BIG 12 WEEKLY RELEASE

The Big 12 will update a media release, including conference notes, results and more throughout the season. Complete league statistics, in addition to team-by-team stats for all nine baseball squads, will be updated via the conference website as well.

PHILLIPS 66 BIG 12 WEEKLY AWARDS

A Big 12 Player, Pitcher and Newcomer of the Week will be chosen each Monday, beginning February 16. Nominations are submitted by the school communications offices and winners are selected by a panel of radio members who cover the league on a regular basis.

BIG 12 WEEKLY SHOWS

The Big 12 boasts two over-the-air weekly magazine-style shows. Each program is a 30-minute promotion of the league, with features on student-athletes, coaches, teams and conference championships. Big 12 Showcase presented by Academy Sports & Outdoors returns for its 19th season on FOX Sports regional affiliates and has been produced by Keith Fletcher each of those years. Erin Hartigan handles hosting duties, with Wendell Barnhouse as a weekly contributor. Big 12 This Week presented by Dr Pepper will be back for its seventh season and is televised on ESPNU. The show is produced by Joe Carmody with Chad McKee as the primary host. Segments of both programs are available via the Big 12 website.

CHAMPIONSHIPS CREDENTIALS

Media credentials for the 2015 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship are authorized and issued by the Conference office. An online credential system, provided through an agreement with Sports Systems Services, Inc., is the only method to submit requests. The credential system will be made available during the month of April.

POSTSEASON AWARDS

The Big 12 presents the only official all-conference awards at the end of the regular season. Major award winners are chosen, along with the All-Big 12 teams. Each Big 12 head coach votes on the squads and is not permitted to vote for his own players. The awards will be announced in May prior to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship. Academic All-Big 12 teams are also chosen in baseball and will be announced prior to the postseason.

BIG12SPORTS.COM

The Big 12 Conference maintains its website at Big12Sports.com. Complete information on the league and the member schools is available.

The site boasts original content from throughout the Conference along with several video broadcasts and features. In baseball, condensed game highlights of selected contests will be available via the Big 12 Digital Network. Many parts of the Big 12 Digital Network - including video - are also available via an application on various mobile platforms (iPhone, iPad, Android). Comprehensive coverage of the 2015 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship in May is also available.

In baseball, scores throughout the league, standings and box scores are updated as games are final. Big 12 conference and team statistics are updated no later than the following morning, with weekly award winners posted each Monday. An archive of conference and team-by-team statistics for every season in league history is included as well.

Media can access Acrobat PDF files of the weekly release, statistics, team-by-team statistics and the conference media guide on the website.

BIG 12 SOCIAL MEDIA

The Big 12 also maintains a presence on Facebook (facebook.com/Big12), Twitter (@Big12Conference), Instagram (@Big12Conference) and YouTube (youtube.com/Big12Conference). Regular updates are posted, including selected game updates and other conference-related information.

BIG 12 BASEBALL ON TV

The Big 12 Conference along with the league's television partners, FOX and ESPN, select several league contests to feature as national telecasts on FOX and ESPN platforms. Additional television appearances are available through institutional third-tier rights. For the third year in a row, the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship will be telecast in its entirety with all contests leading up to Sunday's championship game on FOX College Sports (FCS) and the finale set for a national telecast at Noon CT on FOX Sports I.



The Big 12 is in the midst of its 19th year as it continues to promote the strength and success of one of the nation's premier athletic conferences under the direction of third-year commissioner Bob Bowlsby.

TCU and West Virginia joined the league on July 1, 2012 and became the Big 12's first additions since inception, joining Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas Tech.

With 10 members, the Big 12 remains as the only major conference in the nation to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field of play with a full round-robin schedule. The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first 18 years.

The 2014 fall sport season saw Texas become the 13th league volleyball squad to advance to the national semifinals – its 10th appearance all-time. A total of five Big 12 volleyball teams moved on to the postseason and also finished in the NCAA RPI top 30. Big 12 soccer teams represented in the NCAA postseason field with six selections, marking the highest total for the league since 2008. In cross country competition, three teams place in the top 10 at the NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships, including a runner-up finish by the Iowa State women. Seventy percent of the league advanced to bowl games with two teams playing in the College Football Playoff News Year's bowls. The Conference has had seven or more bowl teams in 15 of the last 17 years.

