BIG 12 WEEKLY RELEASE

The Big I2 will update a media release, including conference notes, results and more throughout the season. Complete league statistics, in addition to team-by-team stats for all nine baseball squads, will be updated via the conference website as well.

PHILLIPS 66 BIG 12 WEEKLY AWARDS

A Big I2 Player, Pitcher and Newcomer of the Week will be chosen each Monday, beginning February I6. Nominations are submitted by the school communications offices and winners are selected by a panel of radio members who cover the league on a regular basis.

BIG 12 WEEKLY SHOWS

The Big I2 boasts two over-the-air weekly magazine-style shows. Each program is a 30-minute promotion of the league, with features on student-athletes, coaches, teams and conference championships. Big I2 Showcase presented by Academy Sports & Outdoors returns for its I9th season on FOX Sports regional affiliates and has been produced by Keith Fletcher each of those years. Erin Hartigan handles hosting duties, with Wendell Barnhouse as a weekly contributor. Big I2 This Week presented by Dr Pepper will be back for its seventh season and is televised on ESPNU. The show is produced by Joe Carmody with Chad McKee as the primary host. Segments of both programs are available via the Big I2 website.

CHAMPIONSHIPS CREDENTIALS

Media credentials for the 2015 Phillips 66 Big I2 Baseball Championship are authorized and issued by the Conference office. An online credential system, provided through an agreement with Sports Systems Services, Inc., is the only method to submit requests. The credential system will be made available during the month of April.

POSTSEASON AWARDS

The Big I2 presents the only official all-conference awards at the end of the regular season. Major award winners are chosen, along with the All-Big I2 teams. Each Big I2 head coach votes on the squads and is not permitted to vote for his own players. The awards will be announced in May prior to the Phillips 66 Big I2 Baseball Championship. Academic All-Big I2 teams are also chosen in baseball and will be announced prior to the postseason.



BIG 12 BASEBALL ON TV

The Big I2 Conference along with the league's television partners, FOX and ESPN, select several league contests to feature as national telecasts on FOX and ESPN platforms. Additional television appearances are available through institutional third-tier rights. For the third year in a row, the Phillips 66 Big I2 Championship will be telecast in its entirety with all contests leading up to Sunday's championship game on FOX College Sports (FCS) and the finale set for a national telecast at Noon CT on FOX Sports I.

Big 12 Conference - One True Champion



The Big I2 is in the midst of its I9th year as it continues to promote the strength and success of one of the nation's premier athletic conferences under the direction of third-year commissioner Bob Bowlsby.

TCU and West Virginia joined the league on July I, 2012 and became the Big I2's first additions since inception, joining Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas Tech.

With IO members, the Big I2 remains as the only major conference in the nation to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field of play with a full round-robin schedule. The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first I8 years.

The 2014 fall sport season saw Texas become the I3th league volleyball squad to advance to the national semifinals – its I0th appearance all-time. A total of five Big I2 volleyball teams moved on to the postseason and also finished in the NCAA RPI top 30. Big I2 soccer teams represented in the NCAA postseason field with six selections, marking the highest total for the league since 2008. In cross country competition, three teams place in the top I0 at the NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships, including a runner-up finish by the Iowa State women. Seventy percent of the league advanced to bowl games with two teams playing in the College Football Playoff News Year's bowls. The Conference has had seven or more bowl teams in I5 of the last I7 years.

The 2014 winter and spring seasons were just as successful as Oklahoma claimed the Big I2's first NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championship and I4 student-athletes claimed individual national titles. Texas women's indoor and outdoor track & field, UT men's swimming & diving, Oklahoma men's tennis and Oklahoma State men's golf finished as NCAA runners-up. Baylor softball was one of the last four teams standing at the Women's College World Series and the Big I2 placed a nation's-best four baseball squads in the NCAA Super Regionals and three in the College World Series.

Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 53 NCAA team titles and 552 individual national championships.

