2019 BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

ESPN in conjunction with the Big Ten Conference and the Atlantic Coast Conference announced the matchups for the 21st annual ACC/Big Ten Challenge Thursday and Northwestern will travel to battle Boston College.

The Wildcats and Eagles will meet at Conte Forum on Tuesday, Dec. 3, 2019. Tip times and television designations will be announced at a later date.

Northwestern and Boston College have met five times with the Wildcats holding a 3-2 series lead. The last meeting was a 85-67 win for NU in the second round of the 2011 National Invitation Tournament. This is the first time NU and BC have met in the Challenge.

The Wildcats moved to 9-11 all-time in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge following a 67-61 win over Georgia Tech in the 2018 conference clash.

ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU will combine to televise all 14 games of the event, matching top college basketball programs playing for conference supremacy and the Commissioner's Cup. All games will also be available to stream via the ESPN app.

WELSH-RYAN ARENA

Welsh-Ryan Arena underwent a complete \$110 million renovation following the completion of the 2016-17 season. It opened on Nov. 2, 2018, when the Wildcats defeated McKendree, 83-44.

Highlights of the project include:

- New seating throughout the arena, with chair-back seats replacing existing wood bleachers
- Wider, more accessible concourses with improved lighting
- Improved accessibility for the mobility-impaired, with five new elevators replacing the existing one
- New and expanded restrooms as well as the addition of accessible family restrooms
- New concession areas with twice as many point-of-sale stations for increased efficiency, along with new food and drink offerings
- State-of-the-art lighting, audio and video capabilities in the arena
- Premium seating areas and expansion of the club area, which provides space for pre- and post-game events
- Expansion of the building lobby
- New locker rooms for men's basketball, women's basketball and volleyball

McGaw Memorial Hall has been the home of the Wildcats since 1952, when it was built in part to accommodate a meeting of the World Council of Churches at the University. One of the best facilities of its size in the nation when it opened, McGaw Hall played host to the 1956 Final Four, which saw San Francisco win an 83-71 decision over Iowa in the championship game—a contest which drew a crowd of 10,653, still the building's basketball attendance record. McGaw Hall was one of just three different arenas to stage the event from 1953-59.

McGaw Hall was officially dedicated on Jan. 18, 1953, although the first game in it was played Dec. 6, 1952, with Northwestern taking on Western Michigan. The fieldhouse was donated to the University by Foster G. McGaw and friends in memory of his father, the Reverend Francis A. McGaw, a Presbyterian minister who died at his mission in Nairobi, Africa, in 1942.

After its early glory days, the structure to which the Wildcats returned

in 1983-84 was not the same one they had left 12 months earlier. A \$6.75 million renovation of the building had dramatically altered its interior, with the biggest improvement being the completion of Welsh-Ryan Arena. NU played its home games at Alumni Hall on DePaul University's campus during the 1982-83 season while the renovations were taking place.

As a part of the \$20 million Campaign for Athletic Excellence, various facilities in McGaw Hall were updated and improved. New wood basketball courts were added to the back of McGaw Hall for extra practice and playing time for the men's basketball, women's basketball and volleyball teams.

The arena is named in recognition of a leadership gift to the \$21 million Athletic Facilities Campaign by the Patrick G. and Shirley Ryan family of Kenilworth, Ill. Ryan, the recently retired chairman of Northwestern's Board of Trustees, is retired president and chief executive officer of AON Corporation. The name-gift pledge to the Campaign was made by the Ryan family in honor of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Patrick G. Ryan Sr. and his wife's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. Welsh Sr.

Prior to their move to McGaw Hall, the Wildcats played their home games at Patten Gymnasium from 1910-40. One of the most important events held in the building during its final year was the championship game of the first NCAA tournament on March 27, 1939, when Oregon defeated Ohio State 46-33. Northwestern split its home games between Chicago Stadium and Evanston High School from 1940-52 before McGaw Hall opened for the 1952-53 season. The facility was constructed at a cost of \$1.3 million.

The men's and women's basketball programs moved into brand-new locker rooms during the 2007-08 season as part of a \$4 million project. The second phase of the efforts was completed in time for the 2008-09 campaign as the coaching staffs moved into their new offices on the second floor of the project.

For the 2014-15 season, high definition quality videoboards were installed at center court as well as behind each of the baskets.



Northwestern University President

MORTON SCHAPIRO

Morton Schapiro began his term as the 16th president of Northwestern University on September 1, 2009. He is a professor of economics in Northwestern's Judd A. and Marjorie Weinberg College of Arts and Sciences and also holds appointments in the J. L. Kellogg School of Management and the School of Education and Social Policy.

President Schapiro is among the nation's leading authorities on the economics of higher education, with particular expertise in the area of college financing and affordability and on trends in educational costs and student aid. He has testified before US Senate and House committees on economic and educational issues and is widely quoted in the national media on those issues.

Previously President Schapiro was president of Williams College from 2000 to 2009. Earlier he had served as a member of the Williams College faculty from 1980 to 1991 as professor of economics and assistant provost. In 1991 he went to the University of Southern California, where he served as chair of the Department of Economics until 1994 and then as dean of the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences until 2000. During his last two years as dean, he also served as the university's vice president for planning.

President Schapiro has written more than 100 articles and written or edited nine books. The books include: *Cents and Sensibility: What Economics Can Learn from the Humanities* (with Gary Saul Morson, Princeton University Press 2017); *The Student Aid Game: Meeting Need and Rewarding Talent in American Higher Education* (with Michael McPherson, Princeton University Press 1998); *Keeping College Affordable: Government and Educational Opportunity* (with Michael McPherson, Brookings Institution 1991); plus an edited volume: *The Fabulous Future? America and the World in 2040* (with Gary Saul Morson, Northwestern University Press 2015).

He has received research grants and contracts from the National Science Foundation, the US Department of Education, the World Bank, the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the Spencer Foundation, the College Board, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, and other groups to study the economics of higher education and related topics. In 2010 he was elected a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and in 2017 he was elected to the National Academy of Education.

He received his bachelor's degree in economics from Hofstra University and his doctorate from the University of Pennsylvania.

President Schapiro and his wife Mimi have three children: Matt, Alissa and Rachel.





Combe Family
Vice President for Athletics and Recreation

DR. JIM PHILLIPS

James J. Phillips became Northwestern's 21st director of intercollegiate athletics and recreation on April 14, 2008, bringing a track record of success at the Division I level and a commitment to the values Northwestern always has maintained in collegiate athletics. Four years into his tenure, Northwestern President Morton Schapiro elevated Phillips to the position of Combe Family Vice President for Athletics & Recreation.

A native of the Portage Park neighborhood on Chicago's northwest side, Phillips has proven to be the perfect fit to lead Northwestern's 19-sport program in the shadow of the nation's third-largest city. His deep Windy City roots and family orientation are an integral part of a core philosophy of providing student-athletes with a world-class experience that enables them to thrive academically, socially and athletically.

During Phillips' decade-plus of leadership, Northwestern student-athletes have reached new heights in the classroom, in the community and in competition.

Academically, Wildcats set school records with 265 Academic All-Big Ten honors and 86 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar awards in 2018-19. The group of more than 500 young men and women combined to post a record GPA of 3.38 during the 2018-19 academic year. The spring of 2019 marked the 12th consecutive quarter in which the Wildcats exceeded a 3.3 average GPA as a group, with the average student-athlete GPA a record 3.40 during the term. During that most recent quarter, 83 percent of student-athletes posted a GPA of 3.0-or-better.

NU scored a 98 percent overall Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in the latest data released by the NCAA, a figure which leads all Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools. The Wildcats have scored 96 percent-or-higher overall in every year that GSR data has been released, finishing in the Top-4 among FBS athletic departments all 14 years. Northwestern football's 99-percent GSR is the top score among all FBS institutions across the nation, and leads the Big Ten by 10 points.

Northwestern continues to be among the nation's leaders in community service, and Wildcats student-athletes totaled more than 5,500 hours in service of more than 100 community organizations in 2018-19. That emphasis on outreach has also included athletic department staff since 2012, during the annual Staff Service Day in early June. In 2012, Phillips guided the institution of the trailblazing 'NU For Life' program, an innovative four-year curriculum dedicated to guiding student-athletes toward their professional passion, connecting them with desirable internship and job opportunities, and preparing them for lifelong success after their playing careers are complete.

In competition, lacrosse, softball, golf, fencing, soccer, tennis, field hockey, swimming, diving and wrestling all have won conference or national championships during Phillips' tenure. Nine of Northwestern's 15 all-time bowl appearances have been earned since 2008, and the football program has posted three 10-win campaigns, four bowl championships, and a Big Ten West Division title over the last seven seasons, including back-to-back-to-back bowl wins the last three years. With Phillips at the helm, Northwestern student-athletes have piled up 137 All-America honors, 41 Player of the Year awards and more than 2,500 Academic All-Big Ten honors. The Wildcats also have been recognized with 30 Coach of the Year awards, and have won 37 conference championships.

