FIRST PITCH

- Texas Tech will begin its second trip to the College World Series in Omaha this Sunday when the Red Raiders face Big 12 Conference foe TCU. First pitch is slated for 2 p.m. inside TD Ameritrade Park with television coverage provided by ESPNU.
- Texas Tech is one of three national seeds to advance to the College World Series, joining top-seeded Florida as well as No. 2 Miami. The Red Raiders earned a national seed this season for the first time since the NCAA went to its current format (Super Regionals) in 1999.
- This is Texas Tech's second appearance all-time at the College World Series as the Red Raiders also advanced to Omaha in 2014. Tech is one of seven programs nationally to advance to Omaha twice over the past three seasons.
- The Red Raiders will face a familiar foe in TCU to open the College World Series. Texas Tech took two-of-three games against the Horned Frogs earlier this season during their Big 12 series held in Fort Worth.
- Texas Tech also opened the 2014 College World Series against TCU where the Horned Frogs escaped with a 3-2 victory. Both of Tech's losses during the 2014 event came via one-run decisions as Ole Miss eliminated the Red Raiders with a 2-1 victory.
- The Red Raiders advanced to Omaha after bouncing back from a game-one loss to defeat East Carolina in the NCAA Lubbock Super Regional. Texas Tech overcame an 8-6 setback in the opener by topping the Pirates, 3-1, in 13 innings last Saturday and then 11-0 on Sunday.
- Tim Tadlock, the Big 12 Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year Award, is the first skipper in Big 12 history to lead a program to Omaha twice in his first four seasons.

PLAYER TO WATCH - ERIC GUTIERREZ

Gutierrez, the Big 12 Player of the Year and a first team All-America honoree, enters his second trip to the College World Series looking to further his legacy as one of the best players in program history. The senior provided quite the heroics during Texas Tech's 3-1 victory over East Carolina as he connected on a two-out, two-run single in the 13th inning. He followed with another two-run single the following day to push the Red Raiders to an 11-0 rout over the Pirates, clinching a berth in the College World Series for the second time in three years.



TEXAS TECH AT THE COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

Texas Tech returns to the College World Series for the second time in program history this weekend. The Red Raiders previously made the trip to Omaha in 2014 where Tech dropped a pair of one-run games to TCU and Ole Miss. Tech is one of seven programs nationally to advance to the CWS twice over the past three years, joining the likes of Florida, Vanderbilt, Louisville, TCU, Virginia and Miami (Fla.). Tech head coach Tim Tadlock, meanwhile, is the first head coach in Big 12 history to lead a program to Omaha twice in his first four seasons.

TEXAS TECH IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- Texas Tech is making its 11th all-time appearance in the NCAA Championship and second at the College World Series.
- Texas Tech is 25-23 all-time in the NCAA Championship, including a 5-2 mark this season.
- The Red Raiders previously advanced to the NCAA Championship over eight-straight seasons from 1995-2002 and then again in 2004 and 2014.
- Texas Tech is one of seven schools nationally to advance to the College World Series twice of the past three seasons, joining the likes of Florida, TCU, Miami (Fla.), Vanderbilt, Virginia and Louisville.
- TCU is the only opponent in Texas Tech's bracket to previously face the Red Raiders in school history. Tuesday will mark the first time Tech has ever met either Florida or Coastal Carolina on a baseball diamond.
- Texas Tech is 2-3 all-time in NCAA Championship games against the College World Series Field. The Red Raiders are historically 0-1 against TCU and then 2-2 all-time against Miami (Fla.).
- Texas Tech advanced to the Super Regional round after defeating the likes of Fairfield, New Mexico and Dallas Baptist during the NCAA Lubbock Regional. The Red Raiders opened the tournament with 12-1 and 4-3 victories over Fairfield and New Mexico and then needed a 5-3 win in the "if necessary" game to advance to their second Super Regional in school history.
- In each of its two trips to Omaha in school history, Texas Tech has advanced to the College World Series after winning a Super Regional played at home. The Red Raiders previously swept College of Charleston via two 1-0 victories in 2014 before bouncing back from a game-one loss to defeat East Carolina last weekend in Lubbock.
- The Red Raiders needed 13 innings to even the series against East Carolina in the second game of the series where Texas Tech escaped with a 3-1 victory. It marked the longest game for Tech in postseason history and also matched the fourth-longest game ever in a NCAA Super Regional.
- Texas Tech is the 30th team all-time and the first since 2014 to advance to Omaha after a game-one loss during the Super Regional round. The NCAA began the Super Regional format starting with the 1999 season.
- Texas Tech's 11-0 win marked its largest margin of victory in the NCAA postseason since the Red Raiders defeated Temple, 14-3, at the 2001 NCAA Fullerton Regional.
- Texas Tech's 11-0 win over East Carolina marked the largest margin of victory in a Super Regional finale among the eight teams who advanced to the College World Series.
- The Texas Tech pitching staff tossed its sixth shutout all-time in the NCAA Championship, five of which that have come under head coach Tim Tadlock. The Red Raiders tossed four shutouts during the 2014 run to the College World Series.
- The Texas Tech pitching staff held East Carolina scoreless over the final 15.1 innings of the series. It is the longest scoreless streak for the Red Raiders since going 17.1-straight innings without allowing a run from April 15-17, 2016.
- Texas Tech is now 7-2 in NCAA Championship games played inside Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park since the start of the 2014 season. Tech was 5-2 at home during the NCAA postseason this year alone.
- Texas Tech sold out each of its seven games during the postseason at home. Tech had 4,732 on hand for all four days of the NCAA Lubbock Regional before a crowd of 4,817 attended the NCAA Super Regional against East Carolina.
- Texas Tech is one of just 13 schools nationally and one of three in the Big 12 Conference (TCU, Oklahoma State) to advance to a Super Regional twice over the past three seasons.
- The Red Raiders advanced to the College World Series in Omaha for the first time in program history during their last appearance in the NCAA Championship. Texas Tech toppled both Columbia and No. 3 Miami in the NCAA Coral Gables Regional before downing College of Charleston in the NCAA Lubbock Super Regional.
- Tim Tadlock is only the second head coach in school history to lead the Red Raiders to the NCAA Championship. Larry Hays previously made nine NCAA tournament appearances during his tenure from 1987-2008.
- Texas Tech is 8-4 all-time in NCAA Championship games under head coach Tim Tadlock.

