History

About The Big West Conference

The Big West Conference enters the 2006-07 season in its 38th year of operation. There are 17 conference-sponsored sports in the Big West. Women's sports are comprised of soccer, volleyball, cross country, swimming and diving, basketball, golf, tennis, softball and track and field. Men's sports include soccer, cross country, swimming and diving, basketball, golf, tennis, baseball and track and field.

Over the past three decades, the conference has striven for athletic and academic success, and has accomplished those goals to a large degree. The conference has undergone membership changes throughout its long history, the most recent of which has significantly enhanced its stability.

Following the 2004-05 academic year, Idaho and Utah State left the Big West, creating an eight-team league comprised of all California schools: Cal Poly, Cal State Fullerton, Cal State Northridge, Long Beach State, UC Irvine, UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara and Pacific. A ninth school from the Golden State – UC Davis – is currently in the final year of a four-year process of transitioning from Division II to Division I and officially joins the Big West at the start of the 2007-08 season.

Regardless of the membership makeup, the Big West has stacked up well against the rest of the nation. In fact, the conference has claimed 17 team national championships in its history, including six in women's volleyball, two in baseball, one in softball and one in men's basketball. The latest national championship occurred just this past fall when UC Santa Barbara men's soccer team hoisted the trophy. Big West athletes also have claimed several titles on an individual basis in such sports as swimming, track and field and golf.

The Big West also fared well in the 2006 United States Sports Academy Directors Cup, which gauges the best overall collegiate athletic programs, with three league schools finishing in the top 100. Cal State Fullerton finished in a tie for 73rd, Long Beach State came in 89th and UC Santa Barbara was tied for 92nd.

On a worldwide scale, Big West athletes also have competed in the Olympics. A sampling of athletes who have competed at the Olympic level include Long Beach State's Tara Cross-Battle, Tayyiba Haneef and Danielle Scott (women's indoor volleyball), and Misty May (women's beach volleyball); UC Santa Barbara's Jason Lezak (men's swimming), Cal State Fullerton's Leon Wood (men's basketball) and Jenny Topping (softball); Pacific's Elaina Oden (women's volleyball) and Brad Schumacher (men's swimming) and UC Irvine's Steve Scott (men's track and field).

Big West Success Found In All Sports

The 2005-06 campaign proved successful once again for the Big West Conference with 19 teams continuing play well into the postseason, which included 11 NCAA automatic bids, eight NCAA at-large berths and one WNIT bid. In addition, six of the eight round robin sports (women's volleyball, men's and women's soccer, women's basketball, baseball and softball) sent multiple teams to the postseason, with the sport of softball leading the way with three teams. Also, all eight schools represented the Big West in postseason play in at least one sport.

The year was highlighted by the Cal State Fullerton's baseball team making its 14th trip to the College World Series and the Cal State Fullerton women's soccer team and Cal State Northridge men's soccer team both advancing to the third round (Sweet 16) of their respective NCAA Championships.

The Titan baseball squad, one of two Big West programs making the tournament, would battle its way to the Final Four before being eliminated by the North Carolina Tar Heels, ending its attempt for the fifth National Championship in school history. UC Irvine was the other Big West school to receive an NCAA bid. It was the Anteaters' second visit to the postseason in the past three years. Cal State Fullerton's Friday-night starter, Wes Roemer, was tabbed Collegiate Baseball Co-National Player of the Year with outfielder Kellen Kulbacki of James Madison. Roemer became the second Big West player in the last three seasons to earn the prestigious honor.

Cal State Fullerton and UC Riverside received bids to the 2005 NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, marking the first time that two teams were selected to the postseason in the Big West's 10-year history of sponsoring the sport. The Titans also established another first for the conference in earning the right to host the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament at Titan Stadium.

Cal State Fullerton advanced to the third round for the first time in school and conference history, while UC Riverside was eliminated after the first round. As a conference, the Big West finished fourth out of 30 conferences in the season-ending Women's Soccer Ratings Percentage Index (RPI). The ranking is an all-time best for the league and continues to show a trend of improvement for the sport of women's soccer in the conference, following finishes at No. 14 in 2002, No. 12 in 2003 and No. 10 in 2004.

On the men's side, Cal State Northridge and UC Santa Barbara were chosen to participate in the 2005 Division I NCAA Men's Soccer Championship. The Matadors received a first-round bye before winning their first Division I postseason game and knocking off conference foe UCSB to advance to the third round. UC Santa Barbara shut-out San Diego State, 2-0, before facing CSUN in the second round.

Representing the Big West in the 2005 NCAA Volleyball Tournament were Long Beach State and UC Santa Barbara. The tradition-rich Gauchos are tied with Stanford and Penn State for the most consecutive postseason appearances with 25, while the 49ers aren't far behind at 19 straight trips to the tournament.

While men's and women's basketball each sent one team to the NCAA Tournament, with Pacific (men) and UC Riverside (women), the Gauchos of UC Santa Barbara earned a berth to the WNIT, extending their streak of postseason play to 11 years. The Tigers (24-8), who compiled three straight 20-plus win seasons for the first time in school history, earned the conference's automatic bid after defeating Long Beach State in the Big West Men's Basketball Tournament. On the women's side, the Highlanders received the league's automatic bid after defeating nine-time defending tournament champion UC Santa Barbara, 59-58, sending them to the

Big Dance for the first time in school history.

