No. 3 Oklahoma State 5, No. 2 Baylor

Big 12 Championship Notes

- Oklahoma State improved to 27-37 in the Big 12 Championship and now owns a 5-2 record vs. the Bears.
- With the win, the Cowboys are the highest seeded team that is still undefeated for the first time since 2013.
- Baylor fell to 37-38 all-time in the Big 12 Championship.
- For the first time ever in the Big 12 tournament, the first two teams eliminated represent that bottom two seeds.

No. 2 Oklahoma State

- Colin Simpson hit his 14th HR of the season, setting him apart from Texas Tech's Cameron Warren for the second most homers in the league.
- Starting pitcher Jensen Elliott threw six shutout innings and surrendered just two hits. He struck out four batters and earned his ninth win.
- Andrew Navigato extended his hitting streak to 11 when he singled to left in the 2nd inning. He followed that at-bat with a base hit in the 4th inning bringing his season total to 58.
- Trevor Boone drove in two runs when he singled in the 4th inning. It is Boone's team-high 12th multi-RBI game this season.
- Oklahoma State improved to 12-0 when holding its opponent to fewer than two runs.

No. 3 Baylor

- Starting pitcher Jimmy Winston threw 95 pitches over 5.1 IP. He allowed five runs on six hits and struck out a career-high seven batters en route to just his second loss of the season.
- Big 12 Co-Player of the Year, Davis Wendzel, singled to left field in the 5th inning to break up Jensen Elliott's no-hit bid. The hit marked Wendzel's 61st hit of the season, inching him closer to his career-high of 67.
- Baylor's bullpen faced 12 batters, striking out 8 and not surrendering a run.

STAT OF THE GAME: 2013. This is the first time that Oklahoma State has shut out Baylor since the 2013 campaign.

ATTENDANCE: 4,190

WHATS NEXT: Oklahoma State will face the winner of Game 10 between No. 2 Baylor and No. 6 TCU on Saturday at 12:30 p.m. Baylor will play on Friday at 7 p.m. in an elimination game vs. TCU.