INSIDE THE TCU SERIES

- Texas Tech and TCU will be meeting for the 164th time on a baseball diamond Sunday afternoon which marks the most played series against an opponent in school history.
- The Red Raiders are 72-90-1 all-time against the Horned Frogs, including a 5-4 mark in neutral-site games.
- Since the start of the 2014 season, Texas Tech is 6-5 against TCU after the Red Raiders won both the 2014 and 2016 series in Fort Worth. TCU claimed two-of-three games during the 2015 series in Lubbock as well as the 2014 College World Series opener. Tech also defeated TCU, 8-1, at the 2015 Big 12 Championship.
- Texas Tech and TCU have split their four Big 12 series against each other since the Horned Frogs joined the Big 12 Conference prior to the 2013 season.
- The Red Raiders claimed two-of-three games from the Horned Frogs this season after defeating TCU, 7-3, in the series opener and then 3-1 in the rubber match. TCU managed a 13-6 victory in the second game of the series.
- This is the third-straight season where Texas Tech and TCU have met outside the regular season as the Horned Frogs claimed a 3-2 victory in the College World Series opener in 2014 while Tech scored an 8-1 win during last season's Big 12 Championship.
- Texas Tech is 7-8 against the Horned Frogs under fourth-year head coach Tim Tadlock.

TADLOCK LEADS THE RED RAIDERS BACK TO THE COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

When Texas Tech departed the College World Series after back-to-back losses in 2014, Tim Tadlock famously said "We're going to lay our head down every night and wake up every morning trying to get back here." Fast forward two years and the Red Raiders are back in Omaha after winning the Big 12 regular-season title with several familiar faces that led Tech to the College World Series in 2014. Tadlock, the Big 12 Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year Award, is the first head coach in Big 12 history to lead his team to the College World Series twice in his first four seasons.

RED RAIDER NATION PACKS RIP GRIFFIN PARK - SETS STADIUM RECORD ATTENDANCE

Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park, which has a stadium capacity of 4,528, was sold out and had extra bleachers brought in to help with the demand for tickets the last two weekends as Texas Tech hosted both the NCAA Regional and Super Regional rounds. Both games of the Lubbock Super Regional had announced paid attendance of 4,817 - marking a stadium record (since 2012 \$5 million renovation). That attendance mark is the 11th most in school history and the most at a Tech home game since 2000 (vs. Texas, 5,124). The Red Raiders have played in front of a sellout crowd in each of their last nine NCAA Championship games played at home. In addition, Tech has boasted a crowd of over 4,000 fans in 16 of its 18 NCAA Championship games held at home in school history.

SMITH GETS READY TO TAKE THE BIG STAGE FOR HIS THIRD WORLD SERIES TOURNAMENT

Texas Tech junior outfielder Stephen Smith was a member of the 2007 Lubbock Western Little League team that finished runner-up in Williamsport, Pennsylvania, during the Little League World Series. Smith started the championship game for Lubbock Western Little on the mound in a game that had 24,200 fans in attendance. Fast forward seven years and Smith was the leadoff hitter and starting outfielder for his hometown Red Raiders in Texas Tech's first ever visit to the NCAA College World Series in 2014. He helped the Red Raiders return to Omaha this season after earning All-Big 12 first team honors.

RED RAIDERS FEATURE SEVEN PLAYERS WHO HAVE PLAYED IN COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

Many often say experience is key for teams at the College World Series. The Red Raiders will be a little more familiar with TD Ameritrade Park and the College World Series this time around as Texas Tech boasts seven players - Zach Davis, Eric Gutierrez, Ryan Long, Anthony Lyons, Ryan Moseley, Tyler Neslony and Stephen Smith - who played during Tech's 2014 trip to Omaha. In addition, the Red Raiders also have three additional players - Dalton Brown, Ty Damron and Tyler Floyd - who were on the 2014 roster that helped push Tech to the College World Series for the first time in program history.