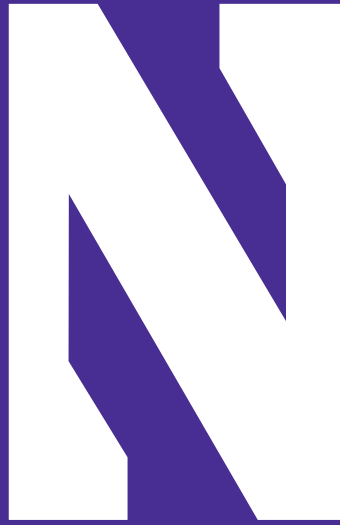
Mirroring the evolution across campus, Athletics & Recreation is in the midst of a facilities transformation, led by unprecedented support from the Wildcats community. This year the department will officially introduce the new Trienens Performance Center and a dramatic renovation to the Gleacher Golf Center and Patten Gymnasium. Last year Walter Athletics Center, Ryan Fieldhouse and Wilson Field on Lake Michigan opened as the new nucleus of the day-to-day student-athlete experience, and the new Welsh-Ryan Arena debuted as the home of basketball, volleyball and wrestling. Northwestern also has opened a 30,000 square-foot expansion of the Henry Crown Sports Pavilion for recreation, a multi-million dollar sailing center serving the entire community, Miller Park, Martin Stadium, Hutcheson Field, and the renovated Lakeside Field in the last several years.

He was elected by his peers as the inaugural chair of the NCAA Division I Council. During a two-and-a-half year term, he served as the first-ever sitting athletic director on the NCAA Board of Directors and Board of Governors, and helped lead the most sweeping legislative reform in history for the benefit of student-athletes across the nation. He is currently a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee, the group's first Northwestern representative in 50 years. This year he serves on both the Rose Bowl Management Committee and Fiesta Bowl Board of Directors, and is a past president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

Phillips was honored as the 2018 Sports Business Journal Athletic Director of the Year, and as the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year in FBS in both 2012 and 2016.

Phillips and his wife, Laura, have five children: Luke, Madeline, Meredith, John and James.

Sullivan-Ubben Head Coach • Seventh Season

CHRIS COLLINS

Chris Collins is in his seventh season as the head coach at Northwestern. He was named the University's 24th head men's basketball coach on March 27, 2013.

During his sixth campaign at the helm of the program, Collins saw program greats Vic Law and Dererk Pardon complete their college careers. Both were named All-Big Ten honorable mention and both finished with over 1,000-career points. Law finished his career in the top-10 at Northwestern for 3-pointers made (10th; 193), rebounds (9th; 710), and double-doubles (7th; 8). As a senior, Pardon averaged a career-high 13.9 points per game, a single-season high 244 rebounds and was the only Wildcat to start and play in all 31 games throughout 2018-19. Collins mentored Pardon to become Northwestern's all-time leader in career field goal percentage (60.2%). He ranks second all-time at NU in blocks (149), fifth in rebounds (785) and fourth in double-doubles (18).

With Northwestern's 73-66 win over Indiana on Jan. 22, 2019,

Collins picked up his 100th career head coaching victory. He became the third coach in program history to accomplish the feat and fastest ever to reach the mark.

In 2017-18, Collins saw his first Northwestern recruiting class wrap up their collegiate careers. Bryant McIntosh left NU with more than 1,600 points and 700 career assists, becoming one of only three players in Big Ten history to reach both milestones. His 700 career assists are a program record, while ranking seventh in league history. Scottie Lindsey finished his time in Evanston ranking eighth in school history in career three-point field goals and in the top 20 in scoring.

Collins guided the Wildcats to heights never before reached during the 2016-17 season. The unforgettable campaign saw Northwestern accumulate a school-record 24 wins while earning the program's first NCAA tournament berth and victory in school history.

NU captured the nation's attention with its outstanding start to the season. An 18-4 start, including a six-game winning streak in Big Ten Conference play — the program's first since 1933 — saw the team crack the top 25 of the Associated Press poll on Jan. 30, the team's first national ranking in seven years.

Northwestern went on to record 10 wins in league play, its most

since the 1932-33 campaign. Five of the victories came on the road, including a 66-59 triumph at No. 7/5 Wisconsin on Feb. 12.

The 'Cats picked up a pair of wins in the Big Ten tournament in Washington D.C., including defeating 25th-ranked Maryland in its own backyard, to give NU its first appearance in the conference tournament semifinal round in school history.

NU was rewarded with an NCAA tournament berth on Selection Sunday and the Wildcats earned a 68-66 victory over Vanderbilt in an opening-round contest in Salt Lake City. Northwestern pushed second-ranked and eventual national runner-up Gonzaga to the limits in the second round before eventually suffering a narrow loss.

The 'Cats placed two individuals on the All-Big Ten teams for the first time since 2012 as Bryant McIntosh was a unanimous second-team selection while Scottie Lindsey was recognized as a third-team pick of the league's coaches. In addition, Vic Law was named to the conference's five-member All-Defensive Team.

Lindsey was one of the Big Ten's most improved players while McIntosh became Northwestern's all-time leader in assists in just his third season of play. McIntosh's average of 5.4 assists per game in conference play made him the first Wildcat in school history to lead the Big Ten in the category (since 1975).

Additionally, Derek Pardon led the Big Ten in field goal percentage in league play (.617) and Nathan Taphorn was the conference leader in 3-point field goal percentage in all games (.470).

Northwestern hung its hat on its defense as the team ranked second in the Big Ten in both opponents field goal percentage (.403) and scoring defense (65.5 ppg), while ranking third in blocked shots (4.9 pg).

Collins' contributions to the program were rewarded by being named one of four national finalists for the Naismith Men's Coach of the Year award.

Following the 2016-17 season, Collins agreed to a contract extension that runs through the 2024-25 campaign.

The 2015-16 season saw the Wildcats establish a then school regular-season record 20 wins, including eight in Big Ten play. Three of the Big Ten wins were by 20 or more points, marking the first time a Northwestern team posted three league wins by 20+ points since the

1943-44 season.

The Wildcats posted a 10-game winning streak—just the second double-figure winning streak all-time at NU—en route to a 13-1 start to the season, matching the school record for the top 14-game opening stretch in school history. The squad also notched a school-record 13-game home winning streak spanning the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons.

Northwestern ranked sixth in the nation with a 1.59 assist-to-turnover ratio paced by McIntosh who recorded a school single-season record 213 assists. The total blew away the previous record of 157 set by Tim Doyle in 2006-07. McIntosh earned honorable mention All-Big Ten distinction along with senior Tre Demps.

Collins' second season with the Wildcats saw the young team continue to improve throughout the season. Despite a stretch of heartbreaking losses, Northwestern showed the resilience to bounce back late in the year to post four straight Big Ten victories and five of six.

Despite being without the services of leading returning scorer JerShon Cobb for a good portion of the season, the 'Cats came together during their late-season surge. Three of the team's top six scorers were true freshmen, including McIntosh who set the school freshman record with 150 assists to go along with an average of 11.4 points per game en route to being named to the five-member Big Ten All-Freshman Team.

Demps and Alex Olah both earned honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition. Olah became the school's career leader in blocked shots in just three seasons and ranked third in the Big Ten with seven double-doubles.

In his first season at the helm, Collins led the Wildcats to an impressive string of road victories.

Collins won his debut as a head coach, notching a 72-55 victory over Eastern Illinois Nov. 9. He traversed the 'Cats through a grinding Big Ten schedule, including earning his first conference triumph at home against 23rd-ranked Illinois Jan. 12.

Northwestern's impressive string of road success began Jan. 18

at Indiana before the Wildcats earned a 65-56 win at 14th-ranked Wisconsin. The loss was just the fifth by an unranked Big Ten team in 73 games during Bo Ryan's tenure in Madison. The winning ways continued three days later when the 'Cats notched a one-point win at Minnesota, marking NU's first three-game road winning streak since 1960.

Even though second-leading scorer Cobb was lost to injury late in the season, the Wildcats finished the campaign strong, defeating Purdue on the road to wrap up the regular season before upsetting sixth-seeded Iowa in the opening round of the Big Ten tournament.

The Wildcats were greatly improved on the defensive end under Collins' guidance, holding four of their Big Ten opponents below 30 percent shooting in a game. NU allowed a mere 63.3 points per game in conference play to rank second in the league. Meanwhile, the team's .419 opponents field goal percentage ranked third in the Big Ten.

Collins came to Evanston after serving on the coaching staff at Duke since July 22, 2000. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach in the summer of 2008. During Collins' 13 seasons on the Blue Devils' staff, Duke posted an overall record of 385-77 while recording eight ACC tournament championships, four ACC regular season titles, eight in-season tournament titles and national championships in 2001 and 2010.

