on ESPNU. The show is produced by Joe Carmody with Chad McKee as the primary host.

Championship Credentials

Media credentials for the 2016 Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship are authorized and issued by the Conference office. An online credential system, provided through an agreement with Sports Systems Services, Inc., is the only method to submit requests. The credential system will be made available during the month of January.

Postseason Awards

The Big 12 presents the only official all-conference awards at the end of the regular season. Major award winners are chosen, along with the All-Big 12 teams. Each Big 12 head coach votes on the squads and is not permitted to vote for his own players. The awards will be announced in March prior to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship. Academic All-Big 12 teams are also chosen in men's basketball and will be announced prior to the postseason.

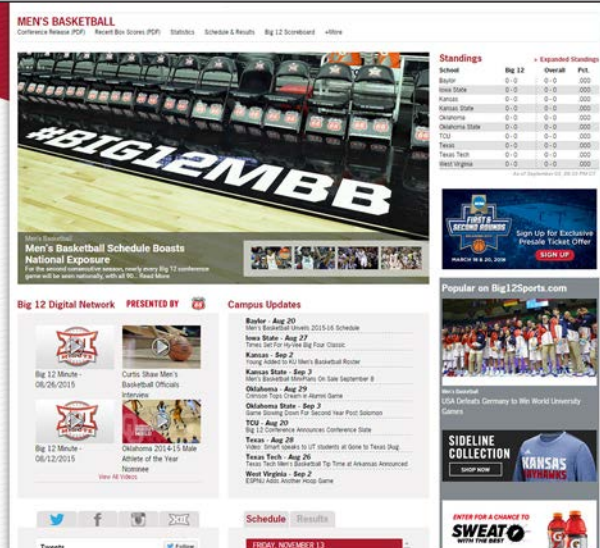

The Big 12 celebrates its 20th year in 2015-16 as it continues to promote the strength and success of one of the nation's premier athletic conferences under the direction of fourth-year commissioner Bob Bowlsby.

TCU and West Virginia joined the league on July 1, 2012 and became the Big 12's first additions since inception, joining Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas Tech.

With 10 members, the Big 12 remains as the only major conference in the nation to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field of play with a full round-robin schedule. The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first 19 years. Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 54 NCAA team titles and 587 individual national championships.

Additionally, the Big 12 has been at the forefront in college athletics reform, specifically with student-athlete welfare issues, including cost of attendance and strengthening policy for concussion diagnosis and management. In 2014-15, the Big 12 introduced and hosted three "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums to examine the issues facing college athletics. Two were conducted in Washington, D.C and one in New York City. Panelists included respected authorities from intercollegiate athletics, university leadership and sports journalism. The third forum featured a special session comprised of student-athletes.

The 2014 fall sport season saw Texas become the 13th league volleyball squad to advance to the national semifinals – its 10th appearance all-time. A total of five Big 12 volleyball teams moved on to the postseason and also finished in the NCAA RPI top 30. Big 12 soccer teams represented in the NCAA postseason field with six selections, marking the highest total for the league since 2008. In cross country competition, three teams placed in the top 10 at the NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships, including a runner-up finish by the Iowa State women. Seventy percent of the league advanced to bowl games with two teams playing in the College Football Playoff News Year's Bowls. The Conference has had seven or more bowl teams in 15 of the last 17 years.