The 2014 winter and spring seasons were just as successful as Oklahoma claimed the Big 12's first NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championship and 14 student-athletes claimed individual national titles. Texas women's indoor and outdoor track & field, UT men's swimming & diving, Oklahoma men's tennis and Oklahoma State men's golf finished as NCAA runners-up. Baylor softball was one of the last four teams standing at the Women's College World Series and the Big 12 placed a nation's-best four baseball squads in the NCAA Super Regionals and three in the College World Series.

Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 53 NCAA team titles and 552 individual national championships.

The Big 12 lays claim to five Heisman Trophy winners since 1996 and has had a finalist in 12 of its 18 seasons – tied for the most of any league. Twenty-two athletes have earned major individual awards in football in the past six campaigns. Overall, more than 1,900 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition in the past seven years alone.

Through its first 18 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 17 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference finished the BCS era ranked tied for second with seven appearances in the National Championship Game. League squads combined to lead the nation in women's basketball attendance 15 consecutive years and the Big 12 is the only conference to surpass the one-million mark in season attendance – doing so six times. In men's basketball, the league has had seven teams earn NCAA bids twice in the past five years and every coach has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament, including a nation's-best six coaches that have led teams to the Final Four. During the last 10 years a total of 32 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 17 consecutive seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) will be presented the NCAA Today's Top 10 Award in January of 2015. It recognizes former student-athletes for their successes on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. Danielle Robinson (Oklahoma) and Sam Acho (Texas) were previous recipients of

the award when it was named Today's Top VIII Awards. In the last three seasons, four student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 89 Award with pitcher John Curtiss (Texas) picking up the latest honor in the spring of 2014. The honor showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has had 591 Academic All-America recipients, averaging more than 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Eleven times in the past nine years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport, including Frances Silva (West Virginia) for soccer and Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) for football in 2013.

The Big 12 can take pride in other stories that combine on and off the field success. In the fall of 2013, former Texas Tech track and field student-athlete Ifeatu Okafor was named the Big 12's first NCAA Woman of the Year. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008, given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. She was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in 2007, but rebounded to win All-America honors at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. Oklahoma State women's basketball was the inaugural recipient of the "Together We R" Team Award in 2012, recognizing programs that have strived to succeed in the face of adversity. Following a devastating tornado south of Oklahoma City just before the Big 12 Baseball Championship in 2013, several league baseball teams along with other student-athletes, coaches and former Conference players contributed help in a variety of ways. Plus, the Conference contributed \$200,000 to the relief efforts. In the fall of 2014, Oklahoma football student-athlete Sterling Shepard and head coach Bob Stoops were honored with the Disney Sports Spirit Award while Kansas football student-athlete JaCorey Shepherd received the Lee Roy Selmon Community Spirit Award.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsman of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 341 scholars have received nearly \$2.3 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 18 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big 12 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 38 million people. Nearly 5,000 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts postseason championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition.

In its first 18 years, the Big 12 has distributed more than \$2.04 billion to its member institutions, including a record \$220.1 million in 2013-14. The Conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

Football, volleyball and softball do not sponsor postseason championships. The final softball and football championships were held in 2010. Volleyball has never sponsored a championship.

Big 12 titles for sports without round-robin conference play are determined by the postseason championship (Cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, rowing, swimming & diving, indoor/outdoor track & field, wrestling). Wrestling determined a regular-season champion only in 2012 and 2013.

IN THE RANKINGS

In 2014, for the first time in league history, four Big 12 teams finished the regular season ranked in the top 10 of all four national polls. Texas earned its highest finish since the 2009 season with a No. 3 spot in three polls, while TCU finished fifth in all four. The Red Raiders ranked as high as eighth, while Oklahoma State checked in at No. 10 on all four lists – the highest final ranking for the Cowboys since 1999.