Big West softball finished up another solid season with three representatives in the NCAA Championship. Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State and UC Santa Barbara continued the league's trend of sending multiple teams to the postseason, a string that has not been broken in all 22 years the Big West has sponsored the sport. Although all three schools were ousted in the NCAA Regionals, the Big West remained one of the top softball conferences in the nation thanks to its strength from top to bottom. Six of the seven members posted winning records in 2006.

The Long Beach State women and UC Santa Barbara men earned the conference's automatic qualifiers for the 2006 NCAA Men's and Women's Tennis Championships. Long Beach State made its third consecutive NCAA appearance and fourth overall, while UC Santa Barbara appeared in its sixth NCAA Tournament. Joining the 49er and Gaucho squads were Pacific senior Arnar Sigurdsson and Long Beach State freshmen Hannah Grady and Jessica Weeks, who earned entries into the 64-person 2006 NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Individual Tennis Championships.

Men's and women's golf also contributed to the conference's grand total of postseason participants, each grabbing two bids. On the women's side, UC Irvine, making its third team appearance in just five years of the program's existence, earned the conference's automatic bid to NCAA Regionals by winning the Big West Championship in grand fashion. The Anteaters out-distanced themselves from the rest of the field by 43 strokes. Long Beach State's selection as an at-large bid to the 21-team regional field was a first-time accomplishment for the program.

The Cal Poly and UC Irvine men's golf teams represented the Big West at the NCAA West Regional, while Long Beach State junior Ryan Wood competed for the Big West as an individual. Cal Poly earned the conference's automatic berth, while the Anteaters received an at-large bid for their fifth trip in six years. The story during the Big West Golf Championships had to be Long Beach State's Ryan Panichpakdee's final round. Panichpakdee shot a course record 62 on his way to a 16-under par for the tournament.

Individually, the Big West enjoyed another impressive season with a total of 29 student-athletes competing in the NCAA finals (18 track & field, 7 swimming & diving, 2 women's tennis, 1 men's golf, 1 men's tennis). Of those athletes, eight returned home with All-America status. As a whole (round robin and individual), the Big West garnered 20 All-America honors in nine different sports. Men's and women's track & field nabbed six national accolades, with baseball a close second with five honorees. Student-athletes competing in volleyball, softball, men's and women's soccer and men's and women's swimming & diving were also tabbed with All-America status.



The Beginning

The Big West Conference was formed as the Pacific Coast Athletic Association on July 1, 1969. However, the unofficial history of the conference pre-dates that point of time, extending back to 1967.

Cal State LA, Fresno State, Long Beach State and San Diego State were members of the California Collegiate Athletic Association, long recognized as the nation's premier college circuit.

That conference was classified college division, and therein lay a major source of dissatisfaction. Since 1963, the four institutions had captured 16 national titles. The number swelled to 21 if the mythical football championships were included.

With no more territory to conquer at the college division, a step up to university ranks had to be considered.

At the time, San Jose State, UC Santa Barbara and Pacific were members of the West Coast Athletic Conference but were enduring a strained relationship due to the limit of conference sports sponsored. That, plus the fact that national football figures UOP and SJSU were already competing as independents, led the schools to pursue a more broad-based conference alignment.

Therefore, officials of the seven colleges and universities assembled as a body in May of 1969, tied up loose ends and less than two months later the PCAA was born.

Direction in the early days of the conference came from such men as Dr. Stephen Goodspeed, vice-chancellor at UC Santa Barbara, the first president and chairman of the founders committee. J. Kenneth Fagans provided guidance as the league's first commissioner. Jesse T. Hill, one of the nation's most successful directors of athletics at USC, followed Fagans as the conference's first full-time commissioner.

SJSU was already labeled a university division school in all sports when the PCAA emerged. San Diego State and Pacific were granted university division status in the summer of 1970 and the remaining conference members shed the college division moniker by 1972.

The original PCAA lineup changed in the early years and by 1975, charter members UCSB and CSLA had dropped football and SDSU left the conference in football only. In 1974, Cal State Fullerton moved into the conference. By 1977, UC Irvine joined the Big West and UCSB was back in — both as non-football playing institutions — while Utah State became the first non-California member of the circuit, transforming the PCAA into a regional conference.

UNLV (1981) and New Mexico State (1984) soon followed suit, bringing the league's membership to 10 universities.

In the fall of 1983, the PCAA became the first western conference to incorporate women's athletic programs into the conference. Charter women's members UC Irvine, UC Santa Barbara and UNLV competed in five championships.

By the end of 1985, Pacific, Hawai'i, Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, San Diego State, Fresno State and San Jose State had joined the women's conference. The PCAA upped its women's sponsorship to eight championships.

The PCAA began its 20th year of existence in 1988 by changing its name to the Big West Conference. With the inclusion of the states of Utah, Nevada, and New Mexico, the term "Big West" more accurately represented the conference. Since the name Big West has been used, conference teams have won nine NCAA team championships, establishing the Big West's winning identity that is recognized nationally. Even though the Big West is again an all-California conference, the name Big West still embodies the identity, history, and tradition of excellence the conference has achieved, making it a well-known entity in collegiate athletics.

The 2006-07 academic year marks the 15th year in Dennis Farrell's tenure as commissioner of the Big West Conference, but twenty-seventh season on staff. He is the fourth full-time commissioner in the 38-year history of the Big West, following Jess Hill (1972-78), Lew Cryer (1978-88) and Jim Haney (1988-92).