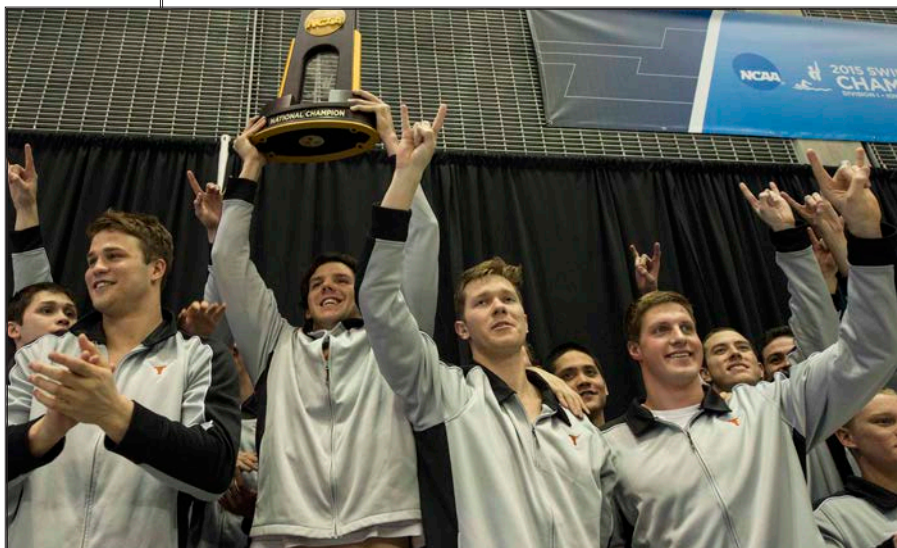
The 2015 winter and spring seasons saw Texas swimming & diving claim its fifth national championship while Oklahoma men's tennis and Baylor women's golf finished as NCAA runners-up. TCU made the Big 12's 19th appearance in the baseball College World Series. The Conference won NCAA individual titles in 22 events across the sports of men's swimming & diving, wrestling, men's tennis and men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field.

The Big 12 lays claim to five Heisman Trophy winners since 1996 and has had a finalist in 12 of its 19 seasons. Twenty-two athletes have earned major individual awards in football in the past six campaigns. Overall, more than 4,600 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition. This past summer, West Virginia soccer standout Kadeisha Buchanan earned the Hyundai Young Player Award at the 2015 World Cup while playing for her native Canada, given to the player born in 1995 or later that made the biggest impression in the competition.

Through its first 19 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 17 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference finished the BCS era ranked tied for second with seven appearances in the National Championship Game. League squads combined to lead the nation in women's basketball attendance 15 consecutive years (2014-15 not yet available), and the Big 12 is the only conference to surpass the one-million mark in season attendance – doing so six times. In men's basketball, the league has had seven teams earn NCAA bids three times in the past six years and every coach has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament, including a nation's-best six coaches that have led teams to the Final Four. During the last 11 years a total of 33 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 18 consecutive seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) was presented the NCAA Today's Top 10 Award in January 2015. It recognizes former student-athletes for their successes on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. Since 1996, the Big 12 has a total of 11 honorees for this prestigious award. In the last four seasons, six student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 89 Award with women's cross country's Kelly Williams (West Virginia) and women's outdoor track



& field athlete Montene Speight (Texas Tech) picking up the latest honors in 2014-15. The accolade showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has nearly 600 Academic All-America recipients, averaging more than 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Eleven times in the past 10 years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport, including Frances Silva (West Virginia) for soccer and Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) for football in 2013.

The Big 12 can take pride in other stories that combine on and off the field success. In the fall of 2013, former Texas Tech track and field student-athlete Ifeatu Okafor was named the Big 12's first NCAA Woman of the Year. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008 while Imani McGee-Stafford (Texas) was honored in 2015. It is given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. Oklahoma State women's basketball was the inaugural recipient of the "Together We R" Team Award in 2012, recognizing programs that have strived to succeed in the face of adversity. Following a devastating tornado south of Oklahoma City just before the Big 12 Baseball Championship in 2013, several league baseball teams along with other student-athletes, coaches and former Conference players contributed help in a variety of ways. Plus, the Conference contributed \$200,000 to the relief efforts. In the fall of 2014, Oklahoma football student-athlete Sterling Shepard and head coach Bob Stoops were honored with the Disney Sports Spirit Award while Kansas football student-athlete JaCorey Shepherd received the Lee Roy Selmon Community Spirit Award.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsperson of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 361 scholars have received over \$2.5 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 19 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big 12 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 38 million people. Nearly 5,000 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts postseason championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition.

In its first 19 years, the Big 12 has distributed approximately \$2.3 billion to its member institutions, including a record \$253 million in 2014-15. The Conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

Football, volleyball and softball do not sponsor a postseason championship. The final softball and football championships were held in 2010. Volleyball has never sponsored a postseason championship. Equestrian and rowing championships began in spring 2009 and became fully sponsored in 2011-12.

Big 12 titles for sports without round-robin conference play are determined by the postseason championship (Cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, rowing, swimming & diving, indoor/outdoor track & field). Wrestling was determined in this manner from 1997-2011 and 2014 - present.

