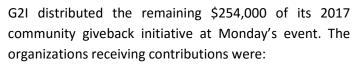


St. Louis Organizations Receive Nearly \$310,000 for Technology Needs G2I Has Given Back Nearly \$1.4 Million Since the First IT Conference in 2006

St. Louis, MO – July 17, 2017- Gateway to Innovation (G2I) capped off \$309,908 in 2017 St. Louis community giveback by presenting contributions to 16 non-profit and educational organizations during a special event hosted by the St. Louis Regional Chamber.

Each year <u>G2I donates 100 percent of net proceeds</u> from its increasingly popular annual conference, which was attended by 1,500 regional Information Technology (IT) professionals in downtown St. Louis in early May, to worthy organizations that demonstrate technology-related needs. Since the first conference in 2006, G2I community giveback totals \$1,369,169.