Prior to assuming the role of commissioner on July 1, 1992, Farrell served the conference in various capacities as an assistant/associate commissioner since joining the conference in 1980. During his Big West tenure, Farrell has acted as the primary rule interpreter, championship administrator, schedule coordinator and director of the league's successful postseason basketball tournament.

Farrell has been active in representing the Big West on both the national and regional level. From 1994 to 1997 he served on the important NCAA Council and from 1991 to 1997 he sat on the NCAA Two-Year College Relations Committee (including serving as its chair from 1992 to 1995). He currently serves as the Division I-AAA Vice President of the Collegiate Commissioners Association and is chair of the NCAA Baseball Issues Committee. Farrell also is presently a member of the Los Angeles Sports Council which is active in securing, marketing and administering major athletic events for the Southern California area.

Before joining the Big West, Farrell was the sports information director for nearly three years at Saddleback Community College in Mission Viejo, Calif. A 1974 graduate of San Diego State University, Farrell worked for the Daily Californian newspaper in El Cajon and radio station KDEO while attending college. From 1975 to 1977, he was employed as sports editor of the Saddleback Valley News in Mission Viejo. He also worked in the sports department of the Orange County edition of the Los Angeles Times.

Farrell and his wife, Charlene, reside in Coto de Caza with their sons, Timothy and Michael.

Rob Halvaks is in his 15th season with the conference office. Halvaks is responsible for office and financial administration, is the tournament director for the Big West Men's and Women's Basketball Tournament, and has sports management responsibilities for men's and women's basketball and baseball. Halvaks is a member of the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet. He is also the conference's staff liaison to the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation.

She lives in Costa Mesa with her husband Brian.





About The Mustangs

- Cal Poly (29-27) was one win shy of posting its third consecutive 30-plus win season. The Mustangs ended the season in fourth place in the Big West with a 10-11 record.

- The Mustangs opened the 2006 season with a 9-2 record, which was the best start since the 1997 season and the second best start since going Division I.

- In 2006 Cal Poly won seven of its first eight games against teams ranked in the top 25, including a season-opening sweep of then-No. 21 Fresno State. But the Mustangs their final five games against ranked opponents -- two to Oregon State and all three games of a Big West series against Cal State Fullerton by a total of five runs.

- The Mustangs return 19 letterwinners from last season, including All-Big West Honorable Mention selection Grant Desme. Cal Poly will rely on the veterans to replace the void of powerhouses Josh Lansford and Jimmy Van Ostrand. Lansford led the squad with a .353 batting average, while Van Ostrand tallied a team-high .561 slugging percentage and recorded a conference-high 13 home runs.

- Cal Poly is ranked 20th in *Collegiate Baseball*'s annual rundown of NCAA Division I baseball recruiting classes. Five of the Mustang recruits have been drafted and six of the 10 high school recruits were on the final 2005 Area Code Team. The four draftees are outfielder Luke Yoder, outfielder Logan Schafer, left-handed pitcher Tommy Palica and right-handed pitcher Marc Nobriga. In addition to Yoder and Berlind, shortstop Kyle Smith, catcher/first baseman Wes Dorrell, outfielder DJ Gentile, and right-handed pitcher Steven Fischback all made the final 2005 Area Code Team.


- During the 2007 season, the Cal Poly Mustangs will face six teams that participated in the 2006 NCAA Tournament., including three of the last four College World Series champions in 2007. The Mustangs host 2006 champion Oregon State in March and 2004 title winner Cal State Fullerton in May while visiting 2003 winner Rice in March.

- Cal Poly lost a record six players to the Major League Baseball draft last June and two other players signed free-agent contracts. Three other seniors completed their eligibility last spring, leaving numerous holes to fill in 2007. The Mustangs lost all three starting pitchers, their closer and five of the eight position starters.

- Cal Poly is still looking for its first-ever NCAA Division I postseason playoff berth. The Mustangs, ranked as high as No. 22 by Baseball America last season after sprinting to a 9-2 start, won just seven of its next 19 games, dropping out of the polls, and finished the year winning just 20 of its last 45 games. Cal Poly was 36-20 in 2005 and finished tied for second place in the Big West but was denied a playoff bid.





5th Season

Larry Lee enters his fifth season as the Cal Poly Mustangs' skipper. Over the four-year span he has accumulated a 130-98-2 record.

Last season Cal Poly was one win shy of posting its third consecutive 30-plus win season at 29-27. The Mustangs' 10-11 Big West record earned them a fourth place finish.

In 2005, Lee guided the Mustang squad to its best Big West finish in school history, after tying Long Beach State for second place with a 14-7 record. Overall, Cal Poly concluded the year with back-to-back 30-plus win seasons.


In his second year at the Cal Poly helm, Lee set a school record for wins in a Division I season with 2004's 38-23-1 mark. In his first season with Cal Poly, Lee helped the Mustangs to their second straight fourth-place finish in the Big West with a 28-12-1 overall record.

Lee came to the Mustangs program on July 22, 2002, after 16 seasons as head coach at Cuesta College, where he led the Cougars to four trips to the California Community College State Final Four (1992, 1997, 2001, 2002). Lee pushed Cuesta to the Southern California Regionals in his last six years with the program to lift his total to 11.