Collins worked primarily with backcourt players during his time at Duke and tutored All-Americans Jason Williams, Mike Dunleavy, Chris Duhon, J.J. Redick, Gerald Henderson, DeMarcus Nelson, Jon Scheyer, Nolan Smith and Austin Rivers, in addition to NBA draft picks Daniel Ewing, Kyrie Irving and Kyle Singler.

Collins also served as a court coach and scout for Mike Krzyzewski, assisting the USA Basketball Senior National Team staff with on-court duties as well as game preparation from 2006-12, including during the program's gold-medal performances at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championships and 2012 London Olympics.

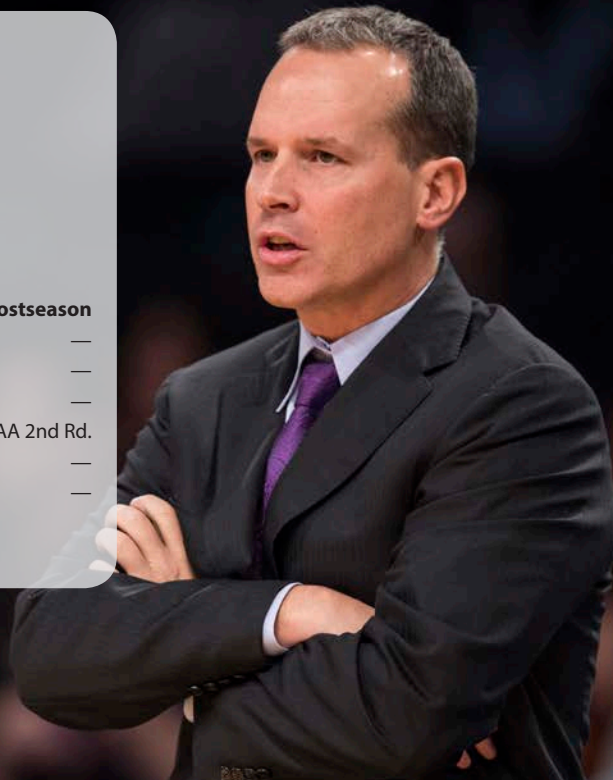

2001 national championship with an 82-72 victory over Arizona. Along the way, Williams earned unanimous first-team All-America and National Player of the Year honors by the NABC. Duhon, a freshman under Collins' tutelage in 2001, was named the ACC Rookie of the Year.

The following year, the Blue Devils posted a 31-4 record, won the ACC tournament for the fourth-consecutive season and were ranked No. 1 in the nation in the final Associated Press poll. Williams earned National Player of the Year honors for the second-consecutive year.

During the 2002-03 season, Duke posted a 26-7 record, a fifth-consecutive ACC tournament championship. One year later, Duke went 31-6 and returned to the Final Four for the second time in Collins' coaching career. Two of his backcourt players, Duhon and Redick, earned All-America and All-ACC recognition.

Collins helped the Blue Devils to a 26-7 overall slate that included the ACC tournament crown in 2004-05. Redick was named the National Player of the Year.

In the 2005-06 season, Collins watched his star pupil, Redick, rank second in the NCAA with a scoring average of 26.8 points per game, while setting the Duke and ACC career scoring records and the NCAA career three-point field goals record. He was a consensus National Player of the Year and a unanimous first-team All-American for the 32-4 Blue Devils.

In 2007-08, Collins helped Nelson elevate his game and garner several honors along the way. Nelson was tabbed the ACC Defensive Player of the Year and also earned NABC third-team All-America, first-team All-ACC and ACC All-Defensive team honors. In 2008-09, Collins guided Henderson to All-America and first-team All-ACC honors. Collins also coached Scheyer in his transition to point guard late in the year, which led to an ACC tournament title.

Collins helped lead Duke to its second national championship during his tenure in 2009-10 as the Blue Devils defeated Butler, 61-59, in the NCAA championship game. Collins coached the top-scoring trio in the NCAA as guards Jon Scheyer, Kyle Singler and Nolan Smith combined to score 53.3 points per game. Scheyer was named a second-team All-America, Singler was the NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player and Smith was the NCAA Tournament South Region MOP. All three players were also selected All-ACC and to ACC all-tournament teams while leading the Blue Devils to ACC tournament and ACC regular season championships.

The 2010-11 season marked the third-straight 30-win campaign for the Blue Devils. Collins coached a pair of senior all-stars for the Blue Devils, Singler and Smith. Singler earned first-team All-ACC honors, while Smith led the ACC in scoring at 20.6 points per game to claim ACC Player of the Year and first-team All-America honors.

In 2011-12, Collins was integral in the development of a backcourt that featured NABC third-team All-American Austin Rivers. Rivers averaged a team-high 15.5 points per game to become just the third Duke freshman to lead the team in scoring. He also was tabbed as the ACC Rookie of the Year and was just the seventh freshman in league history to earn first-team all-conference honors.

Before returning to his alma mater, Collins served as an assistant coach at Seton Hall for two years with Tommy Amaker. In 1999-2000, Collins was part of a staff that guided the Pirates to a 22-10 record and the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament. Prior to Seton Hall, Collins spent the 1997-98 season as an assistant with the WNBA's Detroit Shock.

As a player, Collins played professional basketball in Finland during the 1996-97 season, leading the league in scoring.

While at Duke, Collins was a team captain as a senior and four-year letterman from 1993-96. He ranks 11th among Duke's all-time leaders in three-point field goals (209) and 10th in three-point field goal attempts (539). Collins averaged 9.1 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.4 assists as a collegian. He earned second-team All-ACC honors as a

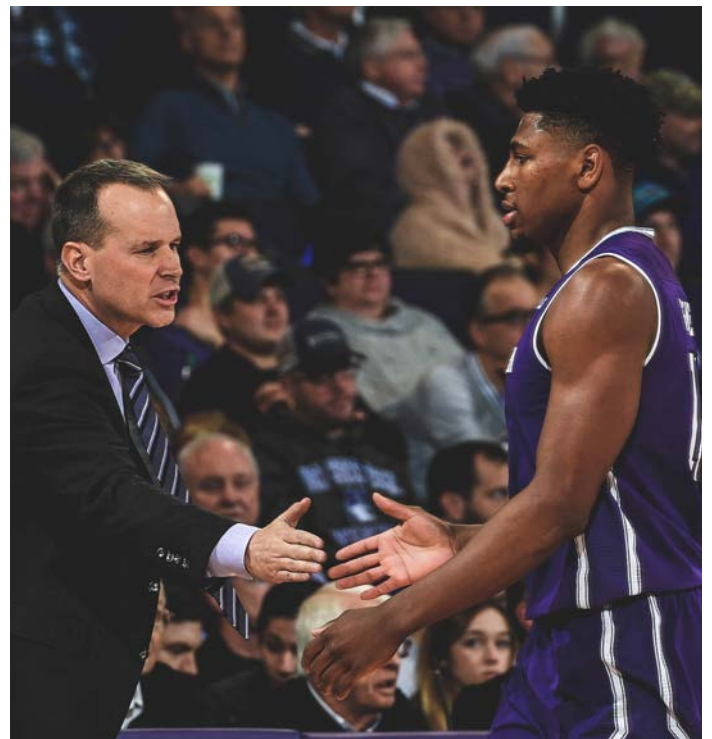
senior.

Collins was a member of a Duke senior class that had 83 total victories, three NCAA tournament bids, one Final Four appearance, two ACC regular season championships, an ACC tournament title, and two in-season tournament championships (the 1992 Maui Classic and the 1995 Carrs Great Alaska Shootout).

As a senior in 1996, Collins had his most productive season, leading the Blue Devils in three-point field goals (79), three-point percentage (.441), free throws made (83) and attempted (115), assists (132) and steals (37). Collins also ranked second on the team by averaging 16.3 points per game. He was among the ACC leaders in scoring (10th), assists (fourth), field goal percentage (.467, seventh) and free throw percentage (.722, 10th).

Collins is the son of former NBA All-Star, Doug Collins, who is currently a senior advisor for the Chicago Bulls. A native of nearby Northbrook, Illinois, Collins is a 1996 graduate of Duke with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Collins and his wife, Kim, have two children: Ryan and Kate.





Assistant Coach • Seventh Season

BRIAN JAMES

Brian James is in his seventh season as an assistant coach at Northwestern on Chris Collins' staff.

James served as Collins' coach during his high school career at Glenbrook North where he helped Collins gain McDonald's All-America status as well as the title of Illinois' Mr. Basketball.

James is in charge of working with the Wildcats' post men and played a vital role in developing Dererk Pardon and Alex Olah into top centers in the Big Ten.

