Offensive Player Of The Week

Cynthia Sanchez • CSUN
SO. • 5-2 • Forward •

CSUN sophomore Cynthia Sanchez (Gilroy, Calif./Gilroy HS) provided her fourth game-winning goal of the year and established career single-game highs for points and shots in a match, earning Big West Women's Soccer Offensive Player of the Week recognition.

After going three straight contests without a point, Sanchez erupted with two goals and an assist to fuel CSUN's 4-3 come-from-behind win at San Jose State on Sunday.

Down 2-0 at intermission, Sanchez assisted on CSUN's first goal to cut the Spartan lead in half.

With San Jose State leading 3-2, this time Sanchez dented the scoreboard, waiting until the 75th minute to convert from the right wing and level the score again.

Sanchez notched her second goal of the match, and fourth game-winner of the year, nearly five minutes later when she collected a rebound of her own shot and deposited it into the goal.

Sanchez's five points and seven shots set new career highs. Her two goals represented her second brace of the season. She is tied for the Big West lead with eight goals.

Defensive Player Of The Week

Earning her third career Big West Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week award, Cal Poly senior Alyssa Giannetti (Yorba Linda, Calif./Esperanza HS) posted a 0.45 goals against average over two matches.

The netminder made a combined total of 11 saves against Dayton and No. 13 California to complete an impressive week in which she earned her 18th career shutout, including three shared.

Giannetti made five stops in a 4-1 victory over Atlantic 10 Conference preseason favorite Dayton on Friday. In Sunday's matchup with the nationally-ranked Bears, Giannetti stonewalled six tries on frame as the Mustangs settled for a scoreless draw.

Giannetti's save percentage of .892 and goals against average of 0.73 are both on pace to rank third in Cal Poly single-season annals over the course of the program's 24-year history.

Stalemate Versus Ranked Cal: Cal Poly hosted No. 13 California and held the Bears scoreless through two overtime periods. Sunday marled the Mustangs' third match with a top 25 club and

moved to 0-2-1 versus those opponents. CP also picked up a 4-1 win over Dayton earlier last weekend in Alex G. Spanos Stadium.

Final Non-Conference Swing: The Mustangs host Brigham Young Thursday before traveling south to face the Pepperdine waves. The Mustangs look to pick up their first win against a West Coast Conference opponent this season as they are 0-0-2 so far against programs in that league.

Giannetti Approaches Record: With 58 saves so far in the season, senior goalkeeper Alyssa Giannetti's 343 career stops is fourth-best in league history. The goalie is 56 saves away from tying the Big West best. The senior is also close to breaking the CP record for starts. Her 67 consecutive starts is six away from setting a new mark.

Titan Tough: Cal State Fullerton returns to the pitch this weekend with two games at Titan Stadium after a week-long hiatus. CSF will host Loyola Marymount and San Diego in its final outings before conference play.

Unfamiliar Defeat: The dropped contest to Washington State marks the first loss for Fullerton since Nov. 14, 2014 to Stanford in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Sunday marked the first regular season loss for the Titans since Sept. 28, 2014 at San Diego. Sunday was the first time the Titans trailed in 769 minutes of play.

Bertsch Steps Up: Sophomore goalkeeper Morgan Bertsch appeared in seven matches and made five starts in her inaugural campaign and has three starts under her belt in 2015. The sophomore boasts a 1.01 goals against average in 355:06 minutes of play while recording a shutout for a 2-1-1 overall record. Junior Jennifer Stuart last appeared on Sept. 4 in the Titans' 4-3 win over FGCU. Stuart is 4-0-0 on the year.

#BWCWords: Coach Keith West on the comeback W - "The team showed a lot of character to comeback from two goals and also from two different deficits. Most teams would wilt after falling behind a second time after tying a match, but we didn't break today. We were able to score that first goal and we kept coming after that."

Four Scores: The four goals scored Sunday in the second half of action is the most in a half since Oct. of 2012 against then Big West member, Pacific. CSUN's 22 scores on the year are the most in league. The Matadors' collective 18 assists also set a conference-mark in the category while 70 shots top all Big West opponents in 2015.