Under Lee's leadership, Cuesta claimed nine Western State Conference titles, including the last six in a row, and averaged 38 wins during that six-year stretch. His teams produced a 267-119 record in conference games.

Before becoming head coach at Cuesta College in 1987, Lee served as an assistant coach for the Cougars for two seasons and at Cal Poly for one. Lee earned a bachelor's degree in physical education/kinesiology from Pepperdine in 1983 and a master's degree in physical education from Cal Poly in 1985 as well as an adaptive physical education credential from Cal Poly in 1988.

- Cal State Fullerton, boasting an 18-3 conference record, claimed its third consecutive Big West title and earned the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, making it the Titans' 14th consecutive postseason appearance. The 2006 season marked the 28th year the Titans have competed in the NCAA postseason - 20th time as a member of the Big West.

- Cal State Fullerton advanced to the College World Series unscathed. Fullerton rolled through a Regional and Super Regional at Goodwin Field, winning five straight games by a combined score of 41-8. At the CWS the Titans knocked off ACC powers Georgia Tech and Clemson, but fell short to North Carolina and became the fifth team to say good-bye to Omaha.

- Justin Turner, Danny Dorn and David Cooper were named to the College World Series All-Tournament Team. Dorn, along with Blake Davis, Brandon Tripp, Lauren Gagnier and Wes Roemer grabbed Fullerton Regional All-Tournament honors.

- The Titans concluded the 2006 season with their eighth consecutive 35-plus win season at 50-15.

- The Titan trio of Wes Roemer, Lauren Gagnier and Dustin Miller spearheaded a pitching squad that produced the nation's lowest team ERA at 2.73 with three 12-game winners. The 2006 *Collegiate Baseball* Co-National Player of the Year, Roemer, is the lone returnee from the impressive threesome. Roemer finished the season 13-2 with a 2.38 earned run average as the Friday-night starter. He registered 145 strikeouts in 155 innings pitched, while giving up just seven walks.

- With the Titans returning only four position starters from last season's squad, Cal State Fullerton will need to replace its power numbers created by the departures of All-American Justin Turner, Blake Davis and Danny Dorn. Turner rewrote the Big West record book in career games (253), at bats (1,008) and hits (331). In 2006 he led the conference in hits (102) and total bases (141), while also leading the team in batting average and RBI. Davis scored a conference-high 64 runs and tied Dorn for the team's second-best batting average at .351.

- While Roemer is set to headline the pitching staff, senior Evan McArthur will be the front-runner at the plate this season. He enters the year as the Titans' top returning hitter from last season with a .303 batting average. The 2006 All-Big West honorable mention selection recorded 69 hits, ninth best in the conference, scored 44 runs and drove in an additional 36.

- Cal State Fullerton who opens with a three-game home-series against Stanford, is scheduled to face seven teams that advanced to postseason play just a season ago.


- Cal State Fullerton led all Big West schools with nine selections in the 2006 MLB Amateur Draft, including junior Blake Davis, who was taken in the fourth round by the Baltimore Orioles.
- Cal State Fullerton baseball's recruiting effort has been rewarded with a pair of top ten rankings by the two major college baseball publications. The Titans' incoming class, assembled by Recruiting Coordinator and Assistant Coach Jason Gill, has been ranked eighth by *Collegiate Baseball*, while *Baseball America* has it one spot lower at ninth in the nation.

- With 188 Big West career wins, head coach George Horton moved into a second-place tie with former Fresno State coach Bob Bennett in all-time conference career victories.



Under the tutelage of George Horton through the past 10 seasons, the Cal State Fullerton baseball program continues to be regarded as one of the nation's elite. Horton and his Titans have claimed three consecutive Big West titles, while tallying four consecutive 40-plus win seasons, two of which reached the 50-win plateau. Their 2006 conference win propelled them into the NCAA Tournament for the 14th consecutive year. They advanced to the College World Series undefeated in the tournament before stumbling against North Carolina and became the fifth team eliminated. For his efforts, Horton received his fifth Big West Coach of the Year accolade - the most of any Big West coach.

In 2004, Horton led the Titans to their fourth - and his first - NCAA National Championship.

In leading Cal State Fullerton to its 12th trip to the College World Series in 2004, Horton solidified himself as one of nine men to reach the heralded Omaha stage as a player and a head coach. That year the Titans went on to be crowned National Champions.

Horton added Collegiate Baseball's 2004 National Coach of the Year honor to his laundry list of accolades that include Baseball America's 2003 National Coach of the Year and five Big West Conference Coach of the Year titles (1998, 1999, 2004, 2005, 2006).

During his tenure, Horton has seen over 60 Titans selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. With his 452 career victories, he moves into fourth all-time among Big West coaches.



Horton began his head coaching career at Cerritos College, where he led his teams to three junior college state championships (1985, 1987, 1989) in six years. He compiled a 226-53 record and was selected National Junior College Coach of the Year in each of those title seasons.

With a 26-30 record, Cal State Northridge surpassed the prior year's mark of 18-36-1 and for the first time in four years the Matadors tallied more than 20 wins. Their 6-15 Big West record showcased the most conference wins in three years.

The Matadors 6-2 record to open the 2006 season was the best start under head coach Steve Rousey. Cal State Northridge compiled a nonconference record of 20-15, with five of those losses coming against ranked opponents.