TEXAS TECH - 2016 BIG 12 REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- Texas Tech claimed the outright Big 12 regular season title as the Red Raiders finished 19-5 overall in Big 12 play, marking their best winning percentage (.792) in school history. Tech broke the previous mark of .767 from the 1997 season.
- This is Texas Tech's fifth conference title in school history and first since the Red Raiders won the 1998 Big 12 Tournament. Tech also claimed the Southwest Conference regular season and tournament titles in 1995 as well as the inaugural Big 12 regular season crown in 1997.
- Of the nine current baseball members in the Big 12, Texas Tech is one of just three schools to win multiple regular-season titles, joining Texas (8) and Baylor (3).
- Picked to finish fifth in the coaches preseason poll, Texas Tech is just the third team in league history to win the regular-season title after being picked fifth or lower, joining both Texas A&M (picked fifth in 1999) and Kansas State (picked seventh in 2013).
- The Red Raiders swept four of their eight Big 12 series this season which matched the single-season school record from the 1997 season. Texas Tech played 10 conference series that season, two more than its current slate of eight weekend series.
- Texas Tech's 19 wins in Big 12 play marked its most against conference foes since the Red Raiders finished 19-10 in 2001.
- Texas Tech's 19 wins in Big 12 play marked the most by a conference team since Baylor finished 20-4 in 2012.
- Texas Tech's seven Big 12 series wins marked its most since the Red Raiders also claimed seven series wins in 2001.
- The sweep of Kansas improved the Red Raiders to 10-2 in league games away from home, marking the first time a Big 12 school has won 10 or more road games since the conference moved to a nine-team format in 2012.
- Texas Tech's successful start to league play was boosted by a school record 11-game conference winning streak. The streak, the fifth-longest winning streak in league history, was snapped April 23 with a 7-4 loss to Texas.
- Texas Tech had not previously swept three-consecutive Big 12 series in program history (Oklahoma, K-State, Oklahoma State).
- Texas Tech's series sweep of Oklahoma State marked its first over a ranked opponent since the Red Raiders took all three games from No. 17 Baylor in 2002. It also marked the first road sweep for Tech over a ranked Big 12 opponent in program history.
- Texas Tech had not previously swept a Big 12 opponent on the road since traveling to Kansas on May 1-3, 2004. In addition, Texas Tech had not previously swept Oklahoma State at home or on the road in school history.

Texas Tech claimed its second Big 12 regular-season title in school history this season as the Red Raiders finished 19-5 in league play, the most wins for a conference team since 2012 (Baylor - 20).

TEXAS TECH NOTES

- Texas Tech boasts 46 wins already this year, third-most in program history and the most since the Red Raiders finished the 1997 season with a 46-14 overall record.
- Texas Tech concluded the regular season with 40 wins for the 13th time in school history and second time under Tim Tadlock. The Red Raiders had not recorded a 40-win season since 2004 prior to Tadlock's arrival.
- This is the seventh time in school history where the Red Raiders have recorded 40 wins during the regular season (2016, 2014, 2002, 1996, 1995, 1993, 1991).
- Texas Tech entered the NCAA Championship ranked 14th nationally in the latest Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) rankings that were released on May 29. The Red Raiders were the highest-ranked Big 12 team in the RPI.
- Texas Tech has 12 victories already this season against ranked opponents, its most since also winning 12 games versus top-25 opponents in 2014.
- Texas Tech leads the Big 12 Conference with 12 victories this season against nationally-ranked opponents.
- Texas Tech has scored 451 runs through 64 games this season, its most since plating 554 runs in 2004.
- Texas Tech has stolen 69 bases already this year, its most since recording 87 during the 2012 season.
- Texas Tech has recorded 54 home runs so far this year, its most since hitting 61 during the 2010 season.
- Through the first 64 games of this season, the Red Raiders have turned 78 double plays, 10 more than the previous single-season school record of 68 that was set in 2013. Tech turned seven double plays during the NCAA Super Regional series against East Carolina alone.
- The Texas Tech pitching staff has combined for 19 saves already this year which is tied for the single-season school record that was set in 2010.
- Texas Tech's .294 team batting average is currently on pace to be its highest since the Red Raiders hit .307 overall in 2010.
- Texas Tech hit .300 as a team during Big 12 play. That average ranked as the sixth highest in program history.
- Texas Tech finished a perfect 8-0 in Big 12 series openers this year after outscoring opponents, 57-17, in those games.
- Texas Tech boasted a 4.07 ERA in Big 12 play which ended the year ranked as the second-lowest in program history.
- Texas Tech combined to go 16-2 during Big 12 play this season when scoring at least five runs.
- Texas Tech is a combined 27-8 this season when the Red Raiders hit at least one home run.
- Texas Tech is a 42-1 this season when either leading or tied following the eighth inning.
- Texas Tech has scored at least five runs in 37 of its last 48 games entering Sunday's opener against TCU.
- Through 32 dates at Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park this season, Texas Tech ranks among the national leaders in attendance. The Red Raiders ended the year ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (127,743) and then 15th in average attendance (3,991).