As a senior, Pardon averaged a career-high 13.9 points per game, a single-season high 244 rebounds and was the only Wildcat to start and play in all 31 games throughout 2018-19. James mentored Pardon to become Northwestern's all-time leader in career field goal percentage (60.2%). He ranks second all-time at NU in blocks (149), fifth in rebounds (785) and fourth in double-doubles (18).

Olah became Northwestern's all-time leader in blocked shots in only three seasons while finishing with 181 for his career. He also posted 1,161 career points and left NU with 663 rebounds to rank ninth in program history in the category.

With both Olah and fellow veteran big man Joey van Zegeren sidelined due to injury at the beginning of Big Ten play in 2015-16, James groomed freshman Dererk Pardon for a key role on the squad.

In just his second career game and first Big Ten game, Pardon posted 28 points and 12 rebounds in a victory at Nebraska under James' tutelage.

Some of Olah's top performances came against the top big men in the Big Ten, including NBA Lottery selections Noah Vonleh of Indiana and Frank Kaminsky of Wisconsin as well as Purdue's A.J. Hammons.

James has helped in the development of Pardon as one of the conference's best big men. Pardon led the Big Ten Conference in 2016-17 with a .617 field goal percentage in league play, becoming the first Northwestern player to do so since Evan Eschmeyer in 1998-99. In all games, Pardon ranked second in the league in field goal percentage (.611), fourth in blocked shots (1.8 pg) and seventh in rebounding (8.0 pg).

James is credited for drawing up "The Play," Nathan Taphorn's length-of-the-court to Dererk Pardon that resulted in a buzzer-beating 67-65 win for Northwestern over Michigan that all but clinched NU's first NCAA tournament berth in program history.

James came to Northwestern after spending three seasons as an assistant coach with the Philadelphia 76ers alongside head coach Doug Collins, Chris Collins' father. He helped the Sixers reach the 2012 NBA Eastern Conference Semifinals.

The Taylorville, Illinois, native has 14 years of NBA coaching experience. Prior to joining the Sixers, James served as an assistant coach with the Milwaukee Bucks for three seasons from 2005-06 through 2007-08. In addition to the Bucks, James had held assistant coaching positions in the NBA with Washington (2001-03), Toronto (1998-2001) and Detroit (1995-98). His stints with the Wizards and Pistons also came as a member of Doug Collins' staff.

The Raptors reached the semifinal round of the Eastern Conference playoffs in 2001 and James helped coach the Eastern Conference squad at the 1997 NBA All-Star Game while on the coaching staff of the Pistons.

During his time in the NBA, James coached such notable players as Michael Jordan, Grant Hill, Vince Carter, Tracy McGrady, Michael Redd, Elton Brand and Andre Iguodala.

He also served as an NBA analyst for ESPN.com and spent two years as an advance scout for the Seattle SuperSonics.

His 18 years of high school coaching experience in the state of Illinois were split between four different high schools. In addition to Glenbrook North, James also served head-coaching stints at Romeoville and Wilmington. He compiled a varsity career coaching record of 196-79 (.713) and helped his teams reach the state tournament four times.

A 1977 graduate of Illinois State University with a degree in physical education, James holds a masters degree in educational administration from Northeastern Illinois University.

He has three children: Christopher, Dayna and Brady.



Assistant Coach • First Season

JON BOROVICH

Jon Borovich was named an assistant coach in May of 2019. Borovich comes to the Wildcats after eight seasons (2011-19) as a member of the Northern Illinois coaching staff, four of which were as the associate head coach. Prior to his arrival in DeKalb, he spent four seasons (2007-11) as an assistant coach at Dayton and two campaigns (2005-07) as an assistant at Oakland.

"We are extremely excited to add Jon to our staff," said Sullivan-Ubben Head Men's Basketball Coach Chris Collins. "He is an experienced college coach with a great pedigree coaching under fantastic coaches throughout his stops along the way. He is a hard worker with great energy and a terrific teacher that will impact our program in many areas."

"I am very grateful to Coach Collins, Dr. Phillips and the administration for the opportunity to join the Northwestern program," said Borovich. "It's a privilege to coach world-class student-athletes, while working with some of the best coaches and staff in the country. I can't wait to get started."

The recent success of Huskie basketball is the result of the building blocks set in place since Borovich's arrival with NIU head coach Mark Montgomery in 2011.

Borovich, who was promoted to NIU associate head coach in August of 2015, played a large role in the rebuilding process at NIU that saw a program which had produced just two winning seasons in the previous 15 years grow to earn its fourth postseason appearance, and the second-most wins, in school history in 2015-16.

The Huskies posted a 21-13 record in 2015-16 and accepted an invitation to the inaugural Vegas 16 tournament. NIU's success came despite having the second-youngest team in the MAC, a squad that saw nearly 40 percent of its scoring come from freshmen.

Three Huskies earned conference postseason

honors, including sophomore Marin Maric who was named to the All-MAC Third Team; Aaric Armstead was named to the MAC All-Defensive

Team and Marshawn Wilson was recognized on the MAC All-Freshman Team. It marked the first time since the 2002-03 season that NIU had three all-league honorees.

More milestones were reached during the 2016-17 season as the Huskies earned 15 victories, giving the program 65 total wins over the last four seasons, the second-best four-year stretch in school history.

NIU had one of its best offensive teams in 2017-18 as it averaged more points than any Huskie team since 2001-02 and scored the third-most points (2,319) in a single-season in school history. Eugene German led the MAC in scoring while earning Second Team All-MAC and First Team NABC All-District honors.

As an assistant at Dayton, Borovich helped the Flyers advance to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In his first season, 2007-08, Dayton started 14-1 and climbed to No. 14 in the Associated Press poll, the highest ranking for the program in 40 years. The next season, Dayton was again nationally-ranked and finished with a 27-8 record, including a trip to the second round of the NCAA tournament.

In 2009-10, Borovich helped UD win 25 games and win the NIT title, the first NIT crown for the program since 1968. In his final season on the Flyer staff (2010-11), Dayton finished with a 22-14 mark, reaching the championship game of the Atlantic 10 Tournament and advancing to the NIT.

Borovich began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Michigan State from 2001-03. He then spent two seasons (2003-05) at Dayton as the Director of Basketball Operations.

During his two seasons at Oakland, the Golden Grizzlies won 30 games. In Borovich's second year, Oakland compiled a 19-14 mark, the most wins for the school since joining Division I in 1997. Borovich helped the Golden Grizzlies recruit class that, as juniors and seniors, went 34-2 in the Summit League and appeared in back-to-back NCAA tournaments.

A native of Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, Borovich assisted in video analysis as a graduate assistant at Michigan State while completing his master's degree in athletics administration.

Borovich played collegiately at Central Michigan from 1997-2001, while NIU head coach Mark Montgomery was working as an assistant coach for the Chippewas.

EMANUEL DILDY

Emanuel Dildy joined the Northwestern men's basketball program in May of 2018.

A Chicago native, Dildy joined Northwestern after spending the 2017-18 season as an assistant coach at Valparaiso. During his lone season with the Crusaders, Dildy was key in the player development of Tavon Walker and Bakari Evelyn, helping them earn Missouri Valley Conference All-Defensive Team and All-Newcomer Team honors, respectively.

During the 2016-17 season, Dildy coached in the Southeastern Conference as an assistant coach at the University of Missouri. Under Dildy's tutelage, Jordan Barnett developed into one of the SEC's most productive perimeter players, leading the team in scoring with an average of 12.2 points per game.

Prior to arriving at Mizzou, Dildy worked for three seasons (2013-16) as an assistant coach at Loyola Chicago. Dildy's player development and recruiting efforts helped lead Loyola to a College Basketball Invitational title in 2014-15 and later helped Loyola earn an NCAA Final Four appearance during the 2017-18 season.

Aundre Jackson ranked among the national leaders and set a Loyola single-season record for field goal percentage (.669) while also setting the school's career field goal percentage mark (.620). Jackson's production led to 2017 MVC Sixth Man of the Year and MVC All-Newcomer Team accolades.

Donte Ingram blossomed into a 2018 MVC Tournament MVP and Second-Team All-MVC honoree. He is one of only 11 Ramblers to record over 1,200 points and 600 rebounds in a Loyola uniform for his career.

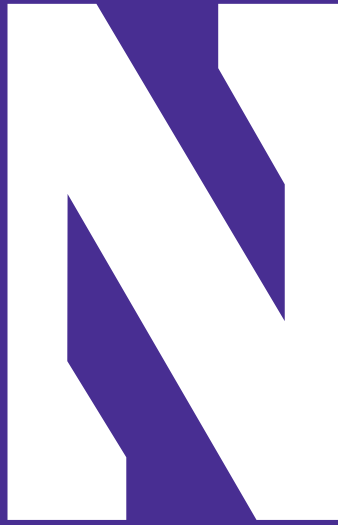
Dildy also help coach guard Milton Doyle develop into Loyola's first player to earn First-Team All-MVC recognition. He finished his career with 1,606 points, which places him eighth on Loyola's all-time scoring chart and he also ranks fifth with 459 assists. Doyle capped his career by becoming the first Rambler since 2007 to earn NABC First-Team All-District recognition.

