Topic	Volunteer Placement to Childcare Organizations
Summary of Issue	As part of its Corporate Social Responsibility initiative, Wizardz Consulting makes visitations to nursery schools. The purpose of the visits are to read picture books aloud to children and donate picture-books. The initiative started in the year of 2024. The company has formalized a commitment to donate 10,000 books within the next 10 years. One of the nursery schools was selected as they reside within the community in which the company operates, and other nursery schools were introduced to the company by the childcare council based on the schools need for picture books.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	A total of 17 employees, representing more than 50% of the company's total workforce had participated in the 13 visitations to various nursery schools that occurred in the last fiscal year.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Volunteer programs at childcare organizations, if not managed appropriately, could potentially pose risks to children, such as disruption of development due to short-term connections with caregivers, as well as, risks to children's safety and well-being.  For more information please see <u>B Lab's position statement on Orphanage-Based Volunteer Programs</u> .
Implemented Management Practices	The company has yet to formalize a policy and guidelines to ensure the safety of children during visitions by its employees. However, the company has practices that mitigates any risk to the children.  When donating picture books, the company first obtains approval from the head office and the director of the nursery school that would be receiving the books. During visitions, the company ensures that the teacher of the nursery school is always present and supervises all activities. In addition, the picture books are given directly to the principal (rather than to the children), and permission is obtained in advance to take photographs to a minimum (even if permission is given, the



	children's faces are not included) to protect the privacy of the children. There is no direct contact between the employees and the children.
	The company has strict company regulations that prohibit employees from all forms of harassment and behavior that disrupts social order, and it is also clearly stated that they will be subject to disciplinary action if such behavior occurs.
Management Comments	All 13 childcare facilities were selected from where the company operates. There will be some introduction from the council in the next fiscal year to provide updates on this program.
