

TCU 6, Coastal Carolina 1 - Attendance 22,704 (MCWS Total: 164,499; Avg. 20,562) - Time of Game: 3:08

TCU advances to the winner's bracket game on Friday at 7 p.m. (ET)
Coastal Carolina will play (5) Texas Tech in an elimination game Thursday at 7 p.m. (CT)

### TCU (49-16):

- TCU is playing in its fourth CWS (others: 2010, 2014, 2015) ... The Frogs are 8-6 all-time in CWS action (5-4/ TDAPO and 3-2/Rosenblatt) ...
- The Frogs have appeared in 14 NCAA Tournaments posting a 45-32 all-time record ...
- TCU finally broke through and won a Game 2 ... Previously was 0-3 with losses to UCLA/2010, Virginia/2014 and Vanderbilt/2015 ...
- The Frogs have recorded two wins against Florida State, LSU and Texas Tech, while picking up one win vs.
   UCLA and Coastal Carolina ... Their losses came twice to UCLA and Vanderbilt along with one each to Virginia
   and Ole Miss
- TCU is 4-0 in its opening CWS games following a 5-3 come from behind win against TTU in Game 3 ...
- TCU has homered in 41 games this season with Luken Baker's solo blast in the second frame ...
- The Frogs are 7-1 in NCAA Tournament games this year and are outscoring its opponents 43-18 ...
- Since May 1st. TCU is 16-4 which ranks second only to Coastal Carolina, who is 19-3 (best in Division I) ...
- TCU is 11-0 in games which Luken Baker has homered ... Five of his 11 home runs this season have given TCU
  a lead or broken a tie ...
- TCU is 9-1 at neutral sites this season ...
- Jim Schlossnagle owns a 565-252 record at TCU ... He has guided TCU to 12 NCAA Tournament's sporting a 35-24 overall record and 8-6 in CWS ...
- All six of TCU's home runs in this postseason have come from Luken Baker (3) and Cam Warner (3) ...
- Luken Baker belted his 11th home run of the season and second of the 2016 CWS with his solo shot in the second inning ... Extended current hit streak to 13 games (season long) and on-base streak to 37 games (also season long) ... Baker homered in consecutive at-bats (last vs. TTU and first vs. Coastal Carolina) the first time by a player in the CWS since Texas' Russell Moldenhauer on June 22, 2009 (vs. Arizona State) ... He is only the fifth player to hit two home runs in a CWS since move to TD Ameritrade Park (nobody has more): Peter Alonso (FLA, 2015), Harrison Bader (FLA, 2015), Robert Refsnyder (ARIZ, 2012), Connor Harrell (VAN, 2011) ... Baker has reached base safely in his last five plate appearances (two homers, two singles, walk) and has recorded four-straight hits in the CWS ...
- Cam Warner hit his first CWS homer in Game 3 ... He has three home runs in seven postseason games ...
- Austen Wade's 56 walks lead the Big 12 and are the second-most in a single-season at TCU ... Needs one more
  walk to tie the school record (Matt Curry 57 in 2010) two to break ... Drew bases loaded walk in the fifth inning
  scoring Josh Watson ... Has seven hits in NCAA Tournament action this season ...
- Evan Skoug has thrown out two runners on the base paths (three in NCAA Tournament this year) ...
- Brian Howard (10-2) worked 5.2 innings allowing one run (earned) on six hits with three walks and seven strikeouts ... In three NCAA Tournament starts, he has given up three runs (two earned) with five walks and 24 strikeouts in 20.2 innings while posting a 3-0 record ...
- Ryan Burnett notched his first career save tossing 3.1 perfect frames of relief with two strikeouts ... In four outings this postseason, he is 2-0 with a save and has not allowed a run in 6.0 innings ... He has not allowed a run in his last 11 appearances, which spans 13.1 innings ...
- Josh Watson's single in the fifth inning extended his on-base streak to a career-high 11 games ...
- Cam Warner's RBI fielder's choice in the fifth gave TCU a 3-0 lead ... It was his second RBI of the CWS and ninth of the NCAA Tournament ...
- Michael Landestoy's RBI triple in the ninth extended TCU's lead to 5-1 ... It was his second hit of the CWS and fifth of the NCAA Tournament ...
- TCU's 49 wins are tied for third-most in program history, trailing only the 2010 (54) and 2015 (51) teams that also
  played in the CWS ...
- TCU improves to 42-3 when outhitting its opponent this season ... They are now 30-3 when scoring five or more runs this season, and 47-10 when holding foes to three runs or less ...



