SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a company that leases industrial machines such as forklifts, warehouse towing machines, etc. that consume liquid petroleum gas and diesel, Comaco operates in an industry in which energy and carbon emissions are a material environmental issue.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The key sources of energy for the company's equipment are are electricity, liquified petroleum gas and diesel. More than 80% of the company's revenue is derived from LPG-powered or petrol-powered equipment.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Impacts related to carbon emissions and climate change.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Comaco quantified the Corporate Carbon Footprint for the calendar year 2020 period, through the measurement of greenhouse gases (GHG) in scopes 1,2 and 3 The company is committed to reducing its energy consumption by 2% by the end of 2023 and a reduction of 8% by 2026. The company's business model seeks to contribute to the reduction of the use of conventional fossil fuels through the use of forklifts that are powered by cleaner combustion such as liquefied gas and electricity. As a part of the Race to Zero initiative of the UNFCCC, the company is committed to achieving net zero emissions by 2030,  Electric powered vehicles already represent 18% of the company's total fleet. Per the company's business plan, they have a commitment to increase the number of 2-ton electric forklifts in their fleet by 12% by 2022 and 20% by 2023.  The company participated in an emission mitigation project with SocialGreen certified by the UN through the 2.5 MW Rice husk based cogeneration plant at Hanuman Agro Industries Limited. The company is also exploring a commercial opportunity regarding the sourcing of cranes with green hydrogen from expert suppliers in hydrogen as an alternative fuel to current batteries, which pose several drawbacks in their logistics.  Comaco has established objectives and goals within the framework of the 2020 environmental management system, where a matrix was created to manage the environmental impact by pillar. It is in this context that objectives and goals were generated for GHG emissions from the use of electrical energy.
REPORT	Comaco obtained a voluntary cancellation certificate from the UN, which verifies that the SocialGreen project seeks to mitigate emissions through various initiatives, with a special tendency in the project to generate energy through biomass rice husk in the Hanuman Agro Industries Limited plant project.  The company will allocate 5 million pesos this year to finance Chilean entrepreneurship projects around REGENERATION, sponsoring the national entrepreneurship championship Nothing Stops Us Regeneration.