Chuckie Fick and Edwin Quirarte return to the mound this season without the arm of All-Big West pitcher Craig Baker. In 15 starts, Fick (6-7) registered a 4.48 ERA in 90.1 innings pitched. Quirarte held a 4.50 ERA in 18 appearances, 13 starts.


With a crop of junior college transfers, the coaching staff has several new weapons at their disposal this season, including righties Eric Billings, Mark Haderlein, Phil Hann and Steven DeFratus, and southpaw Josh Herback-South. Freshman Billy Ott will also contribute on the bump.

The Matadors return Jorge Andrade and Jonathan Sakurai to the 2007 lineup. Andrade is the team's top returner after firing a .320 batting average. He produced 34 runs and 19 RBI, while tallying a team-high .990 field percentage at the catcher position. Starting 55 of the Matadors' 56 contests, Sakurai scored a team-high 45 runs for seventh best in the conference.

Cal State Northridge's 2007 schedule showcases five teams that advanced to the 2006 NCAA Tournament. With nonconference series at Washington and Texas Tech and home contests against Washington State, Oklahoma State and UNLV, the Matadors once again have a loaded slate ahead of them this season.



Steve Rousey enters his fifth season as head coach for Cal State Northridge after posting a 26-30 overall record in 2006 and finishing eighth in the Big West with a 6-15 record. Now 77-146-1, Rousey is confident in the growth of his Matador program.

The 2006 season was the best year since Rousey took over the helm of the Matador program. They opened the season with a 6-2 mark and went on to post their first 20-plus win season. The six conference wins was also the highest total in three years.

As a coach and a player, Rousey has experience getting his teams to the College World Series. The top assistant coach at Cal State Northridge for the 2001 and 2002 seasons, Rousey helped lead the Matadors to a two-year record of 75-39. In 2002, the coach helped guide the Matadors to an impressive 41-17 overall record, a Big West title and its first trip to the NCAA Regionals since 1996.

In Rousey's first season as a Matadors pitching coach, he guided his staff to a 4.60 ERA and 459 strikeouts in 492.2 innings. The Matadors ranked second in the Big West Conference in strikeouts, fourth in ERA and gave up the third fewest earned runs in the conference in 2001. Before coaching at Cal State Northridge, Rousey's 12-year coaching career included stints at Long Beach State and Los Angeles City College. While coaching at LBSU, Rousey helped the 49ers advance to the 1998 College World Series.

Before his career as a coach, Rousey was a top pitcher at Cal State Fullerton. Rousey played in the College World Series twice (1982, 1984), helping the team to the National Championship in 1984 while compiling an 8-3 record with a 3.47 ERA.

A fourth-round pick by the Seattle Mariners in 1984, he spent five years playing professionally in the Mariners and Montreal Expos organizations.

About The 49ers

- The 2006 season marked the first time Long Beach State did not reach the 30-win plateau since 1988 when it went 14-15. Their 29-27 record halted the five-year streak of postseason appearances.

- The 49ers' 12 Big West wins was the lowest conference win total for LBSU since 2001.

- Evan Longoria became the highest-ever 49er drafted, when he went third overall to the Tampa Bay Devil Rays in the 2006 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. He also tied for the fourth-highest pick for the Big West Conference. In five seasons, head coach Mike Weathers has seen 34 players sign professional contracts.

- Despite being absent from the national polls throughout 2006, for the first time in five years, Long Beach State enters the new season ranked 30th in the *Collegiate Baseball Preseason Poll*.

- On the mound, Vance Worley enters the year as the team's number one starter, after losing Andrew Carpenter and Jared Hughes to the 2006 MLB Amateur Draft. The 49ers will feel the absence of Carpenter and Hughes, as they combined for a 15-8 record in 2006. Last season Worley appeared in 21 contests with eight starts and registered a 3.82 ERA in 73.0 innings pitched. In the final two months of play the true freshman produced a 1.65 ERA and 3-2 record.


- Long Beach State returns 14 letterwinners, including two All-Big West Second Team members - Robert Perry and Shane Peterson. Perry carries a .300 career average over three Division I seasons and was named to the 2007 Brooks Wallace National Player of the Year watch list. He batted .309 last year with 43 runs and 33 RBI over 55 starts. Last season Peterson split time between first base and pitching duties. At the plate he posted a .328 batting average and tallied a 6.23 ERA in relief.

- Big West Freshman Player of the Year and Freshman All-American Danny Espinosa returns for his sophomore campaign after playing in the Cape Cod League this past summer. Playing in all 56 games last year, he batted .281 and ranked in the Big West top 10 in doubles with 16.







Mike Weathers

Head Coach
6th Season

Mike Weathers enters his sixth season at the helm of the Long Beach State 49ers. Last season the 49ers opened with a series sweep over No. 17 USC, but struggled down the stretch to post an overall record of 29-27. This season Weathers looks to turn things around and win the 49ers' first Big West title in four years.

In 2005, Weathers guided the 49ers to their fifth straight trip to the NCAA Regionals after posting a 37-22 record and finishing in a tie for second in the conference at 14-7.

Weathers now boasts a 186-111 record at Long Beach State, as well as the 2003 Big West championship.

Long Beach State pitching has been one of the best in the country under the watch of Weathers. The 49ers led the nation with a 2.53 earned run average in 2005. A year earlier the 49ers ranked fourth in the nation with a 3.11 ERA. In 2003, their 2.99 team ERA ranked them fifth nationally.

