BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- This week's conference schedule is highlighted by the 15th annual ACC/Big Ten Challenge that tips off Wednesday and continues Thursday. The latest matchup of two of the nation's top conferences is highlighted by 18 schools that competed in postseason play last year (ACC-10, Big Ten-8), including three NCAA Elite Eight qualifiers (Michigan, Louisville and NC State) and seven NCAA Sweet Sixteen participants (Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Ohio State, Louisville, North Carolina and NC State). Fans are invited to join the social media conversation for this year's ACC/Big Ten Challenge through the event's official hashtag (#WACCBB1G).
- The 2022 ACC/Big Ten Challenge will again offer one of the most robust television packages in the event's history, with 10 games on linear television and the other two streamed on B1G+ (visit bigtenplus.com for details) or ACC Network Extra. The Big Ten Network will once again provide doubleheader coverage on both Wednesday (Purdue-Syracuse and Minnesota-Wake Forest) and Thursday (Indiana-North Carolina and Michigan State-Georgia Tech), with ESPN2 adding a doubleheader on Thursday (Maryland-Notre Dame and Iowa-NC State). The ACC Network will also carry a doubleheader on both nights (Illinois-Pittsburgh and Ohio State-Louisville on Wednesday; Northwestern-Duke and Michigan-Miami on Thursday). All BTN games can also be seen on the FOX Sports app, while those on the ESPN and ACC networks are available on the ESPN app.
- Eight of the 14 games in this year's ACC/Big Ten Challenge will feature at least one school that is either ranked or receiving votes in one of the major national polls, including four top-20 matchups. On Wednesday, No. 4/5 Ohio State travels to No. 18/15 Louisville (7:30 p.m. ET on ACC Network), while on Thursday, No. 6/6 North Carolina visits No. 5/4 Indiana (6 p.m. ET on BTN), No. 20/21 Maryland heads to No. 7/7 Notre Dame (6:30 p.m. ET on ESPN2) and No. 12/11 NC State heads to No. 10/10 Iowa (8:30 p.m. ET on ESPN2).
- The Big Ten and ACC split the past two Challenges, with the Big Ten winning in 2019 (its first-ever victory by a 9-5 margin), and the ACC prevailing last season (10-4). Three other times, the Challenge has ended in a tie (6-6 in 2011, 7-7 in 2014 and 2015). The Big Ten schools with the most success in the Challenge are Maryland (12-2 all-time, 5-2 as a Big Ten member), Michigan (9-5) and Indiana (8-6).
- In recent seasons, the ACC/Big Ten Challenge has emerged as one of the more closely contested non-conference events in the country. The last four times the Challenge has been played, nearly two-thirds of the games (36 of 56) were decided by 11 points or fewer (seven in 2017, 10 in 2018, nine in 2019, 10 in 2021). In those four years, nine Challenge games decided by one possession and two going to overtime (2018 - Clemson def. Illinois, 69-67; 2019 - Michigan def. Syracuse, 84-76).
- Big Ten Conference have four wins over ranked opponents this season, including a pair of top-10 victories. Ohio State and Indiana both defeated top-10 foe Tennessee during the opening week of the season, while Maryland went on the road to defeat Baylor on Nov. 20, and Michigan then defeated Baylor on Sunday in the Gulf Coast Showcase championship game in Estero, Fla. The Big Ten currently ranks second among all conferences with four Top 25 wins to its credit this season.
- With wins by Ohio State and Indiana over Tennessee on Nov. 8 and 13, respectively, three different Big Ten Conference schools have earned five marquee top-five regular-season non-conference victories in the past four years. On Nov. 28, 2019, Indiana downed No. 5/6 South Carolina, 71-57 at the Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. A week later on Dec. 5, 2019, Ohio State ousted No. 2/2 Louisville, 67-60 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge at Value City Arena. More recently on Dec. 19, 2021, Michigan defeated No. 5/5 Baylor, 74-68 in overtime at the Basketball Hall of Fame Showcase in Uncasville, Conn., securing the Wolverines' first-ever top-five win.

BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- Penn State stayed unbeaten this season, improving to 7-0 with a 68-49 win over Fresno State Saturday at the Daytona Beach (Fla.) Invitational. The Lady Lions are off to their best start since 1996-97, when they also opened with a 7-0 record, while the seven-game winning streak is the Lady Lions' longest since Dec. 9, 2012-Jan. 27, 2013, when they won 11 in a row.
- Indiana also kept its record unblemished this season, going to 7-0 after its 79-64 win over Memphis on Nov. 26 to wrap up the Las Vegas Invitational. The 7-0 start continues to be the Hoosiers' second best opening to a season in head coach Teri Moren's nine years in Bloomington, topped only by a 10-0 start in 2018-19.
- Nebraska had to work an extra five minutes before downing Mississippi State, 73-65, in overtime on Nov. 26 at the Puerto Rico Clasico in San Juan, Puerto Rico. It was the Huskers' first overtime victory since Nov. 10, 2019, when they defeated another SEC opponent, Missouri, by a 90-85 count in Columbia, Mo.
- Although many of the Big Ten's wins to date this season have featured large margins, a handful have gone down to the wire and two have gone to overtime (Iowa winning at Drake, 92-86 on Nov. 13; Nebraska defeating Mississippi State, 73-65 on Saturday in San Juan, Puerto Rico). Since the start of the 2019-20 season, Big Ten teams are a combined 17-5 (.773) when going to overtime in non-conference regular season games and have won 12 of their last 14 OT contests against outside opposition.
- The Big Ten Conference remains tied for the national lead among all conferences with three top-10 and five top-25 teams in this week's Associated Press poll. The Big Ten also had three top-10 programs in the AP poll for seven weeks last season. In the latest media survey, Ohio State remains No. 4 (the Buckeyes' highest ranking since reaching the same No. 4 spot on Jan. 25, 2010), followed by Indiana, which moved up to No. 5 this week. Iowa is next at No. 10, with Michigan also on the rise to No. 17. Maryland rounds out the Big Ten contingent at No. 20.
- For the third consecutive week, the Big Ten shares the national lead with three top-10 schools and five top-25 teams in the WBCA/USA Today coaches' poll — No. 4 Indiana, No. 5 Ohio State, No. 10 Iowa, No. 20 Michigan and No. 21 Maryland, with Nebraska receiving votes. The Big Ten also had three top-10 teams in the coaches' poll for nine weeks last year, including the final poll after the NCAA Tournament.
- On Sunday, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame unveiled its Class of 2023 induction class, which will include two Big Ten Conference legends — former Purdue head coach Carolyn Peck, who led the Boilermakers to their first NCAA national championship in 1999, and current Minnesota head coach/former All-America guard Lindsay Whalen, who guided the Golden Gophers to their first NCAA Final Four berth in 2004 and was enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame back in September. Peck and Whalen will join 12 previous enshrinees with Big Ten ties, the most recent being former Ohio State All-America guard Katie Smith in 2018.
- As of Tuesday, the Big Ten leads all Division I conferences in scoring (78.0 ppg.), field-goal percentage (.458), three-point percentage (.338), assists (17.6 apg.) and steals (10.0 spg.).
- It's called "sharing the sugar", and so far this season, no conference has been sweeter when it comes to the assist game than the Big Ten. Nine conference schools rank among the top 25 in the country in assists, paced by Ohio State (1st - 21.8 apg.), Indiana (6th - 20.0 apg.) and Michigan State (10th - 19.2 apg.). Purdue senior guard Jeanae Terry is second in the country in assists (8.3 apg.) and has posted double-digit assist totals in three games this year, tying her career high with 12 in a Nov. 20 win over Indiana State.
- Ohio State became the eighth different Big Ten Conference school to score 100 points in a game this season, reaching that mark in its last two outings (105-52 vs. Wright State on Nov. 23; 105-67 vs. North Alabama on Sunday). The Buckeyes' performances further illustrate the trend in recent years of an exciting brand of up-tempo Big Ten basketball. This season, six Big Ten schools are averaging more than 80 points per game, and all rank among the nation's top 25 scoring offenses (including three of the top 10) reside in the Big Ten, led by Ohio State (3rd - 94.0 ppg.), Indiana (7th - 88.7 ppg.) and Iowa (10th - 86.0 ppg.).
- Ohio State also nabbed 19 steals on Nov. 23 against Wright State, the fifth consecutive game the Buckeyes have posted double-digit steals (OSU's longest such streak since December 2009). Ohio State currently is No. 1 in the country in turnovers forced (29.8 per game) and turnover margin (+16.83 per game), and second in steals (18.5 spg.).
- Big Ten programs have a 76-23 (.768) combined record this year, prevailing by an average margin of 27.4 points per game, with 33 of those wins by at least 30 points. Highlighting the Big Ten's success are four Top 25 wins (Ohio State vs. No. 5/4 Tennessee; Indiana at No. 11/4 Tennessee; Maryland at No. 17/17 Baylor; Michigan vs. No. 21/20 Baylor). Since the start of the 2019-20 season, Big Ten schools are a combined 345-112 (.755) in non-conference regular-season games, the best stretch in conference history.
- The Big Ten Network announced its Nov. 8 broadcast of No. 14/15 Ohio State defeating No. 5/4 Tennessee drew 100,498 viewers, ranking as the second-most watched women's basketball non-conference game in BTN history. The only higher-drawing game took place on Dec. 21, 2016, when 141,041 viewers tuned in for Nebraska's matchup with UConn at Pinnacle Bank Arena.
- The Big Ten Conference has rolled out a robust women's basketball television package for the 2022-23 season, with all 126 conference games nationally produced and distributed for the ninth consecutive season. All told, no less than 76 Big Ten women's basketball games are scheduled to be televised nationally by three of the conference's TV partners (Big Ten Network, FOX and ESPN). Included in this year's Big Ten television package are 62 games on BTN, nine games on ESPN networks (highlighted by the first regular-season Big Ten women's basketball game on ABC on Dec. 11 when Maryland hosts UConn), and five games on FOX or FS1, the first time the conference package has included games on the FOX broadcast network (and the third consecutive year Big Ten games will air on FS1).