#BIG12STRONG

- The Big 12 sends multiple teams to Omaha for the sixth time in conference history and three teams to the College World Series for just the third time, including the second time in the past three seasons (2014).
- The Big 12 is the only conference with multiple teams in this year's field of eight as the league looks to end a 10-year drought without a national championship (2005 - Texas).
- This is the 14th time one conference has sent three or more teams to the CWS in the same year. Of those occasions, the Big 12 is the only conference to have advanced 100 percent of its bids.
- The Big 12 is the only conference to send three or more teams to Omaha in two of the past four years.
- The Big 12 is 15-3 in the NCAA postseason (.833). The .750 Super Regional win percentage is tied for the best in league history (in years with multiple Super Regional teams). The .900 (9-1) win percentage in regional play marked the best in conference history.
- Big 12 teams outscored their opponents 101-21 in their 15 postseason wins, including 67-15 in 10 regional games and 34-6 in Super Regional contests. Individually in the postseason victories, OSU went 35-6, TCU 31-7 and TTU 35-8.
- The Big 12 knocked off the tournament champions from the ACC (Clemson) and SEC (Texas A&M), which also marked the elimination of two national seeds (Texas A&M - No. 4 and Clemson - No. 7).
- The Big 12 is the only conference with a different regular season and postseason champion both advancing to Omaha (Texas Tech and TCU). It was only one of two conferences to advance two champions to Super Regional action.
- The Big 12 becomes the second conference to win two Super Regionals on the road in the same year (ACC - 2006).
- TCU and Texas Tech are two of five teams in the Big 12's history to make multiple appearances in the CWS as a member of the league, with Texas the only other current member who can make that claim.
- The Big 12 has advanced seven of seven of its 11 postseason teams to Omaha over the last three seasons - 64 percent.

TEXAS TECH IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Texas Tech ranks among the top-10 teams in the country in all six national polls this week - Collegiate Baseball (No. 4), Baseball America (No. 8), National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (No. 8), D1Baseball (No. 9), Perfect Game (No. 9) and USA Today Coaches' poll (No. 11).
- Texas Tech's No. 4 ranking in the Collegiate Baseball poll is its highest since the 1997 season (No. 1).
- This is the 10th time this season where the Red Raiders have appeared in all six major collegiate baseball polls.
- The Red Raiders began the year ranked 25th by Perfect Game and 39th by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Tech was also receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches' and National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association polls.
- This is the second-straight year where the Red Raiders have started their season ranked in a preseason poll. It is the first time Texas Tech has appeared in the preseason rankings in consecutive seasons since prior to the 1999-2000 campaigns.

TEXAS TECH, TIM TADLOCK AGREE TO CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2022 SEASON

Texas Tech University and head baseball coach Tim Tadlock have agreed to a contract extension that will keep the fourth-year skipper in Lubbock through the 2022 season. The extension was approved May 19 by the Texas Tech Board of Regents. In his four seasons leading his alma mater, Tadlock has built Tech into a national contender as the Red Raiders are currently ranked as high as fifth in the country after clinching the outright Big 12 regular-season title this past weekend. The conference title marked Tech's first since 1998 as the Red Raiders are 44-25 in Big 12 play over the last three seasons (.638 winning percentage). In addition, Tech has won 148 games during Tadlock's tenure, the most through four seasons for a Tech head coach in program history.

TADLOCK MOVES INTO THIRD PLACE FOR CAREER WINS AT TEXAS TECH

Texas Tech head coach Tim Tadlock moved into sole possession of third place on the school's career wins chart on March 24 with a 5-0 victory over Oklahoma. The victory marked the 116th of Tadlock's career, moving the fourth-year skipper past Dan Spencer (2009-12) for third place all-time in program history. Tadlock led the Red Raiders to 26 victories his first season in 2013 (second-most by a Tech head coach in debut season). He followed with 45 wins - the fourth-most in school history - and Tech's first ever trip to the College World Series in 2014 before finishing with 31 victories a year ago. Tech is coming off consecutive 30-win seasons for just the first time since the 2005 and 2006 seasons.

TURN TWO - RED RAIDERS ONCE AGAIN AMONG NATION'S ELITE IN DOUBLE PLAYS

Texas Tech has regularly ranked among the top teams in the country in doubles plays turned under head coach Tim Tadlock. The Red Raiders ranked seventh nationally in Tadlock's first season in 2013. Tech followed by finishing sixth in 2014 and then 14th in 2015. The Red Raiders are on pace to continue that trend this season as Tech ranks second nationally with a school record 78 double plays turned this season, seven of which that came in the East Carolina series alone.

DAVIS MARTIN NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR NATIONAL PITCHER OF THE YEAR

Texas Tech freshman right-handed pitcher Davis Martin was named one of 18 semifinalists for the National Pitcher of the Year award on June 1 in an announcement by the National College Baseball Hall of Fame. Martin, a native of San Angelo, Texas, is one of just two freshmen nationally to be named a semifinalist as he is joined by TCU left-hander Dalton Horton. The duo makes up the only two pitchers from the Big 12 Conference who advanced to the semifinal round. Martin has been among the most dominant freshmen in the country this season as he heads into this weekend's NCAA College World Series with a 9-1 record to go along with 2.73 ERA.

GUTIERREZ, TADLOCK HIGHLIGHT TEXAS TECH'S ALL-BIG 12 HONORS

Texas Tech senior first baseman Eric Gutierrez led a school-record eight Red Raiders honored on the All-Big 12 teams as he was named the Big 12 Player of the Year while Tim Tadlock was tabbed the league's Coach of the Year. Gutierrez is the first Red Raider to be named the Big 12 Player of the Year since Joe Dillon in 1997 while Tadlock is the first Tech skipper to garner Coach of the Year honors since Larry Hays that same year. Gutierrez was joined on the All-Big 12 first team by freshman right-handed pitcher Davis Martin, sophomore outfielder Tanner Gardner and junior outfielder Stephen Smith. The four selections matched the most to the first team in school history as the Red Raiders previously had four first-team honorees in 1997.

Gardner and Martin were both unanimous selections to the first team, marking their first career honor. Smith was recognized for the second time in his respective career. Martin was also a unanimous pick to the All-Freshman team where he was joined by fellow pitcher Steven Gingery. In addition to earning All-Freshman honors, Gingery was also a member of the second team where he was joined by junior left-handed pitcher Hayden Howard, senior outfielder Tyler Neslony and senior designated hitter Cory Raley.