### Coastal Carolina (50-17):

- This is Coastal Carolina's fifth season in school history with 50 or more wins, and first since 2010 won a record 55 contests ...
- Coastal Carolina is now 6-1 on neutral fields this year ...
- Four Chanticleers (Connor Owings, Zach Remillard, Michael Paez and G.K. Young) set the CCU single-season record for games played by appearing in their 67th contest this season ...
- Coastal Carolina is the second team in Super Regional era (since 1999) to make CWS & lead NCAA in homers in same year, joining Florida in 2012 ...
- G.K. Young extended his hit streak to a season-best nine with a double in the fourth ... He also has reached base in 14 straight games.
- G.K. Young's two hits tonight give him 30 multi-hit games this season, while Michael Paez had his 22<sup>nd</sup> multi-hit game of the year.
- Bobby Holmes has inherited 31 runners this season, including three tonight in the fifth ... The inherited runner to score tonight was just Holmes second of the season.
- Coastal Carolina turned two double plays tonight, giving the Chanticleers 15 twin killings in eight NCAA
  Tournament games ...
- The Chanticleers are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position in the CWS ...
- Coastal Carolina's 50 wins are tied for second-most in the nation with Louisville and Miami (Fla.). Florida's 52 wins lead the nation ...



### 2016 College World Series Notes

#### **Runs Notes:**

- Miami allowed four of the CWS' five runs in the first inning this year (3 vs. Arizona, 1 vs. USCB) ...
- TCU (twice), Arizona (once) and UC Santa Barbara (once) are the only two teams to score at least five runs in a
  game this CWS ...
- Through 8 games there have been 39 runs scored the fewest in CWS history (second fewest is 41 in 1973) ...
- Of the last 48 teams to score five or more runs at the CWS, 46 of them have won (Virginia lost 10-5 to Florida/2015, Virginia lost 9-8 to Vanderbilt/ 2014) since 2010 at Rosenblatt ... Since the CWS moved to TD Ameritrade Park, teams that score at least 5 runs are 41-2 (.953) ...
- In this year's CWS, 29 of the 39 runs scored (74.4%) have been driven in via a hit ...
- In other words, 10 of the 39 runs (25.6%) have scored as a result of something other than a hit ...
- Actual scoring breakdown: hits (29), error (3), groundout/fielder's choice (2), sac bunt (2), walk (2), sac fly (1) ...
- Inning breakdown of runs scored: first (5), second (1), third (3), fourth (6), fifth (7), sixth (6), seventh (0), eighth (3) and ninth (8) ...

#### Hit Notes:

- Coastal Carolina's first five hits of the game (vs. Florida/Game 4) went for extra bases (3 doubles, 2 triples) marking the first time at the CWS in TDAPO that a team's first five base knocks were for extra bases ...
- Hits breakdown: singles (80), doubles (22), triples (3) and home runs (6) ...

#### **Home Run Notes:**

- Through eight games of the CWS, there have been six home runs with TCU's Luken Baker smacking two
  (Games 3 and 8) ... Other home runs: Cam Warner (TCU/G3), Zack Collins (Miami/G5), Eric Gutierrez (TTU/G7)
  and Peter Alonso (Florida/G7) ...
- Luken Baker's (TCU) three-run homer in the top of the ninth is just the second homer in the 9th inning (or later) in the CWS at TDAPO (other was Jeren Kendall from Vanderbilt in 2015 walk-off) ...
- The total number of home runs at TDAPO is 46 (83 CWS game in park history) ... CWS home run chart at TDAPO including Sunday: LF/20, LCF/5, CF/3, RCF/2 and RF/16) ... In all games played at TDAPO, there have been 118 home runs ...
- Luken Baker homered in consecutive at-bats (last vs. TTU/G3 and first vs. Coastal/G8) ... It's the first time someone has belted homers in consecutive plate appearances since Texas' Russell Moldenhauer on June 22, 2009 (vs. Arizona State) ...

### **Pitching Notes**

- Game 1 between Oklahoma State and UC Santa Barbara was the first CWS game with both starting pitchers throwing a complete game since June 19, 2013 ... Oregon State's Matt Boyd and Indiana's Aaron Siegers did it ...
- Andrew Beckwith (Coastal Carolina/Game 4) is the third pitcher in this year's CWS to toss a complete game (others: Thomas Hatch/Oklahoma State and Shane Bieber/UC Santa Barbara – both in Game 1) ... There was only one complete thrown in the 2014 CWS and 2015 CWS ...
- Arizona is the first staff since 2010 to have two pitchers with at least 10 strikeouts in a game (Nathan Bannister/11 and Bobby Dalbec/12) ... The last team was UCLA in 2010 (Trevor Bauer twice, Gerrit Cole) ...

## **Taking The Lead Notes:**

- Teams leading after eight innings have won 88 of the last 90 CWS games (Vanderbilt overcame a 3-1 deficit to defeat Cal State Fullerton 4-3 in Game 4 of 2015; TCU scored three runs in top of ninth to beat Texas Tech in Game 3 of 2016) ...
- Teams leading after eight innings at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha are 224-8 all-time at TDAPO in 232 games ...