Dildy spent the 2012-13 season as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois, as he broke into the Division I coaching ranks. While at EIU, Dildy was instrumental in the player development of Sherman Blanford, who led the team in rebounding and also went on to earn 2012-13 All-Ohio Valley Newcomer Team and 2013-14 Second-Team All-OVC accolades. Dildy also was key in the recruitment of transfer Reggie Smith who was named to the 2013-14 All-Newcomer team and transfer Chris Olivier who became the team's leading scorer and finished his career fifth on EIU's all-time blocked shots list.

Dildy's coaching career started at Kennedy-King College in Chicago, where he served as an assistant coach for two seasons (2008-10) before spending two seasons as head coach (2010-12). As the head coach, Dildy guided the Statesmen to a 35-27 overall record and led the team to an appearance in the NJCAA 2012 Region IV tournament championship game.

Dildy played for two seasons at New Mexico State before transferring to Eastern Illinois, where he was an All-Ohio Valley Conference selection as a senior. After earning his B.A. in Communications from EIU in 2005, Dildy played professionally in Germany for two years and stateside for one season in the International Basketball League before embarking on his coaching career.

He finished with 11 points in the game, his 38th game scoring 10 or more points. He was five-of-seven from the charity stripe. NU compiled 15 points off turnovers in the game, edging out the Bulldogs' total of 14.

Led by three 20-plus point performances, Northwestern (4-1, 0-0 Big Ten) got back on track with a 91-74 win over La Salle (0-6, 0-0 Atlantic 10) at Titan Gym in the second game of the Wooden Legacy. Ryan Taylor and Vic Law both finished the contest with 21 points. Law was 14-for-16 from the charity stripe, while Taylor made four three-pointers in the victory. A.J. Turner compiled a career-best 20 points, thanks in part to a seven-for-seven performance from the free throw line. He improved to 25-for-27 (.926) on the season from the stripe. Chicago's Big Ten Team started off effective, compiling a 59 percent field goal percentage in the first half, NU's best mark in a half this season. In particular, NU dominated in the paint, 20-12, due in large part to six dunks in the first stanza. NU was able to account for 35 of its points from the charity stripe as the Wildcats converted on 35-of-43 from the free throw line. La Salle finished with 21 free throws made. Northwestern also crashed the boards with much success against the Explorers, finishing with 37 rebounds, compared to 23 for La Salle. NU had 12 offensive rebounds — five of which came from Pardon.

Game 6

NU 79, Utah 57

Nov. 24, 2018 • Fullerton, Calif.

Northwestern used a stifling defense to dispatch Utah (3-3, 0-0 Pac-12), 79-57, to finish off a two-win Wooden Legacy stay on Sunday afternoon at Titan Gym. Senior forward Vic Law scored in double-digits for the sixth-straight game to start the year. He led the Wildcats with 19 points, including four three-pointers — his most in the 2018-19 season and his most since making five against Michigan State on Feb. 17, 2018. He also added six rebounds, two blocks, and an assist. Northwestern forced 21 Utah turnovers — tied for the second-most by a Wildcat opponent in the Chris Collins era (trailing only 24 forced turnovers by Chicago State on Dec. 11, 2017). The 'Cats scored 26 points off those Ute takeaways. NU compiled 30 points from beyond the arc, shooting 10-for-21 (48 percent) from three-point range. Redshirt junior forward A.J. Turner went 2-for-3 from downtown. As a team, NU finished with a 51 percent field goal percentage — their third time this season with a shooting percentage of 50 percent or better (also, Binghamton (51.6) and La Salle (56.1)). Only two Big Ten Teams (Indiana (5) and Michigan State (4)) have more such games so far this season. Senior center Dererk Pardon was perfect from the field, going five-for-five — including his first-career three-pointer — for 15 points. He has not missed a shot in his last two competitions, going nine-for-nine between the Utah and La Salle games. Graduate guard Ryan Taylor and sophomore guard Anthony Gaines both also finished with double-digit points. Gaines' 11-point output matched a career high, while Taylor's 14-point game was his 62nd career game with 10-plus points.

Game 7

NU 67, Georgia Tech 61

Nov. 28, 2018 • Evanston, Ill.

Northwestern earned conference bragging rights with a victory over Georgia Tech in the B1G/ACC Challenge. The Wildcats were buoyed by a once-again stifling defense, holding their opponent to under 40 percent shooting for the third time this season and winning by a final score of 67-61. Ryan Taylor led a trio of double-digit scorers for Chicago's Big Ten Team, finishing with 20 points and four made three-pointers. Dererk Pardon notched his third double-double of the year with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while Vic Law added 14 points and nine boards. The hosts got off to a quick start, with a basket-and-one from Pardon giving NU an 8-2 lead after two and a half minutes played. A pair of assists from Anthony Gaines in his first two minutes off the bench helped stretch the advantage to 15-5 with 12:42 to play in the half. Five points from Vic Law and a three-point-play from Gaines ensured Northwestern continued its dominant opening frame, with the score reading 23-11 at the seven-minute mark. A three from Ryan Taylor on the next possession forced Georgia Tech to call a timeout, as the visitors trailed by 19 with 5:27 in the period. Chicago's Big Ten Team continued to keep the visitors at arm's length as the second half progressed. Another three from Taylor gave NU its largest lead of the night, 52-26, just over five minutes in. With 4:25 on the clock, the Yellow Jackets had cut the lead down to 10 points, but the Wildcat defense tightened up and held them scoreless over the next two-plus minutes. A jumper from Law with 45 seconds to play put the result beyond any remaining doubt.

Game 8

Indiana 68, NU 66

Dec. 1, 2018 • Bloomington, Ind.

Northwestern narrowly dropped its Big Ten opener to Indiana in a thrilling Saturday afternoon affair, 68-66. Senior center Dererk Pardon had a career game, finishing with a double-double on 24 points and 10 rebounds. The game was tied 30 different times and neither team held a lead of more than five points for the entire contest. Pardon's 24-point output was the second-largest scoring performance of his career, trailing only his 28-point total against Nebraska on Dec. 30, 2015. Senior forward Vic Law continued his stretch of double-digit scoring games to start the year, finishing with 16 points, including a final-seconds three-pointer that kept NU's winning hopes alive. He logged nine rebounds, tying a season high. The first half was a neck-and-neck affair, with Indiana holding a narrow, 37-33 lead after the first 20 minutes of play. It was a hot-shooting start to the game with both squads shooting north of 55 percent. Pardon led the way for NU with 12 points in the first stanza on five-of-five shooting. The senior also added four rebounds, an assist, and a block. Law and Pardon combined for 21 of NU's 33 points in the second half.

Game 9

#5 Michigan 62, NU 60

Dec. 4, 2018 • Evanston, Ill.

Northwestern came all the way back from a 15-point deficit to lead No. 5 Michigan in the fourth quarter but fell short at an electric Welsh-Ryan Arena, 62-60. Senior Dererk Pardon scored 20 points for the second-consecutive game, doing so for the first time in his career. His classmate Vic Law put up 19 points for the 'Cats and seven boards, marking his ninth straight double-digit scoring effort. Pardon knocked down eight of Northwestern's first 10 points to open the game, finishing the night with 20 points and 5 rebounds, going 9-10 from the arc. Northwestern went on a 7-0 run over a 2:36 span to cut into Michigan's lead and make it 22-19 with 8:09 to go in the first half and forced the Wolverines into a scoring drought of 4:22 midway through the first half. Vic Law's deep three pointer at the buzzer cut Michigan's lead to six heading into halftime. In the second half, The Wildcats erupted for a 15-2 run including a 8-0 blitz in 44 seconds with 13:16 to go to get within two of the Wolverines, 47-45. Law's back-to-back three pointers gave Northwestern its first lead of the game at 52-51 with 6:24 to play to switch the momentum, putting the 'Cats within reach. Northwestern trailed 62-60 in the closing stages and had two late looks to tie the game from Ryan Taylor and Law, but both shots missed their mark. Taylor added nine points and A.J. Turner added seven, while each recorded their third block this season.