** - Oklahoma won the 1996 Big 12 softball postseason title prior to the first academic year of Big 12 competition (1996-97).

NO ONE HAS IT TOUGHER

A look at the conference schedules for this year shows that Big 12 teams will be tested more than anyone in the nation. Once the New Year's celebrations are complete, every squad in the conference will play a minimum of 12 contests versus opponents that competed in last year's NCAA Championship.

Every team in the Big 12 also faces difficult stretches during the season. Each league squad has no fewer than four consecutive games at some point after January 1 where the opponent was in the 2015 NCAA Championship. K-State and Texas Tech both have strings of nine straight opponents that received NCAA bids a year ago.

TOP TALENT RETURNS

For the first time in Big 12 history, four of the five members of the all-conference first team from the previous season will return. Among the Big 12, ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC, the Big 12 is the first conference since 2010-11 (Big Ten) to bring back four of five first team selections.

MORE ON RETURNEES

Overall, 10 of the 15 members of last year's All-Big 12 First, Second and Third Teams will play in the conference again this season. In addition, the Player of the Year (Buddy Hield, OU), Defensive Player of the Year (Jameel McKay, ISU) and Sixth Man Award winner (Taurean Prince, BU) are all back for the 2015-16 campaign. It marks the first time in Big 12 history that the recipients of those three awards all returned for the following season.

PLENTY OF POINT PRODUCTION

For the second straight season, the Big 12 leading scorer from the previous campaign will return. This year it's Buddy Hield of Oklahoma, one of six of the top nine conference scorers from 2014-15 that will suit up again this year.

CRASHING THE BOARDS (AGAIN)

The top five rebounders in the Big 12 and 13 of the 20 leaders in the category are eligible to take the court again in 2015-16. Leading the way is Rico Gathers of Baylor, who ranked fourth nationally a year ago and has 40 career double-figure rebounding efforts.

BIG 12 COACHING - THE NATION'S BEST

The Big 12 has a lineup of head coaches that is unmatched by any other conference in the country. Every coach in the league has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament.

In addition, six of the head coaches in the Big 12 have led teams to the Final Four at some point in their careers - the most of any conference. Four boast at least 500 career victories.

Seven coaches have career winning percentages of .600 or better, while the group as a whole has nearly 4,000 career victories (3,910-2,040, .657) with all of them having winning career records.

BIG 12 COACHES RANK HIGH NATIONALLY

Big 12 coaches are also prominent among the national leaders in NCAA Basketball. Five coaches rank among the top 31 active coaches in winning percentage. A sixth, Steve Prohm at Iowa State, would place third (104-29, .782), but is one year shy of the minimum five years required for the list.

TOP-RATED RPI

For the third time in six years and the second straight campaign, the Big 12 ranked first in the nation in the RPI on Selection Sunday when it claimed the top spot in 2015. The Conference has been rated in the top five each of the past eight seasons.



PRIME TIME EXPOSURE

The Big 12 takes a back seat to no one when it comes to national television exposure.

A total of 84 conference matchups will be televised on a national platform - ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPNEWS or CBS Sports. In addition, the remaining six contests are slated for national and regional institutionally-branded outlets.

During the conference portion of the season, a Big 12 game will be telecast in prime time every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday when ESPN is showing college basketball. In March, the entire Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship is also shown on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.

OUR CHAMPION IS DETERMINED ON THE COURT

For the fifth consecutive season, the Big 12 will play a full round-robin schedule - with every team playing every other twice (home and away). The Big 12 is the only one among the ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC to employ a full round-robin schedule.

RANKINGS REGULARS

Nine of 10 teams in the Big 12 have been ranked in the top 25 since January 1, 2014, with nine of 10 being ranked or receiving votes last season alone. Overall, the Big 12 had 80 percent of its squads ranked in the AP during 2014-15, a single-season record. The mark topped the previous best percentage, set by the Big East in 1991 (7 of 9 teams).

Every Big 12 team has been in the top 25 since 2010. Entering the 2015-16 campaign, at least one conference squad has been ranked every week since the Big 12 began competition in 1996-97, a span of 367 consecutive weeks.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

The Big 12 has won at least 71 percent of its non-conference games each of the past 16 seasons. Last year, the Conference boasted a .791 winning percentage overall - the second-best in league history.