### **Shutout Notes:**

- With Thomas Hatch's (Oklahoma State) complete game shutout in Game 1 vs. UC Santa Barbara, it was the 82nd CG SHO in CWS History and first since Matt Boyd (Oregon State) on 2013 vs. Indiana on 6/19/13 which is a 1-0 contest ...
- Only four teams have opened the CWS with back-to-back shutouts; 2 went on to win the title (1992 Pepperdine and 1955 Wake Forest did, 1970 Florida St didn't) Oklahoma State has two in 2016 CWS ... Last team to throw consecutive shutouts was Texas in 2014 (against UC Irvine/1-0 and Vanderbilt/4-0) the Longhorns finished tied for third in the CWS that year ...
- Oklahoma State is the first school in CWS history to throw consecutive 1-0 shutouts (vs. UC Santa Barbara/Game 1, vs. Arizona/Game 6) ... They are the fourth team to open a CWS with back-to-back shutouts – 2 of previous 3 went on to win the national championship ...
- With OSU's 1-0 win over UC Santa Barbara, it is the fourth-straight year with a 1-0 game in the CWS ... There were no 1-0 games in Omaha from 1986-2012 (27 years) ... Last 1-0 game to open a CWS was in 1985 (Arkansas 1, South Carolina 0) ... There have been three 1-0 games to open a CWS (Wake Forest 1, Colgate 0/1955; Minnesota 1, Oklahoma 0/1973; Arkansas 1, South Carolina 0/1985) ... This is the 22nd 1-0 decision in CWS history ...

#### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- First official review in CWS history (started in 2012) came in top of the third inning of Game 4 in the 2016 CWS between Coastal Carolina and Florida ... The call was four minutes and six seconds (4:06) and was overturned on the field in favor of Coastal Carolina ... Original call was a foul ball down the right field line overturned for an RBI double ...
- National Seeds are 1-5 in the 2016 CWS (No. 1 Florida/0-2/eliminated; No. 3 Miami/0-2/eliminated; No. 5 Texas Tech/1-1) ... It's the 17th-straight year that a No. 1 national seed will not win the title only team to do it was Miami in 1999 ... Only two of the last 12 national champions have been national seeds (LSU/2009 and South Carolina/2011) ...
- Florida is the fourth program with 10 CWS appearances who have not won a championship (Florida State/21, Clemson/12, Florida/10, North Carolina/10, Northern Colorado/10) ...
- For the first time since 2012, the CWS had more than one team in the field make its first CWS appearance with Coastal Carolina and UC Santa Barbara ... In 2012, it was Kent State (1-2) and Stony Brook (0-2) ...
- Oklahoma State is one of three Big 12 teams in this year's CWS (Texas Tech and TCU) ... Last time a
  conference had multiple bids with each team reaching Omaha was the Big 8 in 1993 (Kansas and Oklahoma
  State) ... Last time a conference has three or more bids with each team making the CWS was the SEC in 1990
  (Georgia, LSU and Mississippi State) ...
- Josh Holliday (Oklahoma State), Jay Johnson (Arizona) and Gary Gillmore (Coastal Carolina) picked their first career wins in the CWS ... The last head coach to win his CWS debut was Elliot Avent (NC State) on June 16, 2013 ...
- June 13, 1955 was the last time that Oklahoma State and Arizona both won CWS games on the same day ...
- Saturday marked the first time two head coaches (Josh Holliday and Jay Johnson) won their CWS debut on the same day since June 19, 2010, when Jim Schlossnagle (TCU) and John Savage (UCLA) both won, also on the Opening Day of the CWS ...
- The Big 12 is 20-4 (.833) in the NCAA Tournament after Tuesday's results ... No conference to earn at least 3 bids has ever posted a winning percentage better than .760 ... They Big 12 is 5-1 in 2016 CWS ... Those 20 victories have come against teams from 13 different leagues ... The Big 12 is the only conference with a different regular-season and postseason champion both in Omaha (Texas Tech and TCU) ...
- With TCU's 6-1 victory over Coastal Carolina, they improve to 2-0 in the 2016 CWS ... The Frogs join Big 12 foe
  Oklahoma State (2-0) in the winner's bracket marking the third time that two schools from the same conference
  started 2-0 in the CWS (others: Arkansas and Texas/1979 Southwest Conference; Florida and South
  Carolina/2011 Southeastern Conference) ...
- Jim Schlossnagle (TCU) and Tim Tadlock (Texas Tech) are the only coaches in Big 12 history to guide their squads to the CWS twice in their first four years coaching in the conference ...
- For the first time since 2005, the Atlantic Coast Conference failed to advance a team past its first two games ...
- Teams to score first are now 6-2 in the 2016 CWS ... Visiting teams are 6-2 so far this year ...
- Game 5 had a 62-minute rain delay ... Last weather delay in CWS was Vanderbilt vs. Cal State Fullerton (June 14 & 15, 2015) ... Delay lasted 1:19 with Cal State leading 3-0 in the bottom of the sixth inning later suspended until next day) ...



- The start time of Game 6 was delayed two hours and 21 minutes due to weather ... Last time we had a starting delay for inclement weather was June 21, 2012 (South Carolina vs. Kent State) ... Rain forced the game to be moved from June 20 to June 21 ...
- The last time the SEC and ACC both went winless at the CWS was in 1984 neither conference had a team in the College World Series that year ...