Northwestern came from behind to take down cross-town rival DePaul on the back of electric performances from Vic Law and A.J. Turner. The Wildcats scored 46 points, including 25 unanswered in the second half, as they improved to 5-1 at home. Turner dropped a career-high 24 points on just 13 shot attempts, while also stuffing the stat sheet with five assists, three steals, and three rebounds. Law led all scorers with 25 in the game, connecting on a pair of threes and all nine of his free throw attempts. The visitors got off to a quick start in the opening minutes, hitting five of their first six shot attempts and jumping out to an early lead. NU struggled from deep in the opening minutes, with Turner connecting on the team's first three-pointer just past the midway point of the half. Chicago's Big Ten Team continued to claw its way back as a pair of threes from Miller Kopp and Turner with under seven minutes to go brought the score to 24-23. Turner recorded his third trey of the contest with another make two minutes later, but DePaul led 41-29 at the break. Northwestern quickly scored the first six points of the second half, cutting the deficit to six in less than two minutes. DePaul responded, however, stretching the lead back to 15 with with 9:48 minutes left in the game. The Wildcats then came storming back, dominating on both sides of the ball as they ripped off an incredible 25-0 run over 6:50 of action. NU held DePaul without a field goal for eight minutes while Law and Turner took over on the offensive end, hitting a combined five threes and scoring at least 10 points apiece during the run. Four late makes from the charity stripe by Law sealed the game for Northwestern, putting his team up 71-64 with under a minute on the clock. The final score read 75-68 in favor of the hosts after more late free throws from Gaines and Law.

Game 11
NU 88, Chicago State 46
Dec. 17, 2018 • Evanston, Ill.

Vic Law, Derrek Pardon, and Miller Kopp combined for 47 points and Northwestern utilized a balanced scoring attack to defeat Chicago State, 88-46. Northwestern improved to 8-3 with the win, while Chicago State moves to 3-10 overall. Kopp's 17 points marked a career-high, and both Law and Pardon notched double-digit points for the 11th consecutive game. The Wildcats tallied a season-high 33 field goals on 23 assists. In a complete team effort, every player recorded at least one assist, led by first-year Ryan Greer's career-high five dimes. The Atlanta native also matched a career-high with five points in the contest. Accompanying Northwestern's offensive barrage was a smothering defensive effort. The Wildcats forced 18 Cougars turnovers and limited them to 31.3-percent shooting (15-of-48). The 'Cats utilized a balanced scoring attack to build the lead in the first half, shooting 50.0% for the second consecutive game. Eight different players scored points in the half, led by Law's 12. The #18GCats fired on all cylinders offensively in the second half, opening on a 21-8 run. Barret Benson threw down a dunk to push the lead to 30 midway through the period. The junior big man finished with 9 points and 4 rebounds. Northwestern finished with a 50.8% (33-65) shooting clip, and committed only eight turnovers, a season-low. Aaron Falzon made his first appearance of the season in his return from a lower body injury. The redshirt junior finished with six points, including an exclamation-mark three with 1:06 to play. He has connected on a 101 triples in his career. The Wildcats never trailed in the contest. With the win, NU improved to 13-0 all-time against Chicago State.

Game 12
Oklahoma 76, NU 69 (OT)

Senior Vic Law tallied 23 points and eight rebounds, but Northwestern fell to Oklahoma in overtime 76-69, at the new Welsh-Ryan Arena. Graduate transfer Ryan Taylor had an open look from three in the closing seconds of regulation for the win but his effort just missed. Taylor finished with 14 points, marking the 64th time in his career and sixth time this season he scored double figures. Senior Dererk Pardon added 15 points and seven rebounds. The big man also recorded a pair of blocks, which moved him into a tie for fourth all-time (132) at NU with Evan Eschmeyer (1995-99). The duo of Law & Pardon have scored double digit points in every game this season. In a back-and-forth affair, both teams traded leads throughout the game. A tight first half found the score tied at 32 apiece. Oklahoma's 32 points in the first half marked OU's lowest first half total since it scored 29 against North Texas on Nov. 27. Another balanced scoring effort had seven Wildcats contributing points in the first half, led by Law's eight. The contest's energetic pace continued into the second half. Following a chase-down block by Law, a put-back slam by Pardon tied the game at 66 with 1:13 remaining. That score would remain for the remainder of regulation. Law opened the scoring in overtime with a three from the top of the key to give the 'Cats a 69-66 lead, but the Sooners broke a late run to steal the result.

He finished with 12 boards — his fifth time this season with double-digit rebounds. The Wildcats were effective from the charity stripe, knocking down 19-of-24 from the free throw line. NU also shot well from beyond the arc, making 10 three-pointers compared to Columbia's five. The contest started as a back-and-forth affair, though the Wildcats started to pull away at the end of the first half, with NU holding an eight-point advantage heading into the break. Northwestern outscored Columbia, 20-11, in the first 10 minutes of play of the second half and proceeded to shoot effectively to secure their ninth win of the season.

Northwestern fell to the visiting Iowa Hawkeyes in a back-and-forth affair at the new Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Wildcats put four scorers into double figures, led by Anthony Gaines and Vic Law, who each added 13 points. Gaines did not register a miss in the game, making all three of his field goal attempts and going a perfect 7-for-7 from the free throw line. Law also racked up 10 rebounds to record his second-consecutive double-double. The visitors got off to a quick start, leading 9-2 before the hosts found a spark through Gaines. His seven points were part of an 11-4 run by NU that tied the contest at 13 apiece just over eight minutes in. Iowa responded with run of its own, stretching the lead back to nine before Northwestern answered once more. A steal and fast-break dunk by Law capped an 8-0 run that made it 28-27 with three minutes to play in the half. In the final minute of the frame, A.J. Turner pulled up from several feet beyond the arc and drilled a three to knot it at 32-32. After a basket from the Hawkeyes on the ensuing possession, Ryan Taylor drove to the hoop in the final seconds and finished under the rim to ensure the teams ended the opening period tied. Chicago's Big Ten Team came out of the break firing on all cylinders, ripping off a 10-3 run that put the hosts up by seven. The Hawkeyes took the lead back over the next several minutes, but two free throws from Law just before the nine-minute mark brought the 'Cats within five as the game approached its final stages. Jordan Bohannon scored six of his eight points in the final three minutes as Iowa pulled away, sealing the victory by a final score of 73-63.

Senior center Dererk Pardon posted his third 20-point game of the Big Ten slate, but Northwestern fell to No. 2 Michigan, 80-60, at the Crisler Center. Pardon was a strong 10-for-16 from the field in his 20-point performance. Graduate guard Ryan Taylor also logged a double-digit scoring performance, finishing with 15 points, including four three-pointers. Northwestern started slowly in the first half but rebounded. The Wildcats missed their first eight field goal attempts of the game but then proceeded to knock down seven of their next eight shots. The two squads played neck-and-neck in the first portion of the opening stanza, but the Wolverines used a torrid run to take a 50-28 score into halftime. First-year forward Miller Kopp came off the bench for the first time in his collegiate career and knocked down his first three field goals. Pardon and Taylor both had double-digit points at the halftime break. Overall, the 'Cats took a 43 percent shooting clip into the locker room. Northwestern outscored Michigan in the second half, 32-30. The Wildcats utilized a 42 percent field goal clip in the second stanza, compared to Michigan's 36 percent rate. Pardon has scored in double-figures in 16 of 17 games this season. His 20-point game was the fifth of his career. First-year forward Pete Nance made the first start of his career and tallied a career highs with four blocks and 30 minutes played. Sophomore guard Anthony Gaines had double-digit rebounds for the first time in his career. The Wildcats were playing without redshirt senior Vic Law (lower-body injury) in the contest.

Northwestern stormed past Indiana, 73-66 at the new Welsh-Ryan Arena on the back of career nights for Aaron Falzon and Dererk Pardon. Falzon provided an incredible shooting performance off the bench, nailing six-of-seven attempts from three-point land. Pardon's solid night ensured he would reach a key milestone in style, as his 17 points in the contest put him over 1,000 total points in his career. As the game got underway, the first half of the opening frame proved to be a defensive battle, with Indiana holding a 14-8 lead after nine minutes of action. Falzon came off the bench with seven minutes remaining in the half and immediately made a splash, nailing a three-pointer from the wing to bring NU within four. After a pair of stops by the Wildcat defense, Falzon canned another look from deep to make it a one-point game. Another triple from Falzon and a dunk from Pardon put the 'Cats up four, an advantage that they would keep into the break. After Indiana was able to cut the deficit to three, Falzon became a one-man offense and helped the 'Cats pull away for good. His deep three from the left wing found nothing but net, and Law's attempt on the next possession yielded the same result. Falzon was then fouled from behind the arc and made all three free throws, and added another triple when Turner found him open on the following trip. Falzon punctuated the 15-4 run with a contested three from the corner at the end of the shot clock, giving him 21 points in just 13 minutes. Indiana fought to stay within striking distance, trailing by seven as the clock ticked under six minutes. A combination of stingy defense and clutch free throws was more than enough to stave off the Hoosiers as the game wound down, as NU maintained its multi-possession lead until the buzzer. The final score read 73-66 in favor of Chicago's Big Ten Team.