SEVEN DANCING FOR SECOND YEAR IN A ROW

The Big 12 had seven teams selected for the 2015 NCAA Championship, leading the nation for the second consecutive season. The 70 percent of Big 12 teams in the tournament was the most of any league. The seven bids ties the conference record (2014, 2010) and the Big 12's three different seasons accomplishing the feat is the second-most in college basketball history.

LEADING THE MADNESS

Over the last two years, the Big 12 has had 14 teams selected for the NCAA Championship - more than any conference in the nation. In fact, eight of the 10 squads (80 percent) in the Big 12 have danced in the last two seasons. It's the best two-year stretch in league history.

BIG 12 BASKETBALL IS ALWAYS WELL-REPRESENTED

The Big 12 has had at least five teams in the NCAA Tournament for eight consecutive seasons, while no fewer than six Big 12 squads have made the field in six of the past eight years. A minimum of five NCAA bids have been earned 15 times in the 19-year history of the conference.

70 PERCENT IS RARE ... AND WE'VE DONE IT TWICE

The Big 12 had 70 percent of its teams in the NCAA field - just the sixth time in NCAA history that a conference has sent 70 percent of its teams. Four of the six times have been by either the Big Eight or Big 12 Conferences.

HIGH SEEDS SHOWCASE STRENGTH

The Big 12 had five teams seeded fifth or better in the 2015 NCAA Championship, tying for the most of any conference in the nation (ACC). The average seed of Big 12 teams was 5.1 - the seventh straight campaign that conference squads averaged 6.0 or better for seeding.

BIG 12 / SEC CHALLENGE MOVES TO JANUARY

For the first time this year, the Big 12/SEC will take place in one day, with all contests being played on Saturday, January 30. The two conferences arranged a mutual bye date for the third annual event and ESPN will provide exclusive coverage of all 10 games on its networks.



ESPN's College GameDay Covered by State

Farm - the Saturday morning and evening roadshow that discusses the top storylines of the college basketball season - will originate from one of the Challenge games, to be announced at a later date.

The Big 12 has won the event each of its first two seasons, capturing victories in six of 10 matchups in 2014 and seven of 10 meetings in 2013. The Big 12 has posted a 41-27 (.603) record in the last two conference challenge series it has played (vs. Pac-10, SEC) dating back to 2007.

Over the past three years, Big 12 teams are 27-16 (.628) against SEC foes.

HIGH ON THE OVERALL SEED LIST TOO

In the overall seed list published by the NCAA, the Big 12 had four of the top 11 teams - double the total of any conference in the nation. Five squads were in the top 20 and all seven NCAA teams from the Big 12 were rated in the top 41.

SEEN ON THE SECOND WEEKEND

When Oklahoma and West Virginia advanced to the regional semifinals in 2015, it marked the 17th consecutive season that at least one Big 12 squad has made the Sweet 16. The league has had at least one regional semifinalist in all but one year in conference history and multiple teams 12 times.

STRONG RESULTS AT THE START

The Big 12 has done well at the start of the NCAA Championship. The league is 27-16 (.627) in NCAA games in the round of 64 over the past seven seasons (2009-15). Since 2008, Big 12 teams are 32-17 (.653) in the same round and 35-17 (.673) during the previous nine tournaments.