Their defensive domination has also been stellar. In 2004, a .975 fielding percentage ranked Long Beach State sixth, while it was unparalleled on defense in 2003, posting a .980 mark to rank No. 1 in the nation and break the all-time Big West record.

Weathers served as an assistant to predecessor Dave Snow for nine years (1993-2001), including a position as associate head coach in 2001. In 2003, he was an assistant on the U.S. National Team that went 27-2 in the Pan American Games, earning a silver medal.

At Chapman, Weathers led his teams to three playoff appearances, including in his first season. The Panthers compiled a 47-14-2 record in 1984 and went



239-241-2 during his tenure. Weathers also amassed a 40-39 record during his two-year stay at Utah. Prior to that, he served as an assistant at Fullerton College from 1978 to 1979. The 1971 Chapman graduate was a two-time All-American in baseball.

About The Anteaters

• UC Irvine (36-24) recorded the second-highest number of victories in its Division I history with 36 wins last season. They also reached the 30-win plateau for the third straight season.

• The Anteaters made their second NCAA Tournament appearance in three years. Unfortunately, UCI was eliminated from the Malibu Regional after dropping contests to UCLA, 3-2, and Missouri, 5-4 (14).

• With a league record of 11-10, the Anteaters concluded the season in third place - their highest finish since reinstating their program in 2002.

• The Anteaters not only led the league in stolen bases with 107, but they set a new school record as well. Four players posted double-digit swipes with Gary Dudrey leading the way with 24.

• The Anteaters also demonstrated their talent on the mound. On Tuesday, April 25, senior southpaw Glenn Swanson tossed UCI's first no-hitter in 32 years, yielding just one walk and striking out a career-high 14 batters, in a 7-0 win over the University of San Diego. For his efforts he earned Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week honors. The last time a no-hitter was thrown by a Big West school was back on March 28, 2003, when Cal Poly's Garrett Olson and Tony Saipe combined for a 7-0 win over Southern Utah. Pacific's D.J. Houlton posted the last complete game no-hitter on May 11, 2001, with an 8-0 victory over UC Riverside.

• On the mound UC Irvine returns All-Big West honorees Blair Erickson and Scott Gorgen. For the second time in three seasons Erickson led the conference in saves, tying CSF's Vinnie Pestano with 13 saves and ranking 13th in the nation. In his three-year tenure he has combined for 40 saves to sit second in the Big West record books. He needs just six more to grab the top spot. Erickson is also nine saves away from tying the NCAA record (49) set by USC's Jack Krawczyk (1995-98). As a freshman, Gorgen led all UCI starters with a 2.54 earned run average to place third in the conference. His impressive ERA was the second-lowest in Big West history for a freshman pitching over 100 innings, which earned him 2006 Big West Freshman Pitcher of the Year accolades. Erickson and Gorgen have both been named to the 2007 Roger Clemens watch list, while Erickson also received preseason All-America nods.

• Collegiate Baseball Preseason All-American Cody Cipriano returns to the lineup for his final season in an Anteater uniform. The Agoura, Calif., native blasted a team-high .354 batting average and .521 slugging percentage, while scoring 31 runs and knocking out 36 RBI. He is the league's top stat returner in four categories.

• Baseball America has recognized UC Irvine Baseball as having the 14th best recruiting class in the nation. The Anteaters, behind the efforts of assistant coach and recruiting coordinator Sergio Brown, have brought in 14 freshmen, four junior college transfers and one four-year transfer. Baseball America has tabbed shortstop Luis Tovar, pitchers Christian Bergman, Reid Sutor, Daniel Bibona, Cory Hamilton and Wes Etheridge as key recruits to watch at UC Irvine. Also mentioned by the publication is catcher Francis Larson.

• UC Irvine opens the 2007 season with 12 of its first 17 contests on the road. The Anteaters follow that up with a nine-game homestand before diving into conference play against Long Beach State.



In just his third year at the helm of the UC Irvine program, Dave Serrano already boasts a shining resume.

It took Serrano just two seasons to guide the Anteaters to an NCAA appearance - their second in three years. UC Irvine boasted an overall record of 36-24, while finishing third in the Big West at 11-10.

In 2005, Serrano led the Anteaters to their second consecutive 30-plus win season with a 31-25 record. UCI finished fifth in the Big West with a 10-11 record.

As the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Cal State Fullerton, Serrano's efforts earned him accolades as the National Assistant Coach of the Year following the Titans' run to the 2004 NCAA National Championship. He is now the seventh coach to assume the head job at UC Irvine.

Through the years Serrano has helped form many All-Americans and nearly 30 pitchers have become Major League Draft selections. Each of his recruiting classes at Cal State Fullerton were ranked among the top 20 in the nation, and his last four years were ranked in the nation's top two.

Serrano's coaching career began with seven years at Cerritos College, one of which he took over as head coach. That year, the Falcons won one of the six conference titles Serrano had been a part of there, and he earned South Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors.

He also spent two years coaching at Tennessee. Between the Titans and the Volunteers, Serrano's teams reached an NCAA Regional every year for 10 years and made five trips to Omaha.

As a player, Serrano pitched at Cerritos College before moving to Cal State Fullerton in 1986.


- With a 29-25 overall record, UC Riverside was one win shy of posting its fourth 30-plus win season in six years. The Highlanders finished the season in a three-way tie for fifth place in the Big West with a 9-12 record.