Northwestern fell to Penn State, 59-52, at the New Welsh-Ryan Arena, despite an 18-point performance by senior center Dererk Pardon. Northwestern had a solid game defensively, holding Penn State to 28.6 percent shooting in the second half while forcing the Nittany Lions to go zero-for-six from beyond the arc during the frame. Offensively however, Northwestern could not mount much momentum, shooting 31.7 percent from the field to score just 52 points. The Wildcats were led by Pardon, who was honored pregame for becoming the 37th player in Northwestern history to score 1,000 points in their career. The captain had 18 points and grabbed 9 rebounds, bringing his career rebound total to 708, becoming just the eighth Wildcat to record over 700 career rebounds. Pardon also has now scored double-digit point totals in 20 of 22 games this season, and 15 or more points in seven Big Ten games. Fellow senior captain Vic Law added a double-double with 10 points, 10 rebounds, and a career-high 6 assists. This is the 16th time this season the duo of senior captains have scored double-digit points in the same game. Sophomore guard Anthony Gaines grabbed five rebounds to follow up one of the best games of his career, his ninth game of the season with five-plus boards.

Law also added seven rebounds — his 14th time finishing a contest with seven-plus boards. As has been Northwestern's calling card this season, the Wildcats were exceptionally effective at defending the three-point arc, limiting the Buckeyes to a 20 percent clip (4-of-20). The 'Cats came into the game leading the Big Ten with a 29.6 opposing three point shooting percentage. NU limited Ohio State to 63 points, the 17th time this season that the Wildcats have held a major conference opponent below their season scoring average. Northwestern fell to Minnesota, 62-50, at the new Welsh-Ryan Arena. Dererk Pardon recorded his seventh double-double of the season and 16th of his career with 16 points and 13 rebounds. He shot 6-for-11 from the floor to help maintain his position as the player with the highest career field goal percentage in Wildcat history. Vic Law dished out a career-high seven assists while adding 13 points, marking the 23rd time this season he has scored in double-figures. The Wildcats also got valuable minutes off the bench from Miller Kopp. The first-year tied a career high with two three-pointers en route to a nine-point performance to bring NU within four of the Golden Gophers. Northwestern continued to share the ball well, assisting on 13 of its 18 field goals. They now own a 61.8 percent assist rate on the campaign, one of the top in the nation. Late in the half, senior captains Pardon and Law combined for a trio of buckets to give the Wildcats momentum heading into the break. Pardon grabbed 10 rebounds in the frame, marking the eighth time this season he has recorded double-digit boards. Kopp paced the Wildcats with seven points at the halfway point. Pardon continued to have his way in the second stanza, grabbing a pair of early baskets before hitting the fourth three-pointer of his career. Sophomore Anthony Gaines kept up the intensity on the defensive end with career-high with four steals, all coming in the second half.

Illinois 81, NU 76

March 3, 2019 • Champaign, Ill.

Despite a late comeback attempt, Northwestern was topped by Illinois, 81-76, at the State Farm Center. Senior center Dererk Pardon again was dominant, scoring 16 points. Graduate guard Ryan Taylor, first-year forward Miller Kopp, and redshirt junior forward A.J. Turner joined Pardon in double-digits, finishing with 13, 13, and 12, respectively. Illinois held a 12-point advantage after the first stanza, leading the contest, 39-27. NU did dominate offensive rebounding in the first half, leading Illinois, 5-1, in the category. Northwestern outscored Illinois, 49-42, in the second half. NU held Illinois without a field goal over the final six minutes and 13 seconds of the affair. The Wildcats' three-point shooting finally found its groove in the second half with five makes from beyond the arc in the first 10 minutes back from intermission. Ryan Taylor was responsible for three of those three-pointers, marking his first game with three-plus three-pointers since making four at Rutgers on Jan. 18, 2019. Miller Kopp also assisted in the NU outburst, making back-to-back-to-back buckets to close the Illinois lead to only six. An emphatic fastbreak dunk by Kopp made the score 56-50 before a fastbreak layup made it 58-52. The NU offense went through a bit of a lull but picked back up with three minutes left in the game. A Pardon free throw made the contest a six-point game with the Fighting Illini leading, 74-68, at 1:49 left in the game. With 44 seconds in the contest, Kopp made a clutch free throw to make it a five-point game at 76-71. Illinois would make their final free throws to win, 81-76.

Northwestern took down Ohio State, 68-50, at the new Welsh-Ryan Arena, thanks to a stingy defensive game and an all-around offensive performance. The Wildcats never relinquished the lead in the game, opening the contest on a 12-2 scoring run. The 'Cats held Ohio State without a made field goal for the game's opening eight minutes, shooting 0-of-13 from the field, and held the Buckeyes to shooting 26.6 percent in the game. This marks the 19th contest this year in which NU held a major conference opponent to below their scoring average (Ohio State entered the game averaging 70.1 ppg). The Wildcats led, 28-17, at the break, outscoring the Buckeyes in the paint, 16-6. Vic Law led the team with eight first-half points on 4-of-5 shooting, followed by Anthony Gaines contributing six points. NU's bench tallied 12 points compared to OSU's bench scoring four points, with A.J. Turner led the way with five points and Barret Benson added four points in the game's opening 20 minutes. The Wildcats extended their lead in the second half in part due to a huge performance from Dererk Pardon. He finished the game with 20 points and 13 rebounds, capping his 8th double-double of the season. With his 13 rebounds, Pardon moved into sole possession for fifth place among Northwestern's career rebounding list. NU dominated near the basket, outscoring Ohio State, 36-20, in points in the paint. The 'Cats offense operated very efficiently, dishing out 15 assists with only five turnovers.

#11 Purdue 70, NU 57

March 9, 2019 • Evanston, Ill.

Vic Law and Dererk Pardon combined for 21 points and nine rebounds as the Wildcats celebrated senior day at the new Welsh-Ryan Arena, while Northwestern lost to Purdue 70-57. Northwestern shot 11-24 from three in the game, tied for their second most made threes in a game this season. Law finished with 13 points in 30 minutes, before leaving the game with a lower body injury. AJ Turner led the #B1GCats with 14 points, with four threes late in the game, while adding three assists. Pardon finished his Welsh-Ryan career with eight points, two rebounds and two assists, while Anthony Gaines recorded nine points to go with his three rebounds and three assists. Purdue jumped out to early 10-3 lead, but the Wildcats charged right back. Law, Kopp, and Gaines scored all of NU's first 20 points as the Wildcats pulled within 22-20 with five minutes left in the first. Northwestern's stingy defense held Purdue to just 34 percent shooting in the half, well beneath their season average of 45 percent. After being held quiet in the first half, Northwestern's seniors made noise in their last home half of basketball. Law started the half with a three, before Pardon scored on consecutive possessions and Falzon rained in from deep to pull the Wildcats within ten at 44-35. As the Boilermakers looked to be gaining steam, it was Turner's turn to shine. A pair of corner threes brought Welsh-Ryan to life and cut the score to 54-47 with nine minutes to go. It happened again five minutes later, when Taylor slipped into the corner for a pair of consecutive threes to keep the Wildcats within reach at 63-55. Eventually, the clock ran out for the last time at Welsh-Ryan in the 2018 season, with Purdue ahead 70-57.

Game 32

Illinois 74, NU 69 (OT)

March 13, 2019 • Chicago, Ill.

Illinois edged Northwestern, 74-69, in overtime, in the first round of the 2019 Big Ten Tournament. Redshirt junior A.J. Turner led the Wildcats in scoring, finishing with 20. The contest was his fourth-straight in double-figures for NU. He drained three three-pointers and added four rebounds and five assists. Senior Dererk Pardon added 17 points, including a perfect four-for-four mark from the charity stripe. First-year Miller Kopp and sophomore Aaron Falzon both finished with 11 points. The Wildcats took 36 three-pointers, their most this season and the most-ever in a Big Ten Tournament game. The two squads traded blows early in a low-scoring affair. A three-point jumper with just under 12 minutes left in the first half by Falzon evened the score at nine points apiece. The game continued to be close as the first half progressed. At 2:54, Turner made a tough running layup to bring the 'Cats to within one point, trailing the Fighting Illini, 26-25. Illinois led going into halftime by a tally of 30-27. Northwestern came strong out of the locker room, taking a lead over the Fighting Illini as a Kopp layup made it 43-41 with 15:21 lead. Both squads' offenses went cold later in the second and the score sat at 54-53, Illinois lead, with just under four minutes to play. A close end of the contest brought the score to 61 points apiece. Turner was exceptional in the second half, scoring 16 points, including three three-pointers. NU came out strong in overtime, but Illinois made some opportune three-pointers to win, 74-69.