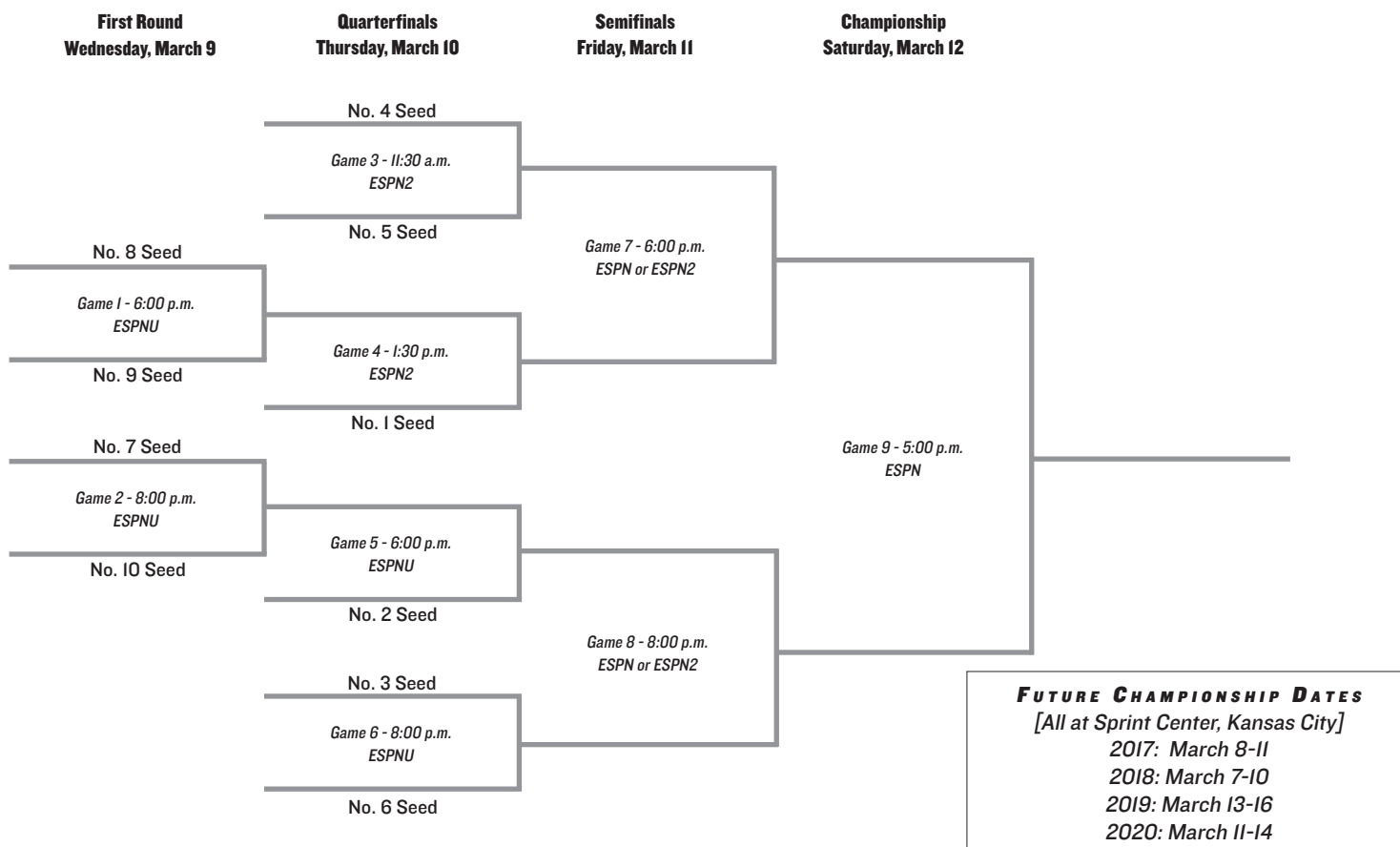

The Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship will continue in Kansas City in 2016, with Sprint Center hosting the league championship for the seventh time. All 10 institutions will participate with seeding based on regular season finish. The top six squads in the conference standings earn first-round byes. The Big 12 Champion earns the league's automatic bid to the 68-team NCAA Championship field. The entire Big 12 Championship will be televised nationally on ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU.

CHAMPIONSHIP TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

Seeding for the championship will be based upon regular-season competition. The winner of the postseason basketball championship shall be declared the Big 12 automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championship. A team ineligible under NCAA or Big 12 rules for postseason competition shall not compete in the championship.

Tiebreakers - The first criteria in the breaking of ties in the standings shall be head-to-head competition of tied teams. The following procedure will be used to establish the postseason championship seeds when ties exist.

Ties Involving Two Teams.

Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season. If teams remain tied, then:

- i. Each team's record versus the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tiebreaking procedures), rather than the performance against individual tied teams. The lone exception to this guideline would be if there are only two tied teams in the group placement and one of the teams won both regular-season games. In this instance, the tie is deemed broken and comparison of the seed rather than the placement will be utilized.
- ii. A comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record.
- iii. A comparison of the tied teams Conference games only road record versus the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then counting down through the standings until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams. The lone exception to this guideline would be if there are only two tied teams in the group placement and one of the teams won both regular-season games. In this instance, the tie is deemed broken and comparison of the seed rather than the placement will be utilized.
- iv. Draw. In the event tiebreaking procedures are unsuccessful and a draw is necessary in determining any portion of seeding, the following procedure will be used:

(1) The draw will be conducted in public or with media attendance.