Tech led all Big 12 programs with eight selections to either the first or second team. It marked the most selections in school history, breaking the previous mark of six that was set most recently in 2001. Junior right-handed reliever Robert Dugger and sophomore second baseman Michael Davis rounded out Tech's list of award winners as they were both named All-Big 12 honorable mention.

GUTIERREZ SNAPS BIG 12 CAREER RECORD WITH FIFTH PLAYER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADE

Texas Tech senior first baseman Eric Gutierrez was named the Big 12 Co-Player of the Week on May 23 after helping lead the Red Raiders to a series win over West Virginia. It marked the fifth time in Gutierrez' career where he has earned a Big 12 weekly award which snapped the previous conference record of four that was set by Ken Harvey during the 1999 season. Gutierrez was previously honored as the Big 12 Player of the Week on April 4 earlier this year.

Tyler Neslony has connected on five extra-base hits (four doubles, one home run) during the postseason. He enters the College World Series as the Big 12 leader with 21 doubles so far this season.



TEXAS TECH RANKS THIRD IN BIG 12 WINS SINCE 2014

TEXAS TECH TURNS TO FRESHMEN ON THE MOUND THROUGHOUT 2016 SEASON

- The Texas Tech rotation has featured a freshman starting pitcher in 39 of the past 51 games.
- Texas Tech has started a freshman on the mound in 46 of its 64 games this season. Davis Martin and Steven Gingery lead the group with 13 starts each already this season.
- Five different Red Raider freshmen have started on the mound this season - Steven Gingery, Ty Harpenau, Erikson Lanning, Davis Martin and Ryan Shetter. Shetter joined the group March 17 with 5.2 shutout innings against San Diego State.
- Texas Tech had not previously started three true freshmen within the first five games of a season dating back to the start of the 2001 campaign.
- Texas Tech has used six different freshmen pitchers already this season in Lanning, Harpenau, Gingery, Martin, Shetter and Jonathan Nicholson.
- Over the first two games of the Baylor series, Martin and Gingery combined to allow just four hits, two each, over 11.0 shutout innings. The duo also combined on 10 strikeouts.
- Martin was called on five times out of the bullpen before joining the weekend rotation prior to the California series. He is the first Red Raider dating back to 1998 to record a win and two saves through the first six games of a season.
- Gingery recorded his most impressive performance so far this season on March 2 as the left-hander struck out 12 hitters in a 14-2 rout of New Mexico State. His 12 strikeouts marked the most by a Tech freshman pitcher since Miles Morgan fanned 15 on March 18, 2006, against Texas. The performance earned Gingery his first career win.
- Harpenau earned his first career win on April 10 in the series finale at No. 16 Oklahoma State. He returned to the weekend rotation against West Virginia after entering out of the bullpen over his last four appearances.
- Lanning began his Red Raider career by tossing six shutout innings against Milwaukee where he allowed just one hit while striking out four in a 12-0 rout. The performance marked the first time a Red Raider freshman had earned the win and combined on a shutout in his career debut since Matt Withrow helped Texas Tech trounce Northern Illinois, 13-0, on Feb. 17, 2013.
- Shetter has already appeared 18 times out of the bullpen, compiling a 4-2 record with a 4.02 ERA. He has also made one start which came April 17 in the series finale against San Diego State.

MICHAEL DAVIS NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK, NATIONAL HITTER OF THE WEEK

Texas Tech sophomore infielder Michael Davis was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and NCBWA National Hitter of the Week on March 11 after leading all conference players with 11 RBI, including seven in the Red Raiders' 15-5 victory over No. 16 Oklahoma State on March 9. Davis capped a successful week at the plate with seven RBI in the Sunday victory which marked the most for a Red Raider since Chris Richburg also had seven on May 1, 2007, at Dallas Baptist. It was the most RBI for a Red Raider in a Big 12 contest since Gera Alvarez drove in seven runs against Baylor on May 19, 2002. The Lubbock native began the series with the game-winning RBI in Friday's 5-1 victory. His RBI single was the second of two hits in the win for Davis, who wrapped the Oklahoma State series with a .500 average (6-for-12) to go along with a team-leading nine RBI. In addition, Davis also knocked in a pair of runs in Tech's 8-4 victory at No. 5 Florida State on March 6 as he finished 2-for-5 overall. He recorded the game-winning RBI in three of Tech's four victories during the week.

MARTIN BECOMES FIRST RED RAIDER FRESHMAN TO START A BIG 12 OPENER SINCE RAMOS

Davis Martin became the first Red Raider freshman to start a Big 12 opener since current Miami Marlins closer AJ Ramos earned the nod against Texas in 2006. Ramos tossed five strong innings against Texas, allowing three runs off five hits and three strikeouts in a no-decision. The Longhorns broke a 3-3 tie with a run in the ninth to secure a 4-3 victory. Martin put together quite the performance of his own as he tossed six shutout innings in a 5-0 victory over Baylor. He is the first Red Raider freshman in school history to earn the win in a Big 12 opener. The shutout was the first for the Red Raiders against Baylor in the Big 12 era. Martin, who is now 2-0 this season, was making just the second start of his career.