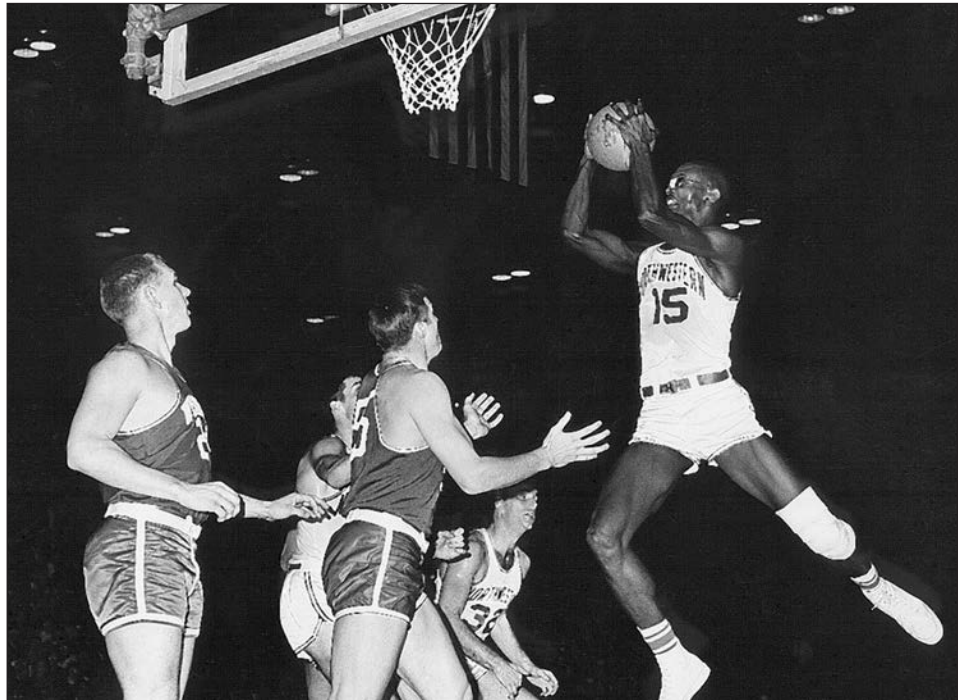

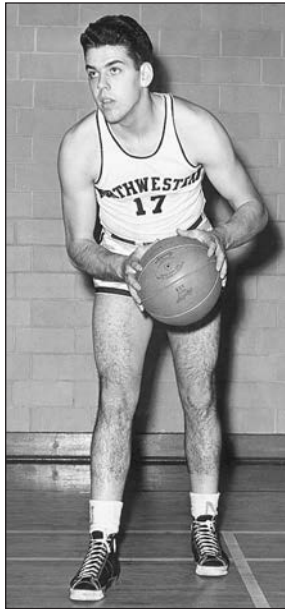






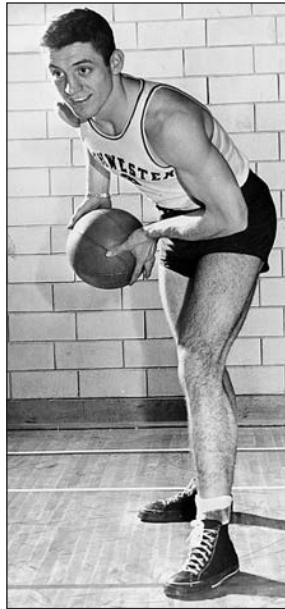
JOE REIFF

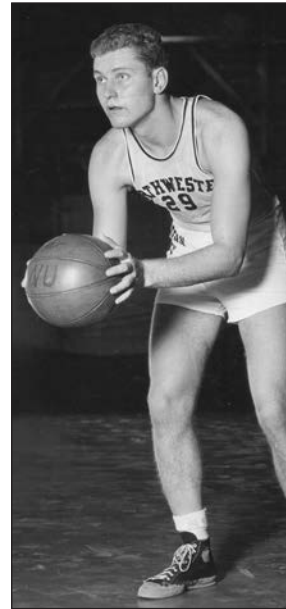
OTTO GRAHAM

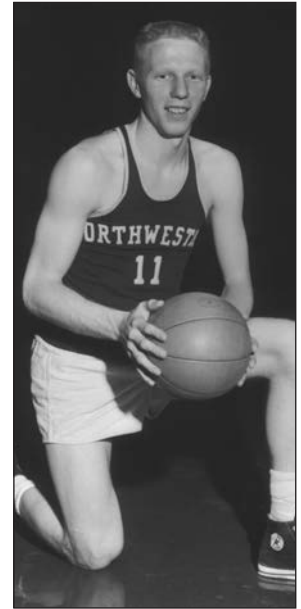
MAX MORRIS

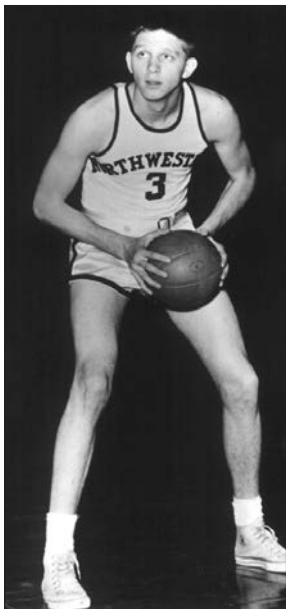
RAY RAGELIS

FORWARD • 1955

Frank Ehmann's scoring average of 23.9 points per game as a senior in 1954-55 is the second-best single-season mark in school history. He was a two-time team MVP and was inducted into Northwestern's Hall of Fame in 1987.



JOE RUKLICK
CENTER • 1958

Joe Ruklick led the 'Cats in both scoring and rebounding all three of his seasons on the varsity. His career scoring average of 19.9 points per game is tops in school history, while his average of 13.9 rebounds per game in 1958 is an NU season mark.



JIM BURNS
GUARD • 1967

Jim Burns enjoyed an outstanding senior season, leading the team with an average of 21.5 points per game. At the time his career ended, Burns was Northwestern's career scoring leader with 1,368 points in three seasons. He currently ranks 13th.

CENTER • 1999

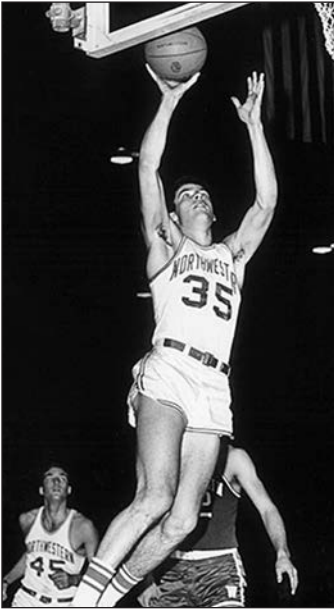

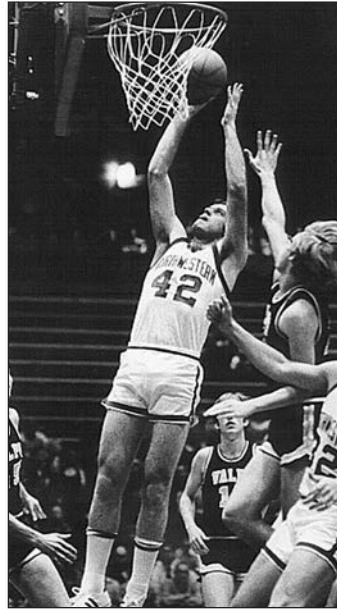

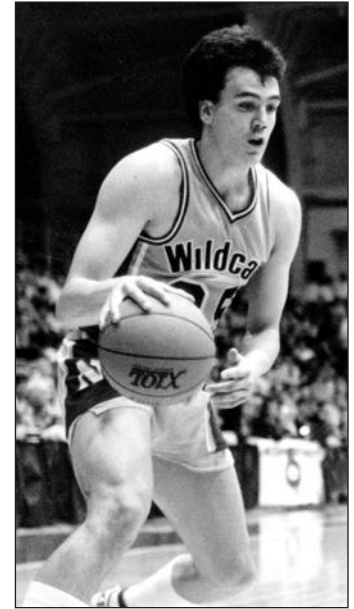

Shon Morris is NU's only three-time Academic All-American, and as a senior he was also Playboy Magazine's Anson Mount Scholar-Athlete of the Year.



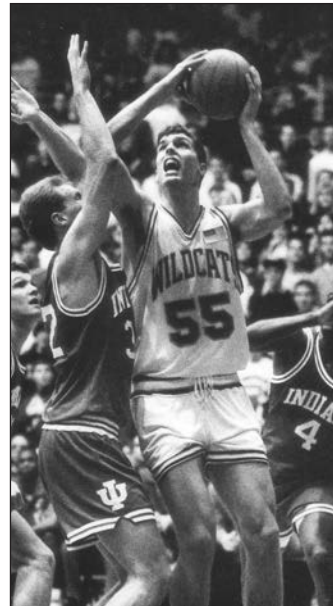