(2) Institutions involved in the drawing have the right to have a local representative in attendance at the drawing;

(3) A single slip of paper for each institution (with name or logo) will be placed into a container and will be drawn in order of seeding from highest to lowest.

Ties involving more than two teams.

Results from the collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams in a mini round-robin format, ranking the tied teams by winning percentage from highest to lowest will be used to determine the seeds.

- i. If during this process two teams remain tied with the same winning percentage, the two-team tiebreaking system is used, starting with head-to-head results.
- ii. If during this process more than two teams remain tied with the same winning percentage, a second mini round-robin format is implemented, ranking the remaining tied teams by winning percentage from highest to lowest to determine seeds. If the teams remain tied, then the two-team tiebreaking system is used, starting with head-to-head results.
- b. If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record versus the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tiebreaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams. The lone exception to this guideline would be if there are only two tied teams in the group placement and one of the teams won both regular-season games. In this instance, the tie is deemed broken and comparison of the seed rather than the placement will be utilized.
- c. If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference games only road record.
- d. If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference games only road records versus the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standing until one team gains an advantage. If at any point the multiple-teams tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie breaking procedures above will be applied.

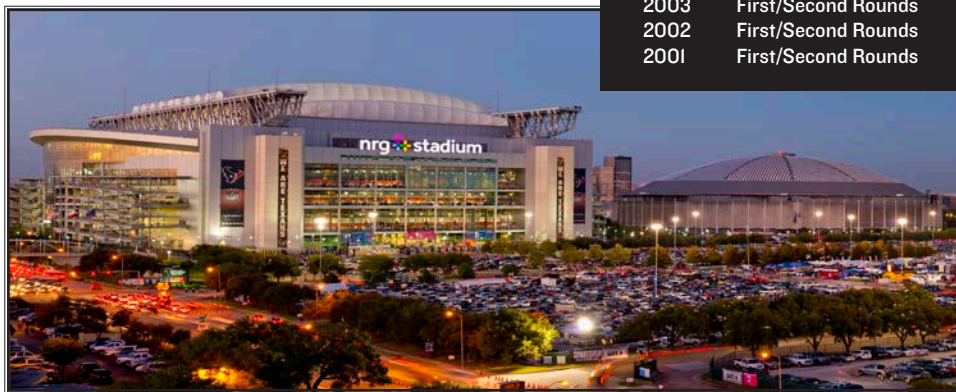

BIG 12 BASKETBALL TELEVISION DISTRIBUTION

The Big 12 Conference maintains long-term television agreements to ensure the greatest exposure for its men's basketball programs. Included below is a breakdown of these rights and how they affect which games are televised, and when they are shown.

ESPN has the rights to 100-105 games, plus all games of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship. Of those contests:

- Forty-three games (minimum of 30 Conference games) will be televised on either ESPN or ESPN2
- Guaranteed national telecasts on Monday, Wednesday and Saturdays during Conference play
- Ability to sublicense 20 additional games to a national over-the-air or cable outlet
- Up to 40 games per year on ESPNU and six additional games on ESPN3

Appearance Requirements

There are no appearance requirements (minimums or maximums) for games on the various ESPN platforms.

Game Times/Exclusive Windows

There are only a few exclusive windows in men's basketball. Institutional packages are restricted from televising games during Big Monday telecast windows and Saturday prime times windows when a Big 12 school is hosting College Game Day. Those are fully protected two-hour windows.

Distribution of Institutional (Local) Package Games

ESPN controls the national/regional distribution of games and the contract may limit the geographical reach of institutional (third-tier or local) package games to the state(s) of the participating team(s).

The guidelines for the distribution of these games include the following.

- Telecasts may be distributed only within the states (and overlapping DMAs) of the two participating teams, except when a game is distributed via a member institution branded outlet. The visiting team is not guaranteed the ability to take the game back to its home market(s)
- At its option, institutions may present the telecasts to ESPN for placement on ESPN Full Court
- In many instances, unselected games produced as part of the local package may be distributed by school websites

Revenue Distribution Process

Basketball television revenue is divided equally among all member institutions. Each member retains the revenue it receives for their local package telecasts.