STEPHEN SMITH NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stephen Smith was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Feb. 22 after the junior led the Red Raiders to a series win against Milwaukee. This is the first weekly award for Smith, who hit .571 overall (8-for-14) with seven runs scored, four doubles, five RBI, two stolen bases, a .857 slugging percentage and a .684 on-base percentage. He ended the weekend with at least a share of the Big 12 lead in five categories: hits, runs scored, doubles, total bases and on-base percentage. Smith, who had at least one hit in all four games in the series, is the first Red Raider outfielder to receive Big 12 Player of the Week accolades since Adam Kirsch earned the honor on May 19, 2014.

TEXAS TECH RETURNS BULK OF 2015 LINEUP

- Texas Tech head coach Tim Tadlock boasts one of the most experienced lineups of his tenure this season as the Red Raiders return 12 position players from a year ago, including seven starters. It marks the second time in the past three seasons Tech has returned at least seven position starters as the Red Raiders previously brought back eight starters prior to the 2014 campaign.
- In Texas Tech's group of seven returning position starters, five are seniors with a combined 539 games played over their career. Eric Gutierrez, Tyler Neslony and Zach Davis all feature three years of experience in a Red Raider uniform while Tyler Floyd and Cory Raley both transferred to Tech following successful junior-college careers.
- Texas Tech is tied with Oklahoma State and Baylor for the most position starters returning heading into this season.
- Texas Tech's group of returners accounted for 219 of the 269 RBI in 2015 (81 percent) as well as 33 of 41 home runs on the year (80 percent).
- The Red Raiders return their top four hitters (minimum of 50 at-bats) by average from the 2015 season in Cory Raley (.350), Eric Gutierrez (.315), Stephen Smith (.291) and Tyler Neslony (.286). That group combined for 23 home runs and 134 RBI during the 2015 season alone.

HOTTEST TICKET IN TOWN ... AGAIN

After selling out season tickets for the first time in program history prior to 2015 season, Texas Tech fans once again scooped up season tickets in record numbers as Tech sold more than 2,400 season tickets prior to Opening Day. Tech sold out of season tickets just a few weeks later, marking the second-straight year where Red Raider fans have purchased over 2,500 season tickets. Tech has ranked among the top 31 schools in the nation over the past 18 years in average attendance per game. Tech closed the 2015 season averaging 3,665 fans per game, a figure that ranked 13th nationally and the third highest in program history.

MOSELEY BECOMES SIXTH RED RAIDER FROM LUBBOCK TO START ON OPENING DAY SINCE 1987

Texas Tech junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Moseley - a 2013 graduate of Lubbock Cooper High School - is just the second Red Raider pitcher from Lubbock to earn the Opening Day start in back-to-back seasons since 1987. He joins former Red Raider and current Colorado Rockies right-hander Chad Bettis (2009-10) as the only Lubbock natives with multiple Opening Day starts.

NEW TURF, VIDEO BOARD HIGHLIGHT IMPROVEMENTS TO RIP GRIFFIN PARK

Red Raider fans will see a pair of new additions as they enter Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park this season as Texas Tech installed a new FieldTurf surface in December and then upgraded its video board to the version that previously occupied Jones AT&T Stadium. The nearly \$1 million project will provide Tech with one of the largest video boards in college baseball as well as a state-of-the-art playing surface. The screen size on the video board will more than double from 15-by-20 feet on the previous model to 48-by-22 feet. Both projects were funded privately through philanthropic contributions and gifts to The Campaign for Fearless Champions.

FLOYD EARNS HIS TEXAS TECH DEGREE PRIOR TO SENIOR SEASON

Tyler Floyd entered his senior season with a degree already in hand as the senior graduated this December with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in the Texas Tech exercise sports science program. Floyd, who started in 46 games at catcher in 2015, was recognized as the highest-ranking graduate in the ESS program as part of the commencement ceremonies. 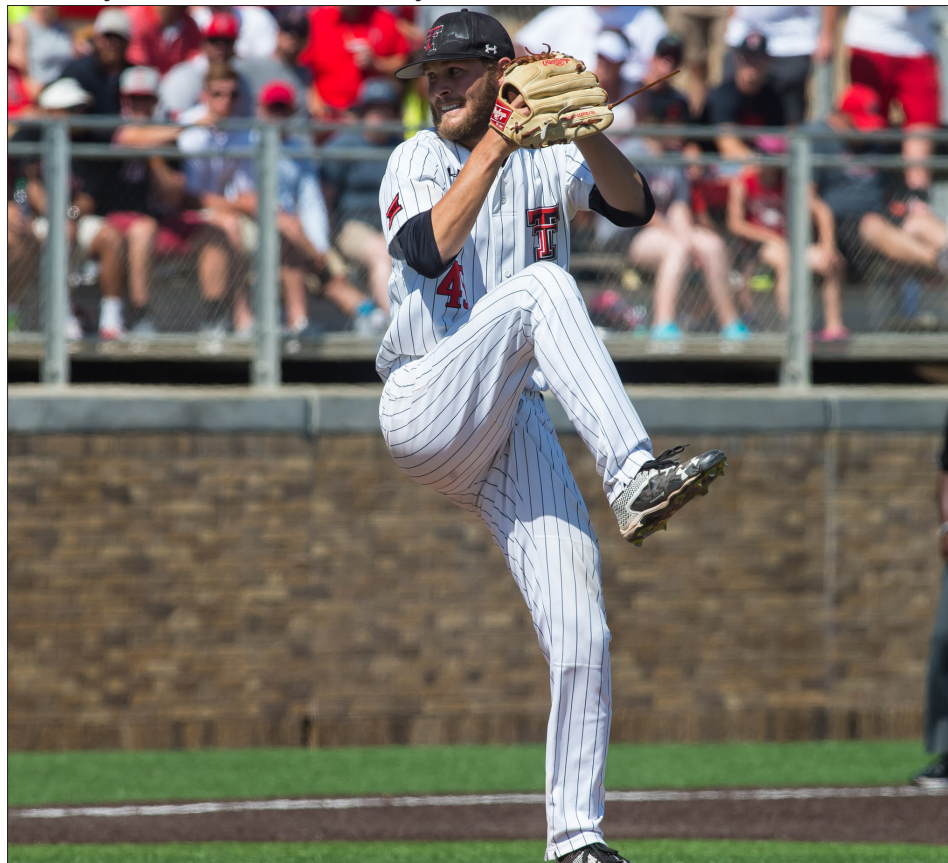