The Big I2 lays claim to five Heisman Trophy winners since I996 and has had a finalist in I2 of its I8 seasons – tied for the most of any league. Twenty-two athletes have earned major individual awards in football in the past six campaigns. Overall, more than I,900 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition in the past seven years alone.

Through its first 18 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 17 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference finished the BCS era ranked tied for second with seven appearances in the National Championship Game. League squads combined to lead the nation in women's basketball attendance 15 consecutive years and the Big 12 is the only conference to surpass the one-million mark in season attendance – doing so six times. In men's basketball, the league has had seven teams earn NCAA bids twice in the past five years and every coach has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament, including a nation's-best six coaches that have led teams to the Final Four. During the last 10 years a total of 32 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 17 consecutive seasons.

The Big I2 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big I2 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big I2. Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) will be presented the NCAA Today's Top IO Award in January of 2015. It recognizes former student-athletes for their successes on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. Danielle Robinson (Oklahoma) and Sam Acho (Texas) were previous recipients of

the award when it was named Today's Top VIII Awards. In the last three seasons, four student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 89 Award with pitcher John Curtiss (Texas) picking up the latest honor in the spring of 2014. The honor showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big I2 has had 59I Academic All-America recipients, averaging more than 30 each season. Big I2 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Eleven times in the past nine years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport, including Frances Silva (West Virginia) for soccer and Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) for football in 20I3.

The Big I2 can take pride in other stories that combine on and off the field success. In the fall of 2013, former Texas Tech track and field student-athlete Ifeatu Okafor was named the Big I2's first NCAA Woman of the Year. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008, given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. She was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in 2007, but rebounded to win All-America honors at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. Oklahoma State women's basketball was the inaugural recipient of the "Together We R" Team Award in 2012, recognizing programs that have strived to succeed in the face of adversity. Following a devastating tornado south of Oklahoma City just before the Big I2 Baseball Championship in 2013, several league baseball teams along with other student-athletes, coaches and former Conference players contributed help in a variety of ways. Plus, the Conference contributed \$200,000 to the relief efforts. In the fall of 2014, Oklahoma football student-athlete Sterling Shepard and head coach Bob Stoops were honored with the Disney Sports Spirit Award while Kansas football student-athlete JaCorey Shepherd received the Lee Roy Selmon Community Spirit Award.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big I2 philosophy. All-Big I2 teams and Academic All-Big I2 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big I2 Athlete of the Year and Big I2 Sportsperson of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 34I scholars have received nearly \$2.3 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first I8 years of the program.

The Big I2 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big I2 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 38 million people. Nearly 5,000 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts postseason championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition.

In its first I8 years, the Big I2 has distributed more than \$2.04 billion to its member institutions, including a record \$220.1 million in 2013-14. The Conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

IN THE RANKINGS

In 2014, for the first time in league history, four Big I2 teams finished the regular season ranked in the top I0 of all four national polls. Texas earned its highest finish since the 2009 season with a No. 3 spot in three polls, while TCU finished fifth in all four. The Red Raiders ranked as high as eighth, while Oklahoma State checked in at No. IO on all four lists – the highest final ranking for the Cowboys since 1999.

The Big I2 has had three or more teams in the top 25 of the final rankings every year since I997. Last season was the sixth time that four or more teams finished in the top 25 on each of the final national lists. In 2014, six of the league's nine squads appeared in the national rankings over the course of the season.

The Big I2 finished with the second-best conference RPI in the nation in 2014. It marked the third time in league history (2007 & 2005) the conference has claimed the No. 2 spot. Six teams (67 percent) finished in the top 50 with four league teams in the top 20 for just the third time. Notable turnarounds from the 2013 RPI:

IMPORTATION DE LA POST DE LA POST SEASON

Kansas, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech represented the Big I2 in the NCAA Championship field. The Cowboys and Horned Frogs served as regional hosts. The Big I2 has earned five or more NCAA berths in all but three years since the league's inception in I997. The Big I2's five selections tied for the third-most by one conference.