- For the 2007 season, UC Riverside welcomes back 16 letterwinners, which includes six starting position players and three pitchers.

- The Highlanders took a hit on offense as they lost Brett Bigler and D.J. Hollingsworth to the MLB Amateur Draft. Bigler led the conference with 27 stolen bases and a .356 batting average. Hollingsworth blasted a team-high 39 RBI and batted .351. As a team, UCR finished second in the conference with a .298 average. Looking to fill the void are Jaime Pedroza and Jeff Dunbar. Pedroza, the top returner, batted .352 last season and scored 29 runs, while driving in 31. As the starting catcher, Dunbar tallied a .996 fielding percentage while hitting .293 from the plate.

- The pitching squad will be led by preseason All-America pick James Simmons. He returns to the mound this season after posting a 9-5 record with a 2.96 earned run average in 2006. In a team-high 109.1 inning pitched, the right-handed pitcher tossed 94 strikeouts. He enters this season as a member of the Brooks Wallace and Roger Clemens watch lists. Simmons spent his summer playing in the highly-regarded Cape Cod League where he was the eighth-best overall prospect. Simmons went 4-2 with a 1.18 earned run average (third in the league) for the Cotuit Kettleers. He also had 44 strikeouts while walking only five batters in 53.1 innings. Simmons was named to the All-Star team and was the Kettleers' Co-Most Valuable Player.

- Joining Simmons on the bump are seniors Taylor Bills and Marc Rzepczynski. Bills finished the year with a 4.11 ERA in 15 appearances (12 starts), while Rzepczynski tallied a 4.47 ERA in 16 appearances (eight starts). Over the summer, Rzepczynski was listed as the fourth-best prospect out of the West Coast Collegiate League. Playing for the Aloha Knights, Rzepczynski posted a perfect 6-0 record with a 2.25 ERA and 58 strikeouts in 52 innings. He was also named to the league's all-star team.



- Head coach Doug Smith enters his third season at the helm of the Highlanders' program with a 57-52 record (.523).



Doug Smith was appointed as the fourth head baseball coach in UC Riverside history in September 2004, following 25 years as the top assistant and hitting coach at his alma mater.

Smith made short work of putting his name in the record books at UCR, becoming the fastest coach in school history to reach 50 wins, doing so in just two years. He is the first coach in the program to have a winning record in his first two seasons, compiling a 57-52 mark.

In his first season at the helm, UCR posted a 28-27 record under Smith, the program's fourth consecutive winning season at the Division I level. The team improved upon that record the next year, going 29-25.

In a collegiate coaching career spanning over 1,500 games, Smith has helped the Highlanders to nine post-season appearances, including one Division II National Championship and one NCAA Division I West Regional appearance.

As the Highlanders' hitting coach, Smith has seen his teams set nearly every significant offensive school record, including batting average, home runs, runs, RBI and extra base hits. In his career, Smith has coached over 150 all-conference selections and 30 All-America selections. During that time, nearly 100 of his players have been signed to professional contracts. In addition, the 2003 Highlanders led the Big West in batting average and homers and had the fourth highest team batting average in Division I.

Smith graduated from UC Riverside in 1975 with bachelor's degrees in sociology and political science. An outstanding catcher, his senior year was highlighted by his performance in the All-Riverside Baseball Invitational Tournament, where he helped lead the Highlanders to their first-ever title and was the leading hitter at .471. Following the season he was named All-CCAA First Team.

Smith served as a part-time assistant coach from 1976 through 1980 while he pursued a master's degree in Physical Education from Cal Poly Pomona. After taking three years off to venture into private business, Smith returned to the Highlanders in 1983 and has been on the staff ever since. In 1989 Smith led the Kenai Peninsula

About The Gauchos

- UC Santa Barbara concluded the 2006 season with 26 wins, emulating the previous year's total victories. The Gauchos also picked up one more Big West win than the previous year at 9-12.


- There are a total of 15 players that were not on the 2006 roster who will suit up in 2007. Ten of those 15 players are freshmen, while the remaining five transferred from other schools. Of those 15, four are infielders, four are southpaw pitchers, three are right-handers, three are outfielders and one is a catcher.

- After missing the entire 2006 campaign due to preseason injuries, right-handers Steve Morlock and Michael Martin will be back on the hill in 2007. Morlock, who was slated to be the Friday starter for UCSB last season, should pick up right where he left off - as the ace on the squad with the ball at the start of the weekend series. Martin, who was also slated to be one of three weekend starters last season, should battle for starts this upcoming season.

- Along with Morlock and Martin, UCSB has a very strong pitching staff returning to the Gaucho clubhouse. UC Santa Barbara returns six senior pitchers with left-hander Jeff Braun and right-handed pitchers Brian Tracy and Bryan Fleming, who combined to start 35 of the Gauchos' 54 games last season. Perhaps the biggest return for UCSB is reliever Justin Segal. From the bullpen, he finished last year with a team-best ERA (2.29) and seven saves, while leading the Big West with 36 appearances - which is also a Gaucho record.