The Big 12 has had three or more teams in the top 25 of the final rankings every year since 1997. Last season was the sixth time that four or more teams finished in the top 25 on each of the final national lists. In 2014, six of the league's nine squads appeared in the national rankings over the course of the season.

The Big 12 finished with the second-best conference RPI in the nation in 2014. It marked the third time in league history (2007 & 2005) the conference has claimed the No. 2 spot. Six teams (67 percent) finished in the top 50 with four league teams in the top 20 for just the third time. Notable turnarounds from the 2013 RPI:

HISTORICAL 2014 NCAA POSTSEASON

Kansas, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech represented the Big 12 in the NCAA Championship field. The Cowboys and Horned Frogs served as regional hosts. The Big 12 has earned five or more NCAA berths in all but three years since the league's inception in 1997. The Big 12's five selections tied for the third-most by one conference.

The Big 12 advanced 80 percent of its NCAA postseason teams to the Super Regional field and was represented in the CWS with one-third of its baseball-playing institutions. Sixty percent of its NCAA tournament teams advanced to Omaha (3-of-5).

All four Super Regional teams served as hosts with the Big 12 comprising one-fourth of the field of 16. Since the Super Regional format began in 1999, it marked just the second time that one conference has had four teams serve as Super Regional hosts in the same year. The ACC also had four teams in 2013.

It was the first time in league history that the conference has sent four teams to the Super Regional field in the same year. The league had never had more than three teams in the same year with a trio appearing only in 2005 and 1999 – the first year of Super Regional play in the NCAA postseason.

The Big 12 sent three teams to the College World Series field for just the second time in conference history (2005 – Baylor, Nebraska, Texas). It was the 12th time a conference has sent three or more teams to the CWS in the same year. The three teams combined for a 4-6 record at the event. It also marked the fifth time the league has sent multiple members to Omaha (1999, 2002, '05, '11) with a total of 18 CWS appearances all-time.

The Big 12 was one of five conferences with more than two teams appearing in the NCAA Championship field of 64. Of those five conferences, the Big 12 was the only one that advanced more than 30 percent of its qualifiers to Super Regionals and was the only league that had more than two teams representing (Big 12: 4 of 5 – 80%, ACC: 2 of 7 – 29%, Big West: 1 of 4 – 25%, SEC: 2 of 10 – 20%, Pac-12: 1 of 5 – 20%).

Big 12 teams went 23-13 in NCAA postseason play last season. The league went 6-3 in Super Regional action – matching the most wins since the 2005 campaign (6-2). Last year's .765 (13-4) winning percentage in regional contests was the second-best mark all-time for the league, which went 8-2 (.800) in the opening round in 2013.

PRESEASON PICK

TCU has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the league in a vote by the Conference's head coaches. The Frogs were picked to finish second each of the past two seasons and did claim the runner-up spot in the standings a season ago.

TCU is the first team to earn a unanimous vote since 2012. Since 1999, the preseason favorite has gone on to claim the regular season title on five occasions (last in 2010 by Texas). After starting the season 15-12 in 2014, the Frogs finished 33-6, including winning 18 of 19 from April 1-May 10 before claiming the Big 12 postseason title.

DEFENDING CHAMPS

Oklahoma State, which won 16 consecutive Big Eight crowns before the Big 12's first season in 1997, claimed the 2014 regular season title. It was the first Big 12 regular season title for the Cowboys, who won the conference's postseason championship in 2004. Last season, OSU won seven straight Big 12 series and led the league in conference ERA. The Cowboys also totaled 28 come-from-behind wins. OSU head coach Josh Holliday earned Big 12 Coach of the Year honors. He is 89-37 over two seasons at OSU.

A different league team has won the regular season title in each of the past four years with Texas being the last squad to repeat as champion in back-to-back campaigns (2010 & 2011).

POTENT PITCHING

TCU's 2.22 ERA in 2014 led the nation while Texas' mark of 2.25 ranked fourth. The Big 12 was the only conference with multiple teams in the nation's top 10 for final ERA, with 2014 marking the third time a league squad has finished the season ranked first nationally (2010 – Texas; 2000 – Nebraska).