The Big I2 advanced 80 percent of its NCAA postseason teams to the Super Regional field and was represented in the CWS with one-third of its baseball-playing institutions. Sixty percent of its NCAA tournament teams advanced to Omaha (3-of-5).

All four Super Regional teams served as hosts with the Big I2 comprising one-fourth of the field of I6. Since the Super Regional format began in I999, it marked just the second time that one conference has had four teams serve as Super Regional hosts in the same year. The ACC also had four teams in 20I3.

It was the first time in league history that the conference has sent four teams to the Super Regional field in the same year. The league had never had more than three teams in the same year with a trio appearing only in 2005 and 1999 - the first year of Super Regional play in the NCAA postseason.

The Big I2 sent three teams to the College World Series field for just the second time in conference history (2005 - Baylor, Nebraska, Texas). It was the I2th time a conference has sent three or more teams to the CWS in the same year. The three teams combined for a 4-6 record at the event. It also marked the fifth time the league has sent multiple members to Omaha (1999, 2002, '05, 'II) with a total of I8 CWS appearances all-time.

The Big I2 was one of five conferences with more than two teams appearing in the NCAA Championship field of 64. Of those five conferences, the Big I2 was the only one that advanced more than 30 percent of its qualifiers to Super Regionals and was the only league that had more than two teams representing (Big I2: 4 of 5 - 80%, ACC: 2 of 7 - 29%, Big West: I of 4 - 25%, SEC: 2 of I0 - 20%, Pac-I2: I of 5 - 20%).

Big I2 teams went 23-I3 in NCAA postseason play last season. The league went 6-3 in Super Regional action – matching the most wins since the 2005 campaign (6-2). Last year's .765 (I3-4) winning percentage in regional contests was the second-best mark all-time for the league, which went 8-2 (.800) in the opening round in 20I3.

PRESEASON PICK

TCU has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the league in a vote by the Conference's head coaches. The Frogs were picked to finish second each of the past two seasons and did claim the runner-up spot in the standings a season ago.

TCU is the first team to earn a unanimous vote since 2012. Since 1999, the preseason favorite has gone on to claim the regular season title on five occasions (last in 2010 by Texas). After starting the season 15-12 in 2014, the Frogs finished 33-6, including winning 18 of 19 from April I-May IO before claiming the Big I2 postseason title.

TOTAL PROPERTY OF THE PROPERT

Oklahoma State, which won I6 consecutive Big Eight crowns before the Big I2's first season in I997, claimed the 2014 regular season title. It was the first Big I2 regular season title for the Cowboys, who won the conference's postseason championship in 2004. Last season, OSU won seven straight Big I2 series and led the league in conference ERA. The Cowboys also totaled 28 come-from-behind wins. OSU head coach Josh Holliday earned Big I2 Coach of the Year honors. He is 89-37 over two seasons at OSU.

A different league team has won the regular season title in each of the past four years with Texas being the last squad to repeat as champion in back-to-back campaigns (2010 & 2011).

MODIFICATION PITCHING

TCU's 2.22 ERA in 2014 led the nation while Texas' mark of 2.25 ranked fourth. The Big I2 was the only conference with multiple teams in the nation's top I0 for final ERA, with 2014 marking the third time a league squad has finished the season ranked first nationally (2010 – Texas; 2000 – Nebraska).

The Horned Frogs ranked third in the nation in shutouts while Texas ranked fifth. TCU and UT are two of three schools to finish in the top five in ERA and shutouts. The Horned Frog pitching staff combined for a Big I2 record I4 shutouts on the year, surpassing the previous single-season high of I3 set by Texas in 20II.

Four of the league's top pitchers from a season ago will return in 2015, including Big I2 Pitcher of the Year Preston Morrison (TCU). He will return in 2015 for his senior season with a career ERA of I.4I (third-best all time on the Big I2 charts) and three complete games during two years in the conference. Morrison is the first player to lead the league in ERA for two straight seasons and is also the league's active career leader in ERA, strikeouts, complete games and shutouts.