- Went a perfect 10-for-10 from field in a Nov. 25 win over Auburn, scoring 26 points and grabbing 12 rebounds — her field-goal percentage was three made field goals shy of the Big Ten record, which she also shares (13-of-13 vs. Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 25, 2020)
- Tallied 27 points (12-15 FG) and five rebounds the following night in a victory over Memphis
- A two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree (2021, 2022) and a 2021 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar
- Earns her fourth career Big Ten Player of the Week award

Since its inception in 1896, the pursuit and attainment of academic excellence has been a priority for every Big Ten member institution. But maintaining the conference's standard of competing at the highest level in athletics also endures as an important component of the Big Ten experience. Striking that balance between academics and athletics is integral to the Big Ten's identity. Recognized as one of intercollegiate sports' most successful undertakings, the Big Ten strives for success from its students not only on the field and in the classroom, but around the world as well.

PREMIER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 70 universities in the nation according to the 2022 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including six in the top 30.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,900 Academic All-Americans, including 48 honorees during the 2021-22 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Big Ten schools have won at least five national championships in 24 of the last 28 years, averaging nearly seven per year during that span.

Since the 2005-06 academic year, current Big Ten institutions have claimed 109 team national championships in 26 different sports.

BROAD-BASED PROGRAMMING

The Big Ten will administer more than \$240 million in direct financial support to more than 9,800 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on 350 teams in 42 different sports.

The Big Ten sponsors 28 official conference sports, 14 for men and 14 for women, including the addition of men's ice hockey and men's and women's lacrosse in this decade.

The Big Ten leads the nation in total students competing in intercollegiate athletics and participation opportunities, and sponsors more official sports than all conferences except the Ivy League.

More than 1,500 Big Ten competitors have participated in the Olympics, winning more than 500 medals, including more than 200 gold. The Big Ten Conference enjoyed its finest performance at a single Olympic Games during the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo, Japan, as athletes with Big Ten ties set conference records by earning 51 total medals and 22 gold medals during the 17-day competition. All 14 Big Ten member schools had an athlete win at least one medal in Tokyo, also a first in conference history. Big Ten Olympians collected nearly 80 medals in the most recent games in PyeongChang and Beijing.

PASSIONATE FOLLOWING

The Big Ten leads all conferences with 6.4 million alumni and nearly 580,000 students.

Each year more than 11 million patrons attend Big Ten home contests, as the conference has led the nation in attendance for men's basketball, ice hockey, volleyball and wrestling.

LEADERS IN INNOVATION

Took part in the nation's first bowl game, winning the 1902 Rose Bowl Game, and signed an exclusive contract with the Tournament of Roses in 1946, making it the first bowl with permanent conference affiliations.

Awarded the first Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1915, honoring outstanding seniors who demonstrated excellence in academics and athletics.

Formed the Big Ten Advisory Commission in 1972, enlisting former students that competed in conference athletics to serve as liaisons to the NCAA's Diversity and Inclusion Department, the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Commission and other organizations.

Became the first conference to voluntarily adopt male and female participation goals after launching its Gender Equity Action Plan in 1992.

Implemented the first collegiate football system of instant replay in 2004, which the NCAA approved for use among all conferences in 2006.

Launched the Big Ten Network (BTN) in 2007, the first national conference-owned television network.

Began partnering with the Ivy League to study the effects of head injuries in sports in 2012.

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively, and added Notre Dame as a sport affiliate member in men's ice hockey in 2017.

EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, more than 2,000 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in almost 60 million homes across the United States and Canada, and is also available via the Fox Sports App, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. B1G+ streams hundreds of additional events each season.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 30 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation and other events such as the Big Ten Career Expo, SaturDAY of Service and Youth Football Clinics. In addition, the Big Ten has hosted a downtown 5K, collaborated with a local breast cancer awareness group and provided unique event experiences for military veterans.
