Offensive Player Of The Week

Nick DePuy • UC Santa Barbara

The Big West Men's Soccer Offensive Player of the Week award went to UC Santa Barbara junior Nick DePuy, who notched three goals in three matches.

His first two goals came in a road showdown with UCLA, fueling a 4-1 rout at Drake Stadium on Monday. The Gauchos registered their first ever road win against the Bruins. Both of DePuy's goals resulted via the header as he tied the score at 1-1 in the 38th minute, and registered the game-winner in the 57th.

DePuy posted his third goal of the week in a 4-0 shutout of San Diego on Sunday. The goal was his 16th in 22 career appearances since moving to forward midway through the 2014 season.

UCSB also continued to benefit from DePuy's offensive presence. The Gauchos are now 11-0-3 in games in which DePuy scores a goal.

Defensive Player Of The Week

Adam Hobbs • CSUN

Notching his third shutout of the season and 12th of his career, CSUN senior Adam Hobbs racked up his first Big West Men's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week honor.

Hobbs stonewalled a penalty kick attempt by San Diego in the 86th minute to preserve the lead in an eventual 1-0 victory. It was the second-straight game that he thwarted a PK effort.

He made six saves against the Toreros to secure his second consecutive shutout win. He also moved into fifth in school history with 162 career saves. CSUN's defense has yielded just one goal in the run of play over its last 512 minutes.

CSUN also improved to 3-0 this season against West Coast Conference opponents with all three victories coming on the road.

Momentum: Cal Poly finished out its non-conference slate with a second consecutive win, a 2-0 shutout at Loyola Marymount. The Mustangs enter Big West action at 5-2-1, marking the fourth straight year the program has registered an above .500 non-conference record.

Hamilton Enters Top 10: Senior goalkeeper Wade Hamilton tallied his 28th career win in the shutout of Loyola Marymount, moving him into a tie for No. 10 all-time in Big West history for total victories. He is two victories shy of becoming just the ninth backstop in league history to reach the 30-win plateau.

On Top Early: The Mustangs have scored first in seven of eight matches, and are 5-1-1 in those games.

Nifty Stat: Cal Poly is 3-0 this season when scoring multiple goals. Dating back to the start of the 2013 campaign, the Mustangs have registered a 19-2-1 mark when scoring two or more goals in a match.

Sanchez Productive: Sophomore Diego Sanchez has recorded at least one point in five of the last seven games, and at least one goal in four of the last six. The Titans are 4-1-0 this season when Sanchez tallies at least one point.

Quick Start Needed: Cal State Fullerton hosts Sacramento State to open Big West action on Thursday. The Titans are seeking to halt a four-game losing streak in conference season openers. CSF last won a league opener in 2010.

Shutout City: Led by the steady goalkeeping play of junior David Elias, the Titans lead the Big West with four shutouts.

On A Roll: Sacramento State blanked its second straight West Coast Conference opponent, earning a 2-0 win at Saint Mary's on Sunday after a 1-0 clean sheet versus Pacific last week. The Hornets are 3-1-1 over their last five games entering Big West play.

Recipe For Success: Dating back to last season, the Hornets are unbeaten in the last nine games (6-0-3) in which they allow one or zero goals.

Mad Bum For The Win: Redshirt freshman Brad Bumgarner scored his team-leading third goal in the Saint Mary's win. It was his second-straight game-winner. Bumgarner now has three goals on just four shots on goal this season.

Roadies: The Hornets posted a 3-2-0 Big West road record last year, and look to continue that success with away battles this week against Cal State Fullerton and UC Riverside.

A Nose For The Goal: Sacramento State's 10 goals through eight games this year is on pace to better its 2014 total of 18 goals in 20 contests. The Hornets are on an uptick offensively after scoring just 11 goals in all of 2013.

Busting Loose: UC Davis has reeled off 11 goals in its last three games, outscoring those opponents 11-2 to take a three-game winning streak into conference action. It represents the most goals scored over a three-game stretch

since Sept. 7-14, 2007 when the Aggies collected a combined 12 goals against Oregon State, Portland and IPFW.

What A Turnaround: After having scored just one goal through their first three matches, the Aggies proceeded to tally 16 goals over their next six, and now rank second in the Big West (17) in the category. UC Davis is doing it mostly with balance, as 10 different players have found the scoring column.

Shine Lucas Shine: Senior Lucas Mohageg has scored a goal in five of the last six matches, and his five goals tie him for second in the Big West. He already has eclipsed last year's total of four goals with an entire league slate ahead of him.

Congrats: Sophomore Evan Barrett scored his first career goal in Sunday's 3-1 win over San Francisco.

Thrill Of Victory: UC Irvine broke a six-game winless streak with gusto in last Thursday's 4-1 blitzing of Loyola Marymount. The four-goal outburst is something that UCI accomplished just once last season, and for just the second time since 2011.

The last four-goal output for UCI inside Anteater Stadium was Sept. 23, 2011 versus UNLV (4-0).

And The Agony Of Defeat: On the heels of the LMU victory, the Anteaters were in solid position to hand UCLA its third loss against a Big West opponent in 2015. The Bruins were reduced to 10 men just 13 minutes into the match when one of their players was issued a red card. UCI built a 3-0 second-half lead with 24 minutes to play, but watched UCLA score three goals in succession to tie the score, including the equalizer with 10 seconds left in regulation. UCLA completed the comeback with an overtime goal and a 4-3 victory.

Offense Rediscovered: UCI's offense produced just three goals through the first seven games. With seven goals in the last two outings, the Anteaters have their highest back-to-back goals output since scoring a combined seven versus Wisconsin and Illinois-Chicago in 2011.

He ranks ninth in career shutouts (23) and minutes played (6,155) fourth in wins (36), and is tied for seventh in total matches in goal (66). Breslin also stands to make a dent in all-time saves.