MINIOTABLE RETURNERS

In addition to the return of Big I2 Pitcher of the Year Preston Morrison, nine All-Big I2 First Team members from a season ago will be back on the diamond this spring, including four of the five All-Big I2 First Team performers from the infield - Sheldon Neuse (Oklahoma), Donnie Walton (Oklahoma State), Eric Gutierrez (Texas Tech) and Tim Proudfoot (Texas Tech).

Of the Big I2's four Super Regional teams from 2014, Oklahoma State and Texas Tech return over 20 letterwinners, while TCU will welcome back eight returning pitchers and Texas seven returning position players.

The Red Raiders have three players who top several offensive categories on the league's active career statistical leaders entering the season. Tyler Neslony sits as the active career leader in batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage. Bryant Burleson tops the league in games played, at-bats, hits, doubles and total bases. Eric Gutierrez is first on the RBI and home runs lists.

IMPORTAGE SHIP SITE SHIFT

For the first time since 2004, the Phillips 66 Big I2 Baseball Championship will be played at a new site as Tulsa and ONEOK Field host this season's event, May 20-24.

ONEOK Field is located in the historic Greenwood District of downtown Tulsa. Built over a I6-month period, ONEOK Field is a sentinel addition to the downtown landscape. The ballpark opened in 2010 and is home to the Tulsa Drillers, Double A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers ONEOK has a capacity of 8,152, but is capable of holding up to 9,000 for special events, and has averaged 8,900 fans over six Bedlam contests between Oklahoma and Oklahoma State from 2010-14. The Championship will return to Oklahoma City, which has hosted the event I6 of I8 years, in 2016.

IM COACHING MILESTONES WATCH

Several league coaches are closing in on career win milestones this season:

- With eight more victories, KU head coach Ritch Price will reach 400 in his career at Kansas, which began in 2003. He has 1,000 career wins as a head coach and 600 at the Division I level.
- In just their third seasons at each program, OSU's Josh Holliday and Tech's Tim Tadlock are closing in on IOO wins. Holliday needs just II victories to reach the century mark, while Tadlock is 29 wins shy.
- Texas' Augie Garrido needs 3I wins to reach 800. He is the only league coach to record 300 Big I2 wins and has I,920 career victories.

WHAT TO WATCH - CONFERENCE PLAY

The Jayhawks enter 2015 with a nine-game conference winning streak after sweeping their final three Big I2 series to close out 2014.

OSU has won seven straight Big I2 series entering 2015. The Cowboys won each series from a season ago except for their conference-opening series at BU.

TCU also enters the season with a streak of six series wins against league opponents, only losing to OSU and TTU in 2014.

Tech closed out 2014 winning its final nine home Big I2 games.

BIG 12/PAC-12 CHALLENGE

Kansas, K-State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State will compete in the Big I2/Pac-I2 Challenge, February I9-22, with games against Oregon State, Utah, Washington and Washington State at various MLB Spring Training facilities in Arizona (Mesa, Peoria and Surprise).

Additionally, TCU will have a three-game series against Arizona State over the same weekend, while Oklahoma State will take on the Sun Devils in its series opener (Feb. I3-I5) and Oklahoma will face ASU on Feb. I8 prior to the Big I2/Pac-I2 Challenge.

In total, the Big I2 will take on Pac-I2 opponents in 23 games over the first two weekends of the regular season and 32 times total in non-conference action.

TCU will also go on to play UCLA and USC as part of a four-game Los Angeles swing that includes contests vs. the Bruins, Trojans, reigning NCAA champion Vanderbilt and Loyola Marymount, March 6-IO.

CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION/HISTORY

The 2015 Phillips 66 Big I2 Baseball Championship will be held at ONEOK Field in Tulsa, Okla., May 20-24.

With Tulsa serving as the host city for this year's event, this is just the third time in Conference history the postseason tournament has not been in Oklahoma City.