SCHOOL RECORD TEN RED RAIDERS SELECTED IN MLB DRAFT

Texas Tech's success during the 2016 season was evident last weekend as a school record 10 players were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft that concluded this past Saturday.

After three players — Ryan Moseley, Hayden Howard and Stephen Smith — were taken Friday, seven other Red Raiders had their name called Saturday during Texas Tech's 3-1 victory over East Carolina to even the NCAA Lubbock Super Regional. Tech went on to win the Super Regional with an 11-0 rout on Sunday.

The 10 selections break the Tech single-season record from 2012 when nine Red Raiders were drafted by MLB organizations. Tech finished tied for the Big 12 lead and fourth nationally with 10 MLB draftees.

Ryan Moseley — Baltimore Orioles

Moseley, an eighth round pick by Baltimore (No. 241 overall), is the first Red Raider to be selected by the Orioles since Zach Fowler was drafted in the 34th round in 2011. A Lubbock native, Moseley is currently 6-4 this season with a 5.40 earned-run average entering his second trip this weekend at the College World Series in Omaha.

Moseley leads all active Red Raiders with 11 wins over his career as he has gone back and forth between the bullpen and the weekend rotation. His selection marks the second time in his career where he's heard his name called during the MLB Draft as the Tampa Bay Rays previously picked the right-hander in the 36th round in 2013.

Tyler Neslony — Atlanta Braves

Neslony, meanwhile, was drafted for the first time in his career as he is third Red Raider in the past two seasons to be selected by the Braves, who chose the outfielder in the ninth round at No. 259 overall. Atlanta previously used picks a year ago to take Matt Withrow in the sixth round and then Matt Cusured in the 31st round.

Neslony, who homered for the 10th time this year a few hours after being selected, shares the Big 12 lead with 58 RBI this season as he is hitting .314 overall with 21 doubles entering the College World Series opener against TCU. An All-Big 12 second team honoree, Neslony's 10 home runs match his combined total from his three previous seasons as a Red Raider.

Stephen Smith — Arizona Diamondbacks

Smith joins 2015 draftee Cameron Smith as the only Red Raiders in program history to be selected by the Diamondbacks as he was taken in the 10th round at No. 299 overall. A Lubbock native like Moseley, Stephen Smith was drafted for the first time in his career after hitting .318 this season with 10 home runs and 39 RBI.

An All-Big 12 first team honoree this year, Smith has connected on 10 home runs in each of his past two seasons as he is hitting .301 over his career with 40 doubles, eight triples, 21

homers and 91 RBI. He is also among the most patient hitters in program history as he has drawn 123 career walks, fifth-most in program history.

Hayden Howard — Washington Nationals

Howard was the first Red Raider to be selected Saturday as the Washington Nationals picked the left-hander with the 364th overall pick in the 12th round. He is the first Red Raider to be drafted by the Nationals since Jeremy Mayo was chosen in the 31st round of the 2010 draft.

Howard has been instrumental for the Red Raiders out of the bullpen this season as he enters the College World Series with a 9-3 record and 2.95 ERA. He currently shares the Big 12 lead in wins this season while his eight saves are tied for third overall. Howard, the second Red Raider pitcher to be selected in the draft, has made 33 appearances this season, the most in Tech single-season history.

This is the second time Howard has heard his name called during the MLB Draft as the Oakland A's previously selected the southpaw during the 39th round in 2013.

Ty Damron — Oakland A's

Damron was drafted for the second time in his career when the Oakland A's selected the left-hander with the 442nd overall pick in the 15th round. Damron, who was taken out of high school in the 13th round of the 2013 draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers, is the second Red Raider to be selected by the A's in as many years as Tim Proudfoot was picked by the organization in the 35th round a year ago.

The junior is 4-2 this season with a 6.52 ERA entering Tech's second appearance at the College World Series during Damron's tenure. Damron has recorded 10 wins over his career, one shy of the team high. He is 10-4 overall his Red Raider career with a 4.99 ERA.

Robert Dugger — Seattle Mariners

Dugger became the fourth Red Raider pitcher to have his name called this weekend when the Mariners selected him with the 537th overall pick in the 18th round. It marked the first time in Dugger's career where he has been selected in the MLB Draft. He is the first Red Raider to be drafted by the Mariners since Jamodrick McGruder was selected in the ninth round of the 2012 draft.