- While the pitching staff seems to be in place, the outlook for the position players isn't as defined. UC Santa Barbara has the challenge of filling the void of Alden Carrithers, who batted a team-high .342 and led the team with 60 runs, while finishing second in the conference in on-base percentage at .465. UCSB also lost Chris Valaika to the MLB Amateur Draft as the Gauchos top draftee (third round - Cincinnati). Valaika, the lone Gaucho to start all 54 contests, finished second on the team with a .335 batting average and registered a conference-high 57 RBI. First baseman Robbie Blauer will lead the Gauchos as the team's top returning hitter with a .332 batting average and 38 runs scored. He also posted an impressive .989 fielding percentage.

- In 2007, UC Santa Barbara plays 13 contests against 2006 NCAA Tournament qualifiers - three of which are against a College World Series team (conference foe Cal State Fullerton). Of the 55 games, 31 will be played at Caesar Uyesaka Stadium, where the Gauchos were 15-11 just a season ago.



Bob Brontsema enters his 14th season as UC Santa Barbara's head coach having concluded last season with an overall record of 26-28 and finishing in a three-way tie for fifth place in the Big West at 9-12.

With his nine conference victories, Brontsema moves within two wins of the fifth place spot among the Big West career victory leaders. He enters the 2007 season with 142 career Big West wins.

On February 15, 2005, Brontsema earned his landmark 300th career win with the Gauchos after downing Westmont, 14-2. Brontsema amassed his 200th career victory on April 7, 2001, a 7-2 triumph over UC Riverside. In 2004, Brontsema moved into sixth place all-time with 125 career Big West wins.

In 2001, Brontsema's squad was among the elite, going 40-17 and advancing to the NCAA Regionals. That stands as the most victories in a season during his tenure and the second time his program reached the postseason. He was rewarded with Big West Coach of the Year accolades, the second time he had received the honor.

Brontsema, a 1985 UCSB graduate, was named Big West Co-Coach of the Year in 1996 when the club finished 32-20 and qualified for the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 1990.

Brontsema has been involved with the UCSB program since 1982, when he played for the Gauchos for two years, earning All-Southern California Baseball Association honors as a second baseman in 1983. He served as an assistant coach for 10 years before starting his current post in 1994.

About The Tigers

- Pacific posted back-to-back 30-win seasons for the first time in school history. The Tigers started the year with their first 10-win month (February) under the helm of head coach Ed Sprague.

- Last year the Tigers posted an overall record of 30-25 for a .545 winning percentage - third-best in the conference.

- The Tigers tallied a conference record of 9-12 for the second season in a row, their best record since the 1999 season when they went 17-13. They concluded the year in a three-way tie for fifth place with UC Riverside and UC Santa Barbara.


- The Tigers opened their new ballpark - Klein Family Field - with an 8-3 win over former Big West rival Nevada on Tuesday, April 18, 2006. For the year, Pacific was 8-7 when playing at its new home. The 2007 season marks the first complete season held at Klein Family Field.

- Pacific welcomes back 16 players, including five starting position players.

- Justin Baum returns to the lineup this season after blasting his 29th career home run in 2006, setting a new school record. He tallied 12 home runs in 2006, while driving in a team-high 46 runs. Adam Ching also returns after a standout year where he started all 55 games, batted .308 and scored 40 runs. With 69 hits last season, Ching is tied with Cal State Fullerton's Evan McArthur as the conference's top returner, while Baum tops the chart for Big West returners in runs batted in and home runs.

- Baum, a Brooks Wallace watch list member, is one of three returning All-Big West First Team members set to compete this year. Cal State Fullerton's Wes Roemer and UC Irvine's Blair Erickson hold the other top honors. He received first team honors after the 2005 season. Joe Oliveira, Ty'Relle Harris and Joey Centanni, each receiving Big West Player of the Week accolades in 2006, will join Baum in the Tigers' lineup this season.


- On the mound, Pacific returns seven pitchers from a season ago. Joey Centanni will headline the squad after posting a team-best 2.77 earned run average in 87.2 innings pitched. In his 18 appearances, he compiled a 6-4 record.



A native of Stockton, Calif., Ed Sprague enters his fourth year as the head coach of the Pacific baseball program after guiding the Tigers to back-to-back 30-win seasons for the first time in school history. In his three-year stint at Pacific he has improved his winning percentage on an annual basis.

In 2006, the Tigers tied for fifth in the conference with a 9-12 Big West record. Pacific also posted its first 10-win month (February) under the helm of Sprague. He also led the Tigers to a 9-12 league record in 2005, which earned them a sixth place finish.

Sprague enjoyed an 11-year career at the major league level, playing on World Series Champion teams with the Toronto Blue Jays in 1992 and 1993. His most productive season was in 1996 with the Blue Jays when he amassed 36 home runs and 101 RBI.

In 1999, Sprague earned a selection to the All-Star Game as a member of the Pittsburgh Pirates. He also had stints with the Boston Red Sox, Oakland A's, Seattle Mariners and San Diego Padres. Sprague finished his career with 152 home runs and 558 RBI.

He also had a distinguished collegiate career at Stanford as the starting third baseman on the 1987 and 1988 NCAA Championship teams. In 1988, he was named an All-American after hitting .339 with 22 homers and 81 RBI. Sprague was selected in the first round of the 1988 major league draft by Toronto.

Sprague also won a gold medal as a member of the 1988 U.S. Olympic Baseball Team and is married to Kristen Babb Sprague, an Olympic gold medalist in synchronized swimming in 1992. Sprague returned to his roots in 2003, serving as the assistant coach at St. Mary's High School in Stockton, Calif.