The Horned Frogs ranked third in the nation in shutouts while Texas ranked fifth. TCU and UT are two of three schools to finish in the top five in ERA and shutouts. The Horned Frog pitching staff combined for a Big 12 record 14 shutouts on the year, surpassing the previous single-season high of 13 set by Texas in 2011.

Four of the league's top pitchers from a season ago will return in 2015, including Big 12 Pitcher of the Year Preston Morrison (TCU). He will return in 2015 for his senior season with a career ERA of 1.41 (third-best all time on the Big 12 charts) and three complete games during two years in the conference. Morrison is the first player to lead the league in ERA for two straight seasons and is also the league's active career leader in ERA, strikeouts, complete games and shutouts.

NOTABLE RETURNERS

In addition to the return of Big 12 Pitcher of the Year Preston Morrison, nine All-Big 12 First Team members from a season ago will be back on the diamond this spring, including four of the five All-Big 12 First Team performers from the infield - Sheldon Neuse (Oklahoma), Donnie Walton (Oklahoma State), Eric Gutierrez (Texas Tech) and Tim Proudfoot (Texas Tech).

Of the Big 12's four Super Regional teams from 2014, Oklahoma State and Texas Tech return over 20 letterwinners, while TCU will welcome back eight returning pitchers and Texas seven returning position players.

The Red Raiders have three players who top several offensive categories on the league's active career statistical leaders entering the season. Tyler Neslony sits as the active career leader in batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage. Bryant Burleson tops the league in games played, at-bats, hits, doubles and total bases. Eric Gutierrez is first on the RBI and home runs lists.

CHAMPIONSHIP SITE SHIFT

For the first time since 2004, the Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship will be played at a new site as Tulsa and ONEOK Field host this season's event, May 20-24.

ONEOK Field is located in the historic Greenwood District of downtown Tulsa. Built over a 16-month period, ONEOK Field is a sentinel addition to the downtown landscape. The ballpark opened in 2010 and is home to the Tulsa Drillers, Double A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers. ONEOK has a capacity of 8,152, but is capable of holding up to 9,000 for special events, and has averaged 8,900 fans over six Bedlam contests between Oklahoma and Oklahoma State from 2010-14. The Championship will return to Oklahoma City, which has hosted the event 16 of 18 years, in 2016.

COACHING MILESTONES WATCH

Several league coaches are closing in on career win milestones this season:

- With eight more victories, KU head coach Ritch Price will reach 400 in his career at Kansas, which began in 2003. He has 1,000 career wins as a head coach and 600 at the Division I level.
- In just their third seasons at each program, OSU's Josh Holliday and Tech's Tim Tadlock are closing in on 100 wins. Holliday needs just 11 victories to reach the century mark, while Tadlock is 29 wins shy.
- Texas' Augie Garrido needs 31 wins to reach 800. He is the only league coach to record 300 Big 12 wins and has 1,920 career victories.

WHAT TO WATCH - CONFERENCE PLAY

The Jayhawks enter 2015 with a nine-game conference winning streak after sweeping their final three Big 12 series to close out 2014.

OSU has won seven straight Big 12 series entering 2015. The Cowboys won each series from a season ago except for their conference-opening series at BU.

TCU also enters the season with a streak of six series wins against league opponents, only losing to OSU and TTU in 2014.

Tech closed out 2014 winning its final nine home Big 12 games.

BIG 12/PAC-12 CHALLENGE

Kansas, K-State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State will compete in the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge, February 19-22, with games against Oregon State, Utah, Washington and Washington State at various MLB Spring Training facilities in Arizona (Mesa, Peoria and Surprise).

Additionally, TCU will have a three-game series against Arizona State over the same weekend, while Oklahoma State will take on the Sun Devils in its series opener (Feb. 13-15) and Oklahoma will face ASU on Feb. 18 prior to the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge.

In total, the Big 12 will take on Pac-12 opponents in 23 games over the first two weekends of the regular season and 32 times total in non-conference action.

TCU will also go on to play UCLA and USC as part of a four-game Los Angeles swing that includes contests vs. the Bruins, Trojans, reigning NCAA champion Vanderbilt and Loyola Marymount, March 6-10.

CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION/HISTORY

The 2015 Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Championship will be held at ONEOK Field in Tulsa, Okla., May 20-24.

With Tulsa serving as the host city for this year's event, this is just the third time in Conference history the postseason tournament has not been in Oklahoma City.

ONEOK Field is located in the historic Greenwood District of downtown Tulsa. Built over a 16-month period, ONEOK Field is a sentinel addition to the downtown landscape. The ballpark opened in 2010 and is home to the Tulsa Drillers, Double A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers. ONEOK has a capacity of 8,152, but is capable of holding up to 9,000 for special events, and has averaged 8,900 fans over six Bedlam contests between Oklahoma and Oklahoma State from 2010-14. The Championship will return to Oklahoma City, which has hosted the event 16 of 18 years, in 2016.

Three additional venues have sponsored the championship: All-Sports Stadium, Oklahoma City (1997); Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark (1998-2001, '03, '05-'14) and The Ballpark in Arlington (2002, '04).

Past postseason championship winners include Kansas (2006), Missouri (2012), Nebraska (1999-2001, '05), Oklahoma (1997, 2013), Oklahoma State (2004), TCU (2014), Texas (2002, '03, '08-'09), Texas A&M (2007, '10-'11) and Texas Tech (1998).

CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The eight teams with the best conference records (based on winning percentage) in regular season competition will qualify for the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship -- a two-division, double-elimination format.

In the event of a tie or ties in the standings, the following tiebreaking system will be implemented.

- If two teams are tied, head-to-head competition will be used to break a tie.
- If two teams remain tied, the winner of the first game of the Conference series between the two tied teams will be used.
- If two teams remain tied, there will be a comparison of the records of the tied teams against the highest place team(s) in descending order from top to bottom until the tie is broken; or,
- If two teams remain tied, there will be a drawing to determine the seed or qualification for the championship;
- If three or more teams are tied, there will be a comparison of head-to-head records in a 'mini round-robin' of tied teams, followed by steps (a), (b), (c), and (d). Once a team has been eliminated from a multi-team comparison, it is dropped from further comparisons.

The Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship winner earns the Big 12's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship field. If the event is terminated before completion, the highest remaining seed shall be the conference's automatic qualifier. In the event that the Championship cannot be completed in entirety, the highest-seeded team of those remaining will be declared the automatic qualifier, regardless of when the Championship terminated.

THE VENUE

The 2015 NCAA College World Series will again be played at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha. The 24,000 seat stadium opened in 2011 and is home to the College World Series as well as the Creighton Bluejays baseball team.

THE ROAD TO OMAHA

The 64-team bracket provides for 16 four-team double elimination Regionals; and eight two-team, best-of-three Super Regionals, with the eight winners advancing to Omaha for the NCAA Men's College World Series.

The champions of all 29 NCAA Division I conferences automatically qualify for the championship. The remaining 35 teams will be selected at-large. The Division I Baseball Committee will also consider regular season conference standings and/or conference postseason competition.

BIG 12 IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Big 12 has totaled 18 trips to the Men's College World Series, while current league teams have combined for 71 all-time appearances. The Conference has sent at least three teams to the NCAA postseason since the inception of the Big 12 in 1997.

Three league squads advanced to the field of eight in 2014, marking just the second time in Conference history that more than two squads have advanced to the CWS (3, 2005).

Eight different league squads have qualified for the CWS in the Big 12's 18 seasons, including the Longhorns' 2002 and '05 national title runs. Baylor (2005), Nebraska (2001-02, '05), Oklahoma ('10), Oklahoma State (1999), TCU (2014), Texas (2000, '02-'05, '09, '11, '14), Texas A&M ('99, '11) and Texas Tech (2014) have represented the Conference at the event.

The Big 12 has made 95 total appearances in the NCAA postseason with an overall record of 268-215 (.558). Kansas, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech earned berths in 2014.

League teams have combined to make 33 Super Regional trips, producing a mark of 44-41 and have hosted the Super Regional round on 16 occasions, including four Super Regional host sites in 2014. Multiple teams have advanced to the Super Regionals each of the past five years.