Dugger's selection came just an hour or so before he tossed five shutout innings out of the Red Raider bullpen in a 3-1 victory over East Carolina. The win was Dugger's sixth this season as he is a perfect 6-0 overall with a 2.34 ERA. He also has three saves this season over his 28 appearances, all of which that have come in relief.

Eric Gutierrez — Miami Marlins

Gutierrez joined Dugger as a first-time draftee as the Miami Marlins selected the senior at No. 593 overall in the 20th round.

He is the first Red Raider to be drafted by the Marlins since Chris Sadberry was taken in the sixth round of the 2014 draft.

Gutierrez, the Big 12 Player of the Year and a first-team All-America honoree, connected on the game-winning hit in the 13th inning of Tech's 3-1 victory over East Carolina in the NCAA Lubbock Super Regional. The senior boasts the longest consecutive games started streak in the country as he's been in the lineup for all 241 games of his career.

Gutierrez has helped lead Tech to Omaha twice in his career as he hitting .300 over his four seasons with 35 home runs, 59 doubles and 191 RBI. He is among the Tech career leaders in practically every offensive category in the school record. Gutierrez has compiled a .326 average this season to go along with 12 home runs and 17 doubles. His 58 RBI are tied with Tyler Neslony for the Big 12 high entering the College World Series.

Chandler Eden — Los Angeles Dodgers

Eden was drafted for the third time in his career as the Dodgers selected the right-hander in the 25th round (No. 761 overall). A native of Yuba City, California, Eden was previously selected in the 36th round of the 2013 MLB Draft by the Miami Marlins and then the 17th round of the 2015 draft by the Toronto Blue Jays.

The junior has made 12 appearances for the Red Raiders out of the bullpen where he has compiled an 8.00 ERA while striking out 10 hitters in his nine complete innings this season.

Dalton Brown — Milwaukee Brewers

Brown continued Tech's success of pitchers being drafted when the Brewers selected the right-hander in the 30th round (No. 891 overall). It was the first time in Brown's career where he has been selected by a major league organization.

Brown has been a mainstay for the Red Raiders out of the bullpen the past four seasons as he has made 55 appearances during that time. Brown is 3-2 over his career with a 4.93 ERA. He has appearances 14 times in relief this season where he is 0-1 overall with a 4.11 ERA.

Zach Davis — Chicago Cubs

Davis was a steal in the 32nd round for the Cubs, who selected the speedy senior with the 974th pick. Easily one of the fastest players in the country, Davis has made an impact in every way possible for the Red Raiders over his four seasons, most noticeably on the base paths.

Davis is hitting .275 over his career as he has totaled 10 doubles and driven in 29 runs. He has appeared in 163 games during his career, including 43 this season where he has compiled a .250 average and a career-best 13 stolen bases entering his second appearance at the College World Series in Omaha. Davis is a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen bases this season and is 30-for-33 over his career.

Tim Tadlock, the 2014 College Baseball Hall of Fame National Coach of the Year, enters his fourth season as the head coach at Texas Tech after taking the Red Raiders to the College World Series in just his second season while winning over 100 games in his tenure.

Tadlock was named head coach of his alma mater on June 8, 2012, becoming the ninth head coach in program history. Tadlock will enter his 24th year in collegiate baseball in 2016. He owns a collegiate career record of 583-220 in 12 years as a head coach with nine seasons at Grayson County College (435-127) and three at Texas Tech (148-93).

Tadlock and the Red Raiders completed the biggest turnaround in school history and the second biggest turnaround in Big 12 history, going from 26 wins in 2013 to 45 wins in 2014. The season culminated with Texas Tech's first trip to the College World Series in Omaha.

Tadlock was named the ABCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year as well as the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year while guiding the Red Raiders to their best season in school history with a 45-21 overall mark and 14-10 Big 12 record.

Tech finished 31-24 overall in Tadlock's third season in 2015, marking the first time since 2005-06 where the Red Raiders have posted consecutive 30-win seasons. The Red Raiders completed Big 12 play at 13-11 overall, securing a tie for third place in the conference standings, Tech's highest finish since the 2004 season. It was also the second-straight season where Tech has finished among the top four in the Big 12 standings, a first for the Red Raiders since the 2001 and 2002 seasons.

Tadlock returned to his alma mater for the 2012 season as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator following six successful seasons as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Oklahoma. Tadlock produced several of the nation's top recruiting classes while at Oklahoma, helping lead the Sooners back to the College World Series in 2010, the Sooners first trip to Omaha since 1995.

After beginning his college coaching career as an assistant at Hill College (1993-96) for four seasons, Tadlock became the head coach at Grayson County Junior College, where he led the Vikings to back-to-back National Junior College Athletic Association World Series titles in 1999 and 2000. During his nine seasons at Grayson, Tadlock posted a 435-127 (.774) overall record while being named National Coach of the Year following both title runs (1999-2000).

After a prep career at Denton High School and two years at Hill College, Tadlock was a two-year starting shortstop for the Red Raiders where he helped lead Texas Tech to its first-ever 40-win season as a senior in 1991 (42-18). Tadlock graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas Tech in May 1992. He also earned a master's degree in education in August 1994 from the University of Texas at Tyler.

Tadlock and his wife, Kelly, have two children, daughter, Chloe (14), and son, Benjamin (12).

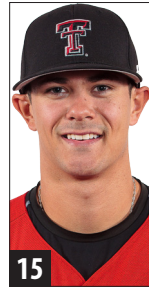