ONEOK Field is located in the historic Greenwood District of downtown Tulsa. Built over a 16-month period, ONEOK Field is a sentinel addition to the downtown landscape. The ballpark opened in 2010 and is home to the Tulsa Drillers, Double A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers ONEOK has a capacity of 8,152, but is capable of holding up to 9,000 for special events, and has averaged 8,900 fans over six Bedlam contests between Oklahoma and Oklahoma State from 2010-14. The Championship will return to Oklahoma City, which has hosted the event 16 of 18 years, in 2016.

Three additional venues have sponsored the championship: All-Sports Stadium, Oklahoma City (1997); Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark (1998-2001, '03, '05-'14) and The Ballpark in Arlington (2002, '04).

Past postseason championship winners include Kansas (2006), Missouri (2012), Nebraska (1999-2001, '05), Oklahoma (1997, 2013), Oklahoma State (2004), TCU (2014), Texas (2002, '03, '08-09), Texas A&M (2007, 'IO-II) and Texas Tech (1998).

CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The eight teams with the best conference records (based on winning percentage) in regular season competition will qualify for the Phillips 66 Big I2 Championship -- a two-division, double-elimination format.

In the event of a tie or ties in the standings, the following tiebreaking system will be implemented.

- If two teams are tied, head-to-head competition will be used to (a) break a tie.
- (b) If two teams remain tied, the winner of the first game of the Conference series between the two tied teams will be used.
- (c) If two teams remain tied, there will be a comparison of the records of the tied teams against the highest place team(s) in descending order from top to bottom until the tie is broken; or,
- (d) If two teams remain tied, there will be a drawing to determine the seed or qualification for the championship;
- (e) If three or more teams are tied, there will be a comparison of headto-head records in a 'mini round-robin' of tied teams, followed by steps (a), (b), (c), and (d). Once a team has been eliminated from a multi-team comparison, it is dropped from further comparisons.

The Phillips 66 Big I2 Championship winner earns the Big I2's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship field. If the event is terminated before completion, the highest remaining seed shall be the conference's automatic qualifier. In the event that the Championship cannot be completed in entirety, the highest-seeded team of those remaining will be declared the automatic qualifier, regardless of when the Championship terminated.

THE VENUE

The 2015 NCAA College World Series will again be played at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha. The 24,000 seat stadium opened in 2011 and is home to the College World Series as well as the Creighton Bluejays baseball team.

THE ROAD TO OMAHA

The 64-team bracket provides for I6 four-team double elimination Regionals; and eight two-team, best-of-three Super Regionals, with the eight winners advancing to Omaha for the NCAA Men's College World Series.

The champions of all 29 NCAA Division I conferences automatically qualify for the championship. The remaining 35 teams will be selected atlarge. The Division I Baseball Committee will also consider regular season conference standings and/or conference postseason competition.

BIG 12 IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Big I2 has totaled I8 trips to the Men's College World Series, while current league teams have combined for 7I all-time appearances. The Conference has sent at least three teams to the NCAA postseasn since the inception of the Big I2 in I997.

Three league squads advanced to the field of eight in 2014, marking just the second time in Conference history that more than two squads have advanced to the CWS (3, 2005).

Eight different league squads have qualified for the CWS in the Big I2's I8 seasons, including the Longhorns' 2002 and '05 national title runs. Baylor (2005), Nebraska (200I-02, '05), Oklahoma ('10), Oklahoma State (1999), TCU (20I4), Texas (2000, '02-'05, '09, 'II, 'I4), Texas A&M ('99, 'II) and Texas Tech (20I4) have represented the Conference at the event.

The Big I2 has made 95 total appearances in the NCAA postseason with an overall record of 268-215 (.558). Kansas, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech earned berths in 2014.

League teams have combined to make 33 Super Regional trips, producing a mark of 44-41 and have hosted the Super Regional round on 16 occasions, including four Super Regional host sites in 2014. Multiple teams have advanced to the Super Regionals each of the past five years.
